On May 21, 1978, the Commission determined that there was reasonable cause to believe that you committed a violation of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i) of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. Specifically, the Commission found reasonable cause to believe that you violated Section 434(a)(1)(A)(i) by failing to file a ten day pre-primary election report prior to the June 6, 1978 Ohio primary election for a seat in the U.S. House of Representative from the 21st district of Ohio.

The Commission has a duty to attempt to correct such violations for a period of 30 days by informal methods of conference, conciliation and persuasion and by entering into a conciliation agreement. If we are unable to reach an agreement during that period, the Commission may, upon a finding of probable cause to believe a violation has occurred, institute civil suit in the United States District Court and seek payment of a civil penalty not in excess of \$5,000.

We enclose a conciliation agreement that this office is prepared to recommend to the Commission in settlement of this matter. If you agree with the provisions of the enclosed conciliation agreement, please sign and return it along with the civil penalty of the Commission within ten days. I will then recommend that the Commission approve the agreement.

On May 31, 1978, the Commission determined that there was reasonable cause to believe that you committed a violation of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i) of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

In 1978 the Reports Analysis Division referred to the Office of General Counsel all candidates and committees which failed to timely file one or more of the following reports: the 1977 year-end report, the 10 day pre-primary report, the 30 day post-primary report, and the 10 day pre-general report.

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The Commission reviewed all of the candidates and committees which failed to file and in accordance with the criteria set forth in the Commission's non-filer memorandum dated May 23, 1978, determined to take further action through conciliation against a number of the candidates and committees. For those candidates and committees which did not conciliate, the Commission found probable cause. 1/ The Commission directed the Office of General Counsel to review all of the candidates and committees against which probable cause was found and to recommend to the Commission those candidates and committees against which a civil action should be filed.2/

-
- 1/ Except for those candidates and committees which failed to file the 1977 year-end report, the Commission did not authorize the filing of civil suits.
- 2/ Four candidates and one committee against which the Commission found probable cause for failure to file reports of receipts and expenditures are not included in this report. They are: the Committee Amigos de Jaime Benitez, NF 54 (Puerto Rico); the New York State Voter Registration Drive, NF 59 (New York); the Committee to Elect Louis Nine to Congress, NF 62 (New York); the North Carolina Democratic Inaugural Committee, NF 70 (North Carolina); and Sanford Krasnoff, NF 193 (Louisiana). Civil actions for failure to timely file and for other violations of FECA were brought against the Committee Amigos de Jaime Benitez and Sanford Krasnoff. A civil action for failure to timely file was brought against the Committee to Elect Louis Nine to Congress and a consent decree has been obtained. The New York State Voter Registration Drive was referred to the Audit Division for an audit. Conciliation is proceeding for failure to timely file and for other violations of FECA with the North Carolina Democratic Inaugural Committee in MUR 859.

II. ANALYSIS

A. 1977 Year-End Non-Filers

The Commission has found probable cause against the following 1977 year-end non-filers:

Attachment I lists each respondent and indicates each respondent's filing history and financial activity for 1978.

All of the respondents are principal campaign committees of candidates who ran for election to federal office in 1976. None of the candidates ran for election to federal office in 1978. The respondent committees appear to be defunct. As none of the respondents filed 1978 quarterly reports there is no indication of financial activity.

Because of the inactivity of these committees in the 1978 elections, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission not bring a civil action for relief against them, but close the files.

Attachment II lists each respondent and indicates each respondent's filing history and financial activity for 1978.

The General Counsel's Office used three criteria in reviewing the respondents. We are recommending the filing

of a civil action against any respondent who meets all three criteria. The criteria are as follows:

1. whether the respondent failed to timely file two of the 1978 reports;
2. whether the respondent (or the candidate if the respondent was a principal campaign committee) received more than 30% of the vote in either the primary or general election; and
3. whether the respondent had more than \$20,000 in receipts.

One committee, Conlin for Congress, meets all three criteria: failing to timely file both the 10 day pre-general election report and the 30 day post-general election report, receiving 42% of the vote in the general election, and having receipts in the amount of \$160,614.

The Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission bring a civil action for relief against Conlin for Congress. Further, we recommend closing the files with respect to all other respondents.

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

The Office of General Counsel recommends the following:

1. file a civil action against Conlin for Congress (NF 173) for failure to file required reports in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434;
2. close the file and rescind the authorization to file a civil action with regard to:



Specifically, the Commission found probable cause to believe that you failed to file a 10 day pre-primary election report in a timely manner.

