

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

This matter was initiated by a complaint filed with the Commission on August 25, 1976, by Bruce Bradley, a candidate for the U.S. Senate from Maryland. The complaint alleged that 17 political clubs in the Baltimore area had not filed reports with the Commission although they had received payments in excess of \$1,000 from the Sarbanes for Senate Committee.


On September 28, 1976, the Commission found reason to believe the 17 political clubs named by Bradley violated 2 U.S.C. §433 and §434. Through the signing of conciliation agreements and/or voluntary compliance the Commission has already terminated action with respect to 12 of the 17 clubs.

On February 23, 1978, the Commission instructed the General Counsel to submit proposed conciliation agreements to the Vanguard Political Organization, Inc. and the Citco Democratic Organization. Signed agreements (Attachments I and II) have been received from both organizations. The Commission also approved the conciliation agreement signed by the Hampden Democratic Club.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Approve the conciliation agreements signed by the Vanguard Political Organization, Inc. and the Citco Democratic Organization.



GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

This matter was initiated by a complaint filed with the Commission on August 25, 1978, by Bruce Bradley, a candidate for the U.S. Senate from Maryland. The complaint alleged that 17 political clubs in the Baltimore area had not filed reports with the Commission although they had received payments in excess of \$1,000 from the Sarbanes for Senate Committee.

On September 28, 1976, the Commission found reason to believe the 17 political clubs named by Bradley violated 2 U.S.C. §433 and § 434.

The Commission voted on February 23, 1978, to withhold action with respect to three of the clubs (5 in 5 Democratic Club, Inc., Fourth District Democratic Organization, and the People's Democratic Action Organization) pending resolution of the issues raised in MUR 500. MUR 500 involves alleged contributions to these clubs by MEBA-PAC which were not reported by the clubs as required by the Act.

The Commission has already terminated action with respect to 12 of the 17 clubs. Signed conciliation agreements have been received from two others which OGC has recommended the Commission approve. If the Commission approves the two


conciliation agreements there will then be only the three clubs also included in MUR 500 left to consider in this matter.

We therefore believe that if the Commission approves the conciliation agreements it would be more efficient to merge MUR 223 with MUR 500 and continue compliance action against the 5 in 5 Democratic Club, Inc., Fourth District Democratic Organization, and People's Democratic Action Organization through MUR 500.

RECOMMENDATION

Merge MUR 223 with MUR 500.

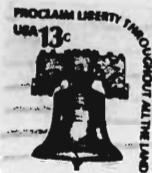

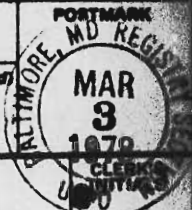



The Commission previously determined that there was probable cause to believe that the following clubs violated the provisions of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434 and authorized the filing of civil actions against them:

1. 5 in 5 Democratic Club, Inc.
2. Hampden Democratic Club
3. Fourth District Democratic Org.
(AKA Fourth District Campaign Club)
4. People's Democratic Action Org.
5. Vanguard Political Organization
6. Citco Democratic Club

After receiving notification of the Commission's authorization to file a civil suit and prior to the complaints being finalized, all of the above clubs submitted statements of organization and disclosure reports. In view of the Commission's policy in favor of voluntary compliance, we prepared conciliation agreements for each club. The Hampden Democratic Club and the 5 in 5 Democratic Club executed conciliation agreements and they are attached hereto. The Fourth District Democratic Organization has not returned the agreement submitted to it. The remaining agreements are attached hereto and are ready for submission to the clubs.

Subsequent to the Commission's probable cause finding, we learned that two of these clubs--5 in 5 and People's--may have failed to report a contribution of \$5,000 received by each of them in April 1976 from the Marine Engineers Beneficial Association PAC (MEBA-PAC). This matter is the subject of MUR 500.

In view of this new information and the General Counsel's recommendations in MUR 500, I am not recommending approval of the conciliation agreement signed by the 5 in 5 Democratic Club.

I am recommending that the agreement signed by the Hampden Democratic Club be approved. This agreement contains an admission that the club was a political committee subject to the registration and disclosure provisions of the Act and it failed to register and file reports as required by the Act. We have not made provisions for a penalty because we believe this is a case of first impression, the expenditures involved were small, and there appears to have been no willful intent to violate the Act by initially failing to register and report.

I am also recommending that the conciliation agreements attached hereto for the Vanguard Political Organization and the Citco Democratic Club be submitted to them for execution. These agreements contain essentially the same provisions as the one executed by the Hampden Democratic Club.

With respect to the Fourth District Democratic Organization and the People's Democratic Action Organization, I am recommending that no action be taken at this time pending receipt of information regarding the MEBA-PAC contributions. The treasurer of Fourth

District Democratic Organization is attempting to obtain information from its bank on the original source of the \$5,000 contribution which the club disclosed on its report of receipts and expenditures. The People's Democratic Action Organization will be notified in accordance with the recommendation in MUR 500.

In view of the substantial voluntary compliance of all six clubs in this matter, we believe it may be appropriate to rescind the authorization to file suit against these clubs. We have at least two vehicles open for assuring compliance in the event the matters raised in MUR 500 constitute violations: (1) suing on the compliance agreements executed by the clubs involved therein or; (2) filing suit on the basis of the matters arising in MUR 500.

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter having been initiated by a signed, sworn, and notarized complaint by Bruce Bradley, and after investigation, the Commission having found reasonable cause to believe that 5 In 5 Democratic Club (hereinafter respondent) violated 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434:

Now, therefore, the Commission and respondent, having duly entered into conciliation as provided for in 2 U.S.C. §437g(a) (5), do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Federal Election Commission has jurisdiction over the respondent and the subject matter of this case.

II. Respondent has had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

A. Respondent received contributions and made expenditures on behalf of a Federal candidate exceeding \$1,000 during 1976.

B. Respondent failed to file a statement of organization as required by 2 U.S.C. §433.

C. Respondent failed to file timely reports of its receipts and expenditures on June 17, 1976, July 10, 1976, October 10, 1976, October 23, 1976 and December 2, 1976, as required by 2 U.S.C. §434.

D. On November 29, 1977, respondent filed a statement of organization and FEC Forms 3 and 3a publicly disclosing certain contributions and expenditures made on behalf of Federal candidates as required by 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434.

WHEREFORE, Respondent agrees:

A. That it was a "political committee" as defined in 2 U.S.C. §431(d) and subject to the registration and disclosure provisions of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434.

B. That it failed to register as a political committee or file reports of receipts and expenditures as required by 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434.

IV. General Conditions

A. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.



Mr. Clarence Mitchell dropped in to see me today to protest against our proceedings with respect to the Baltimore political clubs. His wife, Mrs. Juanita Mitchell, and another attorney were, he advised me, meeting with Gloria Sulton at the same time.

Mr. Mitchell asserted (1) that inordinate publicity and Commission resources were being spent on a trivial matter and (2) that the black political clubs in Baltimore had been singled out for adverse action. I believe that I was able to convince him that the second proposition was unfounded.

Mr. Mitchell stated that he wished to appear before the Commission to urge the impropriety of its course. I advised him that it was unlikely that the Commission would accord him such an opportunity, but he stated that he would submit such a request in writing.







