GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

SENSITIVE

Background

These matters were generated as the result of information compiled by the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) during the ordinary course of review of Quarterly Reports. As the result of earlier recommendations made directly to the Commission by RAD, the Commission has previously found reason to believe that United for Orange County, the Orange County Democratic Central Committee, the Committee to Re-Elect Patterson, the Hannaford Re-Election Committee, the Mobile Homes PAC, and the Re-Elect Paul Bell Committee violated the Act.

Additionally, the Assemblyman Cordova Committee, Californians for Brown, and the Round Up '78 Committee were referred to OGC for failure to adequately respond to surface violation notifications from RAD.

The specific allegations are discussed separately, by respondent, below.

Orange County Democratic Central Committee
("OCDCC") - MUR 1115

The Commission has found reason to believe that OCDCC violated (a) 2 U.S.C. § 434 by failing to adequately disclose its opening funds and failure to properly disclose the individuals involved in partnership contributions; (b) 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) by accepting excessive contributions totalling \$8,330 from Californians for Brown '78;

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and (c) 2 U.S.C. § 441b by accepting contributions from corporations and labor unions.

RAD has also noted that OCDCC has apparently violated:

(a) 2 U.S.C. § 441a by making excessive contributions totalling \$5,000 to the Committee to Re-Elect Patterson to Congress as well as to the Hannaford Re-Election Committee; and (b) 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) by receiving \$7,876 in excessive contributions from the Re-Elect Paul Bell Committee. (MURS 1115, 1117, 1119, 1121 and 1122 have in common the accounts of the Orange County Democratic State Central Committee).

At the time of the referral, all that was known about OCDCC's financial activity was that OCDCC apparently operated with three accounts - a restricted account containing corporate and union monies, a general account, and the "Chairs Committee" account which was established for purposes of segregating proceeds from fundraisers until all expenses for such events had been paid, at which time any remaining proceeds were placed in the general account. OCDCC's reports to the Commission apparently included the activities of both the general and the restricted accounts. It was not possible to determine the relationships of these accounts to the OCDCC's federal activity. Nor was it ascertained into which account the contributions from Californians for Brown '78, the Re-Elect Paul Bell Committee, and the contributions from an individual contributor, Richard J. O'Neill, were placed.

Therefore, on June 3, 1980, the Commission issued an order to OCDCC to clarify unanswered questions surrounding its financial activities as well as its purported affiliation with the California

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Democratic State Central Committee - Federal Account ("DSCC - Federal Account"). In light of the fact that DSCC - Federal Account denied affiliation with OCDCC, it was also issued an order concerning the affiliation issue.

In response to the order, DSCC - Federal Candidate Fund reiterated its previous position that it is not affiliated with OCDCC. OCDCC stated that the relationship between the two is contained in the California State Election Code. A review of the State Election Code Articles which outline membership in the State Central Committee and in the County Committees, does not indicate control, overlapping membership or any other indicia of affiliation between the two. Therefore, absent affiliation with DCSS - Federal Candidates Fund, OCDCC has violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a by making excessive contributions of \$5,000 to the Committee to Re-Elect Patterson to Congress and the Hannaford Re-Election Committee.

The Commission has also found reason to believe that OCDCC violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) by accepting excessive contributions totalling \$8,330 from Californians for Brown and \$7,876 from the Re-Elect Bell Committee. While both contributors maintained that their contributions were earmarked for Registration and GOTV activities of OCDCC, it appears from the reports that the subject contributions were co-mingled with the federal monies held in the various accounts of OCDCC. In response to the Commission's Order, OCDCC filed amended reports but still failed to establish whether certain contributions and expenditures were made from the general account or the federal account and failed to provide the dollar amount expended in connection with GOTV activities.

As discussed in detail with respect to United for Orange County (see discussion MUR 1116, which follows), the Commission has held in AO 1978-28 that the expenses of a political party organization for GOTV drives in a federal election year are, at least in part, for the purpose of influencing the election of persons to federal office even though the drive is not conducted expressly or exclusively on behalf of federal candidates.

However, because the dollar amount expended in connection with GOTV activities has not been provided, it is impossible to ascertain what portion of the contributions from Brown and Bell were used in connection with federal elections.

The Commission has also found reason to believe that OCDCC violated § 434 for failure to report opening cash on hand and for failure to provide complete partnership itemizations. The amended reports do not provide any information which would negate the Commission's previous finding.

