**I. Background/Previous Commission Action**

On October 18, 1983, the Commission found probable cause to believe that Gus Savage for Congress '82 Committee and Thomas J. Savage, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C.

§ 434(a)(2)(A)(iii) by failing to file the July 1982 Quarterly Report, the October 1982 Quarterly Report, and the 1982 Year-End Report; 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i) by failing to file the 12 Day Pre-General Election Report; 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(ii) by failing to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report; and 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(B)(i) by failing to file the 1983 Mid-Year Report. Conciliation was initiated by sending a proposed agreement to Thomas Savage on October 21, 1983.

As of this date, there has been no response to the proposed conciliation agreement. The Office of General Counsel is therefore recommending that the Commission file suit against the Gus Savage for Congress '82 Committee and its treasurer, Thomas J. Savage.



**I. Background**

The Gus Savage for Congress '82 Committee (hereinafter "Committee"), the principal campaign committee supporting Gus Savage in the 1982 General Election and Thomas J. Savage, treasurer of the Committee, failed to file the July Quarterly Report (due July 15, 1982), the October Quarterly Report (due October 15, 1982), the 12 Day Pre-General Election Report (due October 21, 1982), the 30 Day Post-General Election Report (due December 2, 1982), the 1982 Year End Report (due January 31, 1983) and the 1983 Mid-Year Report (due July 31, 1983). The Committee was referred by the Reports Analysis Division to the Office of General Counsel on March 10, 1983, for its failure to file the required reports.

On June 14, 1983, the Commission found reason to believe that the Committee and treasurer Thomas J. Savage violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a). Letters were sent to both the Committee and Thomas Savage notifying them of the Commission's determinations. Neither the Committee nor Mr. Savage responded to the reason to believe notifications.

A letter was received from Congressman Savage which disclosed a new mailing address for the treasurer.

On August 25, 1983, briefs were sent to the Committee and the treasurer. No responses have been filed in reply to the briefs.

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## **II. Legal Analysis**

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

Prior to the due dates for reports, notification was sent by the Commission's Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") of the due dates. Moreover, the Committee has failed to respond to requests for additional information sent out by the Reports Analysis Division.



As the Act holds the treasurer individually responsible for filing reports, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe Thomas J. Savage violated 2 U.S.C. § 434.



Based on information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission, on June 14, 1983, found reason to believe that the Gus Savage for Congress '82 Committee had violated a section of the U.S. Code, and instituted an investigation in this matter.

After considering all the evidence available to the Commission, the Office of General Counsel is prepared to recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred.

Submitted for your review is a brief stating the position of the General Counsel on the legal and factual issues of the case. Within fifteen days of your receipt of this notice, you may file with the Secretary of the Commission a brief (10 copies if possible) stating your position on the issues and replying to the brief of the General Counsel. On June 21, 1982, the committee was notified that a July Quarterly report was due on July 15, 1982 (Attachment 3). The Clerk of the House had not received the report; therefore, on October 28, 1982, the committee was sent notification for its failure to file the report (Attachment 4).

On September 21, 1982, the committee was notified that a quarterly report was due on October 15, 1982 (Attachment 5). On September 27, 1982, the committee was notified that a pre-election report was due on October 21, 1982 (Attachment 6). On October 22, 1982, the committee was sent two mailgrams, one each for failure to file the 1982 October Quarterly and 12 Day Pre-General Election Reports, because the Clerk of the House of Representatives had not received either report (Attachments 7 and 8). On October 29, 1982, the name of the committee was published for failure to file both reports (Attachments 9 and 10).

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The notification that a 30 Day Post-General Election report was due on December 2, 1982, was included with the September 27, 1982, prior notice for the 12 Day Pre-General Election Report (Attachment 6). The committee did not file the post-election report with the Clerk of the House of Representatives; therefore, the committee was notified on January 13, 1983, of its failure to file the report (Attachment 11).

The reports analyst made several attempts to contact the committee's treasurer to discuss the committee's failure to file reports. On January 29, 1983, the treasurer returned the analyst's call. He acknowledged the non-filer notifications were mailed to the proper address and promised to file the reports within a week (Attachment 12). As of this date, the committee has not filed any of the reports.