I. Allegations

II. Previous Commission Action and Facts

Complainant submitted a list of political clubs in Baltimore, Maryland, (See Attached Exhibit A), which was compiled from reports of receipts and expenditures submitted by the Sarbanes Committee. The Sarbanes Committee reported expenditures to each of these clubs ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000 on its July 10, 1976, report.

These expenditures were reported by the Sarbanes Committee as having been made for "ballots and canvass[ing]," "Ballots and Campaign[ing]" and "Democratic Ballot." Complainant characterized these payments as "walking around money." The Sarbanes Committee was advised on September 29, 1976, that the allegations in the complaint did not give the Commission reason to believe it had committed violations of 2 U.S.C. §434.

On September 28, 1976, the Commission found reason to believe the clubs identified on Exhibit A hereto committed violations of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434. The initial 48-hour report indicated that one committee (Pica for Congress) of the 17 identified by the complainant had filed and reported, although no specific finding was made or notification sent to that committee by the Commission at that time. Thus, 16 clubs (excluding the Pica for Congress Committee) were notified and all responded except the People's Democratic Action Organization. Their responses indicated receipt of the monies reported by the Sarbanes Committee and use of the monies generally for printing and distribution of literature, rental of halls, and payments to workers.

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On February 17, 1977, the Commission found reasonable cause to believe against these 16 committees. Fifteen of the 16 clubs were notified on March 9, 1977, of this determination. The United Third District Democratic Organization was not notified because it had registered and reported to the Commission. A follow-up letter was sent to the 15 respondents on April 8, 1977, enclosing reporting and registration forms and giving the filing dates and other information to assist them in completing the forms.

Although several committees responded to the April 8, 1977, letter, it was clear that they did not understand how to properly complete the forms. On May 27, 1977, a letter was sent to each club enclosing a Conciliation Agreement. This letter also informed each club that Mrs. Sulton of the General Counsel's staff would be available to assist them at the Commission's offices on June 13, 1977. This invitation was accepted by representatives of four of the clubs. Two of these representatives brought their books and records and prepared reports at the Commission. Mrs. Sulton was assisted by Mrs. Carroll Bowen from the Disclosure Division.

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Another effort was made to assist the parties in preparing the reports when, on July 21, 1977, Mrs. Sulton and Mrs. Bowen traveled to Baltimore to meet with the clubs. Representatives from five of the clubs met with them and several reports were completed at that time.

To date, the following respondents have filed statements of organization and reports of receipts and expenditures:

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Telephone contact was made with a representative of the Citco Club and later this representative attended the meeting of the club. The treasurer of the 4th District Democratic Club visited the Commission, unannounced, in June 1977. She indicated that her work with the club was as a volunteer and she did not know that acceptance of the office included the filing of forms with the Commission. No further contact has been made with the club. Our last letter to the 4th District Democratic Organization, the Five and Five Democratic Club, and the Vanguard Political Organization was returned as undeliverable.

The Freedom to Choose Democratic Club filed a statement of organization and a disclosure report on FEC Form 6 (short form). We advised this club in a letter dated April 8, 1977, of certain errors or omissions in its statement of organization. The organization was further advised that FEC Form 6 was inappropriate and the

period was incorrect. Despite this letter and two subsequent ones, no further response from that organization has been received. We were advised in a telephone message left by an attorney that the Chairman of the Freedom to Choose Club was serving a sentence at the federal prison in Lewisburg, Pennsylvania. A subsequent telephone call to the former treasurer on August 12, 1977, has not been returned.

III. Analysis and Recommendations

A. With respect to the United Third District Democratic Organization, we recommend that the Commission find no reasonable cause to believe it violated the provisions of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434.

B. With respect to the eight clubs listed below, we recommend that the Commission ratify the Conciliation Agreements submitted by them and attached hereto (these clubs filed statements of organization and reports of receipts and expenditures):

1. The Action Team
2. Metro Campaign Committee
3. Staszak Democratic Team
4. Eastside Democratic Organization

We further recommend that civil suits be filed against the six above organizations.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Bruce Bradley, a candidate for U.S. Senate in Maryland, alleged, in a complaint filed with the Commission on August 25, 1976, that 17 political clubs in Baltimore received payments from the Sarbanes for Senate Committee (hereinafter Sarbanes Committee) in excess of \$1,000; and that receipt of these funds by the clubs triggered the registration and reporting obligations under the Act.

The treasurer of the 4th District Democratic Club visited the Commission, unannounced, in June, 1977. She indicated that her work with the club was as a volunteer and she did not know that acceptance of the office included the filing of forms with the Commission. No further contact has been made with the club. Our last letter to the 4th District Democratic Organization, the Five and Five Democratic Club, and the Vanguard Political Organization was returned as undeliverable.

The Freedom to Choose Democratic Club filed a statement of organization and a disclosure report on FEC Form 6 (short form). We advised this club in a letter dated April 8, 1977 of certain errors or omissions in its statement of organization. The organization was further advised that FEC Form 6 was inappropriate and the reporting period was incorrect. Despite

this letter and two subsequent ones, no further response from that organization has been received. We were advised in a telephone message left by an attorney that the Chairman of the Freedom to Choose Club was serving a sentence at the federal prison in Lewisburg, Pennsylvania. A subsequent telephone call to the former treasurer on August 12, 1977, has not been returned.

III. Analysis and Recommendations

A. With respect to the United Third Democratic Organization, we recommend that the Commission find no reasonable cause to believe it violated the provisions of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434.

B. With respect to the eight clubs listed below, we recommend that the Commission ratify the Conciliation Agreements submitted by them and attached hereto (these clubs filed statements of organization and reports of receipts and expenditures):

1. The Action Team
2. Metro Campaign Committee
3. Staszak Democratic Team
4. Eastside Democratic Organization
5. The New 47th District Democratic Organization
6. 46th Legislative District Official Democratic Ballot
7. Holden J. Hodges Organization
8. The Regular Third District Democratic Organization--Campaign '76.

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C. With respect to the Freedom to Choose Democratic Club, we recommend that the Commission find no reasonable cause to believe it violated the provisions of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434 based upon substantial voluntary compliance.

D. We recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that the organizations listed below committed violations of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434:

1. Citco Democratic Club
2. 4th District Democratic Organization
3. Five and Five Democratic Club
4. Hampden Democratic Club
5. People's Democratic Action Organization
6. Vanguard Political Organization, Inc.

We recommend, however, that no further action be taken against these respondents for the following reasons:

1. Exhaustive efforts have been made by the Commission staff to conciliate this matter. Over 60 hours have been spent by an attorney on this case since May 4, 1977--2 1/2 months after the RCTB determination. Numerous letters have been sent (March 9, April 8, May 27 and July 21, 1977) to these 15 respondents; numerous telephone calls have been placed during this investigation; a reports analyst has assisted in the review of the reports filed; and two staff members have spent at least ten hours each in personal conferences with representatives of these clubs.