The Commission has previously found reason to believe that OCDCC has accepted corporate and union contributions which have been used in connection with federal elections. Again, OCDCC has not provided any information which refutes the Commission's finding.

OCDCC registered in September 1978 and according to a computer run of the Commission C index, OCDCC expended \$92,648 in connection with 1978 primary elections, \$32,730 in connection with the 1978 general election and additionally expended \$25,000 in 1980. In light of the fact that OCDCC is an ongoing Committee, has repeatedly failed to provide adequate disclosure information

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to the Commission and because unanswered questions regarding their financial activities remain, especially those questions pertaining to the restricted account, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission refer this committee to the Audit Division for consideration of a 2 U.S.C. § 437g audit within the parameters of the findings previously made in this matter.

It is recommended that the Commission take no further action against DSCC - Federal Candidates Fund for possible violation of 2 U.S.C. § 433 pending an audit of OCDCC.

United for Orange County
MUR 1116

The Commission has found reason to believe that United for Orange County violated (a) § 441a(f) by accepting an excessive contribution totalling \$14,000 from Californians for Brown '78 and (b) § 433 for failure to file a statement of organization.

Conversely, the Commission has found reason to believe that Californians for Brown violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433, 434, and 441a in connection with making excessive contributions to a political committee while an unregistered committee.

In response to the Commission's findings of reason to believe that this committee may have violated 2 U.S.C. § 433 and § 441a(f), the committee's treasurer informed RAD that United for Orange County filed reports with the Commission by mistake. According to the treasurer, its voter registration activities were conducted exclusively at the state and local levels, particularly in support of Governor Brown's state campaign in 1978.

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On June 3, 1980, the Commission issued an Order to James Kozik, the committee's treasurer, in connection with its get-out-the-vote ("GOTV") activities. The respondent, through counsel, reiterated its previous position that United for Orange is not a political committee as defined by the Act. Jerry Simmons, counsel to the respondent, maintains that the committee was solely organized to conduct voter registration and GOTV activities in a non-partisan manner and its filing of reports with the Commission was an error by their accountant.

United for Orange spent \$30,794 in connection with voter registration and GOTV activities in 1978.

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 433, a political committee is required to register with the Commission within ten days of becoming a political committee under the Act. A political committee is further required by 2 U.S.C. § 434 to file periodic reports of receipts and expenditures with the Commission.

The Commission has recognized in Advisory Opinion 1978-50 that GOTV and voter registration expenditures are considered administrative expenses and may be allocated in the same manner as administrative expenses. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 106.1(e) party committees and other political committees which have established federal campaign committees shall allocate administrative expenses on a reasonable basis between their federal and non-federal accounts in proportion to the amount of funds expended on federal and non-federal elections, or on another reasonable basis. The Commission has further recognized in Advisory Opinions 1978-50, 1978-28, 1978-102, 1978-10, Re: AOR 1976-72, and its

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December 1977 guideline, that various methods may be "reasonable" for the allocation of the GOTV expenses of political committees. Additionally, the Commission has held in AO 1978-28 that the expenses of a political party organization for GOTV drives in a federal election year are, at least in part, for the purpose of influencing the election of persons to federal office even though the drive is not conducted expressly or exclusively on behalf of federal candidates. See also AO 1978-50 and AO 1978-10.

It appears that the method of allocation set forth in Advisory Opinion 1978-102 is the method most appropriate for the allocation of the GOTV expenses of the United for Orange during 1978. The Commission determined in AO 1978-102 that a reasonable basis of allocation for GOTV activity is to determine the ratio of the number of federal candidates seeking election in the areas where get-out-the-vote activity is conducted, to the total number of all candidates, federal, state, and local, seeking office in the areas where get-out-the-vote activity is conducted. Thus, the application of this formula to the GOTV activity conducted by United for Orange and the committees to whom United for Orange made transfers in 1978 for GOTV activity results in the determination that an amount of \$3,240 is the amount attributable to federal activity that year.

This figure is derived from information received from the registrar of voters which indicates that the general election ballots in Orange County included a total of thirty-eight democratic candidates, four of which were federal candidates. Counsel for the respondent states that there were also numerous non-partisan

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city and county races in Orange County in 1978. Thus, total Committee expenditures of \$30,794 divided by the total number of candidates equal \$810 per candidate multiplied by four (the number of democratic federal candidates) equal \$3,240 total federal activity conducted by United for Orange.

In regard to this allocation, it should be noted that if the total number of local candidates were known and the total amount expended on exempted activities were known, the federal allocation would become smaller.