### July Filing Notice for Authorized Committees

This notice summarizes the reporting obligations of candidate authorized political committees for the Second Quarterly, Semiannual and Monthly Reports of Receipts and Disbursements, to be filed under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

#### WHO FILES

During July, all political committees authorized by Federal candidates are required to file Quarterly, Monthly or Semiannual Reports of Receipts and Disbursements, depending on the type of committee they are. The July reports must disclose all financial activity not previously disclosed, and must be filed regardless of the total amount of financial activity involved during the reporting period. The following paragraphs explain the reporting schedule for the various categories of filers.

#### 1982 House and Senate Candidates

Authorized committees of House and Senate candidates seeking election in 1982 are required to file the Second Quarterly Report by July 15, 1982. The report should cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed or from the date of registration, if this is the committee's first report, through June 30, 1982. Reports mailed first class or delivered by hand must be received no later than the close of business July 15. If sent by registered or certified mail, reports must be postmarked no later than midnight July 15.

#### House and Senate Candidates Seeking Election in Year Other Than 1982

Authorized committees of House and Senate candidates not seeking election in 1982 (i.e., committees authorized by candidates who ran for Federal office prior to 1982 or candidates who are involved in future elections) are required to file a Semiannual Report, due by July 31, 1982, instead of the Second Quarterly Report.

The Semiannual Report should cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed or from the date of registration, if this is the committee's first report, through June 30, 1982. Reports mailed first class or delivered by hand must be received by the close of business July 31. If sent by registered or certified mail, the report must be postmarked no later than midnight July 31.

#### Presidential Committees

Authorized committees of Presidential candidates ~~may choose to file on either a monthly or a quarterly basis in 1982. Their filing options are:~~

- They may file monthly reports during 1982. The monthly report, due by July 20, must cover all activity of the preceding month (June 1-30) or from the registration date, if this is the committee's first report, through June 30, 1982.
- Alternatively, they may report on a quarterly basis. (If they wish to change from a monthly to a quarterly reporting schedule, they are asked to notify the Commission of their intention in writing.) The Second Quarterly Report is due by July 15 and must cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed (or from the registration date, if this is the first report) through June 30, 1982.

NOTE: Authorized Presidential committees may not report on a semiannual basis. 11 CFR 104.5(b)(2).

## WHAT FORM TO USE

## FEC PUBLISHES 3RD QUARTER 1982 NON-FILERS

WASHINGTON — The Federal Election Commission published today the list of candidate committees for 1982 U.S. Senate and House campaigns which failed to file the required third quarter financial disclosure reports.

Only those candidates involved in the November general election were included in the group of candidate committees considered for publication.

A total of 5 House campaigns from 4 different states failed to meet the filing requirement for the quarterly report due October 15. The reports were to have included activity from July 1, 1982, (or later for those involved in late primaries) through September 30, 1982.

If mailed by regular mail, or if hand-delivered, the reports should have been received by close of business on October 15. If sent by registered or certified mail, the reports must have been postmarked by midnight October 15.

All committees of candidates involved in the November 2-election were notified approximately 25 days in advance of the due date of the report. Those whose reports had not been received by October 22 were again notified by mailgram that their reports were not in.

The 1979 Amendments to the Federal Election Campaign Act specify that the FEC publish only those committees authorized by candidates to raise and spend money on their behalf. Therefore, this list does not include other political committees which may have been required to file.

In addition, individuals register as candidates only after they have raised or spent in excess of \$5,000. Prior to reaching that threshold, no registration or reporting is required. Therefore, some individuals whose names appear on state ballots may have no filing obligations.

Further Commission action against non-filers and late filers will be decided on a case-by-case basis, depending on the amount of financial activity involved, the percent of vote received and/or the lateness of the report. The Federal Election Campaign Act gives the Commission broad authority to initiate enforcement actions, including civil court enforcement and the imposition of civil penalties (\$5,000 for any violation and \$10,000 for any knowing and willful

## U.S. SENATE AND HOUSE CAMPAIGNS FAIL TO FILE PRE-GENERAL ELECTION REPORTS

WASHINGTON — 21 House campaigns and 1 Senate committee have failed to meet the October 21 deadline for filing 12-day pre-general election reports of receipts and expenditures.

Provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act require that committees supporting candidates seeking U.S. House and Senate seats in the November 2 general election file a report of all financial activity 12 days prior to the election.

The report was to include financial activity occurring from October 1 through October 13. If sent certified or registered mail, the report should have been postmarked by October 18. Otherwise, the due date was October 21.

Some individuals and their committees have no obligation to file reports under federal election law, even though their names may appear on general election ballots. If an individual and his or her campaign committee raise or spend less than \$5,000, the individual is not considered a "candidate" under the Federal Election Campaign Act, and neither the individual nor the committee has to register.

The Commission notified the committees of all candidates for the general election of their potential filing requirements 25 days prior to the due date. Those committees which did not file on the due date were notified on October 22 that their reports had not been received and that their names would be published for failure to file if they did not respond within 4 business days.

The Commission publishes only the names of those committees which have been designated by candidates as their principal campaign committees. Under Amendments to the Federal Election Campaign Act, effective January 8, 1980, candidates no longer are required to file personal reports of receipts and expenditures. All such information is reported by authorized committees of the candidates.

Other political committees supporting House and Senate candidates in the general election (those which are not authorized units of a candidate's campaign) also are required to file pre- and post-general election reports. Those committee names are not published by the FEC.

Further Commission action against non-filers and late filers will be decided on a case-by-case basis, depending on the amount of financial activity involved, the percent of vote received and/or the lateness of the report. The election law gives the Commission broad authority to initiate enforcement actions, including civil court enforcement and the imposition of civil penalties (\$5,000 for "any violation" and \$10,000 for any "knowing and willful" violation) for infractions of the law, including failure to file required disclosure reports.

The next report for all candidates' committees (those involved in the general election) will be the post-general election report - on December 2. The report will cover activity from October 14 through November 22, 1982. The year-end report for activity through December 31, 1982, will be due January 31, 1983.

The Gus Savage '82 Committee was referred by the Reports Analysis Division because it failed to file reports of receipts and disbursements during 1982. <sup>1/</sup>

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October 15, 1982), the 12 Day Pre General Election (due October 21, 1982), and the 30 Day Post-General Election (due December 2, 1982) Reports for 1982. Prior to the due dates for reports, notification was sent by RAD of the due dates. After the due dates the Committee was notified of its failure to file a report.

The pre-notification of the due date and notification of failure to file were sent on the following dates:

At that time he acknowledged that the non-filer notifications were mailed to the proper address and he promised to file the reports within a week.

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(See Attachment 1 page 22). As of the referral date, the Committee has not filed any of the reports.

The candidate's 1980 principal campaign committee was also referred to the Office of General Counsel on March 24, 1981, for failure to file the 1980 April 15 Quarterly and the 1980 30 Day Post-General Election Reports. However, on June 15, 1981, the Commission voted to take no action on the matter.

OGC ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 434a(2)(A) requires that the treasurer of a political committee file reports of receipts and disbursements. The Gus Savage for Congress '82 has failed to file the necessary reports with the Commission. Specifically, the Committee has not filed the July 1982 Quarterly, the October 1982 Quarterly, the 12 Day Pre-General Election the 30 Day Post-General Election and the 1982 Year End Report.

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The Committee has clearly violated the Act in a continuous and consistent manner, therefore, the Office of General Counsel recommends that a MUR be opened.

RECOMMENDATION:

Open a MUR.

## Failure to File Reports of Receipts and Disbursements

The Gus Savage for Congress '82 committee, the principal campaign committee supporting Gus Savage in the 1982 General Election, failed to file the July Quarterly, the October Quarterly, the 12 Day Pre-General Election and 30 Day Post-General Election Reports for 1982. Mr. Savage won the general election with 87 percent of the vote (Attachment 2).

On June 21, 1982, the committee was notified that a July Quarterly report was due on July 15, 1982 (Attachment 3). The Clerk of the House had not received the report; therefore, on October 28, 1982, the committee was sent notification for its failure to file the report (Attachment 4).

