III. BACKGROUND:

A. Cash Discrepancy Between 1988 Year End and 1989 Mid-Year Reports - 11 CFR §104.3(a)(1) and 2 U.S.C. §434(b)(1)

The 1988 Year End Report filed by the New Jersey Democratic State Committee ("the Committee") disclosed a cash-on-hand ending balance of \$8,113.82 (Attachment 2). The 1989 Mid-Year Report filed by the Committee disclosed a cash-on-hand beginning balance of \$89,019.29 (Attachment 3). Thus, the total cash discrepancy between the two reports amounts to \$80,905.47. A letter attached to the 1989 Mid-Year Report explained that the discrepancy was due to a number of accounting errors occurring in previous reporting periods and that amended reports would be forthcoming.

On May 2, 1990 a Request for Additional Information ("RFAI") was sent to the Committee addressing the cash discrepancy (Attachment 4). A Second Notice was sent on May 24, 1990 for failure to respond to the RFAI (Attachment 5).

The Committee submitted a response on June 29, 1990, which indicated that the beginning cash balance as reported on the 1989 Mid-Year Report was "substantially correct." The response further stated that amendments to the 1988 reports were almost complete and that the delay in filing the amendments stemmed from significant staff changes and difficulty in obtaining necessary information (Attachment 6).

On July 10, 1990, the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") analyst telephoned the Committee and spoke to the executive director, Peter Nichols (Attachment 7). Mr. Nichols informed the analyst that the \$80,905.47 cash discrepancy was related to a \$34,288 deposit made in error during October 1988 and could be corrected with a forthcoming amendment.

As of this date, no further responses or amendments have been filed by the Committee.

B. Receipt of Apparent Impermissible Funds - 11 CFR §102.5(a)(1)(i), 2 U.S.C. 441a(f), 2 U.S.C. 441b(a)

During the 1989 Year End reporting period, the Committee showed a \$34,288.16 disbursement made on September 20, 1989 to the New Jersey Democratic State Committee Operating Account (Attachment 8). The purpose of disbursement stated "transfer deposit made in error to account." An RFAI was sent to the Committee on May 2, 1990, requesting "the original date of deposit, the source of the funds, and an explanation of the aforementioned transaction" (Attachment 9). On May 24, 1990, a Second Notice was sent to the Committee for failing to respond to the RFAI (Attachment 5).

The RAD analyst telephoned the Committee on June 25, 1990 to discuss the issues raised in the original RFAI (Attachment 10). The executive director of the Committee, Peter Nichols, stated that the \$34,288.16 transfer to the New Jersey Democratic State Committee Operating Account was for an original deposit made in error to the Committee's federal account. He further stated that the deposit made in error occurred in October of 1988 and that his attorneys were in the process of determining the source of the funds.

A response submitted by the Committee on June 29, 1990 described the transfer-out "as a result of an internal review of the DSC's records" but at that time the Committee was "currently in the process of obtaining the detailed information concerning the transfer and will supply it as soon as it is available." On July 9, 1990, the RAD analyst telephoned the Committee to determine the status of the Committee's response (Attachment 12). Peter Nichols informed the analyst that a response would be ready for submission by July 13, 1990. On July 10, 1990, the analyst telephoned the Committee to determine the nature of the \$80,905.47 cash discrepancy between the 1988 Year End and 1989 Mid-Year Reports (Attachment 7). Mr. Nichols claimed that the \$34,288.16 deposit made in error during October of 1988 and the \$80,905.47 cash discrepancy were related to one another.

As of this date, no further responses or amendments have been filed by the Committee.

This letter is in response to your request for additional information, May 2, 1990 concerning the above-referenced report. The cash-on-hand figure reported on the New Jersey Democratic State Committee's (DSC) 1989 Mid-Year Report was based on an internal review of the DSC's records. Please be advised that the figure is substantially correct.

The DSC is aware that the 1989 Mid-Year Report reflects an opening balance that differs from the closing balance reported on the DSC's 1988 Year-End Report. The DSC intends to amend its 1988 Year-End Report shortly so that it reflects the correct closing balance.

