BACKGROUND

On July 31, 1978, the Commission received a complaint from Robert Huntley, Jr., chairman of the Stan Kress for Congress Committee. Kress is running for a seat in the U.S. House of Representatives from the second district of Idaho. Huntley stated in the complaint that Ralph Harding, Kress's opponent in the Democratic primary, gave a press release to the Associated Press and the U.P.I. The press release accused Stan Kress of wrongfully receiving two salary checks during his 1976 campaign in the second district of Idaho.

The complaint asserts that Harding's press release characterized Kress's salary payments "as being similar to a theft by a bank teller or shoplifting by a supermarket clerk" and that this language is "pure and simple libel and slander of the worst kind." While no specific section of the Act is cited, the complaint requests that the Commission advise Harding to "cease and desist such foul and dishonest campaign techniques".

On August 14, 1978, the Commission received a letter from Mr. Huntley which expressed his desire to withdraw the complaint from any further action by the Commission.

ANALYSIS

The complainant is chairman of candidate Stan Kress's principal campaign committee. Pursuant to §437g(a)(3)(A) of the Act, the Office of General Counsel contacted the Reports Analysis Division concerning Mr. Kress's reports and statements. Kress has waived his reporting requirement. As for Kress's principal campaign committee, it appears that there have been no irregularities in its reports. Reports Analysis also checked respondent Ralph Harding's reports. Like Kress, Harding has waived his reporting requirements. His principal campaign committee encountered some minor reporting problems in its April 10, 1978 quarterly report. However, it appears that there have been no serious reporting violations.

Although candidate Kress might wish to pursue a personal cause of action in this situation, there is no provision in the Act which can be applied to this particular matter. The Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe a violation has occurred and that this matter be closed since it falls outside our jurisdiction.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Find no reason to believe a violation has occurred in this matter.
2. Close the file.
3. Send the attached letters.

Gentlemen:

This letter is to lodge an official complaint of a violation of "fair campaign practices" by Ralph Harding, and request your Commission's immediate investigation and action.

Enclosed is a press release given by Ralph Harding to the Associated Press and U.P.I., accusing Idaho Congressional Candidate Stan Kress of wrongfully receiving two salary checks during his 1976 campaign against the incumbent, George Hansen.

Before the salary checks were issued to Mr. Kress to assist him in meeting the mortgage payments on his home and the grocery and utility bills for his family, his Committee Treasurer telephoned the Federal Election Commission to inquire as to whether it was proper for a candidate to receive a salary.

The F.E.C. advised that such was proper and legitimate.

Enclosed are the following documents:





Ralph Harding told Bannock County Democrats that Stan Kress did not keep faith with his contributors in the 1976 campaign. Harding, who is a candidate for the nomination for congress from the second district, charged, "Kress paid himself a salary from campaign funds without the explicit approval, consent, or knowledge of his campaign contributors." Harding likened the Kress actions to the bank teller who helps himself to the contents of the vault or to a supermarket clerk who carries home the groceries without stopping at the checkstand. "If Kress needed a salary so desperately, he should have communicated with his contributors and asked their consent before helping himself to campaign funds. This conversion of campaign funds which political supporters had contributed for legitimate campaign expenses is highly questionable, unethical, and not in good faith. This is the same type of misappropriation of campaign funds which probably started our incumbent congressman down the trail to his conviction, fine and suspended jail sentence in 1974," Harding concluded.