On September 21, 1982, the committee was notified that a quarterly report was due on October 15, 1982 (Attachment 5). On September 27, 1982, the committee was notified that a pre-election report was due on October 21, 1982 (Attachment 6). On October 22, 1982, the committee was sent two mailgrams, one each for failure to file the 1982 October Quarterly and 12 Day Pre-General Election Reports, because the Clerk of the House of Representatives had not received either report (Attachments 7 and 8). On October 29, 1982, the name of the committee was published for failure to file both reports (Attachments 9 and 10).

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The notification that a 30 Day Post-General Election report was due on December 2, 1982, was included with the September 27, 1982, prior notice for the 12 Day Pre-General Election Report (Attachment 6). The committee did not file the post-election report with the Clerk of the House of Representatives; therefore, the committee was notified on January 13, 1983, of its failure to file the report (Attachment 11).

The reports analyst made several attempts to contact the committee's treasurer to discuss the committee's failure to file reports. On January 29, 1983, the treasurer returned the analyst's call. He acknowledged the non-filer notifications were mailed to the proper address and promised to file the reports within a week (Attachment 12). As of this date, the committee has not filed any of the reports.

**July Filing Notice for Authorized Committees**

This notice summarizes the reporting obligations of candidate authorized political committees for the Second Quarterly, Semiannual and Monthly Reports of Receipts and Disbursements, to be filed under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

**WHO FILES**

During July, all political committees authorized by Federal candidates are required to file Quarterly, Monthly or Semiannual Reports of Receipts and Disbursements, depending on the type of committee they are. The July reports must disclose all financial activity not previously disclosed, and must be filed regardless of the total amount of financial activity involved during the reporting period. The following paragraphs explain the reporting schedule for the various categories of filers.

**1982 House and Senate Candidates**

Authorized committees of House and Senate candidates seeking election in 1982 are required to file the Second Quarterly Report by July 15, 1982. The report should cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed or from the date of registration, if this is the committee's first report, through June 30, 1982. Reports mailed first class or delivered by hand must be received no later than the close of business July 15. If sent by registered or certified mail, reports must be postmarked no later than midnight July 15.

**House and Senate Candidates Seeking Election in Year Other Than 1982**

Authorized committees of House and Senate candidates not seeking election in 1982 (i.e., committees authorized by candidates who ran for Federal office prior to 1982 or candidates who are involved in future elections) are required to file a Semiannual Report, due by July 31, 1982, instead of the Second Quarterly Report.

The Semiannual Report should cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed or from the date of registration, if this is the committee's first report, through June 30, 1982. Reports mailed first class or delivered by hand must be received by the close of business July 31. If sent by registered or certified mail, the report must be postmarked no later than midnight July 31.

**Presidential Committees**

Authorized committees of Presidential candidates may choose to file on either a monthly or a quarterly basis in 1982. Their filing options are:

- They may file monthly reports during 1982. The monthly report, due by July 20, must cover all activity of the preceding month (June 1-30) or from the registration date, if this is the committee's first report, through June 30, 1982.
- Alternatively, they may report on a quarterly basis. (If they wish to change from a monthly to a quarterly reporting schedule, they are asked to notify the Commission of their intention in writing.) The Second Quarterly Report is due by July 15 and must cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed (or from the registration date, if this is the first report) through June 30, 1982.

**NOTE:** Authorized Presidential committees may not report on a semiannual basis. 11 CFR 104.5(b)(2).

**October Filing Notice for Authorized Committees**

This notice summarizes the reporting obligations of candidate\* authorized political committees for the Third Quarterly Report of Receipts and Disbursements, to be filed under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

**WHO FILES**

Authorized committees of House and Senate candidates seeking election in 1982 and authorized committees of Presidential candidates are required to file the Third Quarterly Report by October 15, 1982. The report should cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed or from the date of registration, if this is the committee's first report, through September 30, 1982. The reports must disclose all financial activity not previously disclosed, and must be filed regardless of the total amount of financial activity involved during the reporting period. Reports mailed first class or hand delivered must be received no later than the close of business October 15. If sent by registered or certified mail, reports must be postmarked no later than midnight October 15.

**WHO NEED NOT FILE THE THIRD QUARTERLY REPORT**

Authorized committees of House and Senate candidates not seeking election in 1982 (i.e., committees authorized by candidates who ran for Federal office

prior to 1982 or candidates who are involved in future elections) are not required to file a Third Quarterly Report. These committees will be required to file a Year-End Report due January 31, 1983.

