





GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

On July 3, 1979, the Commission found reason to believe that the People for Improvement of Education ("PIE") may have violated 2 U.S.C. §441b and that the Safety Net for Schools Committee ("SNSC") and the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 Committee ("EBMC") may have violated 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434 in connection with transfers in excess of \$1,000 from SNSC and EBMC to PIE. Letters of notification were mailed to respondents on July 3, 1979.

Evidence

Mr. John Danielson responded on behalf of PIE and EBMC as treasurer of both committees (see Attachment I). Mr. Danielson is associated with the Oregon Education Association and served as a member of the Board of Directors for SNSC. Mr. David R. Dierdorff, Executive Assistant to the President of the Oregon State Senate, responded on behalf of SNSC as his office organized the SNSC legislative effort. (See Attachment II). These responses disclosed the following:

1. SNSC was established in March 1977, for the sole purpose of promoting the passage of school finance measures in the

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May 17, 1977, special election. In this connection, SNSC solicited and received funds from individuals, corporations and labor organizations. SNSC also received more than \$13,000 from EBMC, an organization established by the Oregon Education Association ("OEA") for the specific purpose of collecting voluntary contributions from educators for ballot measures in the May 17, 1977, election as OEA did not have a budget for such purposes. All receipts were deposited to and disbursements made from a single bank account.

2. After discharging the expenses of the May 17, 1977, election a surplus of \$4,045.59 remained in SNSC's account. As the Board of Directors wished to terminate SNSC, a decision was made to reimburse OEA and other entities, on a ratio basis, for pre-election expenses incurred in the commissioning of a state-wide poll on school finance and tax issues. Although funds had been received from EBMC, Mr. Dierdorff stated that SNSC viewed the funds as coming from OEA's membership. The checks were issued in July of 1977. Upon OEA's request that its \$1,045.59 check be voided and reissued to PIE, a check was reissued on October 7, 1977, and SNSC's account closed. PIE reports receipt of these funds on October 21, 1977.

3. The funds used to effectuate the transfer of \$4,504.80 from EBMC to PIE were surplus funds from voluntary contributions which remained in EBMC's account after the special election. PIE disclosed receipt of these funds on September 30, 1977.

4. Minutes taken at a PIE board meeting held on September 17, 1978, disclosed that PIE contributed \$10,000 to a local campaign to defeat an Oregon ballot issue. The \$10,000 was the aggregate of the \$4,504.80 received from EBMC, the \$1,045.59 received from SNSC and a \$4,449.61 contribution from PIE funds.

LEGAL ANALYSIS

The term political committee is defined by 2 U.S.C. §431(d) to mean any committee, club, association or other group of persons which receive contributions or make expenditures during a calendar year in an aggregate amount exceeding \$1,000.

"Contributions" or "expenditures" are defined by the Act to mean anything of value, i.e. gift, advance, payment or deposit of money, made "for the purpose of influencing the nomination for election or election of any person to federal office." 2 U.S.C. §§431(e) and (f). Undisputed facts disclosed that both SNSC and EBMC were established to generate and expend funds for the sole purpose of promoting the passage of state ballot issues in an Oregon special election. No funds were received or expended to influence the nomination or election of any person, and both SNSC and EBMC were terminated after the election.

As Committees are required, under Oregon's election laws, to continue to report until all funds in their respective accounts have been dispersed, directors for EBMC and SNSC dispersed all excess funds prior to termination. While SNSC did transfer


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\$1,045.59 to PIE, the funds appear to be a reimbursement for expenses incurred by PIE in connection with the school finance ballot issues in the 1977 special election. The evidence indicates that the funds transferred by EBMC to PIE were voluntary contributions from individual educators and that PIE used the aggregate amount received from both EBMC and SNSC in connection with a state campaign to defeat another ballot issue. Therefore, while it is true that EBMC and SNSC did transfer funds to PIE, transfers which were fully disclosed to the FEC, the Committees should not be considered political committees and be required to register and file reports under 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434 as the funds transferred were not designed to influence a federal election campaign. Further, the funds received from both SNSC and EBMC were not used in connection with any federal election. Thus, the Office of General Counsel recommends taking no further action in this matter and closing the file.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Take no further action against the People for the Improvement of Education, the Safety Net for Schools Committee and the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 Committee and close the file.

2. Approve and send attached letters.

You have suggested that People for Improvement of Education may have violated federal election law by accepting a \$1,405 contribution from the Safety Net for Schools Committee in 1977.

