
Dear Mr. Leventhal:

This refers to your request for an advisory opinion concerning application of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, to the production and distribution by Spanish International Network of spot announcements and program length presentations concerning census participation, voter registration and actual voting.

Enclosed is a copy of Agenda Document #80-191 which the Office of General Counsel submitted as a proposed response to your request. The Commission considered this document on June 5, 1980, but failed to adopt it as an advisory opinion by the required 4 vote majority. 2 U.S.C. §437c(c).
