
Dear Mr. Zeh:

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its statutory responsibilities. Reason to believe has been found that Respondents Mary Gojack for Congress Committee and Shirley M. LeGoy, as treasurer of the Committee, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i) by not timely filing the 12 Day Pre-General Election Report.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondents, having participated in informal methods of conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondents, and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(A)(i).

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

VI. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent Mary Gojack for Congress Committee was the principal campaign committee for Mary Gojack.

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2. Respondent Shirley M. LeGoy is the treasurer of the Committee.

3. Respondents were required to file the 12 Day Pre-General Election Report for 1982 on October 21, 1982.

4. The report was not filed until December 7, 1982, 47 days late.

V. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(1)(A)(i) a political committee of a candidate for the House of Representatives, through its treasurer, is required to file a pre-election report no later than 12 days before any election in which such candidate is seeking election.

VI. By failing to timely file the 12 Day Pre-General Election Report, the Respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i). Respondents contend that this was not a knowing and willful violation.

VII. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VIII. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any of its requirements has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

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
IX. This agreement shall become effective as of the date all of the parties have executed the same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

X. Compliance with ^{all of the (C's)} terms of this agreement is met upon payment of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250), the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged.







On September 30, 1983, the Commission determined that there is reason to believe that respondents Mary Gojack for Congress Committee ("the Committee") and Shirley M. LeGoy, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i) by not timely filing the 12 Day Pre-General Election Report due on October 21, 1982. The Commission's finding was based on the fact that the Committee failed to file the report until December 7, 1982.

On October 3, 1983, notification of the Commission's finding was mailed to the Mary Gojack for Congress Committee and Shirley M. LeGoy, as treasurer. On October 26, 1983, Joan Crews, the campaign manager, called this office to explain that she had just received the RTB finding because the Committee's post office box had been terminated earlier. On November 7, 1983, Charles Zeh called to inform this office that he was representing the Committee and Shirley M. LeGoy. He was requested to have his clients send a Designation of Counsel Statement. Mr. Zeh states that he sent the Designation of Counsel Statement and a request for pre-probable cause conciliation shortly after November 7, 1983. This office never received that mailing. On December 6, 1983, this office sent the respondents and Mr. Zeh copies of the General Counsel's Brief recommending that the Commission find probable cause to believe that respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i). Copies of the brief were also circulated to the Commission. On December 8, 1983, Mr. Zeh, by phone, requested that this office send him another Designation of Counsel form and again indicated that his clients desired to conciliate the

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matter. This office responded to his request for another Statement on December 13, 1983. A December 21, 1983, letter from Mr. Zeh reiterated the desire to conciliate and his representation of the respondents (Attachment I). On January 17, 1983, this office received from Mr. Zeh a letter and a Designation of Counsel Statement signed and dated by Mary Gajack and Shirley M. LeGoy, but without the name, address or telephone number of counsel filled out - an apparent oversight. The January 17, 1983, letter again reaffirmed respondents' desire to conciliate prior to a finding of probable cause to believe (Attachment II).

It appears that respondents have made several sincere attempts to enter into conciliation negotiations prior to a finding of probable cause to believe. It further appears that their written requests for such conciliation failed to reach the Commission through no fault of respondents. In view of those factors, the Office of the General Counsel recommends that the Commission enter into informal conciliation negotiations with respondents. Attached for the Commission's approval is a conciliation agreement that the Office of the General Counsel recommends be sent to the respondents.

Recommendation

1. Approve the attached proposed conciliation agreement.
2. Approve the attached letter.





Based on information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission, on September 30, 1983, found reason to believe that your clients, Mary Gojack for Congress Committee and Shirley M. LeGoy, as treasurer, had violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) (2)(A)(i), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act ("the Act"), and instituted an investigation in this matter.

After considering all the evidence available to the Commission, the Office of the General Counsel is prepared to recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred.

Submitted for your review is a brief stating the position of the General Counsel on the legal and factual issues of the case. Within fifteen days of your receipt of this notice, you may file with the Secretary of the Commission a brief (10 copies if possible) stating your position on the issues and replying to the brief of the General Counsel. (Three copies of such brief should also be forwarded to the Office of General Counsel, if possible.) The General Counsel's brief and any brief that you may submit will be considered by the Commission before proceeding to a vote of probable cause to believe a violation has occurred.

If you are unable to file a responsive brief within 15 days, you may submit a written request to the Commission for an extension of time in which to file a brief. The Commission will not grant any extensions beyond 20 days.