The Safety Net for Schools Committee was established in March, 1977 for the purpose of supporting a school finance measure that the State Legislature had submitted for vote on May 17, 1977.

Consistent with Oregon election law, funds were solicited from businesses, corporations, unions and individuals in support of the measure. As the Oregon Education Association had no budget for ballot measures, a separate committee, Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1, was established. All funds accumulated by the committee were collected from voluntary contributions by educators.

As the funds were collected, they were contributed to the Safety Net for Schools Committee to use in the campaign. Oregon law requires that if a political committee intends to spend more than \$3,000 during the twelve days immediately preceding an election, then a statement of the additional amount of expenditure will be made. The amount spent could not exceed the estimate by more than 15 percent.

In the case of the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1, it did not appear that more than \$3,000 would be available during the last twelve days; consequently, no additional estimate was made. When additional funds came later, it left a surplus with the committee. The Safety Net for Schools Committee met and allocated surplus funds back to the contributors; consequently, the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 received a refund of \$1,045. Other contributors also received a proportionate refund.

As all of the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 funds had been collected voluntarily, because such funds were collected on a voluntary basis, and because such funds qualify for a tax credit under Oregon law, it was determined that the funds could legally be transferred into the account for People for Improvement of Education which is a

campaign fund for educators that is properly filed with the Federal Election Commission. Additionally, the funds remaining in the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 fund were also transferred to People for Improvement of Education. The transfers were done to avoid continuous filing for committees that had no future intended purpose.

Technically, the Safety Net funds were returned to the Educators for Ballot Measure 1; however, because the transfer was to be made to PIE, they were transferred directly to People for Improvement of Education.

Subsequently, in September, 1978, because the funds mentioned above were collected for a ballot measure, it was determined to contribute those funds to the campaign for another ballot measure; Ballot Measure 6 which was a tax limitation measure.

The minutes of the September 17, 1978 PIE Board of Directors meeting indicate that PIE authorized a contribution including the \$4,504.80 received from the Educators for Ballot Measure 1, and \$1,045.59 received from the Safety Net for Schools Campaign to the campaign to stop Ballot Measure 6. The specific action is listed on page 2 of the minutes which are attached.

It should be noted that all of the funds accepted by PIE had been obtained through voluntary contributions by educators; and that in spite of the fact that the Safety Net Committee had legally accepted corporate contributions, the refund was issued based on the contributions that had been made by the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 fund.

We have previously mailed you copies of the campaign reports of both of the involved committees. If you need additional information, we will be happy to comply.

Jim Walker moved to approve the June 3, 1978 PIE meeting minutes as printed. Motion was seconded by Noel Connall and passed.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Chairperson Lashway added Chairperson's Report and Democratic National Convention to the agenda. Dick Sahagian moved to adopt the agenda as amended. Motion was seconded and passed.

REPORT OF CHAIRPERSON

Chairperson Lashway reported his observations of the August political conference in Waldport. He stated the conference was a success with a high attendance and noted a growing interest in PIE.

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PRESENTATIONS FROM CUES

Joe Rutledge, representative from James Weaver's congressional campaign, spoke to the PIE Board and asked for funding for the campaign.

Mark Knutson, independent candidate in House District 2, spoke to the PIE Board and asked for endorsement.

FINANCIAL REPORT

John Danielson reported on the financial statement mailed to the PIE Board. He noted that not all the moneys allocated to candidates at the last PIE Board meeting were issued. The printing costs are high as noted on the statement because of the printing situation at OEA along with higher costs. An additional \$7,879 is due PIE from 1977-78 PIE dues.

Jim Walker moved approval of the financial report as printed. Motion was seconded and passed.

NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION

Chairperson Lashway reported two Oregon teachers, himself and Gary Sackley, were elected as delegates to the National Democratic Convention.

Alan Ellis moved PIE fund lodging, air fare and meals to delegates Joe Lashway and Gary Sackley to attend the Democratic National Convention. Motion was seconded by Opal Gardner and passed.

REVIEW AND EVALUATION OF ENDORSEMENT CONVENTION

Board members agreed the convention was a success and additional rules would be worked out for the next convention. Ted Romoser noted extensive information on the convention in the OEA newspaper would be effective notice for the teachers. The effect of candidates being prompted to contact local associations as a result of the convention was noted.