**WHAT FORM TO USE**

All authorized committees of House and Senate candidates should use FEC Form 3 with appropriate schedules for filing the Third Quarterly Report. Presidential candidate committees file their reports on FEC Form 3P. Authorized committees, other than the principal campaign committee, should file their reports with the principal campaign committee. The principal campaign committee, in turn, files a consolidated form (FEC Form 32, or 3P2 in the case of Presidential committees), together with its own report and the reports of the authorized committees, with the appropriate Federal and State offices.

\*For purposes of the Act, A "candidate" is an individual who seeks nomination for election, or election, to Federal office, and who has:

1. Received contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 or has made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000; OR
2. Given his or her consent to another person to receive contributions or make expenditures on behalf of such individual and such person has received contributions or made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000.

The Pre-General and Post-General Election Reports must include all reportable transactions of the principal campaign committee and any other authorized committee(s) together with any activity of the candidate and must be filed by October 21, 1982, and December 2, 1982, respectively. These reports must disclose all financial activity not previously disclosed, and must be filed regardless of the total amount of financial activity undertaken during the reporting periods. All campaign-related activity of the candidate (including contributions received, loans received or made, and disbursements made) is considered to be activity undertaken as an agent of the candidate's authorized committee(s) and must be reported by the authorized committee(s).

#### DATE DUE

The Pre-General Election Report must be hand-delivered or received by first class mail at the appropriate filing office no later than close of business October 21, 1982. Reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight October 18, 1982.

The Post-General Election Report must be hand-delivered or received by first class mail at the appropriate filing office by close of business December 2, 1982. Reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight December 2, 1982.

\*For purposes of the Act, a "candidate" is an individual who seeks nomination for election, or election, to Federal office, and who has:

1. Received contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 or has made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000; OR
2. Given his or her consent to another person to receive contributions or make expenditures on behalf of such individual and such person has received contributions or made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000.

## FEC PUBLISHES 3RD QUARTER 1982 NON-FILERS

WASHINGTON — The Federal Election Commission published today the list of candidate committees for 1982 U.S. Senate and House campaigns which failed to file the required third quarter financial disclosure reports.

Only those candidates involved in the November general election were included in the group of candidate committees considered for publication.

A total of 5 House campaigns from 4 different states failed to meet the filing requirement for the quarterly report due October 15. The reports were to have included activity from July 1, 1982, (or later for those involved in late primaries) through September 30, 1982.

If mailed by regular mail, or if hand-delivered, the reports should have been received by close of business on October 15. If sent by registered or certified mail, the reports must have been postmarked by midnight October 15.

All committees of candidates involved in the November 2 election were notified approximately 25 days in advance of the due date of the report. Those whose reports had not been received by October 22 were again notified by mailgram that their reports were not in.

The 1979 Amendments to the Federal Election Campaign Act specify that the FEC publish only those committees authorized by candidates to raise and spend money on their behalf. Therefore, this list does not include other political committees which may have been required to file.

In addition, individuals register as candidates only after they have raised or spent in excess of \$5,000. Prior to reaching that threshold, no registration or reporting is required. Therefore, some individuals whose names appear on state ballots may have no filing obligations.

Further Commission action against non-filers and late filers will be decided on a case-by-case basis, depending on the amount of financial activity involved, the percent of vote received and/or the lateness of the report. The Federal Election Campaign Act gives the Commission broad authority to initiate enforcement actions, including civil court enforcement and the imposition of civil penalties (\$5,000 for any violation and \$10,000 for any knowing and willful



## U.S. SENATE AND HOUSE CAMPAIGNS FAIL TO FILE PRE-GENERAL ELECTION REPORTS

WASHINGTON — 21 House campaigns and 1 Senate committee have failed to meet the October 21 deadline for filing 12-day pre-general election reports of receipts and expenditures.

Provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act require that committees supporting candidates seeking U.S. House and Senate seats in the November 2 general election file a report of all financial activity 12 days prior to the election.

The report was to include financial activity occurring from October 1 through October 13. If sent certified or registered mail, the report should have been postmarked by October 18. Otherwise, the due date was October 21.