In view of the fact that the federal GOTV activity of United for Orange was only \$3,240 and since United did not engage in any other federal activity during 1978, it is recommended that the Commission take no further action against United for Orange.

It is recommended, however, that the Commission advise United for Orange, through the attached letter, that in the future, it must take care to allocate GOTV activities to federal elections if the activities are conducted in a federal election year or are on behalf of federal candidates.

Californians for Brown
MUR 1117

The Commission has previously advised Californians for Brown '78 that it appeared to have violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433, 434 and 441a by making excessive contributions totalling \$8,330 to Orange County Democratic Central Committee (1115) and \$14,000 to United for Orange County (1116).

The Brown Committee maintains that the subject contributions to the above committees were expressly intended for voter registration and GOTV activities at the State and local levels.

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The Brown Committee has stated that their contributions were misreported as being received in connection with federal elections.

Even though it is not known at this time whether the Brown Committee's contributions were deposited into non-federal accounts, the respondent contends that the subject contributions were earmarked for State and local activity.

Therefore, the intent of the respondent should be considered a mitigating factor and it is recommended that the Commission take no further action against Californians for Brown and close the file.

Committee to Re-Elect Patterson
MUR 1118
and

Hannaford Re-Election Committee
MUR 1120

As previously stated, the Commission has found reason to believe the Orange County Democratic State Central Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a by making excessive contributions totalling \$5,000 to the Committee to Re-Elect Patterson to Congress as well as the Hannaford Re-Election Committee.

Conversely, both the Patterson and Hannaford Committees were found to have violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) by accepting the subject excessive contributions. In light of the fact that both recipient committees were incorrectly advised by the contributor that it was affiliated with the State Central Committee and able to make the excessive contributions, since the contributions were accepted in connection with the 1978 election, and since the respondent committees are now terminated, it is recommended that

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the Commission take no further action with respect to the § 441a(f) violations and close the files.

Assemblyman Cordova Committee
MUR 1119

The Assemblyman Cordova Committee contributed \$1,365 to the Orange County Democratic Central Committee during 1978.

Since the Committee exceeded \$1,000 in contributions, RAD advised the Committee that it appeared to have violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433 and 434 for failure to report and register as a political committee with the Commission. No response was ever made by the respondent committee. However, in light of the small amount of the excessive contribution, the fact that it was made in 1978, and because the committee is not likely to again be active in federal elections, it is recommended that the Commission take no further action and close the file.

Re-Elect Paul Bell Committee
MUR 1121

The Re-Elect Paul Bell Committee contributed \$7,876 to the Orange County Democratic Central Committee (OCDCC) in 1978.

Since the Committee exceeded \$1,000 in contributions, RAD advised the Committee that it appeared to have violated 2 U.S.C. § 433 and § 434 for failure to report and register as a political committee with the Commission. On March 20, 1979, the Commission found reason to believe that such violations had been committed.

The Bell Committee then sent a letter to OCDCC requesting a refund of the excessive portion of the contribution. The Bell Committee was advised that OCDCC could not make the requested refund because it was in debt. The Bell Committee then indicated

to RAD that it would request an advisory opinion to determine whether a repayment plan with OCDCC would be appropriate to bring the Committee into compliance with the Act. According to Commission records, no AOR was ever submitted by the respondent.

In light of the fact that the subject violation occurred in 1978 and because the respondent is not likely to be involved in federal elections in the future, it is recommended that the Commission take no further action and close the files.

Round Up '78 Committee
(AKA Chairs Committee) - MUR 1122

The Round Up '78 Committee was referred to OGC by RAD for making a contribution of \$5,300 to the Orange County Democratic Central Committee.

Since the Committee exceeded \$1,000 in contributions, RAD advised the committee that it appeared to have violated 2 U.S.C. § 433 and § 434 for failure to report and register as a political committee with the Commission. In response, it was discovered that the Chairs Committee was an account established by the chairman of OCDCC to hold fundraising proceeds until such time as all expenses for the fundraiser had been paid. The balance was then transferred to the OCDCC General Account.

An AOR was submitted by OCDCC concerning the Chairs account but an advisory opinion was not issued because this issue was part of a compliance matter and because the subject transactions had already occurred.

Because the Chairs Committee is actually an account of OCDCC which OGC has recommended be referred to Audit, it is recommended that this matter also be reviewed by Audit at that time.

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Mobile Homes PAC
MUR 1123

The Mobile Homes PAC, as an unregistered committee, contributed \$5,000 to United for Orange County (MUR 1116), \$1,000 to Nate Holden Campaign Committee, and \$950 to Roos for Assemblyman Committee.