ENDORSEMENT AND FUNDING OF CANDIDATES AND BALLOT MEASURE 6 CAMPAIGN

John Danielson reviewed legislative races. He explained Ballot Measures 6 and 11 and the need for PIE to contribute monies from the Safety Net campaign given to PIE and an additional amount from PIE to the Oregon Tax Relief Committee.

Noel Connall moved PIE contribute \$4,504.80 received from Educators for Ballot Measure 1, \$1,043.59 received from Safety Net for Schools Committee and \$4,449.61 from PIE funds, making a total of \$10,000 to the campaign(s) to stop Ballot Measure 6. Rose Chess seconded the motion.

Chairperson Lashway moved the motion out of order because it is in conflict with the goals and bylaws of PIE stating PIE contribute to candidates only. He called for a roll call vote on the issue. Discussion followed. The seriousness of the implications of Ballot Measure 6 and the importance of stopping it was stressed. History of the PIE Board action on ballot measures was reviewed. The vote to sustain chair's motion stating motion to contribute to an issue was out of order failed. The roll call vote was as follows: Yes--Deanie Barker, Denis Berrigan, Dorothy Burrow, Opal Gardner, Joe Lashway, Dick Sahagian and Jim Walker; No--Jon Anderson, Rose Chess, Noel Connall, Dennis Dearick, Alan Ellis,

Ross Hucke, Sally MacLeod, Steve Nousen, George Porter, Ted Romoser and Garth Ziegenhagen.

Dick Sahagian moved to amend the main motion to read that PIE contribute \$4,504.80 received from Educators for Ballot Measure 1 and \$1,045.59 received from Safety Net for Schools Committee to the campaign(s) to stop Ballot Measure 6. The motion was seconded by Opal Gardner and failed. The roll call vote was as follows: Yes--Dorothy Burow, Opal Gardner, Joe Lashway, Dick Sahagian and Jim Walker; No--Len Anderson, Deanie Barker, Denis Berrigan, Rose Chess, Noel Connall, Dennis Dedrick, Alan Ellis, Ross Hucke, Sally MacLeod, Steve Nousen, George Porter, Ted Romoser and Garth Ziegenhagen.

Noel Connall's main motion to contribute \$10,000 to campaign(s) to stop Measure 6 was passed.

Dick Sahagian moved PIE endorse John Meyer, candidate for House District 3 and John Schoon, candidate for House District 34. Motion was seconded and passed.

Jim Walker moved PIE endorse Jim Petersen, candidate for House District 58. Deanie Barker seconded and the motion passed.

John Danielson and Don Satchell gave their recommendations for financial contributions to endorsed candidates.

Len Anderson moved PIE contribute \$750 plus \$750 for inkind contribution to Ruth McFarland, candidate for State Superintendent of Public Instruction, with the inkind capability to be reviewed and if not possible, the additional cash in the amount of \$750 would be contributed to Ms. McFarland's campaign. Motion was seconded by Rose Chess and passed.

Noel Connall moved PIE contribute \$750 with an additional \$500 if NEA-PAC does not contribute at least \$4,000, to Jim Weaver, candidate for reelection in the Fourth Congressional District. Motion was seconded by Sally MacLeod and passed.

Chairperson Lashway read a year old letter from Bob Monson to the PIE Board asking the Board not to endorse and contribute to John Powell, State Senate District 19, because he did not offer any assistance to Glenn Harrison, a non-renewed DEA member in John Powell's school district. It was noted that Powell had subsequently been endorsed by the UniServ District.

Len Anderson moved to delete the \$100 contribution recommended for John Powell. Jim Walker seconded and the motion failed.

Alan Ellis moved PIE contribute \$500 to Rod Monroe, House District 12. Motion was seconded by Len Anderson and passed.

Alan Ellis moved PIE contribute \$300 to Jane Cease, House District 18. Motion was seconded by Len Anderson and passed.

Rose Chess moved PIE contribute \$750 to Joyce Cohen, House District 24. Motion was seconded by Steve Nousen and passed.

Steve Nousen moved to contribute \$400 and up to \$100 inkind to Dave George, House District 29. Motion was seconded by Rose Chess and passed.

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Jim Walker moved PIE contribute \$1,000 to Ed Beal, House District 44. Motion was seconded by Dorothy Burow and passed.

Steve Nousen moved PIE contribute \$700 and up to \$200 inkind to Chuck Bennett, House District 55. Motion was seconded by Rose Chess. Ross Hucke moved to amend motion to contribute \$700 and up to \$200 inkind to Chuck Bennett to read \$700 and inkind. Motion to amend was seconded and passed. Main motion to contribute \$700 and inkind to Chuck Bennett, House District 55, was passed.