Some individuals and their committees have no obligation to file reports under federal election law, even though their names may appear on general election ballots. If an individual and his or her campaign committee raise or spend less than \$5,000, the individual is not considered a "candidate" under the Federal Election Campaign Act, and neither the individual nor the committee has to register.

The Commission notified the committees of all candidates for the general election of their potential filing requirements 25 days prior to the due date. Those committees which did not file on the due date were notified on October 22 that their reports had not been received and that their names would be published for failure to file if they did not respond within 4 business days.

The Commission publishes only the names of those committees which have been designated by candidates as their principal campaign committees. Under Amendments to the Federal Election Campaign Act, effective January 8, 1980, candidates no longer are required to file personal reports of receipts and expenditures. All such information is reported by authorized committees of the candidates.

Other political committees supporting House and Senate candidates in the general election (those which are not authorized units of a candidate's campaign) also are required to file pre- and post-general election reports. Those committee names are not published by the FEC.

Further Commission action against non-filers and late filers will be decided on a case-by-case basis, depending on the amount of financial activity involved, the percent of vote received and/or the lateness of the report. The election law gives the Commission broad authority to initiate enforcement actions, including civil court enforcement and the imposition of civil penalties (\$5,000 for "any violation" and \$10,000 for any "knowing and willful" violation) for infractions of the law, including failure to file required disclosure reports.

The next report for all candidates' committees (those involved in the general election) will be the post-general election report - on December 2. The report will cover activity from October 14 through November 22, 1982. The year-end report for activity through December 31, 1982, will be due January 31, 1983.

## Failure to File Reports of Receipts and Disbursements

The Gus Savage for Congress '82 committee, the principal campaign committee supporting Gus Savage in the 1982 General Election, failed to file the July Quarterly, the October Quarterly, the 12 Day Pre-General Election and 30 Day Post-General Election Reports for 1982. Mr. Savage won the general election with 87 percent of the vote (Attachment 2).

On June 21, 1982, the committee was notified that a July Quarterly report was due on July 15, 1982 (Attachment 3). The Clerk of the House had not received the report; therefore, on October 28, 1982, the committee was sent notification for its failure to file the report (Attachment 4).

On September 21, 1982, the committee was notified that a quarterly report was due on October 15, 1982 (Attachment 5). On September 27, 1982, the committee was notified that a pre-election report was due on October 21, 1982 (Attachment 6). On October 22, 1982, the committee was sent two mailgrams, one each for failure to file the 1982 October Quarterly and 12 Day Pre-General Election Reports, because the Clerk of the House of Representatives had not received either report (Attachments 7 and 8). On October 29, 1982, the name of the committee was published for failure to file both reports (Attachments 9 and 10).

The notification that a 30 Day Post-General Election report was due on December 2, 1982, was included with the September 27, 1982, prior notice for the 12 Day Pre-General Election Report (Attachment 6). The committee did not file the post-election report with the Clerk of the House of Representatives; therefore, the committee was notified on January 13, 1983, of its failure to file the report (Attachment 11).

The reports analyst made several attempts to contact the committee's treasurer to discuss the committee's failure to file reports. On January 29, 1983, the treasurer returned the analyst's call. He acknowledged the non-filer notifications were mailed to the proper address and promised to file the reports within a week (Attachment 12). As of this date, the committee has not filed any of the reports.

**July Filing Notice for Authorized Committees**

This notice summarizes the reporting obligations of candidate authorized political committees for the Second Quarterly, Semiannual and Monthly Reports of Receipts and Disbursements, to be filed under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

**WHO FILES**

During July, all political committees authorized by Federal candidates are required to file Quarterly, Monthly or Semiannual Reports of Receipts and Disbursements, depending on the type of committee they are. The July reports must disclose all financial activity not previously disclosed, and must be filed regardless of the total amount of financial activity involved during the reporting period. The following paragraphs explain the reporting schedule for the various categories of filers.

**1982 House and Senate Candidates**

Authorized committees of House and Senate candidates seeking election in 1982 are required to file the Second Quarterly Report by July 15, 1982. The report should cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed or from the date of registration, if this is the committee's first report, through June 30, 1982. Reports mailed first class or delivered by hand must be received no later than the close of business July 15. If sent by registered or certified mail, reports must be postmarked no later than midnight July 15.

