
Dear Ms. McDonald:

VII. Respondent agrees that it shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

VIII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.





The General Counsel's factual and legal analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you and the committee. You may submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit any such materials within ten days of your receipt of this letter. Statements should be submitted under oath.

In the absence of any additional information which demonstrates that no further action should be taken against your committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation. Of course, this does not preclude the settlement of this matter through conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe if so desired. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d).

If you intend to be represented by counsel in this matter, please advise the Commission by completing the enclosed form stating the name, address and telephone number of such counsel, and a statement authorizing such counsel to receive any notifications and other communications from the Commission.



GENERAL COUNSEL'S FACTUAL & LEGAL ANALYSIS

MUR 1760

RESPONDENT: Antelope Valley Political Action Committee

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

On June 27, 1984, the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") referred to the Office of General Counsel the Antelope Valley Political Action Committee ("AVPAC") for its failure to timely file the 1984 April Quarterly Report of Receipts and Disbursements.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

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The Reports Analysis Division notified AVPAC on March 22, 1984, that the 1984 April Quarterly Report was due on April 15, 1984. The report was not filed. AVPAC was sent a Non-Filer Notice on May 8, 1984. On May 21, 1984, a letter was received from AVPAC's treasurer, Mr. Richard Schock. In his response, Mr. Schock stated that "[w]e have not filed quarterly in the past. Since our organization we have filed twice yearly."

The Report Analysis Division analyst called AVPAC's office several times during the first week of June. Since no one was available to take any of the calls, messages were left on the answering machine.

On June 11, 1984, a call was received from Kim McDonald, an AVPAC representative. Ms. McDonald said that AVPAC has filed twice yearly since inception (September 28, 1982). The RAD analyst explained that all committees are allowed to file on a semi-annual basis during a non-election year, however, they must

file either quarterly or monthly during an election year.

Ms. McDonald said that she was unaware of this, but she would file the April Quarterly Report. On June 12, 1984, Mr. Schock called and reiterated what Ms. McDonald had stated in an earlier conversation.

AVPAC's 1984 April Quarterly Report was received on June 18, 1984. The cover letter accompanying the report stated that there had been a misunderstanding of the filing requirements.

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) provides that all political committees other than the authorized committees of a candidate shall file a quarterly report, in a calendar year in which a regularly scheduled general election is held, which shall be filed no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter, except that the report for the final calendar quarter of the year shall be filed on January 31 of the following calendar year.

Therefore, the Office of General Counsel recommends finding reason to believe that AVPAC violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(c)(1)(i) by not filing a timely quarterly report of receipts and disbursements.