Ross Hucke moved PIE contribute \$800 plus inkind to Wayne Fawbush, House District 56. Motion was seconded by Rose Chess and passed.

Deanie Barker moved PIE endorse James Petersen, House District 58, and contribute \$500 to his campaign. Motion was seconded by Ross Hucke. Len Anderson moved to amend the motion to read \$250 instead of \$500. Motion to amend the main motion was seconded by Steve Nousen and failed. Main motion passed.

Jim Walker moved to approve the following general election endorsements and contributions by PIE (includes motions made above on individual candidates). Motion was seconded by Len Anderson. Opal Gardner asked minutes to show she abstained from voting on Mark Gardner.

Ross Hucke moved to amend the main motion on the general election contributions to show no financial contribution to Mary Bates, House District 57. Motion was seconded by Deanie Barker and passed. Main motion was passed.

The former treasurer of the "Limit Tax Levy Elections/Safety Net for Schools Committee," D. Keith Swanson, forwarded to our office the letter he received from the Federal Elections Committee in the above referenced investigation. The reason for this is that the committee was disbanded immediately following the May 17, 1977 election and the treasurer's responsibilities under Oregon law ended upon the filing of the last report and the closing of the account in October 1977. Since our office organized the legislative effort and was involved through Senator Boe in the campaign effort, we are the logical place for inquiries.

I have enclosed the following documents for your consideration:

1. Attachment to SED 221, listing the committee directors at the time the committee was formed and the first official filing was made with our Secretary of State
2. List of the committee established for campaign purposes. Members of both committees formed an "executive" committee to make campaign decisions, including those related to contributions and expenditures.
3. Copy of SED 224 from the last official report of the committee, filed on or about October 7, 1977. This shows all disbursements by the committee from June 17, 1977 through October 7, 1977. There were no receipts by the committee after May 17, 1977.

To respond to your specific questions, SNSC was organized on March 25, 1977 for the specific purpose of promoting the passage of Ballot Measure 1 on the May 17, 1977 special election ballot. An amended filing was made later in the spring adding to its purpose the fact that the committee's advertising would, in some instances, promote the passage of Ballot Measures 2 and 3 as well.

The committee did not exist on October 21, 1977, nor does it exist at the present time. The only treasurer was D. Keith Swanson, P. O. Box 69, Salem, OR 97308, and the only other individual with fiscal responsibilities was Larry Picus, 1508 N.E. Stanton, Portland, OR 97210.

As I'm sure you realize, all of the committee's receipts and expenditures are a matter of public record, as required by Oregon law. Only one bank account was used by the committee. All receipts were deposited in the account and all disbursements were made from the account. Among the receipts by the committee were contributions of \$5000 and \$8000 in May 1977 from "Educators for Ballot Measure 1".

It is my understanding that this committee was formed by the Oregon Education Association in order to keep the voluntary contributions from its members for this ballot measure separate from its general political action account (PIE). In any event, we viewed the money as coming from the Oregon Education Association membership, regardless of the name of the committee.

After the election expenses were paid, the committee had a surplus of funds. Since no one desired to keep the committee alive, it was decided by the committee to use the surplus to reimburse the Oregon Education Association, the Oregon School Boards Association and the Confederation of Oregon School Administrators for a pre-election expense incurred by them, the commissioning of a state-wide poll on school finance and tax issues. The surplus was divided in July and three checks were issued, numbers 65, 66, 67. These show on the attached SED 224.

At the request of the Oregon Education Association, their check was voided and a new one issued October 7, 1977, payable to PIE. The committee's "staff", Mr. Larry Picus, prepared the check, obtained Mr. Swanson's signature, and closed the account.

The committee's funds included voluntary contributions received from corporations, unions and individuals, as well as PAC's. All contributions are, as indicated above, a matter of public record and the records are available from the State Archivist. Since copying would involve a considerable expense, I decided not to obtain copies for you unless this matter is not resolved by this letter.


My analysis of these transactions leads me to the conclusion that the payment of \$1045 to PIE was not a contribution, but a reimbursement for expenses or a return of a previous contribution. The fact that the check was issued to PIE at the request of Mr. Danielson is a matter beyond our control.