2. We have carefully considered the probable commitment of additional time to prepare these cases for litigation and

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estimate that approximately 15 hours of staff time would be required per respondent merely to file one complaint. Further commitment of time for six respondents who received an average of \$1,833 each from the Sarbanes Committee in the primary elections does not seem warranted. We also anticipate, based on our previous experience with these clubs, that considerable time would be consumed in preparing and filing the complaint and other motions, reviewing reports submitted, and making necessary court appearances. We doubt that the final disposition of such litigation will significantly enhance disclosure.

3. We question whether service can be perfected (and jurisdiction thus obtained) over these organizations.


2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(5)(B) provides that the Commission may institute a civil action upon a determination of probable cause to believe a violation of the Act has occurred. We recommend that the Commission exercise its discretion in this case by taking no further action.

E. We recommend that the Commission expressly find no reason to believe the Pica for Congress Committee committed violations of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434 and so advise it in writing.

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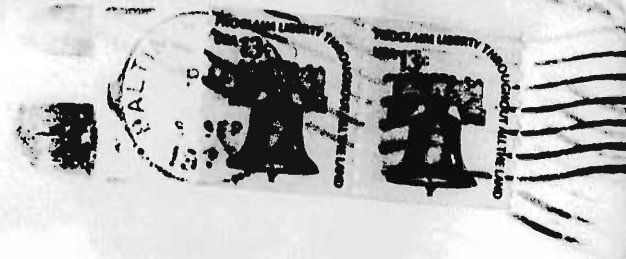

5. That the article referred to in paragraph 4 above was a communication by the corporation reporting, among other things, upon the outcome of the 2nd Congressional District Republican primary. Section 441b(b)(2)(A) since it was distributed to persons other than "stockholders and executive or administrative personnel and their families." However a controversy exists with respect to whether such communication was "in connection with (a

Another change that probably should be incorporated into the final Agreement is that the Chimes, Jr. edition in question was published on August 6, 1976 rather than August 13, 1976. We have not been able to determine how the mistaken date crept into the picture - probably the same elf that slipped in the article.

This acknowledges receipt of the Statement of Organization and a report of receipts and expenditures filed on behalf of the Freedom to Choose Democratic Club, Inc.

Subsequent to your telephone discussion with Mrs. Sulton of my staff regarding this matter, a determination was made that all receipts and all expenditures by your club should be reported since state and local funds were co-mingled with Federal funds. In view of this, your statement of organization should be amended in question 8(b) to include the names of state and local candidates supported. Further, question 10 should be completed.

Since the Freedom to Choose Democratic Club, Inc. is not the principal campaign committee of a candidate, FEC Form 3, instead of Form 6 should be used to report receipts and expenditures.

To further assist you in complying with the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Laws, the following information is submitted for your guidance.

Your first report of receipts and expenditures should cover the period beginning on the date you received contributions exceeding \$1,000 with respect to a Federal election through June 7, 1976. This report is a post-election (primary) report. Your next report should cover the period June 8, through June 30, 1976. This is the July 10, 1976 report. The next reporting period begins July 1 and ends September 30, 1976. This is the October 10 quarterly report. The

pre-election (general) report covers the period October 1 through October 18, 1976. The post-election (general) report covers the period October 19, through November 22, 1976. The last report for 1976 covers the period November 23 through December 31, 1976, and is the annual report, normally due January 31, 1977. See Part 104, Proposed Regulations.

All political committees are required to file pre- and post-election reports if they supported Federal candidates in an election. See §§100.5 and 100.6 definitions, Proposed Regulations. All political committees are required to file an annual report, unless terminated prior to the reporting period.

Since the contribution received by your committee with respect to a Federal election was received after the pre-primary election period, your first report is a post-primary report covering the period through June 7, 1976.

The reports of receipts and expenditures discussed above should be filed on FEC Form 3 (forms were previously sent to you). If your receipts or expenditures were \$1,000 or less during a calendar quarter, FEC Form 3a (postcard form) may be filed in lieu of Form 3. See 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(C); §104.4(d), Proposed Regulations. A political committee is required to report so long as it has outstanding debts and obligations. See §104.8, Proposed Regulations.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. Allegations

Bruce Bradley, a candidate for U.S. Senate in Maryland, alleged, in a complaint filed with the Commission on August 25, 1976, that 16 political clubs in Baltimore received payments from the Sarbanes for Senate Committee (hereinafter Sarbanes Committee) in excess of \$1,000 and that receipt of these funds by the clubs triggers the registration and reporting obligations under the Act.

The allegations against the Sarbanes Committee and the Pica for Congress Committee were dismissed.

II. Evidence

Complainant submitted a list of political clubs in Baltimore, Maryland (See attached Ex. A) which was compiled from reports of receipts and expenditures submitted by the Sarbanes Committee (Exhibit B). The Sarbanes report **disclosed** expenditures to each of these clubs ranging from

\$1,000 to \$5,000 on its July 10, 1976 report. These expenditures were reported by the Sarbanes Committee as having been made for "ballots and canvass[ing]," "Ballots and Campaign[ing]" and "Democratic Ballot." Complainant characterizes these payments as "walking around money."

On January 28, 1976 the Commission found reason to believe the clubs listed below had violated the provisions of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434. All clubs were notified. Each club's response follows:

1. The Fourth District Democratic Organization responded through its treasurer by submitting an accounting of the money received from the Sarbanes Committee. This accounting lists expenditures for bulk mailing, ads and office salaries. The total is \$1,574.47. The Sarbanes Committee report shows a disbursement of \$1,500 to this organization on May 6, 1976. (See attachment).

2. The Five and Five Democratic Club responded on October 8, 1976 through counsel, S. Ronald Ellison. Counsel's opinion is that this Club does not have to register or report under the Act but indicates a willingness to do so "if the burden of filing and preparing a report is not too onerous" The Sarbanes Committee reported a disbursement to this club on May 6, 1976 in the amount of \$2,000. Upon request, Mr. Ellison advised by letter dated November 9, 1976 that the Sarbanes money was used to print ballots, pay election day workers for pre-election canvassing and election day poll

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activites. (See Attachment).

3. Maryland State Senator Harry J. McGuirk replied for the Stonewall Democratic Club (referring to it as the Action Team) indicating a belief that the club did not have to register or file reports. He enclosed a copy of the report filed with the State which discloses a \$5,000 receipt from Sarbanes for Senate on May 10, 1976. He states that the disbursements for literature and publicity were in connection with the primary. The Stonewall Club authorized the use of these funds by the Action Team. (Reply attached).

4. Louis Cavallaro, Treasurer of the Staszak Democratic Team, advised us that the \$5,000 receipt from Sarbanes for Senate was used for the distribution of literature. (See reply attached).

5. Vanguard Political Organization Incorporated replied through its treasurer, Herbert Brown, that it does not regard itself as a political committee because it is a bipartisan organization. Telephone contact was made on October 21, 1976 with the treasurer who explained that the club accepted Democrats and Republicans into its membership and voted on which candidates(s) to support in the election. He confirmed in a letter dated November 2, 1976 that the Club distributed literature before and on election day, made telephone calls and purchased refreshments for workers with the funds received from the Sarbanes Committee.