On March 22, 1979, the Commission also found probable cause to believe that your principal campaign committee, the 21st District Congressional Committee for Bill Mack (hereafter "the Committee") committed a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) (1) (A) (i) and 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) (1) (A) (ii). Specifically, the Commission found probable cause to believe that the Committee failed to file a 30 day post-primary election report in a timely manner, a 10 day pre-general election report in a timely manner, and a 30 day post-general election report in a timely manner. Under section 437g(a) (5) (B), after such a probable cause determination, the Commission may institute civil action in the United States District Court and seek payment of a civil penalty not in excess of \$5,000.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Background

This matter was referred to the Office of General Counsel from the Reports Analysis Division. The original designation of this matter was MUR 634. In that matter respondent candidate Bill Mack had failed to file a 10 Day Pre-Primary Election Report in a timely manner. Subsequent to this referral, this office received a number of other referrals involving Bill Mack's principal campaign committee, the 21st District Congressional Committee for Bill Mack (hereafter "the Committee"). The Committee failed to file its 30 day post primary, its 10 day pre general and its 30 day post general election reports in a timely manner.

Candidate Mack, who ran for a seat in the U. S. House of Representatives from the 21st District of Ohio, lost in the general election, receiving 14% of the votes cast.

Analysis

After a number of attempts at conciliation with candidate Bill Mack, he agreed to file the above named reports, including those for the Committee, which he signed. These reports have been received by the Commission and reveal no expenditures and no receipts.

The Commission approved a modified conciliation agreement on February 2, 1979 which included all the above mentioned violations of the Act and a civil penalty in the amount of \$50.00. We have, however, been unable to conciliate with Mr. Mack in this matter as he refuses to pay any civil penalty. We therefore recommend that the Commission find probable cause that Bill Mack violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(1)(A)(i) and probable cause that Bill Mack's principal campaign committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(1)(A)(i) and 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(1)(A)(ii) for failing to file the above named reports in a timely manner.



Background

This matter involves 10 day pre-election report nonfilers from Ohio's June 6, 1978 primary election. On September 13, 1978 the Commission voted to take further action against the Ted Strickland for Congress Committee and its treasurer Ted Strickland for violating 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(1)(A)(i). The Commission also voted to take further action against candidate Bill Mack for violating 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(1)(A)(i). Conciliation agreements were sent to both the Strickland committee and Bill Mack.

Analysis

Since this time we have received our conciliation agreement without any changes from treasurer Ted Strickland, signed by him and accompanied by a check for \$100, the amount of the civil penalty. This office has recommended in a separate memorandum that the conciliation agreement be accepted and that the matter be closed as to the Ted Strickland for Congress Committee.

As for candidate Bill Mack, in addition to his own failure to file a ten day pre-election report, his principal campaign committee was published as a 30 day post-election non filer and was included in MUR 738. In an October 10, 1978 telephone conversation, Mack expressed confusion as to his own reporting responsibilities as distinguished from those of his committee. He also objected to paying a civil penalty for his failure to timely file the necessary reports. After being advised as to what reports were missing, he agreed to have them mailed to the Commission. Mack also agreed in this conversation to sign his committee's 30 day post-election report and accept responsibility for its late filing.

Accordingly, a 10 day pre-election report from candidate Bill Mack and a 30 day post election report from the 21st Congressional Committee for Bill Mack were received by the Commission on October 15, 1978. The reports reveal no contributions received and no expenditures made by either Mack or his principal campaign committee.



GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Background

This matter was referred to the Office of General Counsel from the Reports Analysis Division. It concerns candidates and committees that failed to file 30 day post-primary election reports in Ohio. They are the Dennerll 20th Congressional District Committee, the People for Bushong Committee, and the 21st District Congressional Committee for Bill Mack.

All three committees were notified by the Commission on July 18, 1978 and on August 4, 1978 of their failure to file 30 day post-primary election reports due on July 6, 1978. The three committees were also included in a press release issued by the Press Office on September 5, 1978 which contained the names of candidates and committees that failed to file these 30 day post-election reports.

Analysis

The Dennerll 30th Congressional District Committee is the principal campaign committee for Norbert G. Dennerll, Jr.

Dennerll, a Democrat, lost the primary election, receiving 12.4% of the votes cast or 4,741 votes. The committee did file a 10 day pre-primary report showing total receipts of \$664.08, total expenditures of \$663.39, and cash on hand of .69. In light of these facts and applying the criteria set forth by the Task Force on Nonfiling Procedures in its Filing Procedures in its

May 23, 1978 memorandum, we recommend closing the matter as to the Dennerll 20th Congressional District Committee.

