Dear Ms. Duffy:

This refers further to your letter of January 19, 1984, requesting an advisory opinion on behalf of the Wisconsin Citizens Concerned for Life Political Action Committee.

As you know, the Commission has formally considered a response to your request on several occasions: March 22/23, 1984, Agenda Document #84-47; April 5, 1984, Agenda Document #84-57; and May 3, 1984, Agenda Documents #84-57, #85-57A, #84-57B. Copies of these documents are enclosed. At the meeting of May 3, the Commission directed the Office of General Counsel to prepare another revised draft advisory opinion in response to the subject AOR 1984-4. This document, designated as a Final Draft of AO 1984-4, was circulated on May 4 for a Commission vote by May 7. On May 8, 1984, the Secretary of the Commission certified that the vote was 3-3 on this final draft. Copies of this final draft and the certification are enclosed.


As is apparent from the enclosures and this letter, the Commission has been unable to approve an advisory opinion in response to your request. The Act requires that an advisory opinion be approved by at least four members of the Commission. 2 U.S.C. §437c(c), § 437d(a)(7). The regulations provide that when the Commission is unable to approve an opinion, the requesting person should be so notified. 11 CFR 112.4(a).

This letter is to notify you that as of May 8, 1984, the Commission has concluded its consideration of the subject AOR 1984-4.