6. The Regular Third District Democratic Organization Campaign '76 responded through its treasurer, Leo M. Welsh. Mr. Welsh raised doubts as to his organization having to file with the Commission. He supplied a copy of the report submitted to the state and indicated that the \$2,500 received from Sarbanes for Senate was paid to precinct workers for "distribution of literature and advertisement."

7. The Freedom to Choose Democratic Club responded on October 11, 1976 advising that the \$1,500 check from the Sarbanes Committee was used to distribute literature on behalf of Mr. Sarbanes. (See attached).

8. Mr. Richard Anzengruber, Treasurer of the New 47th District Democratic Organization telephoned Mrs. Sulton of my staff and indicated receipt of our letter on October 9, 1976. He stated in that conversation that he was willing to file with the Commission with respect to his organization's activities on behalf of Mr. Sarbanes. He requested forms and a copy of the Act. On October 28, 1976, he sent a written response which states that the funds received from the Sarbanes Committee were distributed among 30 ward executives to pay poll workers on election day.

9. Mr. Joseph G. Finnerty, in reply to our letter addressed to him as Treasurer of the United Third District

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Democratic Organization (hereinafter United Third Organization) stated that he was not its treasurer but was treasurer of the Curran for Congress Committee. (See attached letter). A follow-up telephone call to Mr. Finnerty elicited the name of Russell Milburn as Chairman or Treasurer of this organization. A telephone call was made to Mr. Milburn who confirmed that he was treasurer of the organization, which he described as an authorized committee of J. Joseph Curran, candidate for Congress from Maryland. He further stated that the organization had filed a pre-primary report (on Maryland forms) with the Federal Election Commission but that his records did not disclose a receipt of \$3,500 from the Sarbanes Committee. A review of the report substantiates this. Further telephone contact with Mr. Milburn disclosed that the reporting entity -- United Third District Democratic Organization -- 1976 Congressional Committee -- was a spinoff of the United Third District Democratic Organization.

Mr. Finnerty, Treasurer of the Curran for Congress Committee, in the telephone conversation, acknowledged receipt of \$3,500 from the Sarbanes Committee which it reported. He stated that the money was used per agreement between the candidates for printing and distribution of election day ballots and no allocation of the disbursements applicable to each candidate was made since it was a joint effort.

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A further review of the Sarbanes reports disclosed an amendment to its post-primary report which reflects the receipt of this \$3,500 as being the Curran for Congress Committee.

10. The Metro Democratic Club responded on October 11, 1976; however, the letter was not received. Telephone contact was made and a subsequent letter was sent on November 1, 1976. The Treasurer advised that the funds received from Sarbanes for Senate were used to print ballots, man an election headquarters and mail literature. (See attached).

11. The Eastside Democratic Organization answered our correspondence on November 10, 1976 indicating that the money received from Sarbanes for Senate was used to distribute pre-election literature, transportation costs, and ballot distribution on election day. It also provided a cost breakdown for each activity. (See attached).

12. Ms. Lillian Goscinski, replied as Treasurer of the 46th Legislative District Official Democratic Ballot on October 5, 1976. She acknowledged receipt of a \$1,750 payment from Sarbanes for Senate. She further provided an accounting of the funds -- \$225 toward printing and \$1,525 for ballot and political literature distribution. (See reply attached).

clubs are political committee within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. §431(d) and subject to the registration and reporting requirements of the Act. A political committee is defined as "any committee, club, association, or other group of persons which receives contributions or makes expenditures during a calendar year in an aggregate amount exceeding \$1,000." A contribution or expenditure is a gift, advance, purchase, payment, etc. "made for the purpose of . . . influencing the nomination for election, or election, of any person to Federal office" 2 U.S.C. §§431(e) and (f).

A strict reading of §§431(e) and (f) would require each of these respondents which received in excess of \$1,000 with respect to a Federal election to register and report under 2 U.S.C. §433 and §434.

On the other hand, two facts in this case seemingly argue against the strict reading of the Act:

- 1) the funds at issue were not independently raised by the clubs;
- 2) the clubs did not have complete control over the use of the money, because the funds were given to render certain services, i.e. for printing sample ballots and for distributing these

The monies transferred to the clubs can be considered gifts or advances or deposits of money which were given for the

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13. The Hampden Democratic Club responded on October 8, 1976 through a Ms. Mary E. Burns (capacity unknown). She supplied a copy of a report filed with the State of Maryland which lists a receipt of \$1,000 from Sarbanes for Senate '76. A listing of expenditures is also included with all disbursements in cash. (See attached reply).

14. The Citco Democratic Club answered through its treasurer and attached thereto a listing of disbursements "in support of Representatives Paul Sarbanes." Expenditures were made for printing costs, rental of hall, signs and payments to individuals are listed. (See response attached).

15. The Holden J. Hodges Organization replied through its treasurer. James K. Loetz, and namesake, Holden J. Hodges. They report that the funds received from the Sarbanes for Senate Committee were given to precinct workers for distribution of ballots and also used for printing costs. They will provide an accounting of the funds if necessary. (See attached reply).

16. The letter to the People's Democratic Action Organization was returned without a forwarding address. The correct address was determined and notification has been forwarded. No responses has been received and telephone calls have not been returned.

III. Analysis

The issue to be decided is whether these 16 political

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materials. In this view, the clubs would be viewed simply as Sarbanes' agents for the expenditures, and their spending over \$1,000 of his money would not constitute the statutory \$1,000 which triggers the reporting requirements of 2 U.S.C. §433(a). This interpretation would also seem to be consistent with the Commission's notice of September 29, 1976, which put the primary burden on candidates and committees of providing particulars of all expenditures.

In the General Counsel's view these factors do not take the political club outside the statutory definition of a committee, and should not lift the reporting requirements of the Act. Requiring reporting from both the candidate and from the clubs which eventually spent the funds will generally further the primary purpose of assuring disclosure to the public of campaign receipts and disbursements, allowing the purposes of the expenditures to be found both in the candidate reports and the committee reports. There is no reason that making the clubs also responsible should diminish the requirements that the candidate report the particulars of transactions which, as here, are under his direction and control.

With one exception, all the clubs here have, in response to our inquiries, provided more or less detailed particulars as to how the money was spent. Moreover, in an informal telephone conversation the treasurer of Sarbanes for Senate advised that the

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committee would be willing to disclose the particulars consistent with the September 29, 1976 notice.

IV. Recommendation

Find reasonable cause to believe that the clubs failure to report independently was a violation of 2 U.S.C. §433 and §434. Send attached letter to all of them.

NOTICE TO ALL CANDIDATES AND COMMITTEES

During the course of the review of reports of contributions and expenditures, the Commission has noted that some committees and candidates are failing to fully describe the purpose of itemized expenditures, see §102.9 of the Commission's proposed regulations and 2 U.S.C. §432(d).

As required by the statute, the "particulars" of each over-\$100 expenditure must be reported. Entries such as "advance to fieldman" or "travel" are not sufficient to meet the statutory requirement. An advance to staff is not an expenditure, but rather an intra-committee transfer. The actual use to which the advance is put must be itemized. For example, if a fieldman receives a \$500 advance and spends \$250 to rent a hall; \$125 on posters; and \$125 on meals and lodging, each of those expenditures must be specifically itemized. Expenditures of \$100 or less need not be itemized, but must be aggregated and reported as unitemized expenditures. Back-up material for these expenditures should be maintained.