**House and Senate Candidates Seeking Election in Year Other Than 1982**

Authorized committees of House and Senate candidates not seeking election in 1982 (i.e., committees authorized by candidates who ran for Federal office prior to 1982 or candidates who are involved in future elections) are required to file a Semiannual Report, due by July 31, 1982, instead of the Second Quarterly Report.

The Semiannual Report should cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed or from the date of registration, if this is the committee's first report, through June 30, 1982. Reports mailed first class or delivered by hand must be received by the close of business July 31. If sent by registered or certified mail, the report must be postmarked no later than midnight July 31.

**Presidential Committees**

Authorized committees of Presidential candidates may choose to file on either a monthly or a quarterly basis in 1982. Their filing options are:

- They may file monthly reports during 1982. The monthly report, due by July 20, must cover all activity of the preceding month (June 1-30) or from the registration date, if this is the committee's first report, through June 30, 1982.
- Alternatively, they may report on a quarterly basis. (If they wish to change from a monthly to a quarterly reporting schedule, they are asked to notify the Commission of their intention in writing.) The Second Quarterly Report is due by July 15 and must cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed (or from the registration date, if this is the first report) through June 30, 1982.

**NOTE:** Authorized Presidential committees may not report on a semiannual basis. 11 CFR 104.5(b)(2).

**October Filing Notice for Authorized Committees**

This notice summarizes the reporting obligations of candidate\* authorized political committees for the Third Quarterly Report of Receipts and Disbursements, to be filed under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

**WHO FILES**

Authorized committees of House and Senate candidates seeking election in 1982 and authorized committees of Presidential candidates are required to file the Third Quarterly Report by October 15, 1982. The report should cover all activity from the closing date of the last report filed or from the date of registration, if this is the committee's first report, through September 30, 1982. The reports must disclose all financial activity not previously disclosed, and must be filed regardless of the total amount of financial activity involved during the reporting period. Reports mailed first class or hand delivered must be received no later than the close of business October 15. If sent by registered or certified mail, reports must be postmarked no later than midnight October 15.

**WHO NEED NOT FILE THE THIRD QUARTERLY REPORT**

Authorized committees of House and Senate candidates not seeking election in 1982 (i.e., committees authorized by candidates who ran for Federal office

prior to 1982 or candidates who are involved in future elections) are not required to file a Third Quarterly Report. These committees will be required to file a Year-End Report due January 31, 1983.

**WHAT FORM TO USE**

All authorized committees of House and Senate candidates should use FEC Form 3 with appropriate schedules for filing the Third Quarterly Report. Presidential candidate committees file their reports on FEC Form 3P. Authorized committees, other than the principal campaign committee, should file their reports with the principal campaign committee. The principal campaign committee, in turn, files a consolidated form (FEC Form 3Z, or 3PZ in the case of Presidential committees), together with its own report and the reports of the authorized committees, with the appropriate Federal and State offices.

\*For purposes of the Act, A "candidate" is an individual who seeks nomination for election, or election, to Federal office, and who has:

1. Received contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 or has made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000; OR
2. Given his or her consent to another person to receive contributions or make expenditures on behalf of such individual and such person has received contributions or made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000.

These reports must disclose all financial activity not previously disclosed, and must be filed regardless of the total amount of financial activity undertaken during the reporting periods. All campaign-related activity of the candidate (including contributions received, loans received or made, and disbursements made) is considered to be activity undertaken as an agent of the candidate's authorized committee(s) and must be reported by the authorized committee(s).

#### DATE DUE

The Pre-General Election Report must be hand-delivered or received by first class mail at the appropriate filing office no later than close of business **October 21, 1982**. Reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight **October 18, 1982**.

The Post-General Election Report must be hand-delivered or received by first class mail at the appropriate filing office by close of business **December 2, 1982**. Reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight **December 2, 1982**.