Since the Committee exceeded \$1,000 in contributions, RAD advised the committee that it appeared to have violated 2 U.S.C. § 433 and § 434 for failure to report and register as a political committee with the Commission. The Commission, on July 13, 1979, found reason to believe that such violations had been committed. The Committee responded by stating that the subject contributions were expressly earmarked for Voter Registration and GOTV at the state and local levels.

In light of the fact that these contributions were not intended for use in connection with federal elections, the recipient Committees erred, and since the violation is not likely to be repeated in the future, it is recommended that no further action be taken and close the file.

Recommendations


It is recommended that the Commission:

2. MUR 1115 - refer OCDCC to audit for review pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g;
3. MUR 1116 - take no further action against United for Orange County's violations of 2 U.S.C. §§ 433 and 441a(f) and close the file;

4. MUR 1117 - take no further action against Californians for Brown's violations of 2 U.S.C. § 433, § 434 and § 441a and close file;
5. MUR 1118 - take no further action against the Committee to Re-Elect Patterson's violation of § 441a(f) and close the file;
6. MUR 1119 - take no further action against Assemblyman Cordova Committee's violations of § 433 and § 434 and close the file;
7. MUR 1120 - take no further action against Hannaford Re-Election Committee's violations of § 441a(f) and close the file;
8. MUR 1121 - take no further action against Re-Elect Paul Bell Committee's violations of §§ 433 and 434 and close file;
9. MUR 1122 - refer the Round Up '78 Committee to Audit for review pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g; and
10. MUR 1123 - take no further action against Mobile Homes PAC's violations of § 433 and § 434 and close the file.

INTERIM INVESTIGATIVE REPORT #4

Central to alleged violations in these MURs are the finances of the Orange County Democratic Central Committee (OCDCC) and United for Orange County (UOC), and the relationships, if any, between OCDCC, UOC and the Democratic State Central Committee of California (DSCCC). On May 29, 1980, the Commission voted to defer action pending receipt of information solicited in orders to be sent to the respective treasurers of each of these three organizations. On June 2, 1980, the orders were sent. Those addressed to the treasurers of OCDCC and DSCCC apparently were not received. New orders were sent on July 14, 1980. Responses received to the orders raise the possibility that OCDCC and UOC may not be political committees as defined by 2 U.S.C. §431(4)(c).

Therefore, additional information was requested from the Registrar of Voters (Orange County, California) and has recently been received by the Office of General Counsel. A final

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recommendation, based on the ballot information, will be
made to the Commission shortly.





Central to alleged violations in these MURs are the finances of the Orange County Democratic Central Committee (OCDCC) and United for Orange County (UOC), and the relationships, if any, between OCDCC, UOC and the Democratic State Central Committee of California (DSCCC). On May 29, 1980, the Commission voted to defer action pending receipt of information solicited in orders to be sent to the respective treasurers of each of these three organizations. On June 2, 1980, the orders were sent. Those addressed to the treasurers of OCDCC and DSCCC apparently were not received. New orders were sent on July 14, 1980. The Office of General Counsel has recently received a response from the Treasurer of UOC. When this response has been analyzed and the other responses have been received we will report further to the Commission.





SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

These matters were generated as the result of information compiled by the Reports Analysis Division during the ordinary course of review of Quarterly Reports submitted by the Orange County Democratic Central Committee (hereinafter "OCDCC"), by the Committee to Re-Elect Patterson, by the Hannaford Re-Election Committee, and by United for Orange County. (See Attachments I-IX.)

Apparent Violations

The Reports Analysis Division has found with regard to the 1978 election cycle

1. that OCDCC violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a by making excessive contributions to the Committee to Re-Elect Patterson to Congress, and to the Hannaford Re-Election Committee and 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) by receiving excessive contributions from the Re-Elect Paul Bell Committee;
2. that several corporate and union contributions were made to OCDCC in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b;

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2. that several corporate and union contributions were made to OCDCC in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b;
3. that an individual contributor violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a by making an excessive contribution to OCDCC;
4. that the Assemblyman Cordova Committee violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433 and 434 by making a contribution to OCDCC without registering with and reporting to the Commission;
5. and that Californians for Brown '78 violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a, 433 and 434 by making excessive contributions to OCDCC and to United for Orange County and by not registering with and reporting to the Commission.