The Commission notes that some committees and candidates are not maintaining receipted bills or invoices as back-up for expenditures. The proposed regulations permit a canceled check and a contemporaneous memorandum to be kept instead of a receipted bill. That type of back-up may be used only if a receipted bill is not available, since a canceled check/memorandum back-up usually does not provide as much information as a bill or invoice.







Any person who violates any of the provisions of Section 26 is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined not more than one thousand dollars, or be imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in the discretion of the court.



I am responding as per our telephone conversation of October 26th, 1976.

The New 47th District Democratic Organization received a payment of \$1650.00, from the Sarbanes for Senate Committee prior to the primary election of 1976.

This money was designated for expenses incurred by the organization in providing workers at the polls on primary election day.

The New 47th covers five Wards, comprised of thirty precincts, with one ward having fifteen precincts, three having four each and one having three.

Each Ward has a Ward Executive and each precinct, a precinct captain and several workers. With the Ward executive overseeing the precinct captain's and the Captain's overseeing the workers.

I dispersed, on behalf of the New 47th, to each Ward Executive \$55.00 for each precinct in his particular ward. He in turn disperses the money to the precinct captains who in turn pays the individual workers.

This work was performed by persons within the precinct in which they resided. The funds were channeled through EDO to convert the check to cash, since the cashing of checks is a big problem in these poor areas of the City. The funds were, however disbursed in the following fashion:

(a) Pre-election Day distribution	\$ 200.00
(b) Election Day driving reimbursement	500.00
(c) Election Day poll ballot	2,300.00

The above information is presented to show that EDO does not fall within the definition of a "political committee," since it only performed a service for the bonafide registered committee.



We, however do not believe this is the case, since EDO's only function was to provide The Sarbanes for Senate Committee assistance by performing the following functions:

- (a) Pre-election Day literature distribution
- (b) Election Day driving reimbursement
- (c) Election Day poll ballot distribution

This work was performed by persons within the precinct in which they resided. The funds were channeled through EDO to convert the check to cash, since the cashing of checks is a big problem in these poor areas of the City. The funds were, however disbursed in the following fashion:

(a) Pre-election Day distribution	\$ 200.00
(b) Election Day driving reimbursement	500.00
(c) Election Day poll ballot	2,300.00
TOTAL	\$3,000.00

The above information is presented to show that EDO does not fall within the definition of a "political committee," since it only performed a service for the bonafide registered committee.



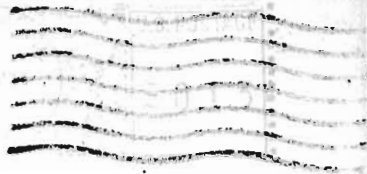

I am responding as per our telephone conversation of October 26th, 1976.

The New 47th District Democratic Organization received a payment of \$1650.00, from the Sarbanes for Senate Committee prior to the primary election of 1976.

This money was designated for expenses incurred by the organization in providing workers at the polls on primary election day.

The New 47th covers five Wards, comprised of thirty precincts, with one ward having fifteen precincts, three having four each and one having three.

Each Ward has a Ward Executive and each precinct, a precinct captain and several workers. With the Ward executive overseeing the precinct captain's and the Captain's overseeing the workers.

I dispersed, on behalf of the New 47th, to each Ward Executive \$55.00 for each precinct in his particular ward. He in turn disperses the money to the precinct captains who in turn pays the individual workers.

Thirty precincts at \$55.00 per, comes to \$1650.00, accounting for the expenditures of the total payment from the Sarbanes for Senate Committee.

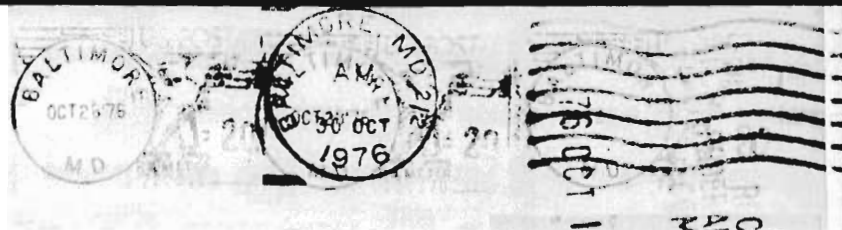





Walk-Around Money As Baltimorean As Crabs And Beer

By RICH HOLLANDER

Walking around money is like baseball — some pitch and others catch. When it comes to an election, the political bosses do the catching.

— A former precinct worker.

No one knows precisely when or where Baltimore's curious institution known as walk-around money took root in the city.

For that matter, no one knows when it will end.

One arm-chair historian of electoral history believes that the practice of passing out money to political operatives on election day conservatively dates back more than a hundred years.

Miniatures of liquor were handed out around the turn of the century to the faithful workers in the precincts, but the temperance folks eventually clamped down on the practice and shut the saloons on election day.

What can be said with historical certainty is that the tradition of walk-around money began to flourish in Baltimore, as in other large cities, during the heyday of the bosses. It was among a large politically unsophisticated immigrant population and their children that the symbiotic relationship between voter and boss reached unparalleled levels of organization and power.

With new waves of immigrants no longer in need of those special services that the boss provided, the system itself has all but receded into folklore. Somehow the practice of handing out money survives.

Stories abound of suburbanites returning to their parents' precincts in the city on election day to pick up \$20 from the boss and stand around the polls handing out sample ballots.

Along with a tradition survives the controversy. In

walk-around money as a cardinal sin. But then, he has little hope of taking South Baltimore on election day.

It is the kind of issue that invites rationalization, gnaws at the conscience of genuine reformers and casts doubt upon all election returns.

Simply stated, in much of Baltimore candidates pass out considerable sums of money to Democratic club leaders who in turn supposedly put the money into the hands of their workers who perform a variety of election day activities. Often the cash reaches the clubs weeks before election day and the candidate is serviced accordingly.

The going pay scale ranges from \$15 to \$25 a day depending on the locale and how much, if anything, the boss skins off the top. It's that skimming that has given walk-around money its unsavory aura, and the Federal Elections Commission recently issued a ruling saying the clubs must report where they spend the money. The FEC, however, didn't issue specific guidelines.

For their money the precinct worker is expected to get the voter to the polls. If it means phoning his neighbors, he calls. If it means driving them to the polls, he drives. If it means standing in the rain handing out sample ballots, he gets wet.

And the fact is, that the Baltimore boss still delivers the vote on election day with the regularity of Santa Claus on Christmas eve.

Apologists for the system can be found among liberals, conservatives and most anywhere in between.

City Council President Walter S. Orlinsky fashions himself as a liberal. Yet he has no qualms about distributing funds to the clubs of South, East or West Baltimore.

"Yeah," says Orlinsky, "I could hire a fancy public relations firm, who have people from out of town, who will do all the things a Joe Staszak does on election day."

But Orlinsky would sooner use the "indigenous base" rather than "hire Hessians" to canvass, turn out rallies and distribute those ever-present ballots.