As was indicated to the Federal Election Commission (FEC) in prior correspondence, the DSC conducted an internal review of its accounts and records in 1989. This review was nearly completed immediately prior to the 1989 general election in New Jersey. On the basis of the review, the 1989 Mid-Year Report was filed using corrected information. Subsequent to the review, a significant change in staffing has taken place at the DSC. As a result, a temporary delay in completing amendments to the 1988 report(s) has occurred. Please be assured that the necessary amendments to prior reports are almost complete at this time. The DSC is currently in the process of obtaining a few outstanding pieces of information that are essential to the filing of the amendments.

Please be advised that all pertinent amendments will be provided to the FEC as they are completed.

Although the Commission may take further legal steps concerning this matter, your prompt action will be taken into consideration.

-Your report discloses no payments for administrative expenses. Each committee utilizing separate federal and non-federal accounts is required to allocate any administrative expenses between the accounts in proportion to the amount of funds expended on federal and non-federal elections or on another reasonable basis. Administrative expenses are those day-to-day costs of operating the committee, including rent, utilities, salaries and other miscellaneous office expenses. 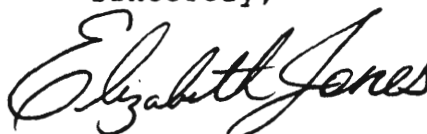

I phoned the Committee and was directed to the executive director, Mr. Nichols. I told him that the Commission needed information concerning the transfer out of the deposit made in error; specifically, the date of receipt for the deposited funds, the source of the funds, and an explanation of the transaction. He told me that the deposit was made some time in October 1988, but that he could not immediately discern the source of the funds or the nature of the error, as none of the personnel responsible for the error were presently working with the Committee.

(2) Administrative expenses

Mr. Nichols stated that administrative expenses for the federal account were negligible because the Committee engaged primarily in non-federal activity during that time period. During that time, he said that the state account made approximately \$12 million in disbursements while the federal account made approximately \$16,000 in disbursements.

(3) Campaign for America disbursements

The two \$5000 checks to Campaign for America were reported incorrectly, said Mr. Nichols, because only one check was cashed. The other check was lost and should have been recorded as a negative disbursement but was not.

This letter is in response to your request for additional information of May 2, 1990 concerning the above referenced report. The New Jersey Democratic State Committee (DSC) is presently reviewing its records in order to respond to your request. As it becomes available, all pertinent information will be provided to the Federal Election Commission (FEC).

To date, the following information has been discovered:

- The \$90,000 offset to operating expenditures previously disclosed on the 1989 Mid-Year Report was inadvertently omitted from Column-B on the 1989 Year-End Report. The DSC will amend its reports to reflect this omission.
- The \$34,288 transfer to the DSC's "Operating Account" was made as a result of an internal review of the DSC's records. The DSC is currently in the process of obtaining the detailed information concerning the transfer and will supply it as soon as it is available.
- During the period covered by the 1989 Year-End Report, the DSC engaged in virtually no federal activity. The reporting period covered the New Jersey gubernatorial election period. During this time, the DSC engaged in almost exclusively non-federal activity. In particular, the DSC's campaign committee, "Campaign '89," raised \$9.2 million and disbursed \$9.7 million as of 12/31/89. With respect to the DSC's state operating account, the DSC raised \$988,243 and disbursed \$994,100 during the 1989 calendar year. The total for DSC non-federal operations in 1989 was, therefore, \$10.1 million in

receipts and \$10.0 million in disbursements.

As you can see from the DSC's reported federal operating expenditures for the subject period, there were only five (5) disbursements made from the account totaling to \$6,948. For the most part, the disbursements from the federal account were for non-election related activity, including legal/compliance fees.

Using a comparison of federal activity to non-federal activity as a basis for allocating administrative expenses, it was determined that the percentage of federal activity and resulting administrative expenses were negligible. Thus, there was no need to allocate administrative expenses for the period.