Earlier RTB Findings

As the result of earlier recommendations made directly to the Commission by the Reports Analysis Division, the Commission has already found reason to believe that OCDCC may have violated

1. 2 U.S.C. § 434 by failing adequately to disclose its opening funds and to disclose properly the individuals involved in partnership contributions;
2. 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) by accepting excessive contributions from Californians for Brown '78; and
3. 2 U.S.C. § 441b by accepting contributions from corporations and labor unions.

Upon the recommendation of the Reports Analysis Division, the Commission has also found reason to believe

1. that the Democratic State Central Committee of California violated 2 U.S.C. § 433 by failing to report its affiliation with OCDCC;
2. that United for Orange violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) by accepting excessive contributions from Californians for Brown '78;
3. that the Mobile Home Parks PAC violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433 and 434 by failing to register with and report to the Commission after making contributions to United for Orange County and to two candidates for federal and state office;
4. that the Re-Elect Paul Bell Committee violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433 and 434 by failing to register with and report to the Commission after making contribution to OCDCC;
5. that Round-Up '78 (now the Chairs Committee) violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433 and 434 by failing to register with and report to the Commission after making contributions to OCDCC; and

6. that the Hannaford Re-Election Committee and the Committee to Re-Elect Patterson violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) by accepting excessive contributions from OCDCC.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

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A. MURs 1115, 1117, 1119, 1121 and 1122 have in common the activities and accounts of the Orange County Democratic Central Committee. Although many efforts have been made by the Reports Analysis Division to obtain clear and complete explanations of OCDCC's financial structure and transactions, particularly during 1978, no official, written explanation has been forthcoming. All that is known is that OCDCC has apparently operated with three accounts - a restricted account containing corporate and union monies, a general account, and the "Chairs Committee" account which was established for purposes of segregating proceeds from fundraisers until all expenses for such events had been paid, at which time any remaining proceeds were placed in the general account. OCDCC's reports to the Commission have apparently included the activities of both the general and the restricted accounts. It has not been possible to determine the relationships of these accounts to the OCDCC's federal activity. Nor has it been ascertained into which account the contributions from Californians for Brown '78, the Re-Elect Paul Bell Committee, and the contributions from an individual contributor, Richard J. O'Neill, have been placed.

Californians for Brown '78 insists that its contribution was intended for voter registration/get-out-the-vote activity at the state and local levels. (See Attachment III-b.) However, no information has been supplied in support of an actual division in OCDCC's 1978 activities and accounts between state/local elections and federal elections. In light of the Commission's policy that voter registration/get-out-the-vote activities during a federal election year are to be deemed as having been carried out for purposes of influencing the persons contacted to vote for all candidates of a political party, it can be assumed that a portion of OCDCC's voter registration/get-out-the-vote activities involved federal campaigns. (See AO's 1978-28 and 1978-50).

It is the opinion of the Office of General Counsel that more information is needed from OCDCC before decisions can be made concerning possible violations of the Act by that committee or by Californians for Brown '78, the Assemblyman Cordova Round-Up '78, or by individual, corporate and union contributors. Therefore it is recommended that pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437d(a)(1) an order be issued to OCDCC for answers to the questions attached hereto.

B. MURs 1115, 1118 and 1120 involve the acceptance by the Committee to Re-Elect Patterson to Congress and the Hannaford Re-Election Committee of \$5,000 each in contributions from OCDCC in 1978. On February 28, 1979, upon the recommendation

of the Reports Analysis Division, the Commission found reason to believe that violations of 2 U.S.C. § 441a on the parts of these two candidate committees had occurred.

In response to the RTB finding, these committees and OCDCC have all asserted that OCDCC is a multi-candidate-committee by virtue of affiliation with the California Democratic Party State Central Committee and therefore qualified to make \$5,000 contributions to federal candidates. OCDCC has submitted an amendment to its statement of organization claiming such affiliation. (See Attachment I-f.) However, differing opinions on this issue have been expressed by the former and present treasurers of OCDCC. (See Attachments I-g, h and i.) The State Central Committee has not replied to inquiries as to its agreement or disagreement with OCDCC's claim. Upon the recommendation of the Reports Analysis Division, the Commission on September 13, 1979, found reason to believe that the Democratic State Central Committee's Federal Candidates Fund has violated 2 U.S.C. § 433.

11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii) states that

"(a)11 contributions made by the political committees established, financed, maintained, or controlled by a State party committee and by subordinate State party committees shall be presumed to be made by one political committee."