This matter came before the Commission as a result of a complaint filed by Mr. Bruce Bradley. A copy of the complaint is enclosed herewith. Mrs. Sulton of my staff advises me that she spoke to you on October 15, 1976, after learning from Mr. Joseph G. Finnerty that he was not the Treasurer of the United Third District Democratic Organization, but that you were associated with that group. You confirmed in that conversation that you were the Treasurer.

I am enclosing a copy of the letter addressed to Mr. Finnerty which apprises you of the relevant provisions of the Act and of your opportunity to respond. Based upon the information you related to Mrs. Sulton, we are checking our records for the pre-primary report from your organization. We would, however, appreciate a written response to the allegations reiterating information you gave to Mrs. Sulton and any other material you may wish to submit. This matter will be presented to the Commission within the next week and a prompt response would be appreciated so that it may be included in the report.

I am responding to your letter of August 12, 1976 concerning receipt by Curran For Congress of Thirty five hundred dollars (\$3500.00) from Sarbanes group.

In the Thirtieth Day Post - Election Report filed on behalf of Curran for Congress, those funds were reported and on that Report the transaction was described as a transfer of funds and not a contribution. The transaction was so reported because those funds were received by Curran for Congress from the campaign funds collected on behalf of Paul S. Sarbanes who was a candidate in the Democratic Primary for United States Senate. The Congressional District in which J. Joseph Curran, Jr. was running in the Democratic Primary was within the same geographical area in which Mr. Sarbanes was running for Senate. Under an agreement between the two candidates, the Curran campaign agreed to expend those funds on behalf of Mr. Sarbanes by printing election day ballots urging voters to support the candidacy of Mr. Sarbanes and by paying the costs of distributing those ballots on and before the date of the Primary Election. The \$3500.00 payment was therefore to cover the cost of those expenses and those funds did not constitute a contribution by the Sarbanes group to Curran for Congress.

I, Bruce Bradley, hereby amend my complaint filed August 20, 1976 with the Commission against the Sarbanes for Senate Committee of Maryland. According to reports filed with the F.E.C. by the Sarbanes Committee, the following democratic political clubs have received and amount over \$1,000 and have failed to: 1) report the amount either as income or expenditure under F.E.C. regulations, or: 2) file a registration statement and supporting information as required by 2 U.S.C. ss433. I am now including the 20 clubs in my complaint, as well as the Sarbanes for Senate Committee, all as respondents.

I respectfully restate my request to you to immediately examine the clubs listed below to determine if, in fact, they are in violation of the law; if they have reported organization statements and detailed records of income and expenditures; if, in fact they even exist.

Since candidate Sarbanes includes in his report records of payments to these political clubs, and alleges that the payments were made for influencing a Federal election, aren't these clubs political and required to file in accordance with 2 U.S.C. ss 433? Furthermore, if these clubs call these payments expenditures, aren't they required to itemize them to you? If these clubs call these payments income, aren't they required to report it with the IRS as well as the F.E.C.?

Finally, if the Sarbanes for Senate Committee calls these payments contributions to those clubs, aren't the clubs still required to file with the F.E.C. and report the income to the IRS?

Finally, I repeat my request for a prompt investigation of this matter. May I remind you that it took three weeks for the F.E.C. to respond to my initial letter and then only to say that they could not find the information I found in the reports. I don't expect another bureaucratic delay to impede this matter any longer.

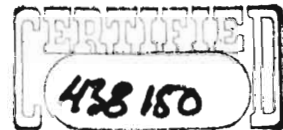

'Walk-Around' Money Curbed by FEC Policy Letter

The fabled Baltimore institution of "walk-around money," a source of political controversy for decades, was dealt a stiff blow by the Federal Election Commission yesterday.

Under a new policy adopted yesterday, candidates will be required to keep detailed records of how all money is spent in their behalf, including itemized reports on all expenditures over \$100 on their already required campaign finance reports. Expenditures under \$100 need not be reported.

This would drastically alter current practice under which candidates simply report large lump payments to their staff members and political clubs. In the May Democratic primary, for instance, Rep. Paul S. Sarbanes, reported giving \$45,200 to 20 Baltimore Democratic political organizations for "election expenses" without saying what these expenses were, or who exactly got the money.

Such money has traditionally been called "walk around money," a broad term that applied to anything from expenditures for printing and paying poll workers to payoffs to party loyalists and political bosses.

Bruce Bradley, an independent candidate for the U.S. Senate has raised walk-around money as an issue in his long shot campaign. He filed a formal complaint about the practice with the FEC Sept. 10.

Yesterday's action, however, was taken in response to questions raised by auditors going over presidential campaign reports and not Bradley's complaint, FEC spokesman David Fiske said. Auditors, he said, had become concerned about the large number of lump sum payments made as "advances" and "travel expenses" to campaign fieldworkers.

Under a policy letter adopted to correct the abuse, the FEC said such vague entries "are not sufficient to meet the statutory requirement. For example, if a field man receives a \$500

advance and spends \$250 to rent a hall; \$125 on posters; and \$125 on meals and lodging, each of these expenditures must be itemized."

The same ruling applies to walk-around money paid to political bosses, Fiske said. Candidates, therefore, will be required to itemize exactly who gets the money they pass out to political bosses, and what it is spent for.

The exact impact of the ruling on walk-around money was difficult to gauge yesterday, however. State Sen. Harry J. McGuirk, whose Stone-wall Democratic Club received \$3,000 from Sarbanes last spring, said, "It doesn't make any difference to my point of view."

"It's only a figment of one candidate imagination that everyone gets rich on election day," he said, referring to Bradley. He said he already keeps such records, and filed a report on them with the state Board of Elections.

State elections administrator Willard A. Morris said, "I don't know how the federal elections commission will enforce it, because if a candidate turns over \$5,000 to a club he doesn't know what they do with it."

That has long been the informal rule in Baltimore politics, he said. "Frankly, damn little reporting has been done by clubs because they haven't been required to."

Since Bradley first raised the walk-around money issue, incumbent Sen. J. Glenn Beall Jr. (R-Md.) has announced he will not use such funds this fall.

Sarbanes, a Baltimore congressman, however, has continued to advocate the use of walk-around money as legitimate campaign expense. Contacted for comment last night, Sarbanes press spokesman Bruce Frame said, "We'll have to see the ruling and have our lawyers study it before we say anything."

Sarbanes is considered the front-runner in the Senate race. FEC spokesman Fiske said Bradley's complaint is still under study.

Walkin'-Around Money ^{MUR 223}

INVESTIGATE

WASHINGTON: As we have learned, what counts in political campaigns is not what the candidate does, but what he is willing to do after some of his campaign aides are caught doing wrong.

Five weeks ago, investigative reporter Grayson Mitchell of the Los Angeles Times revealed widespread irregularities in the reporting of campaign expenditures by Jimmy Carter's minorities division. In California, a group calling itself Ministers for Carter received \$5000 without ever saying what it was going to do with the money, an apparent violation of law.

DECLARED THE Rev. J. L. Richards of Oakland unrepentantly: "When a preacher stands up in his church and talks about Jimmy Carter, he's working for Jimmy Carter as far as I'm concerned, and he should be paid for it."