Please be advised that a review of the DSC's prior filings indicates that the DSC has previously allocated administrative expenses when it engaged in federal and non-federal activity. The DSC will continue to allocate such expenses in the future when required.

The contribution of \$5,000 reported to Campaign for America on July 26, 1999 is correct. The \$5,000 contribution reported on the DSC's 1999 Mid-Year Report was voided. That check, dated June 30, 1999, was apparently lost and never presented for payment. As a result, the check dated July 26 was made as a replacement. That check was presented for payment. Thus, only a single contribution of \$5,000 was made to Campaign for America. The DSC will amend its reports to indicate that the initial contribution to Campaign for America was voided.

This update is to provide additional information concerning the referral of the New Jersey Democratic State Committee ("the Committee").

On July 26, 1990, the Committee submitted amendments to the 1988 October Quarterly, 12 Day Pre-General, 30 Day Post-General and Year End Reports. The amendments answered the issues raised in the July 20, 1990, referral of the Committee. First, the amendments corrected the \$80,905.47 math discrepancy between the 1988 Year End and 1989 Mid-Year reports by divulging additional financial activity of \$100,053.30 in previously undisclosed receipts and \$19,147.83 in previously undisclosed disbursements. Second the committee revealed the source and date of the \$34,288.16 misdeposit disclosed on the 1989 Year End Report, which apparently originated from a non-federal account maintained by the Committee and a non-federal account maintained by the New York State Democratic Committee. The amendments, while adding a substantial amount of financial activity, also recategorized many of the types of receipts and disbursements from the manner in which they were originally reported. In order to provide explanations regarding these changes, this referral update includes a chart for each amendment filed which specifies, by line item, additional financial activities and/or modifications made by the Committee.

The receipt difference between the 1988 October Quarterly Report and the 1988 Amended October Quarterly was an increase of \$5,086.00. The disbursement difference between the two reports was an increase of \$7,662.95.

**Explanation for Increase in Receipts:**

- . The substantial increase in receipts came from a previously undisclosed contribution for \$5,000.00 made by Isaac Heller on 7/5/88 (Attachment 4).
- . The Committee moved \$128,346.13 from Line 11(b) of the original report to Lines 11(c), 12, and 15 of the amendment, reflecting a more accurate picture of financial activity. No net change resulted from this action.

**Explanation for Increase in Disbursements:**

- . The substantial increase in disbursements came from a previously undisclosed \$7,500.00 transfer made on 8/9/88 to the NJDSC office account listed as "allocated administrative expense transfer" (Attachment 5).
- . The Committee responded to an RFAI sent on December 28, 1988 (Attachment 6) with a letter dated February 15, 1989, that explains the removal of \$49,932.45 in coordinated expenditures from Line 23 of the 1988 October Quarterly (Attachment 7). Although it appears that the \$49,932.45 in coordinated expenditures suddenly vanish from the original report, in actuality "the amounts reported as coordinated expenditures on behalf of Frank Pallone on Schedule F were incorrectly designated as coordinated expenditures." Instead, the Committee "was paid by Pallone for Congress for the cost of services rendered." An amount of \$31,692.45 then was disclosed on the amended report as itemized services on Line 19 on behalf of Frank Pallone. In addition to addressing the coordinated expenditures on behalf of Frank Pallone, the Committee also moved \$18,240.00 in coordinated expenditures on behalf of Jim Florio to Line 19 as well.
- . The Committee deleted a \$2,000.00 contribution to John Villapiano from Line 21 of the original report and moved it to Line 27 of the amended report resulting in no net change.

The receipt from Leslie Fay Company, Inc. is reported as "incorrectly deposited - transfer to NJDSC Operating account to be reported in subsequent report." The transfer-out, however, does not appear in any of the subsequent reports filed by the Committee.

