SUBJECT: Reason To Believe Recommendation – 2021 Mid-Year Report for the
Administrative Fine Program

Attached is a list of political committees and their treasurers who failed to file the 2021 Mid-Year Report in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). The Mid-Year Report was due on July 31, 2021.

The committees listed on the attached RTB Circulation Report either failed to file the report or filed the report no more than thirty (30) days after the due date (considered a late filed report). In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties for reports at 11 C.F.R. 111.43, these committees should be assessed the civil money penalties highlighted on the attached circulation report.

Recommendation

1. Find reason to believe that the political committees and their treasurers, in their official capacity, listed on the RTB Circulation Report violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and make a preliminary determination that the civil money penalties would be the amounts indicated on the RTB Circulation Report.
2. Send the appropriate letters.

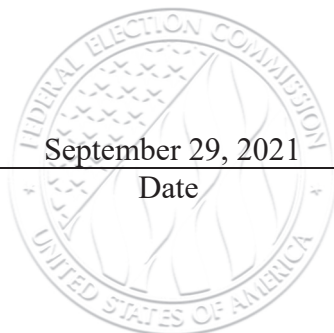

Dear Mr. Quinones,

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), requires that your committee file a Mid-Year Report of Receipts and Disbursements in any calendar year other than one during which a regularly scheduled general election is held. This report, covering the period January 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021, shall be filed no later than July 31, 2021. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). Because records at the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") indicate that you did not file this report within thirty (30) days of the due date, the report is considered not filed for the purpose of calculating the civil money penalty. You should file this report if you have not already done so.

The Act permits the FEC to impose civil money penalties for violations of the reporting requirements of 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). 52 U.S.C. § 30109g(a)(4). On September 27, 2021, the FEC found that there is reason to believe ("RTB") that Puerto Rico Mejor Futuro and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) by failing to file timely this report on or before July 31, 2021. Based on the FEC's schedules of civil money penalties at 11 CFR § 111.43, the amount of your civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage is \$11,972. Please see the attached copy of the Commission's administrative fine regulations at 11 CFR §§ 111.30-111.55. Attachment 1. The Commission's website contains further information about how the administrative fine program works and how the fines are calculated. See <https://www.fec.gov/af/pay.shtml> 11 CFR § 111.34. Your payment of \$11,972 is due within forty (40) days of the finding, or by November 6, 2021, and is based on these factors:

Sensitivity of Report: Not Election Sensitive
Level of Activity: \$328,775
Number of Days Late: Not Filed
Number of Previous Civil Money Penalties Assessed: 0

At this juncture, the following courses of action are available to you:

PUERTO RICO MEJOR FUTURO

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1. If You Choose to Challenge the RTB Finding and/or Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to challenge the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty, you must submit a written response to the FEC's Office of Administrative Review. Your response must include the AF# (found at the top of page 1 under your committee's identification number) and be received within forty (40) days of the Commission's RTB finding, or November 6, 2021. 11 CFR § 111.35(a). Your written response must include the reason(s) why you are challenging the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty and must include the factual basis supporting the reason(s) and supporting documentation. The FEC strongly encourages that documents be submitted in the form of affidavits or declarations. 11 CFR § 111.36(c).

Please note, the Federal Election Commission's office remains closed to visitors and most of its employees are continuing to telework in an effort to limit the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). The Commission is processing some documents submitted by mail, though processing will not occur daily until the agency resumes normal mail operations. Nevertheless, a challenge to an RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty must be received on time. Thus, all written responses and supporting documentation should be converted to PDF (Portable Document Format) and must be emailed to administrativefines@fec.gov. The Commission encourages the use of electronic signatures on electronically submitted documents, but scanned copies of ink signatures will be accepted. Electronically submitted challenges will be deemed received on the date it is electronically received by staff.