You have requested information regarding contributions received from a committee called Safety Net for Schools Committee. The Safety Net for Schools Committee was a broad based committee for the passage of a tax stabilization measure in Oregon school districts. Voluntary teacher contributions for that campaign exceeded \$13,000. As a consequence, after the campaign, part of the remaining balance was given to People for Improvement of Education. I am not aware of the recipients of other parts of the remaining balance. The reason the campaign fund was closed was because the election was over and Oregon State law would have required continuous reporting until such time the fund was terminated.

Although the source of the funds cannot be identified specifically, the volunteer teacher contributions far exceeded the amount that was later transferred to PIE. For your information, we are enclosing a list of the largest contributors to the fund.

1. INCOME AND EXPENDITURES OF COMMITTEE TO LIMIT TAX LEVY-SAFETY NET FOR SCHOOLS IN FAVOR OF BALLOT MEASURE NUMBER 1 -- SPECIAL ELECTION, MAY 17, 1977

When considering the allocation of funds for a ballot measure, it should be recognized that to run a campaign for an issue is substantially more expensive than a similar campaign for a candidate. The reason for the difference is a congressional ruling which requires that candidates for office are guaranteed the lowest advertising rates by the media; whereas advertising for an issue is billed at the top rate. Those closest to campaigns estimate that the cost of a ballot measure campaign is approximately 40 percent higher than a similar campaign for a candidate.

The former treasurer of the "Limit Tax Levy Elections/Safety Net for Schools Committee," D. Keith Swanson, forwarded to our office the letter he received from the Federal Elections Committee in the above referenced investigation. The reason for this is that the committee was disbanded immediately following the May 17, 1977 election and the treasurer's responsibilities under Oregon law ended upon the filing of the last report and the closing of the account in October 1977. Since our office organized the legislative effort and was involved through Senator Boe in the campaign effort, we are the logical place for inquiries.

I have enclosed the following documents for your consideration:

1. Attachment to SED 221, listing the committee directors at the time the committee was formed and the first official filing was made with our Secretary of State
2. List of the committee established for campaign purposes. Members of both committees formed an "executive" committee to make campaign decisions, including those related to contributions and expenditures.
3. Copy of SED 224 from the last official report of the committee, filed on or about October 7, 1977. This shows all disbursements by the committee from June 17, 1977 through October 7, 1977. There were no receipts by the committee after May 17, 1977.

To respond to your specific questions, SNSC was organized on March 25, 1977 for the specific purpose of promoting the passage of Ballot Measure 1 on the May 17, 1977 special election ballot. An amended filing was made later in the spring adding to its purpose the fact that the committee's advertising would, in some instances, promote the passage of Ballot Measures 2 and 3 as well.

The committee did not exist on October 21, 1977, nor does it exist at the present time. The only treasurer was D. Keith Swanson, P. O. Box 69, Salem, OR 97308, and the only other individual with fiscal responsibilities was Larry Picus, 1508 N.E. Stanton, Portland, OR 97210.

As I'm sure you realize, all of the committee's receipts and expenditures are a matter of public record, as required by Oregon law. Only one bank account was used by the committee. All receipts were deposited in the account and all disbursements were made from the account. Among the receipts by the committee were contributions of \$5000 and \$8000 in May 1977 from "Educators for Ballot Measure 1".

It is my understanding that this committee was formed by the Oregon Education Association in order to keep the voluntary contributions from its members for this ballot measure separate from its general political action account (PIE). In any event, we viewed the money as coming from the Oregon Education Association membership, regardless of the name of the committee.

After the election expenses were paid, the committee had a surplus of funds. Since no one desired to keep the committee alive, it was decided by the committee to use the surplus to reimburse the Oregon Education Association, the Oregon School Boards Association and the Confederation of Oregon School Administrators for a pre-election expense incurred by them, the commissioning of a state-wide poll on school finance and tax issues. The surplus was divided in July and three checks were issued, numbers 65, 66, 67. These show on the attached SED 224.

At the request of the Oregon Education Association, their check was voided and a new one issued October 7, 1977, payable to PIE. The committee's "staff". Mr. Larry Picus, prepared the check, obtained Mr. Swanson's signature, and closed the account.

The committee's funds included voluntary contributions received from corporations, unions and individuals, as well as PAC's. All contributions are, as indicated above, a matter of public record and the records are available from the State Archivist. Since copying would involve a considerable expense, I decided not to obtain copies for you unless this matter is not resolved by this letter.