- . Line 12: A previously undisclosed transfer from the DNC Services Corp. "Project Victory" for \$30,000.00 made on 11/2/88 accounts for the \$30,000.00 increase between the original and amended reports (Attachment 14).
- . Line 15: Using this line, the Committee answered the Commission's inquiries stemming from a May 2, 1990 Request for Additional Information ("RFAI") (Attachment 15). The Committee listed a \$34,288.16 transfer-out on Schedule B of their 1989 Year End Report as a "transfer deposit made in error to account" (Attachment 16). On their 1988 Amended 30 Day Post-General Report dated July 26, 1990, the Committee disclosed two transactions to account for that misdeposit (Attachment 17). The Committee received a check from "NJDSC-Decision '88" on 11/9/88 in the amount of \$29,601.16 which was listed as "check incorrectly deposited to this account." The Committee also received a check from "NYSDC" on 11/2/88 in the amount of \$4,687.50 which was also listed as "check incorrectly deposited to this account." Both of these transactions appear to have been made from non-federal accounts and were previously undisclosed.

The receipt total for Line 15 appears to have been inflated by \$12,931.14 to explain an accounting mistake made by the Committee on their 1988 12 Day Pre-General Report. The Committee lists the receipt of the \$12,931.14 on their 1988 Amended 30 Day Post-General Report as "incorrectly recorded as disbursement on preceding report." It appears as though the initial disbursement reported on their 1988 12 Day Pre-General Report never occurred. The total for Line 15 of their 1988 Amended 30 Day Post-General Report, therefore, was inflated by \$12,931.14 to account for the initial erroneous disclosure (Attachment 17).

The Committee reported a previously undisclosed \$4,687.50 receipt dated 11/2/88 from "NYDSC" as a "reimbursement for media time" (Attachment 17).

Explanation for Increase in Disbursements:

- . Line 27: The Committee reported a previously undisclosed contribution to the "Re-elect John Currie Committee" for \$11,625.00 made on 11/7/88 (Attachment 18).

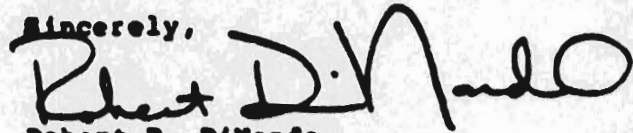

Dear Mr. DiMardo:

This letter is a partial response to your requests for additional information concerning the New Jersey Democratic State Committee's (NJDCS) 1998 October Quarterly and 12 Day Pre-Election Reports. As we have informed you, the bookkeeper is on maternity leave, and was unable for several weeks to assist us in responding to your inquiries. She is now making time available to aid us but is able to do so only to a limited extent. This response addresses your questions which we can answer at this time. We will continue to research your remaining questions and will update this response as soon as possible.

With respect to your request for additional information for the October Quarterly Report:

1. Page 1 of 1, line number 12, entries B and C, were incorrectly reported as transfers from affiliated committees. Both entries should have been reported on line 15 as offsets to operating expenditures. These receipts from Friends of Bill Simon and Pallone for Congress were payments for mailing services provided by NJDCS. NJDCS will amend its report to itemize the costs of the mailings as operating expenditures on line 19 and the payments to NJDCS from the candidate

committees as offsets to operating expenditures on line 15.

2. Page 1 of 1, line number 12, entry D, was incorrectly reported as a transfer from an affiliated committee. This entry should have been reported as a contribution on line 11(c). This contribution was from the candidate's excess campaign funds from his 1984 campaign and is not subject to any contribution limit. 11 C.F.R. § 113.2(c). NJDSC will amend its report accordingly.
3. Page 1 of 1, line number 11(b), entry A, was incorrectly reported as a contribution from the Alabama State Democratic Executive Committee. This entry should have been reported as a transfer from another party committee on line 12. Apparently, there has been some confusion over this contribution. NJDSC was informed at the time the check was received, that it was a transfer from the Alabama State Party's federal account. The check was made out to "Victory Fund '88" which was the name of the NJDSC 1988 general election federal account. This was also the name of the DNC's general election program. We have contacted the Alabama State Party and have determined that the check was drawn on their federal account. They reported making the contribution to the DNC Victory Fund, however, and not to NJDSC Victory Fund. NJDSC properly reported the contribution as coming from Alabama, since the check was from the Alabama Party and was directly deposited into the NJDSC account. Apparently, it was not made clear to the Alabama Party that the check was intended for New Jersey.
4. Page 1 of 1, line number 12, entry A, was incorrectly reported as a transfer from an affiliated/other party committee. This payment was not a contribution. Rather, it was a payment for services provided by NJDSC to Democrats for a New Direction 88, and unrelated to federal candidates. We have requested an accounting from Democrats for a New Direction 88 who have informed us that they had sufficient funds permissible under the Act so that there was no commingling of improper funds by acceptance of the payment from them.
5. Pages 1 and 2 of 3, line number 19, disclose payments made by the NJDSC federal account to the Victory '88 Disbursement Account. You have questioned whether these payments represent reimbursements for payments previously made by NJDSC's non-federal account. They do not. Victory '88 Disbursement Account is the escrow account established by NJDSC to pay its operating and vendor bills which must be allocated between federal

