GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

BACKGROUND

8 2 0 1 3 1 2 7 3 5
The Reports Analysis Division's review of the reports of Taylor for U.S. Senate revealed the following cash flow discrepancies. The Committee's July 10, 1978 report showed \$4,341.64 on hand at the end of the reporting period, but on the next report, the tenth day pre-primary report dated August 22, 1978, there was a balance of \$2,021.64 on hand at the beginning of the reporting period for a discrepancy of \$2,320.00. This tenth day pre-primary report disclosed also \$2,218.89 on hand at the end of the reporting period but the thirtieth day post primary report dated September 22, 1978 indicated \$3,117.94 on hand at the beginning of the reporting period, a discrepancy of \$899.05.

Additionally, the review indicated that the Committee disclosed but failed continuously to report debts totalling \$16,358 and failed to disclose the nature of a candidate loan in the amount of \$15,000 during these reporting periods.

The Committee's treasurer failed to respond to the Commission's September 11, 1979 reason to believe letter and to several telephone requests for an explanation of the cash flow discrepancies and amendments with respect to the debts.

However, in response to the Commission's Order to answer questions, the treasurer simply submitted all of the original

books and records of the committee, indicating orally by telephone that he lacked the ability to answer the questions on his own.

The matter was referred to the Audit Division on May 5, 1981 for a § 437g audit and was returned with the following analysis. The Audit Division's review of the books and records makes the conclusion that cash flow discrepancies between reports were due to apparent errors made when the balances were taken from the committee ledgers. However, the reconciliation disclosed no material misstatements of receipt or expenditure activity. The review further concludes that the debts totalling \$16,358 were paid by the Committee and reported as appropriate on Schedule B. Although the records contained no further information on the candidate loan, the Audit Division believes that the disclosure reports are adequate and that further audit work is unwarranted.

LEGAL ANALYSIS

Although there are violations of 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(1) and § 434(b)(12), it appears that the violations were the result of careless bookkeeping and accounting by a treasurer who acknowledges that he lacks the requisite skills. Moreover, the

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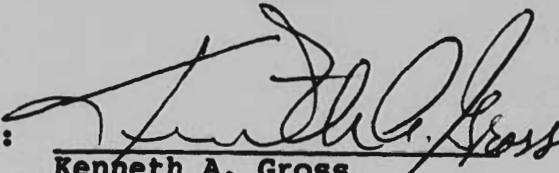
Audit Division has concluded that the Committee's disclosure reports are adequate. In addition, all the activities concerned in this matter relate back to the 1978 election cycle. For these reasons, this Office recommends that the MUR be closed.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Take no further action and close the file.

We have reviewed the records and disclosure reports for the year 1978 which relate to Taylor for U.S. Senate ("the Committee"). The review included such tests as verification of total reported receipts and expenditures and individual transactions.

The records received with the referral contained sufficient documentation to perform a reconciliation of reported activity to the activity reflected on Committee bank records. That reconciliation was performed and no material misstatements of receipt or expenditure activity was disclosed. The beginning and ending cash balances were mis-stated on some reports due to apparent errors made when the balances were taken from committee ledgers. The reports filed do not cover the specified periods in some cases, however, with the exception of the period 9/22 - 30/78, all activity is reported. The activity occurring in that period is not material. For the corrected receipt, expenditure, and cash balance figures, based on coverage dates as filed (see Attachment I).

With respect to the continuous reporting of debts and obligations, the records verify that the debts questioned in the referral were paid by the Committee though the payments were not recorded on Schedule C. They were reported as appropriate on Schedule B.

Finally, the records contained no further information concerning the candidate loan.