The FEC will only consider challenges that are based on at least one of three grounds: (1) a factual error in the RTB finding; (2) miscalculation of the calculated civil money penalty by the FEC; or (3) your demonstrated use of best efforts to file in a timely manner when prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond your control. 11 CFR § 111.35(b). For a challenge to be considered on the basis of best efforts, you must have filed the required report no later than 24 hours after the end of these reasonably unforeseen circumstances. *Id.* Examples of circumstances that will be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) a failure of Commission computers or Commission-provided software despite your seeking technical assistance from Commission personnel and resources; (2) a widespread disruption of information transmissions over the Internet that is not caused by a failure of the Commission's or your computer systems or Internet service provider; and (3) severe weather or other disaster-related incident. 11 CFR § 111.35(c). Examples of circumstances that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) negligence; (2) delays caused by vendors or contractors; (3) treasurer and staff illness, inexperience or unavailability; (4) committee computer, software, or Internet service provider failures; (5) failure to know filing dates;

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and (6) failure to use filing software properly. 11 CFR § 111.35(d).

The "failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver" of your right to present such argument in a petition to the U.S. District Court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109. 11 CFR § 111.38.

If you intend to be represented by counsel, please advise the Office of Administrative Review. You should provide, in writing, the name, address and telephone number of your counsel and authorize counsel to receive notifications and communications relating to this challenge and imposition of the calculated civil money penalty.

2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Submit a Challenge

If you do not pay the calculated civil money penalty and do not submit a written response, the FEC will assume that the preceding factual allegations are true and make a final determination that Puerto Rico Mejor Futuro and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a civil money penalty.

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA"), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. § 3701 et seq. The FEC may take any and all appropriate action authorized and required by the DCA, as amended, including transfer to the U.S. Department of the Treasury for collection. 11 CFR § 111.51(a)(2).

3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to pay the calculated civil money penalty, follow the payment instructions on page 4 of this letter. Upon receipt of your payment, the FEC will send you a final determination letter.

NOTICE REGARDING PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND SETTLEMENT OFFERS

4. Partial Payments

If you make a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination.

5. Settlement Offers

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission, including making a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order, will be rejected.


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Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

This matter was generated based on information ascertained by the FEC in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(2). Unless you notify the FEC in writing that you wish the matter to be made public, it will remain confidential in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4)(B) and 30109(a)(12)(A) until it is placed on the public record at the conclusion of this matter in accordance with 11 CFR § 111.42.

REVIEWING OFFICER RECOMMENDATION OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW (“OAR”)

AF# 4242 – Puerto Rico Mejor Futuro and Edwin Quinones, in their official capacity as Treasurer (C00755306)

Summary of Recommendation

Make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalty.

Reason-to-Believe Background

The 2021 Mid-Year Report was due on July 31, 2021. The respondents have not yet filed the report. The report is not election sensitive and was not filed within 30 days of the due date; therefore, the report is considered not filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.43(d)(1) and (e)(1).

On September 27, 2021, the Commission found reason to believe (“RTB”) that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2021 Mid-Year Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$11,972 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. A letter was mailed to the respondents’ email address of record from the Reports Analysis Division (“RAD”) on September 30, 2021 to notify them of the Commission’s RTB finding and civil money penalty.

Legal Requirements

The Federal Election Campaign Act (“Act”) states that the treasurer of a political committee not authorized by a candidate which is filing on a quarterly basis shall file, in a non-election year, a report for the period ending June 30 no later than July 31. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(c)(2)(i). Reports electronically filed must be received and validated at or before 11:59 pm Eastern Standard/Daylight Time on the filing deadline to be timely filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 100.19(c) and 104.5(e). The treasurer shall be personally responsible for the timely filing of reports. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d).

Summary of Respondents' Challenge

On March 11, 2022, the Commission received the written response (“challenge”) from the respondents. The Treasurer indicates the Committee was not required to file the 2021 Mid-Year Report because they had previously filed a termination report with the Commission on January 18, 2021. On the same date, the Committee also filed a request for dissolution with the Puerto Rico Electoral Controller, “hereby concluding any and all efforts by Puerto Rico Mejor Futuro and dissolving its existences.” The challenge includes supporting documents.