My analysis of these transactions leads me to the conclusion that the payment of \$1045 to PIE was not a contribution, but a reimbursement for expenses or a return of a previous contribution. The fact that the check was issued to PIE at the request of Mr. Danielson is a matter beyond our control.

You have suggested that People for Improvement of Education may have violated federal election law by accepting a \$1,405 contribution from the Safety Net for Schools Committee in 1977.

The Safety Net for Schools Committee was established in March, 1977 for the purpose of supporting a school finance measure that the State Legislature had submitted for vote on May 17, 1977.

Consistent with Oregon election law, funds were solicited from businesses, corporations, unions and individuals in support of the measure. As the Oregon Education Association had no budget for ballot measures, a separate committee, Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1, was established. All funds accumulated by the committee were collected from voluntary contributions by educators.

As the funds were collected, they were contributed to the Safety Net for Schools Committee to use in the campaign. Oregon law requires that if a political committee intends to spend more than \$3,000 during the twelve days immediately preceding an election, then a statement of the additional amount of expenditure will be made. The amount spent could not exceed the estimate by more than 15 percent.

In the case of the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1, it did not appear that more than \$3,000 would be available during the last twelve days; consequently, no additional estimate was made. When additional funds came later, it left a surplus with the committee. The Safety Net for Schools Committee met and allocated surplus funds back to the contributors; consequently, the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 received a refund of \$1,045. Other contributors also received a proportionate refund.

As all of the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 funds had been collected voluntarily, because such funds were collected on a voluntary basis, and because such funds qualify for a tax credit under Oregon law, it was determined that the funds could legally be transferred into the account for People for Improvement of Education which is a

campaign fund for educators that is properly filed with the Federal Election Commission. Additionally, the funds remaining in the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 fund were also transferred to People for Improvement of Education. The transfers were done to avoid continuous filing for committees that had no future intended purpose.

Technically, the Safety Net funds were returned to the Educators for Ballot Measure 1; however, because the transfer was to be made to PIE, they were transferred directly to People for Improvement of Education.

Subsequently, in September, 1978, because the funds mentioned above were collected for a ballot measure, it was determined to contribute those funds to the campaign for another ballot measure; Ballot Measure 6 which was a tax limitation measure.

The minutes of the September 17, 1978 PIE Board of Directors meeting indicate that PIE authorized a contribution including the \$4,504.80 received from the Educators for Ballot Measure 1, and \$1,045.59 received from the Safety Net for Schools Campaign to the campaign to stop Ballot Measure 6. The specific action is listed on page 2 of the minutes which are attached.

It should be noted that all of the funds accepted by PIE had been obtained through voluntary contributions by educators; and that in spite of the fact that the Safety Net Committee had legally accepted corporate contributions, the refund was issued based on the contributions that had been made by the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 fund.

We have previously mailed you copies of the campaign reports of both of the involved committees. If you need additional information, we will be happy to comply.

FINANCIAL REPORT

John Danielson reported on the financial statement mailed to the PIE Board. He noted that not all the moneys allocated to candidates at the last PIE Board meeting were issued. The motion was seconded by Opal Gardner and failed. Based on information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission has found reason to believe that the Safety Net for Schools Committee (SNSC) may have violated certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act").

Specifically it appears that the SNSC may have violated 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434 by contributing in excess of \$1,000 to the People for Improvement of Education Committee (PIE), a federal committee registered with the Commission. Section 433 requires all political committees which expend funds in excess of \$1,000 in connection with a federal election to register with the Commission. Section 434 then requires the registered committee to disclose its financial activity to the Commission through periodic reports.

We have numbered this matter MUR 988.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you. Please submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this matter. Additionally, please submit answers to the enclosed questions. GENERATION OF MATTER

This matter was originally referred to the Office of General Counsel from Reports Analysis on June 5, 1979 concerning the apparent receipt of corporate contributions by a political committee registered with the Commission. The referral was updated on June 18, 1979. (See attachments 1 and 2).

EVIDENCE

A review of 1977 reports filed by the People for Improvement of Education ("PIE") Committee disclosed the receipt of contributions in excess of \$1,000 from two unregistered committees: \$1,045 from the Safety Net for Schools Committee ("SNSC") on October 21, 1977 and \$4,504.80 from the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 Committee (EBMC) on September 30, 1977. Both SNSC and EBMC were organized to promote purely state education issues in Oregon. Surface violation letters were mailed to both PIE and EBMC. John D. Danielson, treasurer for PIE and EBMC, responded on their behalf. He stated that SNSC received corporate, union and individual contributions, but that the early corporate and union contributions were expended by SNSC on purely state issues. Corporate/union contributions were also received toward the end of the campaign period, but these were subsequently refunded.