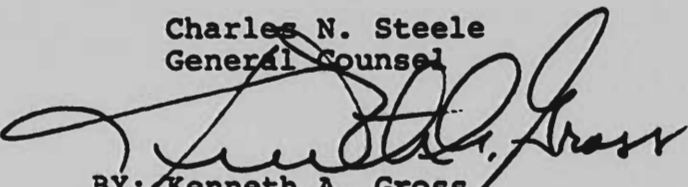

BACKGROUND

The Reports Analysis Division's review of the reports of Taylor for U.S. Senate revealed the following cash flow discrepancies. The Committee's July 10, 1978 report showed \$4,341.64 on hand at the end of the reporting period, but on the next report, the tenth day pre-primary report dated August 22, 1978, there was a balance of \$2,021.64 on hand at the beginning of the reporting period for a discrepancy of \$2,320.00. This tenth day pre-primary report disclosed also \$2,218.89 on hand at the end of the reporting period but the thirtieth day post primary report dated September 22, 1978 indicated \$3,117.94 on hand at the beginning of the reporting period, a discrepancy of \$899.05.

Additionally, the Committee disclosed but failed continuously to report debts totalling \$16,358 and failed to disclose the nature of a candidate loan in the amount of \$15,000 during these reporting periods.

The Committee's treasurer failed to respond to the Commission's September 11, 1979 reason to believe letter and to several telephone requests for an explanation of the cash flow discrepancies and amendments with respect to the debts.

However, in response to the Commission's Order to answer questions, the treasurer simply submitted all of the original books and records of the committee, indicating orally by telephone that he lacked the ability to answer the questions on his own. A review of the materials submitted indicated that the discrepancies, errors and omissions are probably the result of careless or sloppy bookkeeping. For example, the Committee's checkbooks had never been reconciled with the bank statements. In fact, at least half of the bank statements had never been opened and were submitted to us still sealed in envelopes from the banks. The result was that the cash on hand figures

reported to the Commission never even approximated the total bank balance according to the statements.

LEGAL ANALYSIS

Although there are clear violations of 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(1) and § 434(b)(12), it appears that the violations were the result of careless bookkeeping and accounting by a treasurer who acknowledges that he lacks the requisite skills. To pursue this matter further would require a reconstruction of the committee's financial files. We do not believe that this would be a worthwhile use of resources in view of the amount of money involved and the fact that the committee has not been active since the 1978 election. Accordingly, this office recommends that the MUR be closed.


RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Take no further action and close the file.

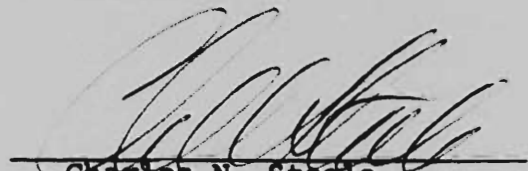
INTERIM INVESTIGATIVE REPORT #3

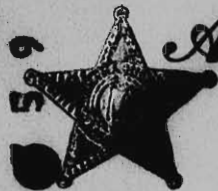
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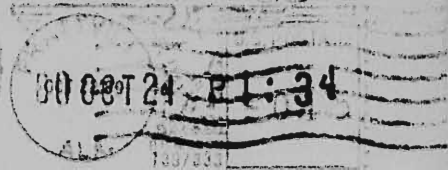

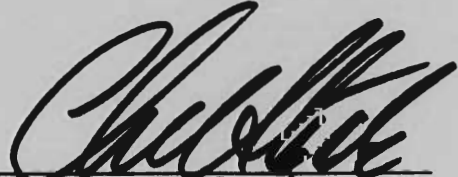

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

The Reports Analysis Division's review of the report of Taylor for U.S. Senate revealed the following cash flow discrepancies. The Committee's July 10, 1978 report reported \$4,341.64 on hand at the end of the reporting period, but the next report, the tenth day pre-primary report dated August 22, 1978 reported \$2,021.64 on hand at the beginning of the reporting period, a discrepancy of \$2,320.00. Similarly, the tenth day pre-primary report disclosed \$2,218.89 on hand at the end of the reporting period, but the thirtieth day post primary report dated September 22, 1978 indicated \$3,117.94 on hand at the beginning of the reporting period, a discrepancy of \$899.05.

Additionally, the Committee disclosed but failed to continuously report debts totalling \$16,358 and failed to disclose the nature of a candidate loan in the amount of \$15,000 during these reporting periods.

The Committee's treasurer failed to respond to the Commission's September 11, 1979 reason to believe letter and has failed to respond to repeated telephone requests for an explanation of the cash flow discrepancies and amendments with respect to the debts.