and non-federal funds. As specifically permitted by the Commission, NJDSC has elected to pay its vendors with a single check from the disbursement account. The appropriate federal share is transferred to the disbursement account from the federal account. Schedules are provided itemizing the federal share of each payment made by the disbursement account in an amount equal to each amount transferred to the disbursement account. FEC Advisory Opinion 1978-67. The payments made to Political Americans from the disbursement account were for exempt campaign materials referencing both federal and state candidates. The portions of these payments allocable to federal candidates are itemized as required on the Attachments to Schedule B.

6. The amounts reported as coordinated expenditures on behalf of Frank Pallone on Schedule F were incorrectly designated as coordinated expenditures. As discussed in ¶ 1 above, NJDSC was paid by Pallone for Congress for the cost of services rendered. The reports will be amended to disclose NJDSC's disbursements as operating expenditures and the payments from Pallone for Congress as offsets to operating expenditures.
7. You have questioned whether transfers from the national party committee were used to finance payments for exempt campaign materials. They were not. NJDSC financed its exempt activities from contributions it received from individuals and non-political party committees, and not from any funds transferred in from the national party. As you can see from the October Quarterly Report, NJDSC had receipts during that period of \$429,356.88, less than one quarter of which were from the national party. Moreover, the ASDC - Dollars for Democrats, and ASDC - Democratic Victory Fund are direct mail and telephone solicitations performed under contract with the DNC and represent funds raised in New Jersey, not funds transferred from the national party.
8. The attachments itemizing the transfers to the disbursement account state "expenses" as the purpose for a number of entries. These reimbursements were primarily for travel, i.e., gas, mileage, tolls, taxis. NJDSC will review the underlying records and will obtain greater detail for those expenditures in excess of \$200. Since NJDSC was not required to itemize expenditures aggregating less than \$201 to a single payee, it was not required to provide any purpose for those amounts less than \$201.

9. The NJDSC's bookkeeper informs us that she submitted a request for approval of the computer produced schedules. She believed she had received such approval and is reviewing her records. If she is unable to find it, NJDSC will submit a new request.

With respect to the request for additional information regarding the 12 Day Pre-Election Report:

1. With respect to the receipts disclosed on page 1 of 1, line number 15, please see the responses to # 1 and 6 above. These receipts were not contributions. They were offsets to operating expenditures.
2. Regarding the transfers from DNC and ASDC, please see the response to # 7 above.
3. The attachments referred to in support of line number 19 will be supplied as soon as the bookkeeper is able to prepare them.

If you have any additional questions concerning this response, please feel free to contact me. As indicated above, NJDSC will file the amended reports necessary as soon as the bookkeeper is able to work with someone to prepare them. The Committee has retained the services of a new accountant to work with her as soon as possible.

