Dear Mr. Noble:

The following constitutes a Complaint by the Idaho State Democratic Party, seeking immediate redress of a violation of the Act by Helen Chenoweth and her principal campaign committee the Chenoweth Committee for Congress ("the Committee"). Mrs. Chenoweth openly reported an illegal loan she obtained for her campaign from Consulting Associates, Inc., a corporation of which she is an officer or principal. This loan violates the federal law prohibition on corporate contributions.

Loan and Corporate Spending Violation

The loan in question is reflected in the July 31, 1993 mid-year report by the Chenoweth Committee. On Schedule A, line 13 (a) there appears clearly disclosed two loans of \$1,250 and \$500 on May 25 and June 11, 1993, respectively (Exhibit "A"). The lender is identified as Consulting Associates, Inc. It is a corporation whose Articles of Incorporation are attached as an exhibit hereto (Exhibit "B").

The report also shows that on June 30, 1993 the Committee repaid Consulting Associates, Inc. the loan. It appears that Ms. Chenoweth "guaranteed" the corporate loan, apparently on some belief that if the committee did not repay the loan, she would do so on the committee's behalf.

These transactions violate the requirements of federal law. The Act prohibits corporations from making contributions to federal candidates. 2 U.S.C. § 441b. The term "contribution" includes any "loan" by a corporation. The requirement applies to all corporations -- to any corporation. 11 C.F.R. § 114.1 (a). Ms. Chenoweth cannot excuse this conduct by relying on her role within Consulting Associates, Inc., her personal

"guarantee" or the size of the corporation. The resources that she used were corporate resources used in violation of the requirements of federal law.

Reporting Violation

Ms. Chenoweth's report, while it reveals the loan as a corporate contribution does not properly report it, in violation of § 434 of the Act. She cannot "guarantee" a corporate loan nor may she suggest that corporation make such as such. The report that she filed misleads the public on the question of both the character and lawfulness of these illegal lending transactions. The subsequent repayment that she made does not cure the violation.

Conclusion

With some concern that Ms. Chenoweth may decide to rely on corporate resources in the future days to continue her campaign, it is important that the FEC address this violation promptly and make clear to Ms. Chenoweth that the only funds upon which she may rely in this campaign are those permitted under federal law. Additionally, we urge the FEC to impose proper fines and penalties to the Chenoweth Campaign Committee sending a clear message to all concerned that the Act has the force of law and will be strictly and consistently enforced by the Committee.

If I can offer anything more, please let me know, and please keep me apprised of your action on this Complaint.

Dear Mr. Mauk:

This is to acknowledge receipt on August 1, 1994, of your letter dated July 27, 1994. The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") and Commission Regulations require that the contents of a complaint meet certain specific requirements. One of these requirements is that a complaint be sworn to and signed in the presence of a notary public and notarized. Your letter did not contain a notarization on your signature and was not properly sworn to.

In order to file a legally sufficient complaint, you must swear before a notary that the contents of your complaint are true to the best of your knowledge and the notary must represent as part of the jurat that such swearing occurred. The preferred form is "Subscribed and sworn to before me on this ____ day of ____, 19__." A statement by the notary that the complaint was sworn to and subscribed before him/her also will be sufficient. We regret the inconvenience that these requirements may cause you, but we are not statutorily empowered to proceed with the handling of a compliance action unless all the statutory requirements are fulfilled. See 2 U.S.C. § 437g.


Enclosed is a Commission brochure entitled "Filing a Complaint." I hope this material will be helpful to you should you wish to file a legally sufficient complaint with the Commission.



TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

The Chenoweth for Congress FEC report for 5-5-94 to 6-30-94 deserves your thorough investigation.

SPECIFICALLY, your attention should be given to the following issues:

1. In the eight pages of itemized receipts, almost ALL of the donors are retired or self-employed...this appears highly irregular.
2. The unitemized receipts for this period alone total \$18,037.11 and approach \$50,000.00 (+/-) for the campaign---much higher than other federal office seekers in Idaho.
What check and balance system is in place to see that these are not repeat donors, etc?
3. Under debts and obligations a payment to The Printing Press, 325 Grove, Boise, Id 83707 is shown for 1448.06, with a balance due of -0-. However, under itemized disbursements page 8 line C, a payment of 724.03 is made to The Printing Press. No other payment is shown to this company, so how did the balance get to -0-? If the amount due was negotiated in some way, it should be shown and it would need to be credited to an individual.
4. Under debts and obligations, a payment to Custom Recording and Sound at 3907 Custer Dr. is shown for 200.00. A payment to Century International at 3907 Custer Drive is shown for 254.37. No corresponding entries are reflected in itemized disbursements. There are however a number of payments made to a David Ferdinand at the same address--3907 Custer Drive--on pages 11 and 12, but none of the amounts paid match those indicated under debts and obligations. Why all the discrepancies?
5. On page 1 of 1 for line 13 b, why are names of employers and occupations omitted?

I represent the Chenoweth for Congress Committee regarding above referenced MUR 4034, and the complaint executed by Bill Mauk, Esq., chairman of the Idaho Democrat Party. In the interest of time, I am forwarding this to you, without an executed designation of counsel statement since the candidate is presently unavailable. However, once I obtain the executed statement, it will be forwarded to you immediately.

Mrs. Chenoweth instructed key personnel early on, prior to the commencement, that the campaign is not to accept campaign contributions or loans from corporations. Once Mrs. Chenoweth discovered the loan from the corporation, it was incumbent upon her to promptly pay back the subject amount, and it was done so within 35 days of the initial two part transfer. Earlier this year FERC made an inquiry to both the candidate and the treasurer, and a response to the inquiry was formally given.

She announced her intention to run in early June 1993, yet she technically was not a candidate for federal office within the meaning of federal law under 2 U.S.C. Section 431(2)(A), as she had not received contributions in excess of \$5,000.00 prior to the end of June 1993.



GENERAL COUNSEL'S MONTHLY REPORT

SENSITIVE

I. INTRODUCTION

This report is the second Enforcement Priority System Monthly Report. The purpose of this September Monthly Report is to recommend that the Commission no longer pursue the identified lower priority and stale cases.

II. CASES RECOMMENDED FOR CLOSING

A. Cases Not Warranting Further Pursuit Relative to Other Cases Pending Before the Commission

A critical component of the Priority System is identifying those pending cases that do not warrant the further expenditure of resources. Each incoming matter is evaluated using Commission-approved criteria and cases that, based on their rating, do not warrant pursuit relative to other pending cases are placed in this category. By closing such cases, the Commission is able to use its limited resources to focus on more important cases.

Having evaluated incoming matters, this Office has identified 44 cases which do not warrant further pursuit

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relative to the other pending cases.¹ A short description of each case and the factors leading to assignment of a relatively low priority and consequent recommendation not to pursue each case is attached to this report. See Attachments 1-44. For the Commission's convenience, the narratives for the externally-generated matters are immediately followed by the complaint and response(s) and the narrative for the internally-generated matter is immediately followed by the referral.

B. Stale Cases

Investigations are severely impeded and require relatively more resources when the activity and evidence are old. Consequently, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission focus its efforts on cases involving more recent activity. Such efforts will also generate more impact on the current electoral process and are a more efficient allocation of our limited resources. To this end, this Office has identified 2 cases that have remained inactive and assigned to the Central Enforcement Docket for one year and which it believes do not warrant further investment of significant Commission resources.² Since the recommendation not to pursue the identified cases is
