I. GENERATION OF MATTER

The Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") referred the above thirteen (13) committees to the Office of the General Counsel on February 16, 1989. (Attachment 1). The basis for the attached referral is the committees' failure to file the 1988 12 Day Pre-General Report in a timely manner.

II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

A. Filing of Reports

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), provides that unauthorized committees which file on a monthly basis shall file a pre-election report, which shall be filed no later than the 12th day before such election, and which should be complete as of the 20th day before the election.

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B). The committees were notified on October 3, 1988, that the report was due on October 27, 1988.

Dear Mr. Hawley:

On June 19, 1989, the Federal Election Commission found that there is reason to believe Union Pacific Fund for Effective Government ("Committee") and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). The Factual and Legal Analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against the Committee and you, as treasurer. You may submit any factual or legal materials that you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit such materials to the General Counsel's Office within 15 days of your receipt of this letter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

In the absence of any additional information demonstrating that no further action should be taken against the Committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

In order to expedite the resolution of this matter, the Commission has also decided to offer to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a conciliation agreement in settlement

of this matter prior to a finding of probable cause to believe. Enclosed is a conciliation agreement that the Commission has approved.

If you are interested in expediting the resolution of this matter by pursuing preprobable cause conciliation and if you agree with the provisions of the enclosed agreement, please sign and return the agreement, along with the civil penalty, to the Commission. In light of the fact that conciliation negotiations, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, are limited to a maximum of 30 days, you should respond to this notification as soon as possible.


Requests for extensions of time will not be routinely granted. Requests must be made in writing at least five days prior to the due date of the response and specific good cause must be demonstrated. In addition, the Office of the General Counsel ordinarily will not give extensions beyond 20 days.

If you intend to be represented by counsel in this matter, please advise the Commission by completing the enclosed form stating the name, address, and telephone number of such counsel, and authorizing such counsel to receive any notifications and other communications from the Commission.

This matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U.S.C. §§ 437g(a)(4)(B) and 437g(a)(12)(A), unless you notify the Commission in writing that you wish the investigation to be made public.

For your information, we have attached a brief description of the Commission's procedures for handling possible violations of the Act. If you have any questions, please contact Michael Marinelli, the attorney assigned to this matter, at (202) 376-8200.





CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission ("Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. The Commission found reason to believe that Union Pacific Fund for Effective Government and Edmund S. Hawley, as treasurer, ("Respondents") violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and the Respondents, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondents and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(A)(i).

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Union Pacific Fund For Effective Government is a political committee within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. § 431(4).

2. Edmund S. Hawley is the treasurer of Union Pacific Fund for Effective Government.

3. Section 434(a)(4)(B) of Title 2 provides that unauthorized committees which file on a monthly basis shall file a pre-election report, which shall be filed no later than the 12th day before such election, and which should be complete as of the 20th day before the election.

4. Respondents filed its 1988 12 Day Pre-General Report on November 11, 1988, fifteen days after the October 27 deadline. The total amount of financial activity disclosed was \$128,949.00.

V. Respondents failed to file its 1988 12 Day Pre-General Report in a timely manner, in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B).

VI. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Federal Election Commission in the amount of Nine Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$950.00), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

VIII. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.


IX. Respondents shall have no more than 30 days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

X. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or

agreement, either written or oral, made by either party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be enforceable.