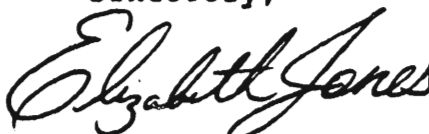

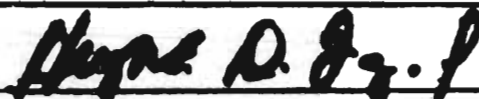

I. GENERATION OF MATTER

This matter was generated by the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") after a review of the disclosure reports of New Jersey Democratic State Committee (hereinafter "New Jersey Committee"). (Attachment 1). The RAD review revealed a cash discrepancy of \$80,905.47 between the Committee's 1988 Year End Report and its 1989 Mid-Year Report. Additionally, the Committee's 1989 Year-End Report disclosed a \$34,288.16 transfer out to its non-federal account. According to the RAD referral, the Committee had failed to provide details regarding this transaction.

A subsequent RAD update, provided additional information concerning the issues raised in the initial RAD referral. The RAD update disclosed the subsequent amendment of several reports. First, the amendments corrected the \$80,905.47 math discrepancy.

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Second, the amendments provided details on the \$34,288.16 transfer out to other non-federal accounts. Third, the amendments revealed additional financial activity that was not previously disclosed in the reports of the New Jersey Committee. Finally, this disclosure of previously undisclosed activity may raise issues of additional violations of the Act by the New Jersey Committee.

## II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

### A. Reporting Violations

#### 1. Cash Discrepancy Between 1988 Year End and 1989 Mid-Year Reports

##### Initial RAD Referral

According to the initial RAD Referral, the 1988 Year End Report filed by the New Jersey Committee disclosed a cash-on-hand ending balance of \$8,113.82. (Attachment 1, pages 2 and 7). The 1989 Mid-Year Report, the next report filed by the New Jersey Committee, disclosed a cash-on-hand beginning balance of \$89,019.29. (Attachment 1, pages 2 and 8). Thus, the total cash discrepancy between the two reports amounted to \$80,905.47. The memorandum attached to the New Jersey Committee's 1989 Mid-Year report explained that the discrepancy was due to a number of accounting errors in previous reporting periods and that amended reports would be forthcoming.

On May 2, 1990, a Request for Additional Information ("RFAI") was sent to the New Jersey Committee addressing the issue of the cash discrepancy. (Attachment 1, page 10). A Second Notice was sent on May 24, 1990, for failure to respond to the RFAI. (Attachment 1, page 11).

On June 29, 1990, the New Jersey Committee submitted a

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response which indicated that the beginning cash balance as reported on the 1989 Mid-Year Report was "substantially correct." The response further stated that amendments to the 1988 reports were almost complete and that the delay in filing the amendments stemmed from significant staff changes and difficulty in obtaining necessary information. (Attachment 1, pages 12-13).

On July 10, 1990, the RAD analyst telephoned the Committee and spoke to the executive director. (Attachment 1, page 14). The executive director informed the RAD analyst that the \$80,905.47 cash discrepancy was related to a \$34,288 deposit made in error during October 1988 and would be corrected with a forthcoming amendment.

#### RAD Update

As noted, the RAD Update provided additional information concerning the transaction at issue. (Attachment 2, pages 22-66). According to the RAD Update, on July 26, 1990, the New Jersey Committee submitted amendments to the following reports for 1988: the 1988 October Quarterly, 12 Day Pre-General, 30 Day Post-General and Year-End Reports. Together, these amendments to the New Jersey Committee's reports corrected the \$80,905.47 mathematical discrepancy by revealing additional financial activity of \$100,053.30 in previously undisclosed receipts and \$19,147.83 in previously undisclosed disbursements. Moreover, the amendments, while adding a substantial amount of financial activity, recategorized many of the types of receipts and disbursements in a manner different from the New Jersey Committee's original reporting of this financial information. (Attachment 2, page 22). The RAD Update includes a chart

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analyzing each amended report by line item and specifies additional financial activity or modifications to the original report. (Attachment 2, pages 22-26).