I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE

84040472411
Mary Gojack for Congress Committee ("the Committee"), Ms. Gojack's principal campaign committee for the general election, and Shirley M. LeGoy, as treasurer of the Committee, failed to file timely the 1982 12 Day Pre-General Election Report (47 days late). The Commission published the name of the Committee on October 29, 1982, for failure to file the report with the Clerk of the House of Representatives. The Committee did file the report on December 7, 1982. */

On September 29, 1983, the Commission found reason to believe that the Mary Gojack for Congress Committee and Shirley M. LeGoy, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i) by not timely filing the 12 Day Pre-General Election Report. The Committee did not respond to the Commission's reason to believe finding.

(A) in any calendar year during which there is a regularly scheduled election for which such candidate is seeking election, or nomination for election, the treasurer shall file the following reports:

(i) a pre-election report, which shall be filed no later than the 12th day before (or posted by registered or certified mail no later than the 15 day before) any election in which such candidate is seeking election, or nomination for election, and which shall be complete as of the 20th day before such election;



OGC ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i) requires that the treasurer of the principal campaign committee of a candidate for the House of Representatives file a pre-election report by the 12th day before an election. Since there was approximately a one and a half month interval between the due date and the actual filing date of the report, it appears the Committee is in violation of Section 434(a)(2)(A)(i) and this matter involved a pre-election report concerning substantial activity. Thus, this office recommends that a MUR be opened.

U.S. SENATE AND HOUSE CAMPAIGNS FAIL TO FILE PRE-GENERAL ELECTION REPORTS

WASHINGTON — 21 House campaigns and 1 Senate committee have failed to meet the October 21 deadline for filing 12-day pre-general election reports of receipts and expenditures.

Provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act require that committees supporting candidates seeking U.S. House and Senate seats in the November 2 general election file a report of all financial activity 12 days prior to the election.

The report was to include financial activity occurring from October 1 through October 13. If sent certified or registered mail, the report should have been postmarked by October 18. Otherwise, the due date was October 21.

Some individuals and their committees have no obligation to file reports under federal election law, even though their names may appear on general election ballots. If an individual and his or her campaign committee raise or spend less than \$5,000, the individual is not considered a "candidate" under the Federal Election Campaign Act, and neither the individual nor the committee has to register.

The Commission notified the committees of all candidates for the general election of their potential filing requirements 25 days prior to the due date. Those committees which did not file on the due date were notified on October 22 that their reports had not been received and that their names would be published for failure to file if they did not respond within 4 business days.

The Commission publishes only the names of those committees which have been designated by candidates as their principal campaign committees. Under Amendments to the Federal Election Campaign Act, effective January 8, 1980, candidates no longer are required to file personal reports of receipts and expenditures. All such information is reported by authorized committees of the candidates.

Other political committees supporting House and Senate candidates in the general election (those which are not authorized units of a candidate's campaign) also are required to file pre- and post-general election reports. Those committee names are not published by the FEC.

Further Commission action against non-filers and late filers will be decided on a case-by-case basis, depending on the amount of financial activity involved, the percent of votes received and/or the lateness of the report. The election law gives the Commission broad authority to initiate enforcement actions, including civil court enforcement and the imposition of civil penalties (\$5,000 for "any violation" and \$10,000 for any "knowing and willful" violation) for infractions of the law, including failure to file required disclosure reports.

The next report for all candidates' committees (those involved in the general election) will be the post-general election report - on December 2. The report will cover activity from October 14 through November 22, 1982. The year-end report for activity through December 31, 1982, will be due January 31, 1983.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

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Mary Gojack for Congress Committee ("the Committee") was the principal campaign committee of Mary Gojack for the 1982 general election. Shirley M. LeGoy is the treasurer of the Committee. The Reports Analysis Division notified the Committee on September 27, 1982, that the Twelve-Day Pre-General Election Report would be due on October 21, 1982. The Committee and the treasurer failed to timely file the Twelve-Day Pre-General Election Report. The Commission published the name of the Committee on October 29, 1982, for failure to file the report with the Clerk of the House of Representatives. The Committee did file the report on December 7, 1982.

FACTUAL BASIS AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i) requires the principal campaign committee of a candidate for the House of Representatives, through its treasurer, to file a pre-election report by the 12th day before an election. Since there was approximately a one and a half month interval between the due date and the actual filing

date of the report, the Committee and Shirley LeGoy, as treasurer of the Committee, are in violation of Section 434(a)(2)(A)(i).