The People for Bushong Committee is the principal campaign committee for Thomas F. Bushong. Bushong lost the Democratic primary election in the 4th District of Ohio receiving 7,702 votes or 42.4% of the votes cast. Candidate Bushong did file a 10 day pre-election report which revealed no receipts and no expenditures. Again applying the criteria set forth by the Task Force on Nonfiling Procedures, we recommend closing the matter as to the People for Bushong Committee.

The 21st District Congressional Committee for Bill Mack is the principal campaign committee for Bill Mack who was unopposed in the June 6, 1978 primary election. Candidate Bill Mack, chairman of his principal campaign committee, has also failed to file a 10 day pre-primary report (see MUR 634). On September 13, 1978 the Commission voted to take further action against Bill Mack for his failure to file this 10 day

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
pre-primary report. A conciliation agreement with a \$500 civil penalty was also approved. On October 10, 1978 this office contacted Bill Mack and discussed both his failure to file his 10 day pre-election report and his committee's failure to file its 30 day post-election report. Conciliation is still taking place. In light of this, we recommend merging the issue of Bill Mack's principal campaign committee's failure to file a 30 day post-election report with MUR 634 which involved candidate Bill Mack's failure to file his 10 day pre-election report.



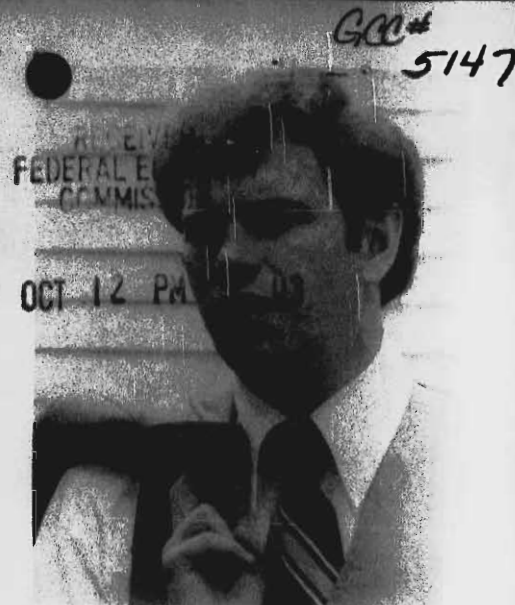

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

BACKGROUND

The following candidates and committees were referred to The Office of General Counsel as 10 day pre-primary election non-filers from the state of Ohio: candidate William P. McKenna, the Normile Election Committee, the Ted Strickland for Congress Committee, and candidate Bill Mack (see Attachment I). The date of the Ohio primary election was June 6, 1978.

On June 3, 1978, the Press Office issued a press release containing the names of the candidates and committees which failed to file these 10 day pre-election reports. Since then, candidate William P. McKenna, the Normile Election Committee, and the Ted Strickland for Congress Committee have filed their 10 day pre-election reports.

William P. McKenna finished second in the Democratic primary for a seat in the U.S. House of Representatives from the 17th district of Ohio. McKenna received 11.7 percent of his party's vote. On June 5, 1978, the Commission received from candidate McKenna his 10 day pre-election report. The report

revealed no expenditures and total receipts of \$200 which were then turned over to his committee. Candidate McKenna's previous reports had likewise revealed no activity. Also McKenna's principal campaign committee had filed its 10 day pre-primary election report prior to the June 3, 1978 date of publication.

Michael Normile finished second in the Democratic primary for a seat in the U.S. House of Representatives from the 23rd district of Ohio. Normile received 16.1 percent of the party's vote. The Normile Election Committee filed its 10 day pre-election report on June 21, 1978. This report revealed no expenditures and no receipts for this period by the committee.

In light of these facts and applying the criteria established by the Task Force on Nonfiling Procedures in its memorandum dated May 23, 1978, the Office of General Counsel recommends that no further action be taken against candidate William P. McKenna and the Normile Election Committee as to the nonfiling of their 10 day pre-primary election reports for the June 6, 1978 Ohio primary election. We recommend closing the matter as to them.

On June 8, 1978, the Commission received from the Ted Strickland for Congress Committee a 10 day pre-primary election report. The report was due on May 27, 1978. Notification of the committee's failure to file this report had been mailed on May 29, 1978 and May 31, 1978. The report which the Committee filed on June 8 listed receipts in the amount of \$1,295.00 and expenditures in the amount of \$3,198.00.

Ted Strickland won the Democratic primary for a seat in the U.S. House of Representatives from the 6th district of Ohio receiving 17,170 votes or 76.7 percent of the votes cast.

In a letter dated June 5, 1978, the chairman of the Ted Strickland for Congress Committee stated that the late filing of the 10 day pre-primary report was due to the treasurer moving out of state (see Attachment II). The letter also advised the Commission that candidate Ted Strickland would sign in place of the treasurer. This had been suggested in a telephone conversation on June 5, 1978 (see Attachment III). Candidate Strickland served in this capacity until August 15, 1978 when the Commission received notification that the committee had designated a new treasurer.