Mr. Danielson also stated that all funds received by EBMC were voluntary individual contributions from educators.

PRELIMINARY LEGAL ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. §433(a) requires all political committees which, during the course of a year, receive contributions or expend funds in excess of \$1,000 in connection with a federal election to register with the Commission. As both SNSC and EBMC contributed in excess of \$1,000 to PIE, a registered political committee which supports federal candidates, it appears the SNSC and EBMC are in violation of §433(a).

Documents submitted by Mr. Danielson disclosed that SNSC received contributions from corporate and union sources, permissible under Oregon's campaign regulations. It appears that these funds were commingled with individual contributions and were deposited to a general account from which funds were drawn to effectuate the contribution to PIE. Therefore, by accepting the SNSC contribution, PIE may have indirectly accepted contributions from corporate and union sources in violation of 2 U.S.C. §441b.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Find reason to believe that the People for Improvement of Education Committee may have violated 2 U.S.C. §441b; send attached letter.
2. Find reason to believe that the Safety Net for School Committee and the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 may have violated 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434; send attached letters.





This letter is prompted by the Commission's interest in assisting candidates and committees who wish to comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act, as amended. During review of the January 31 Year End 1977 Report of Receipts and Expenditures, we noticed entries indicating that you may have accepted corporate contributions through an unregistered organization whose funds are, in part, from corporate entities. Corporate contributions are prohibited by the Act, unless the contribution is made by a separate segregated fund established by the corporation.

The Federal Election Campaign Act and the Commission Regulations permit a committee to accept contributions from an unregistered organization if the contributions are not in excess of \$1,000 during the calendar year and if the contributions originally came from permissible sources, not corporate or union treasuries.

If you find you have accepted a prohibited contribution, the Commission recommends that you return the full amount to the donor. As an alternative, you may transfer the full amount of the contribution to a separate account which is not used to influence Federal elections.

Please notify the Commission within fifteen (15) days from the date of this letter of the determination made on this matter. The Safety Net for Schools Campaign was a campaign established specifically for a school finance program. Most of the funds collected were collected from volunteer contributors. All of those funds collected from teachers were from volunteer contributors.

Oregon law requires that a committee estimate within 10 percent the amount of money they will be expending during the last 12 days of a campaign. Due to the nature of a campaign soliciting voluntary contributions, substantial amounts of teacher contributions came after it was too late to spend the money. Other organizations involved in the campaign experienced similar situations. As the campaign committee was established specifically for one issue, the campaign committee board determined to refund to those organizations who assisted in the solicitations but whose dollars arrived too late to be utilized in the campaign. The dollars received by the People for Improvement of Education were given specifically by teachers on a voluntary basis. It is true that some corporations did contribute to the Safety Net for Schools Campaign; however, because they were early contributors, their funds were utilized by the committee, or in a few isolated cases, if the funds came late, were probably refunded to the contributing corporation.

As the Safety Net for Schools Committee was not involved in any federal elections, its only reporting requirements were to the Secretary of State in the State of Oregon. All contributions were properly registered and reported.



Based on information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission has found reason to believe that the Safety Net for Schools Committee (SNSC) may have violated certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act").

Specifically it appears that the SNSC may have violated 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434 by contributing in excess of \$1,000 to the People for Improvement of Education Committee (PIE), a federal committee registered with the Commission. Section 433 requires all political committees which expend funds in excess of \$1,000 in connection with a federal election to register with the Commission. Section 434 then requires the registered committee to disclose its financial activity to the Commission through periodic reports.

We have numbered this matter MUR 988.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you. Please submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this matter. Additionally, please submit answers to the enclosed questions. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

The Commission is under a duty to investigate this matter expeditiously. Therefore, your response should be submitted within ten days after your receipt of this notification.

Specifically it appears that PIE may have indirectly accepted corporate and union funds by accepting a \$1,045 contribution from the Safety Net for Schools Committee ("SNSC") in violation of 2 U.S.C. §441b. Documents submitted indicate that SNSC received funds from corporate and union sources which may have been commingled with individual contributions and deposited into a single account. SNSC then withdrew funds to effectuate a contribution to PIE.