The Office of the General Counsel notes the following compounding factors in its review of this MUR:

- 1) The report was a pre-election report.
- 2) The Committee had substantial financial activity of approximately one-quarter of a million dollars over a year period.
- 3) Forty-two days is not a reasonable length of delay.

Accordingly, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that the Mary Gojack for Congress Committee and Shirley M. LeGoy, as treasurer of the Committee, have violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i).

SUMMARY OF RAD ACTIONS

Referral category 1: (failure to timely file reports pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434)

Mary Gojack for Congress Committee is the principal campaign committee for the 1982 General Election of Mary Gojack. The Reports Analysis Division notified the Committee on September 27, 1982 that the Twelve-Day Pre-General Election Report would be due on October 21, 1982. The Committee failed to timely file the Twelve-Day Pre-General Election Report. The Commission published the name of the Committee on October 29, 1982 for failure to file the report with the Clerk of the House of Representatives. The Committee did file the report on December 7, 1982.

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Mary Gojack in a three-way contest lost the general election; she obtained 41.3 percent of the vote.

It should be noted that the Reports Analysis Division referred the Committee to the Audit Division for a potential audit; however, the Commission declined to initiate an audit.

The Committee has been responsive to requests for additional information. Additionally, Mary Gojack has stated that the Committee had not received the mailgram notification of the due date for the Twelve-Day Pre-General Election Report and had filed the report as soon as possible upon learning of the time to file, (the time lapse between notification of late filing and filing of report was 42 days).

OGC ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i) requires that the treasurer of the principal campaign committee of a candidate for the House of Representatives file a pre-election report by the 12th day before an election. Since there was approximately a one and a half month interval between the due date and the actual filing date of the report, it appears the Committee is in violation of Section 434(a)(2)(A)(i) and this matter involved a pre-election report concerning substantial activity. Thus, this office recommends that a MUR be opened.

Open a MUR.

Committees must submit legible reports which can be reproduced clearly. Illegible documents will not be accepted as reports, and committees filing such documents will be required to refile.

Please peel off the label on the envelope used for this mailing and place it on the front of the reporting form. This will assist the Commission in the identification of the committee filing the report.

U.S. SENATE AND HOUSE CAMPAIGNS FAIL TO FILE PRE-GENERAL ELECTION REPORTS

WASHINGTON — 21 House campaigns and 1 Senate committee have failed to meet the October 21 deadline for filing 12-day pre-general election reports of receipts and expenditures.

Provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act require that committees supporting candidates seeking U.S. House and Senate seats in the November 2 general election file a report of all financial activity 12 days prior to the election.

The report was to include financial activity occurring from October 1 through October 13. If sent certified or registered mail, the report should have been postmarked by October 18. Otherwise, the due date was October 21.

Some individuals and their committees have no obligation to file reports under federal election law, even though their names may appear on general election ballots. If an individual and his or her campaign committee raise or spend less than \$5,000, the individual is not considered a "candidate" under the Federal Election Campaign Act, and neither the individual nor the committee has to register.

The Commission notified the committees of all candidates for the general election of their potential filing requirements 25 days prior to the due date. Those committees which did not file on the due date were notified on October 22 that their reports had not been received and that their names would be published for failure to file if they did not respond within 4 business days.

The Commission publishes only the names of those committees which have been designated by candidates as their principal campaign committees. Under Amendments to the Federal Election Campaign Act, effective January 8, 1980, candidates no longer are required to file personal reports of receipts and expenditures. All such information is reported by authorized committees of the candidates.

Other political committees supporting House and Senate candidates in the general election (those which are not authorized units of a candidate's campaign) also are required to file pre- and post-general election reports. Those committee names are not published by the FEC.

Further Commission action against non-filers and late filers will be decided on a case-by-case basis, depending on the amount of financial activity involved, the percent of vote received and/or the lateness of the report. The election law gives the Commission broad authority to initiate enforcement actions, including civil court enforcement and the imposition of civil penalties (\$5,000 for "any violation" and \$10,000 for any "knowing and willful" violation) for infractions of the law, including failure to file required disclosure reports.

The next report for all candidates' committees (those involved in the general election) will be the post-general election report - on December 2. The report will cover activity from October 14 through November 22, 1982. The year-end report for activity through December 31, 1982, will be due January 31, 1983.