In the present instance it is unclear, absent confirmation by the California Democratic State Central Committee, whether that committee established, maintains, finances or controls OCDCC. The reports filed by OCDCC do not itemize transfers from the state committee. Therefore, it is the opinion of the Office of General Counsel that additional information is needed before decisions can be made concerning the disposition of MURs 1118 and 1120. It is recommended that any order issued to OCDCC for further information include questions related to that committee's relationship to the California Democratic Party-State Central Committee. Such questions are included in the proposed inquiry attached hereto. It is also recommended that, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437d(a)(1), an order be issued to the California State Central Committee for answers to questions concerning that committee's relationship with OCDCC.

C. MURs 1116 and 1123 involve the activities of United for Orange County, a political committee allegedly unaffiliated with the Orange County Democratic Central Committee. In response to the Commission's findings of reason to believe that this committee may have violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433 and 441a(f), the committee's treasurer has informed the Reports Analysis Division that United for Orange County filed reports with the Commission by mistake. According to the treasurer, its voter registration activities were conducted exclusively at the state and local levels, particularly in support of Governor Brown's state campaign in 1978. Later, in a telegram dated May 21, 1979, and a letter dated March 20, 1980, the treasurer repeated this assertion. He has stated that the Committee's reports are being amended; but no such amendments have been received by the Commission. (See Attachments II-b, c and d.)

- Again, it is the opinion of the Office of General Counsel that additional information is needed concerning the accounts and activities of United for Orange County before decisions can be made concerning possible violations of the Act by this committee, by Mobile Park Homes PAC, by Californians for Brown '78, and by OCDCC. Therefore, the Office of General Counsel recommends that, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437d(a)(1), an order be issued to United for Orange County for answers to the questions attached hereto.

Recommendation

1. Defer action pending receipt of information solicited in the attached Orders.







Jim Kossack of the United for Orange County and the Orange County Democratic Central Committee indicated to me that the people preparing the reports did not know of the requirements concerning segregating income related to federal vs. local elections. He also indicated that amendments will be filed on both these reports to correct this. He emphasized that none of the money expended by our committee was used in any manner for any federal campaign.

The amounts expended by Californians for Brown '78 were intended for, and used for, expenses regarding registration of voters and a "get out the vote" campaign, and both efforts were directed toward state and local candidates. Therefore, Californians for Brown '78 is not liable for filing reports under the Federal Elections Commission.

This letter is prompted by the Commission's interest in assisting candidates and committees who wish to comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act, as amended. During review of the 30 Day Post-Primary Report of Receipts and Expenditures, we noticed an entry indicating that you may have received a contribution which exceeds the limits set forth in the Act. A copy of that portion of your report is attached so that a review of your records can be made.

The Act precludes individuals and political committees, other than multicandidate committees, from making political contributions to a candidate for Federal election in excess of \$1,000 per election. The Act defines a multicandidate committee as one which has been registered for a period of not less than six months; has received contributions from more than fifty persons; and has made contributions to five or more candidates for Federal office. The committee listed as the source of the contribution in question does not presently qualify as a multicandidate committee and we have notified them accordingly. We have recommended that the source committee notify you if it is confirmed that the contribution was in excess of the limits.

The Commission recommends that if you find the contribution you received was in excess of the limits set forth in the Act you return the amount in excess of \$1,000 to the donor. This return should be reported immediately by letter and should be reflected as a contribution refund on your next report of receipts and expenditures. If you find that the entry in question is incomplete or incorrect, please submit a statement which would clarify this particular matter for the public record. You may do so by amending your original report by letter.

Please notify the Commission within fifteen (15) days from the date of this letter of the determination made on this matter. I informed Patterson's staff person that no answer has been received from the committee regarding the \$5,000 contribution from the Orange County Dem Central Committee. I also told him that the last attempt to get in touch with the committee had resulted in the refusal of a certified letter. He will get back to me on the disposition of the Orange County contribution and a change in address for the letter.

Varlyn Jensen, General Counsel for the House Select Committee on Committees, called to find out what Gilbert of Patterson's staff seemed so worried about. Jensen, whose wife is Patterson's new treasurer, had been assured several times by them that the matter was being taken care of. They said that Orange County was affiliated with the State Dem Committee, and that fact had been communicated to the FEC. I told Jensen that we do not have any correspondence indicating any affiliation and that right now his committee is still considered to have received an illegal contribution. He thinks that he is getting caught in the middle of a battle between Orange County and the State committee. He said that he will get on the phone and "shake some feathers" to get the matter straightened out.