In light of the fact that Mr. Strickland won the election and because his committee did not file its 10 day pre-primary report in a timely manner, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission take further compliance action against the Ted Strickland for Congress Committee and its treasurer, Ted Strickland. We also recommend approval of the attached conciliation agreement with a \$100 civil penalty. This determination is consistent with the the Commission guidelines for nonfilers set forth in its memorandum dated May 23, 1978 which states that further action shall be taken against candidates who win their primary election.

Candidate Bill Mack was unopposed in the Republican primary for a seat in the U.S. House of Representatives from the 21st district of Ohio. Notification of his failure to file a 10 day

pre-primary election report was mailed on May 29, 1978 and May 31, 1978. Despite repeated telephone calls and messages (see Attachment IV), we have not received this report. The Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission take further compliance against Bill Mack for his failure to file a 10 day pre-primary election report. We also recommend approval of the attached conciliation agreement with a civil penalty of \$500.00.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Take no further action against William P. McKenna and the Normile Election Committee. Close the file as to them.
2. Leave open the file and seek to reach conciliation with the Ted Strickland for Congress Committee and its treasurer, Ted Strickland for violating 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i).
3. Leave open the file and seek to reach conciliation with Bill Mack for violating 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i).
4. Approve the attached conciliation agreements.
5. Send the attached letters.

Ohio Results:

Rhodes and Celeste Win; Rep. Carney Just Makes It

Gov. James A. Rhodes, R, and Lt. Gov. Richard F. Celeste, D, easily won their parties' nominations for governor, but Rep. Charles J. Carney, D, came within 200 votes of becoming the fifth House incumbent this year to suffer a primary defeat.

Rhodes and Celeste both defeated their rivals by margins exceeding 2-1, with Celeste overwhelming Dale Reusch, an imperial wizard in the Ku Klux Klan and Rhodes beating a more formidable opponent, state Rep. Charles F. Kurfess.

Kurfess had campaigned energetically, charging Rhodes with a crisis-to-crisis operation of the state government. He criticized the governor for inept leadership of both the state and the party, specifically citing recent problems with energy shortages and school financing as well as the decline of the Ohio Republican Party under Rhodes' guidance. (*Ohio Outlook, Weekly Report* p. 1235)

Rhodes ignored Kurfess' charges and campaigned sparingly, banking the money he raised at fund-raising breakfasts for the fall campaign against Celeste. When he did campaign he focused his fire on the Environmental Protection Agency, which he claimed was responsible for plant closings and unemployment.

With the aid of most of the party leadership around the state, Rhodes won all but five of Ohio's 88 counties. Kurfess carried four counties around his base in northwestern Ohio as well as populous Summit County, where he had the backing of the *Akron Beacon-Journal*. The other

major population centers went handily to Rhodes except for Montgomery County (Dayton), which Kurfess lost narrowly after gaining endorsements from the local papers.

The focus of attention among the House primaries was on the 19th District, where Carney narrowly turned back the challenge of state Rep. George D. Tablack. Tablack had criticized the incumbent for failing to take a more active role in preventing plant closings around the district and was able to run ahead of Carney in his home base, Mahoning County.

But Carney, a four-term veteran, offset the loss of Mahoning by piling up a large advantage over Tablack in neighboring Trumbull County. Tablack was not well-known in Trumbull and faced the additional problem of sharing the anti-Carney vote with the other two candidates on the ballot.

In other primaries of interest, veteran state Sen. Stanley J. Aronoff defeated former newscaster Tom Atkins for the Republican nomination in the 2nd District. Atkins had the endorsement of the Republican organization in Hamilton County (Cincinnati), but Aronoff had a large volunteer organization and superior financial resources. He also gained the backing of the major newspaper in the district, the *Cincinnati Enquirer*. Aronoff will face incumbent Thomas A. Luken, D, in the general election.

The primary contests in the 3rd District were both one-sided, with state Sen. Tony P. Hall and Dayton business leader Dudley P. Kircher scoring impressive wins in three-way races. Kircher was expected to have a close contest but swept all portions of the 3rd District, including the hometown of his major rival, Kettering Mayor Charles F. Horn. The Kircher-Hall winner will assume the seat of retiring Rep. Charles W. Whalen Jr., R.

In the 12th District, state Rep. James L. Baumann had little trouble winning the Democratic nomination. He will face 20-year House veteran Samuel L. Devine, R, in what is expected to be a close race this fall.
