GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

BACKGROUND

On July 26, 1978, the Commission found probable cause to believe that the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee ("the Committee") violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a)(1)(A)(i), for its failure to file a timely ten day pre-primary report. The Oregon Primary Election was held on May 23, 1978. On May 22, 1978 the Committee filed its ten day pre-primary report, which showed zero in receipts and expenditures and no outstanding debts.

DISCUSSION

In response to the probable cause to believe notice and the proposed conciliation agreement candidate Terry L. Hicks, in a letter dated August 24, 1978 to the Commission, stated that the ten day pre-primary report had, in fact, been mailed on May 9, 1978 from Idaho Falls, Idaho. (Attachment I)

A letter was also received from Ms. Beverly L. Lozano, Treasurer, in which she stated that on May 20, 1978, she heard "on the news" that the Commission had not received the ten day pre-primary report. 1/ According to Ms. Lozano, on May 22, 1978,


she sent a duplicate copy of the report to the Commission 2/ and attached a note to the report explaining that it had been filed earlier.3/ (Attachment II).

In view of the fact that the ten day pre-primary report was filed by the Committee, that the report showed no financial activity, and that candidate Hicks, as well as Ms. Lozano, maintain that the report had been filed on time, we recommend that no further action be taken at this time against the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee. (Attachment III)

RECOMMENDATION

We recommend the Commission rescind its probable cause to believe finding and take no further action at this time against the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee. Close the file and send the attached letter.

But what really alarms me, as a candidate that just won a primary election and a citizen of this country is the matter-of-fact assumption you and your staff have taken in your percieved supervisory responsibilities, with your assumption that I have a well oiled political machine with unlimited funis.

Well, Sir, I will set your record straight right now. I am a political machine of ONE with one assistant (Beverly L. Lozano). The only reason I have a campaign committee is because the Secretary of State in Oregon told me that it was required. From the date that I filed as a candidate (Jan. '78) through and including this date I have not recieved one single contribution, nor do I anticipate any for the general election.


On July 26 1978, the Commission determined there was probable cause to believe that the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee committed a violation of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i) of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. Specifically the Commission found probable cause to believe that the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee failed to file a ten day pre-primary report within the prescribed deadline required by 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i).

The Commission may, upon a finding of probable cause to believe a violation has occurred institute civil suit in United States District Court and seek payment of a civil penalty not in excess of \$5,000.

We enclose a conciliation agreement that this office is prepared to recommend to the Commission in settlement of this matter. If you agree with the provisions of the enclosed conciliation agreement, please sign and return it (along with the civil penalty) to the Commission within ten days. I will then recommend that the Commission approve the agreement.

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter having been initiated on the basis of information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, an investigation having been conducted, and the Commission having found probable cause to believe that respondent, Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee, (the Committee), violated 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i).

Now, therefore, the respective parties herein, the Federal Election Commission and respondent Committee having duly entered into conciliation pursuant to §434g(a)(5), do hereby agree as follows:

I. That the Federal Election Commission has jurisdiction over respondent and the subject of this proceeding.

II. That respondent Committee has had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. That the pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

A. That the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee knew of its reporting obligations in regard to the filing of the ten day pre-primary report.

B. That the Committee filed the ten day pre-primary report on May 22, 1978, one day before the Oregon Primary Election.

I. Respondent's action in failing to file the ten day pre-primary report in a timely fashion is in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i).

III. Respondent agrees that it will not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. §431, et seq.

I. The Commission, on the request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein, or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

II. It is mutually agreed that this agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

BACKGROUND

On June 12, 1978, the Reports Analysis Division referred the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee and The Committee To Elect Maxwell To The U.S. Senate to the Office of the General Counsel for their failure to file the ten day pre-primary report required by 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i).

The Commission found reason to believe on May 15, 1978 and reasonable cause to believe on May 17, 1978 that the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee and The Committee To Elect Maxwell To The U.S. Senate were in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i). The two committees appeared as non-filers in the Commission's publication of May 20, 1978.

EVIDENCE

The Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee and The Committee To Elect Maxwell To The U.S. Senate are required by 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i) to file a ten day pre-primary report. The Oregon Primary Election was held on May 23, 1978.



Hicks won the House Primary Election, receiving 52.2 per cent of the vote. On May 22, 1978 the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee filed its ten day pre-primary report. The report filed by the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee showed zero in receipts and expenditures and no outstanding debts.


Maxwell was defeated in the Senate Primary Election, receiving 10.2 per cent of the vote. On May 20, 1978 the Committee to Elect Maxwell to the U.S. Senate filed its ten day pre-primary report. The report filed by The Committee to Elect Maxwell to The U.S. Senate showed \$150 in receipts and zero in expenditures and no outstanding debts.

RECOMMENDATION

1. In view of the fact that Terry T. Hicks won the election, receiving 52.2 per cent of the vote and the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee did not file a timely ten day pre-primary report, we recommend the Commission find probable cause to believe that the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee violated 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i). We also recommend the Commission approve the attached conciliation agreement, which includes a fine of five hundred dollars, and so notify the respondent.

2. In view of the fact that Robert Douglas Maxwell lost the election and received under 30% of the vote, and that the aggregate receipts plus expenditures of The Committee To Elect Maxwell To The U.S. Senate totalled well under \$25,000, we recommend the Commission take no further action at this time against The Committee To Elect Maxwell To The U.S. Senate. Close the file as to this respondent.

On 1978, the Commission determined there was probable cause to believe that the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee committed a violation of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i) of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. Specifically the Commission found probable cause to believe that the Hicks for U.S. Representative Committee failed to file a ten day pre-primary report within the prescribed deadline required by 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i).

The Commission may, upon a finding of probable cause to believe a violation has occurred institute civil suit in United States District Court and seek payment of a civil penalty not in excess of \$5,000.

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from 1967 until 1975 apparently had disappeared. Although he has been out of office for only slightly more than three years, it has been nearly eight since he last sought approval from the voters. There appeared to be a strong feeling among Oregonians that two terms is enough for any governor, and at 65, McCall was too old.

McCall was beaten convincingly in both Multnomah (Portland) and Lane (Eugene) Counties, which were considered to be his strongest areas. The only county in McCall's column was Yamhill, southwest of Portland, which he won by 64 votes.

In Eugene a referendum to repeal a gay rights law, which passed by almost 2 to 1, brought out a large conservative vote, which did not help McCall.

The turnout among younger voters, one of McCall's stronger constituencies in the past, was also low on the Re-

publican side. As voters were allowed to register on election day, there was some speculation that many younger liberals registered to vote on the Democratic side for an anti-nuclear power candidate rather than back McCall, whom they assumed would win.

A bitter McCall claimed on election night that his defeat was the work of a "two-man gang." Referring to Martin's personal attacks and Atiyeh's efforts to position himself in the middle, McCall said the younger House member had "bludgeoned" him, allowing Atiyeh to "sail in like an angel." (*Oregon primary outlook, Weekly Report p. 1183*)

Atiyeh's victory sets up a rematch with Gov. Bob Straub, who won the Democratic nomination. Straub easily defeated Atiyeh in 1974, winning 57.7 percent of the vote. But now, with a reputation as a strong-finishing giant