We have numbered this matter MUR 988.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you. Please submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this matter. In addition, please describe the relationship, if any, between PIE, SNSC and the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 Committee. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

Based on information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission has found reason to believe that the Educators for Ballot Measure No. 1 Committee (EBMC) may have violated certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act").

Specifically it appears that the EBMC contributed in excess of \$1,000 to the People for Improvement of Education (PIE) Committee, a political committee which is registered with the Commission and which contributes to federal campaigns. Section 433 of the Act requires all political committees which expend funds in excess of \$1,000 in connection with a federal election to register with the Commission by filing a Statement of Organization, and §434 requires such committees to disclose all financial activity to the Commission through the filing of periodic reports. As it appears that on October 21, 1977 EBMC contributed \$4,504.80 to PIE without registering with the Commission, EBMC may have violated 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434.





Voluntary teacher contributions for that campaign exceeded \$13,000. As a consequence, after the campaign, part of the remaining balance was given to People for Improvement of Education. I am not aware of the recipients of other parts of the remaining balance. The reason the campaign fund was closed was because the election was over and Oregon State law would have required continuous reporting until such time the fund was terminated.

Although the source of the funds cannot be identified specifically, the volunteer teacher contributions far exceeded the amount that was later transferred to PIE. For your information, we are enclosing a list of the largest contributors to the fund.

When considering the allocation of funds for a ballot measure, it should be recognized that to run a campaign for an issue is substantially more expensive than a similar campaign for a candidate. The reason for the difference is a congressional ruling which requires that candidates for office are guaranteed the lowest advertising rates by the media; whereas advertising for an issue is billed at the top rate. Those closest to campaigns estimate that the cost of a ballot measure campaign is approximately 40 percent higher than a similar campaign for a candidate.

When considering the allocation of funds for a ballot measure, it should be recognized that to run a campaign for an issue is substantially more expensive than a similar campaign for a candidate. The reason for the difference is a congressional ruling which requires that candidates for office are guaranteed the lowest advertising rates by the media; whereas advertising for an issue is billed at the top rate. Those closest to campaigns estimate that the cost of a ballot measure campaign is approximately 40 percent higher than a similar campaign for a candidate.

This letter is prompted by the Commission's interest in assisting candidates and committees who wish to comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act, as amended. During review of the January 31 Year End 1977 Report of Receipts and Expenditures, we noticed entries indicating that you may have accepted corporate contributions through an unregistered organization whose funds are, in part, from corporate entities. Corporate contributions are prohibited by the Act, unless the contribution is made by a separate segregated fund established by the corporation.

The Federal Election Campaign Act and the Commission Regulations permit a committee to accept contributions from an unregistered organization if the contributions are not in excess of \$1,000 during the calendar year and if the contributions originally came from permissible sources, not corporate or union treasuries.

If you find you have accepted a prohibited contribution, the Commission recommends that you return the full amount to the donor. As an alternative, you may transfer the full amount of the contribution to a separate account which is not used to influence Federal elections.

Please notify the Commission within fifteen (15) days from the date of this letter of the determination made on this matter. The Safety Net for Schools Campaign was a campaign established specifically for a school finance program. Most of the funds collected were collected from volunteer contributors. All of those funds collected from teachers were from volunteer contributors.

Oregon law requires that a committee estimate within 10 percent the amount of money they will be expending during the last 12 days of a campaign. Due to the nature of a campaign soliciting voluntary contributions, substantial amounts of teacher contributions came after it was too late to spend the money. Other organizations involved in the campaign experienced similar situations. As the campaign committee was established specifically for one issue, the campaign committee board determined to refund to those organizations who assisted in the solicitations but whose dollars arrived too late to be utilized in the campaign. The dollars received by the People for Improvement of Education were given specifically by teachers on a voluntary basis. It is true that some corporations did contribute to the Safety Net for Schools Campaign; however, because they were early contributors, their funds were utilized by the committee, or in a few isolated cases, if the funds came late, were probably refunded to the contributing corporation.

As the Safety Net for Schools Committee was not involved in any federal elections, its only reporting requirements were to the Secretary of State in the State of Oregon. All contributions were properly registered and reported.

Refunds or transfers must be made in such amounts that the total remaining contributions made by you do not exceed \$1,000 during a calendar year.

If you believe that your organization is not a political committee, or that the Commission is otherwise in error, please submit a statement which would clarify this matter for the public record. We have also enclosed relevant informational materials and forms for the registration of and reporting by the political committee. Please examine the enclosed materials.