\*For purposes of the Act, a "candidate" is an individual who seeks nomination for election, or election, to Federal office, and who has:

1. Received contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 or has made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000; OR

## FEC PUBLISHES 3RD QUARTER 1982 NON-FILERS

WASHINGTON — The Federal Election Commission published today the list of candidate committees for 1982 U.S. Senate and House campaigns which failed to file the required third quarter financial disclosure reports.

Only those candidates involved in the November general election were included in the group of candidate committees considered for publication.

A total of 5 House campaigns from 4 different states failed to meet the filing requirement for the quarterly report due October 15. The reports were to have included activity from July 1, 1982, (or later for those involved in late primaries) through September 30, 1982.

If mailed by regular mail, or if hand-delivered, the reports should have been received by close of business on October 15. If sent by registered or certified mail, the reports must have been postmarked by midnight October 15.

All committees of candidates involved in the November 2 election were notified approximately 25 days in advance of the due date of the report. Those whose reports had not been received by October 22 were again notified by mailgram that their reports were not in.

The 1979 Amendments to the Federal Election Campaign Act specify that the FEC publish only those committees authorized by candidates to raise and spend money on their behalf. Therefore, this list does not include other political committees which may have been required to file.

In addition, individuals register as candidates only after they have raised or spent in excess of \$5,000. Prior to reaching that threshold, no registration or reporting is required. Therefore, some individuals whose names appear on state ballots may have no filing obligations.

Further Commission action against non-filers and late filers will be decided on a case-by-case basis, depending on the amount of financial activity involved, the percent of vote received and/or the lateness of the report. The Federal Election Campaign Act gives the Commission broad authority to initiate enforcement actions, including civil court enforcement and the imposition of civil penalties (\$5,000 for any violation and \$10,000 for any knowing and willful

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violation) for infractions of the law, including failure to file required disclosure reports.

## U.S. SENATE AND HOUSE CAMPAIGNS FAIL TO FILE PRE-GENERAL ELECTION REPORTS

WASHINGTON — 21 House campaigns and 1 Senate committee have failed to meet the October 21 deadline for filing 12-day pre-general election reports of receipts and expenditures.

Provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act require that committees supporting candidates seeking U.S. House and Senate seats in the November 2 general election file a report of all financial activity 12 days prior to the election.

The report was to include financial activity occurring from October 1 through October 13. If sent certified or registered mail, the report should have been postmarked by October 18. Otherwise, the due date was October 21.

Some individuals and their committees have no obligation to file reports under federal election law, even though their names may appear on general election ballots. If an individual and his or her campaign committee raise or spend less than \$5,000, the individual is not considered a "candidate" under the Federal Election Campaign Act, and neither the individual nor the committee has to register.

The Commission notified the committees of all candidates for the general election of their potential filing requirements 25 days prior to the due date. Those committees which did not file on the due date were notified on October 22 that their reports had not been received and that their names would be published for failure to file if they did not respond within 4 business days.

The Commission publishes only the names of those committees which have been designated by candidates as their principal campaign committees. Under Amendments to the Federal Election Campaign Act, effective January 8, 1980, candidates no longer are required to file personal reports of receipts and expenditures. All such information is reported by authorized committees of the candidates.

Other political committees supporting House and Senate candidates in the general election (those which are not authorized units of a candidate's campaign) also are required to file pre- and post-general election reports. Those committee names are not published by the FEC.

Further Commission action against non-filers and late filers will be decided on a case-by-case basis, depending on the amount of financial activity involved, the percent of vote received and/or the lateness of the report. The election law gives the Commission broad authority to initiate enforcement actions, including civil court enforcement and the imposition of civil penalties (\$5,000 for "any violation" and \$10,000 for any "knowing and willful" violation) for infractions of the law, including failure to file required disclosure reports.

The next report for all candidates' committees (those involved in the general election) will be the post-general election report - on December 2. The report will cover activity from October 14 through November 22, 1982. The year-end report for activity through December 31, 1982, will be due January 31, 1983.

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After several attempts to contact the current treasurer of the campaign committee, I was able to leave a message on January 27, 1983 asking for a return call from Tom Savage. Mr. Tom Savage contacted me on January 29, 1983. He informed me that he had no idea that the committee was delinquent on their filing for the past four reports although he acknowledged that the non-filer notices were mailed to the proper address. He assured me that the committee would file the reports within the week.