In Ohio and North Carolina, the newspaper found evidence of \$12,000 falsely listed as "advance travel" expenses, later used for other purposes, also likely violations of law. In all, according to Carter campaign official Paul Hemman, some \$150,000 in taxpayer funds would have to be returned to the federal Treasury because of such discrepancies and lack of documentation required by law.

At that time, Carter press secretary Jody Powell stoutly announced, "If we discover instances in which funds were improperly or illegally spent, we will publicly report the incident..." At that time, a stern-looking candidate Carter announced that he had directed his campaign treasurer, attorney Robert Lipshutz, to investigate any evidence of wrongdoing on the part of his staff. And at that time, the ever-vigilant compliance division of the Federal Elections Commission filed an internal complaint that launched a review of the Times' charges.

WHAT HAS happened since then? After one day's attention,

the national press dropped the story, generally attributing the violations to "walkin'-around money," a long-tolerated form of petty bribery in which local workers or precinct captains buy voters a drink or pocket the money themselves.

The fact that this "walkin' around" is now being done with taxpayers' dollars and not political donations evidently troubles nobody. What of the Carter internal investigation? Lipshutz informs me: "We have found to date no evidence of any wrongdoing, or suspicion of wrongdoing, by any member of our staff, or anybody else."

That is what used to be called hanging tough. But what of Hemman's \$150,000 rebate estimate? Reached about this, Hemman places his tail firmly between his legs and will only say "talk to Bob Lipshutz." The likeable, intelligent and honorable Lipshutz — he is sometimes called "Carter's Garment" — says confidently that he does not expect that any money will have to be returned to the Treasury.

HE IS TELLING the literal truth. The Carter campaign intends to ask the Treasury for several hundred thousand dollars less than it has legitimate vouchers for, which would more than make up for the money Carter received to date on the undocumented or false claims. That cleverly does away with the embarrassment of having to return money.

Meanwhile, some who were caught with "walkin'-around money" in their pockets have been sending back the money. They can say they did not need what they will call an "advance" and thus there was no "wrongdoing." Much record-correcting is taking place.

And what of the Federal Election Commission (FEC) gumshoes, guardians of the taxpayers' dollars? With great relief, an FEC spokesman points to a line in the law that prohibits discussion of any matter "under review." But it is

a solid fact that no FEC investigator has yet spoken to — or even written a letter to — any of the key witnesses in the disbursement of all the Carter "walkin'-around money," including Hemman, minorities division overseer Benjamin Brown or former California Carter operative Frank Mullen. Some "investigation."

A LOW-LEVEL Carter accountant in Atlanta, reached before Lipshutz passed the word to stonewall on this matter, told this questioner what low-level FEC auditors told him: "They're considering not coming in for an audit until after the election." At that time, if Carter has won, and if the irregularities or illegalities are brought to light, the patter of light wrist-slappings will be heard in the land.

Anybody with any political horse sense knows just what kind of traditional, minor-league corruption was involved here: it's nearly impossible to run a national campaign without some funny business down the line. What is significant is the reaction at the top in this classic test case: the Carter reaction is to cloak and fix rather than to expose or admit.

But while Carter can find not one shred of wrongdoing in the tens of thousands of dollars in "walkin'-around money," and will neither fire nor reprimand anyone connected with the campaign, he announces that he would have fired the head of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for having accepted a few hundred dollars in gifts.

"WHEN PEOPLE see the head of the FBI violate a little law and get away with it," Carter piously intones, "it gives everybody a sense that crimes must be okay."

And so it does. A great many corner-cutters in Washington will take great comfort in the knowledge that what Carter preaches for the FBI is a far cry from what he practices in his own organization.

PRELIMINARY ANALYSIS

As for the 17 political organizations listed as receiving the monies, only one of these organizations has registered with the Commission. Although the payment of monies to an organization for services performed on behalf of Mr. Sarbanes (e.g., "ballots and canvassing" or "ballots and campaign") would not in and of itself transform the organization into a political committee, ~~ALTERNATIVE 1~~ the complaint does raise a question as to whether these organizations "received contributions or made expenditures during [this] calendar year in excess of \$1,000" and hence are subject to the reporting requirements of the Federal Election Campaign Laws. Accordingly, we recommend that the committees be advised that there is reason to believe they are in violation of 2 U.S.C. §§433, 434.

The allegation regarding hotel space is based solely on unsubstantiated oral allegations made to FBI agents. We are of the view that, absent further substantiation there is no reason to believe that a violation of §441b has been committed.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATION

The complainant alleges that the Sarbanes for Senate Committee made expenditures in excess of \$1,000 to the 17 political organizations listed on the attached pages for election day campaign purposes. He further alleges that the receipt of these funds by the committees makes is necessary for them to register with the Commission.

Complainant also made similar allegations to the Department of Justice.

PRELIMINARY LEGAL ANALYSIS (See Continuation Sheet)

With regard to the "walking around money" claim, the attached copies of the Sarbanes Committee reports indicate that it has reported all of the alleged expenditures as being made for "ballots and canvassing" or "ballots and camp(aign)." Thus the allegations do not give reason to believe that the Sarbanes Committee has violated any statutes within the jurisdiction of the Commission.

Summary of Allegation

During the course of an interview with F.B.I. agents he asserted that Mr. Sarbannes had paid out \$53,000 in "walking around money" to various Maryland organizations. Complainant also asserted to F.B.I. agents that the Hilton Hotel has provided the Sarbanes' campaign with office space for \$400 per month, when, in fact, the usual charge for the space is \$1,000 per month. The discount allegedly constitutes a corporate contribution in violation of 2 U.S.C. §441b.

Preliminary Analysis

As for the 17 political organizations listed as receiving the monies, only one of these organizations has registered with the Commission. However, the payment of monies to an organization for services performed on behalf of Mr. Sarbanes (e.g., "ballots and canvassing" or "ballots and camp(aign)") would not in and of itself transform the organization into a political committee. Whether the organizations were political committees and therefore subject to the reporting requirements of the Federal Election Campaign Laws would depend on other circumstances which are not at issue herein. In this connection, it is also significant that the Department of Justice, on the basis of the information available to it, has concluded that there was no violation of

18 U.S.C. §597. On the basis of the information presently available, we are of the view that there is no reason to believe further investigation is warranted with respect to the recipient organizations.

The allegation regarding hotel space is based solely on unsubstantiated oral allegations made to F.B.I. agents. We are of the view that, absent further substantiation there is no reason to believe that a violation of §441b has been committed.





banes in the May primary have broken the law by not registering with the FEC and filing expenditure reports.

The FEC now is studying the complaint, but an FEC spokeswoman said last week it was "uncertain" whether Baltimore clubs fall under the broad category of "political committees" required to file financial reports with the FEC.

Should the FEC rule in Bradley's favor, however, it could force political clubs for the first time to disclose in detail how they spend money for candidates just prior to election day.

THAT COULD mean problems for old political veterans like Pollack, who do not wield the kind of clout they did 20 years ago, but who still take pride in the contacts they've built up over the last five decades.

"Asking political clubs to reveal their expenditures in detail is like asking a reporter to reveal his best sources," complained Walter Orlinsky, president of the Baltimore City Council. "No political club wants to let everybody know who their best workers are, who they spend money on," he said.