Analysis

In response to the Committee’s contention that it filed a termination report on January 18, 2021, the Reviewing Officer requested evidence to support the report was successfully delivered or transmitted to the FEC. The Committee reviewed its records and explained that until recently, it was the Committee’s understanding that its accountant successfully filed a termination report on January 18, 2021. While the Committee’s records indicate the termination report was prepared on that date, the Committee had no evidence to suggest the report was successfully transmitted to the FEC.¹

The Reviewing Officer recognizes the Committee may have become inactive in early 2021. However, a committee’s filing obligation ends only when a committee files a termination report, and the Commission notifies them in writing that their termination report has been accepted. 11 C.F.R § 102.3.² Therefore, the respondents were required to file the 2021 Mid-Year Report on July 31, 2021.

At the time of the RTB finding, the Commission used an estimated level of activity (\$328,775) to calculate the penalty because the 2021 Mid-Year Report had not yet been filed. 11 C.F.R § 111.43(d)(2)(ii). On April 21, 2022, the Committee filed a Form 99 (Miscellaneous Electronic Submission) disclosing a level of activity of \$0 for the reporting period. 11 C.F.R § 111.43(d)(3)(ii). The activity was disclosed 264 days late and is considered not filed. 11 C.F.R § 111.43(e)(1). Using the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R § 111.43(a) for not election sensitive reports, no penalty should be assessed for a level of activity of \$0 (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$11,972).

The Reviewing Officer recommends that the Commission make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalty.

2. Make a final determination in AF# 4242 that Puerto Rico Mejor Futuro and Edwin Quinones, in their official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalty (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$11,972); and

On September 27, 2021, the Commission found reason to believe (“RTB”) that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2021 Mid-Year Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$11,972 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On March 11, 2022, the Commission received their written response (“challenge”). After reviewing the challenge, the Reviewing Officer Recommendation (“ROR”) dated May 2, 2022 was forwarded to the Commission, a copy was forwarded to the respondents, and is hereby incorporated by reference. The Reviewing Officer confirmed the Committee’s requirement to file the 2021 Mid-Year Report and recommended that the Commission recalculate the civil money penalty because, after RTB, the Committee disclosed no activity for the reporting period. *See* ROR. The Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalty (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$11,972).

Within 10 days of transmittal of the recommendation, the respondents may file a written response with the Commission Secretary which may not raise any arguments not raised in their challenge or not directly responsive to the ROR. 11 C.F.R. § 111.36(f). The respondents have since indicated they will not be submitting a response.

OAR Recommendations

1. Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 4242 involving Puerto Rico Mejor Futuro and Edwin Quinones, in their official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;

On September 27, 2021, the Federal Election Commission (“the Commission”) found reason to believe (“RTB”) that Puerto Rico Mejor Futuro and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2021 Mid-Year Report. By letter dated September 30, 2021, the Commission sent notification of the RTB finding that included a civil money penalty calculated at \$11,972 in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On March 11, 2022, the Office of Administrative Review received your written response challenging the RTB finding.

The Reviewing Officer reviewed the Commission’s RTB finding with its supporting documentation and your written response. Based on this review, the Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission reduce the RTB civil money penalty because it was calculated using an estimated level of activity, make a final determination that Puerto Rico Mejor Futuro and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and based on the actual level of activity disclosed for the 2021 Mid-Year Report coverage period (\$0), assess no civil money penalty in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. The Reviewing Officer Recommendation was sent to you on May 2, 2022.

On May 25, 2022, the Commission adopted the Reviewing Officer’s recommendation and made a final determination that Puerto Rico Mejor Futuro and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and based on the level of activity disclosed for the 2021 Mid-Year Report coverage period (\$0), assessed no civil money penalty (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$11,972). It is based on the same factors used to calculate the civil money penalty at RTB except that the actual level of activity, rather than the estimated level of activity, was used. A copy of the Final Determination Recommendation is attached.

The confidentiality provisions at 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(12) no longer apply and this matter is now public. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.42(b) and 111.20(c), the file will be placed on the public record within 30 days from the date of this notification.