Bradley, meanwhile, has said Sarbanes is guilty of "political bribery" and "hypocrisy" by distributing thousands of dollars in walking around money last May.

Sarbanes, Bradley has noted, introduced a bill six years ago while a member of the Maryland House of Delegates to outlaw the practice of distributing walking around money to political clubs in Maryland.

The Sarbanes proposal never got out of committee, and since then, he apparently has changed his mind about the practice of spending walking around money on election day.

AS ORLINSKY puts it: "Paul has grown up a lot. The goo-goo, super-moralistic days are over. If it's a sin to spend money on walking around money, then it's a sin to spend money on TV ads or on polls."

Added Orlinsky: "If anybody gets cheated, it's not the voter, it's the gullible politician who tries to do business with a political club that isn't established, that doesn't exist except on paper."

Sarbanes himself insists that paying workers to distribute literature and stand at the polls on election day "has merit" considering that some of these workers can't afford to take a day off from work and volunteer their services.

Mikulski puts it a different way: "I believe in full employment, and I help create it in Baltimore on election day."

Nevertheless, even political club stewards acknowledge there are still abuses on election day in Baltimore, with people pocketing walking around money and offering the candidate little work in return.

"PEOPLE HAVE gotten fat and lazy. They've slowed down, if you know what I mean," said Pollack.

"Just like everywhere, there are larceny-hearted people in Baltimore, hustlers who take advantage of candidates who suddenly breeze into town," said Raymond Haysbert, treasurer of the powerful Metro Democratic Club. "For these operators, election day is the time to put a downpayment on a new car."

Said Tommy D'Alesandro III, the son of a Baltimore mayor and a former mayor himself: "My guess is a candidate gets about 10 cents on every dollar he spends on walking around money. And I

don't believe there are any more than maybe six or seven really powerful clubs in Baltimore. There used to be 20 or 30 big ones."

The diminishing influence of the Baltimore political clubs, said D'Alesandro, is the result of many factors: The replacement of the old patronage system with the civil service system in Baltimore government, the flight of many white ethnic Baltimoreans from the city to the suburbs over the past two decades and the general breakdown of many old ethnic neighborhoods in Baltimore. "When I was a boy," said D'Alesandro, "I knew the name of every precinct captain in my ward, now I couldn't tell you who my neighbor is four doors down the block."

Fifty years ago, D'Alesandro continued, a politician had no choice but to play ball with the Baltimore clubs. "Back then, it was worth the money. There was no way else you get into a neighborhood and talk with the voters unless you paid a club to take you around. Now, well, you can get into everyone's living room just by purchasing TV time."

WHATEVER THE clout of political clubs is these days, the clubs still enjoy the blessings of a generous state legislature that still fears trying to bring them into line with other so-called political committees.

Maryland state law still specifically exempts Maryland political clubs from filing detailed campaign expenditure reports with the Maryland state election officials.

This exemption is so broad, in fact, that the state legislature has not even bothered to define what a political club is.

Atty. Gen. Francis B. Burch has concluded that under the current Maryland law political clubs get "special treatment" that "runs counter to the general purpose and thrust of (Maryland's) Fair Election Practices Act."

Against this background, Sarbanes — a generally closed-mouth, aloof politician who has always kept himself at arms length from the political bosses of Baltimore — finds himself in the unusual position of defending the practice of spending walking around money on Baltimore clubs.

Already incumbent Republican Sen. J. Glenn Beall has picked up on Bradley's attack against Sarbanes, indicating last week that he, too, was seriously considering not spending any walking around money in Baltimore this year.

IN 1970 BEALL paid \$40,000 in cash on election day to various Baltimore Democratic clubs in his successful bid to defeat Sen. Joseph Tydings. The money came from secret cash controlled by the Nixon White House and to this day Beall has refused to identify the Democratic clubs that got the cash.

Beall's brother, George, the former federal prosecutor and the Senator's campaign chief in Baltimore, said last week that he would have nothing to do with distributing walking around money this year.

"The time has passed when this kind of expenditure produces any kind of real political benefit, especially at the level of a senatorial race," the former U.S. attorney from Maryland said.

This brought a hot retort from Orlinsky: "The Bealls are suddenly getting religion, those phonies."

None of this, however, appears of special concern to Pollack, who has witnessed many a political brouhaha in his day and who, incidentally, got none of Sarbanes walking-around money last May.

"My son talked me into backing Tydings in the primary, so I did and we won a few precincts," explained Pollack, who runs the Trenton Democratic Club in Baltimore's 4th District. "Sarbanes is a nice enough boy, but he means nothing to me."

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'Walking-Around' Money: Outdated in '76?

Don't ask Baltimore political boss Jack Pollack about all the "walking-around money" he's received and spent for political candidates over the past half-century. If you do, Pollack will blow your ear off.

"WALKING AROUND MONEY?" growls the flamboyant 78-year-old ex-boy who 15 years ago was the most powerful political boss in Baltimore.

"WALKING AROUND MONEY," he shouts again over the telephone, this large, 6-foot-2, hulking political

warhorse whose first political job was tearing down opponents' posters.

"WHAT IN THE HELL IS WALKING AROUND MONEY?" he asks incredulously with all the guile of a man who insists there are no saints in this world. "Saints," he says, "are in heaven, and where's heaven?"

Walking-around money, Pollack is informed, is the phrase used to describe the money political candidates give Baltimore political clubs just prior to a city election for all sorts of purposes — like canvassing, poll-watching, the printing of ballots and getting out the vote.

Some purists in Baltimore insist the term only should be applied to money spent by political clubs in showing a candidate around a ward or precinct. It is "mingling money," as one Baltimore politician put it this week. The other expenditures more properly are called "election day expenses."

WHATEVER THE proper definition, Pollack gets the drift. "Oh, I know what you mean. You give a guy a \$50 bill before the election and he does a chore for you. So what?"

Well, Pollack is told, it's an issue

this year — possibly an explosive one. It turns out that neither Maryland state law nor federal elections statutes deal adequately with so-called walking around money.

Last May, for example, three liberal reform Democrats competing in Maryland's primary — City Council member Barbara Mikulski (running for Congress), Baltimore Congressman Paul Sarbanes (running for Senate) and California Gov. Jerry Brown (running for President) — shelled out \$72,000 to Baltimore political clubs just prior to election day.

In spending reports on file with the

Federal Elections Commission, all three candidates reported only the total amount they gave each club and provided only the sketchiest of details about how the money was spent.

For example, Sarbanes, who distributed more than \$50,000 to Baltimore political clubs in May, reported the money was spent "for ballots and canvassing."

Brown, who distributed some \$16,000 to the clubs, reported the money was used for "printing campaign literature (and) the printing of ballots" although his report indicates his campaign also dealt directly with

Baltimore printing firms for such services.

MIKULSKI REPORTED that the \$5,800 she gave to three political organizations was spent on "literature and literature distribution." All three candidates say their reports comply with current FEC regulations.

Last week independent candidate Bruce Bradley filed a formal complaint with the FEC, contending that some 20 Baltimore political clubs which received \$1,000 or more in walking around money from Sar-

The hijackers, who demanded and won wide publicity for their cause of