## 2. Reporting of Coordinated Party Expenditures

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Additionally, in a response to a RFAI sent on December 28, 1988, the New Jersey Committee explained the removal of \$49,932.45 in coordinated expenditures from line 23 of the 1988 October Quarterly report.<sup>1/</sup> (Attachment 2, pages 23, 37-38, 41-42 and p. 45). First, the response of the New Jersey Committee states that the amounts reported as coordinated expenditures on behalf of Frank Pallone on Schedule F were incorrectly designated as coordinated expenditures. Rather, the New Jersey Committee states, Pallone for Congress paid the New Jersey Committee for services rendered. Consequently, the New Jersey Committee amended its report to show \$31,692.45 in itemized services on behalf of Frank Pallone on line 19 as operating expenditures.<sup>2/</sup> Second, in addressing the coordinated expenditures on behalf of Frank Pallone, the New Jersey Committee also moved \$18,240 in previously disclosed coordinated expenditures on behalf of another candidate, former Rep. Jim Florio, to line 19 as well.

It does appear from the reports on file at the Commission that the New Jersey Committee received from the Pallone campaign a substantial amount of payments above and beyond \$31,692.45 for services rendered to Pallone. What is less clear is whether the

recharacterization as operating expenditures of \$18,240 in previously disclosed coordinated expenditures on behalf of Jim Florio should also occur. Reports on file at the Commission do not show at least \$18,240 in payments from Jim Florio to the New Jersey Committee for services rendered. Thus, the New Jersey's committee's rationale for moving the \$18,240 in coordinated expenditures from line 23 to line 19 does not appear to be supported by the record.

### 3. Analysis

Under 2 U.S.C. § 434(b), political committees are required to report all receipts and disbursements during the reporting period and to disclose the cash on hand balance at the beginning of each reporting period. 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a)(1).

The initial RAD review disclosed a cash discrepancy of \$80,905.47 between the ending cash-on-hand balance of the 1988 Year End Report and the beginning cash-on-hand balance of the 1989 Mid-Year Report of the New Jersey Committee. Initially, the New Jersey Committee indicated a relationship between the cash discrepancy and the transfer-out of the deposit made in error. The cash discrepancy also raised the issue of whether the New Jersey Committee accurately reported all financial transactions. This discrepancy has been corrected by the New Jersey Committee's amendments to the 1988 October Quarterly, 12 Day Pre-General, 30 Day Post-General and Year End Reports. These amendments

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disclosed a substantial amount of previously undisclosed activity (\$100,053.30 in disbursements and \$19,147.83 in disbursements) and also recategorized or modified the previously filed reports of the Committee. Thus, there was no connection between the cash discrepancy and the New Jersey Committee's transfer-out, as the Committee had originally posited. Instead, the record clearly shows that the New Jersey Committee failed to disclose a substantial amount of receipts and disbursements until approximately 2 years after the 1988 election. Furthermore, it is not clear whether the New Jersey Committee has accurately reflected the change from coordinated expenditures made on behalf of Jim Florio to operating expenditures made by the New Jersey Committee.<sup>4/</sup> Accordingly, the Office of the General Counsel recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that the New Jersey Committee and Robert Menezes, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b).

**B. Receipt of Apparent Impermissible Funds**

**1. Deposits Made in Error**

**Initial RAD Referral**

On the 1989 Year End Report, the New Jersey Committee disclosed a \$34,288.16 disbursement made on September 20, 1989, to the New Jersey Democratic State Committee Operating Account. (Attachment 1, page 15). The purpose of the disbursement was

The New Jersey Committee, however, has never argued that the expenditures in question constitute exempt activity under the Act. In any case, there does not appear to be a 2 U.S.C. § 441a(d) issue with respect to the Florio expenditures because these expenditures were within the spending limits (\$23,050) for the state party in 1988.



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listed as "transfer deposit made in error to account." An RFAI was sent to the Committee on May 2, 1990, requesting "the original date of deposit, the source of the funds, and an explanation of the aforementioned transaction". (Attachment 1, page 16). On May 24, 1990, a Second Notice was sent to the Committee for failing to respond to the RFAI. (Attachment 1, page 11).

The RAD analyst telephoned the Committee on June 25, 1990, to discuss the issues raised in the original RFAI. (Attachment 1, page 10). The executive director of the New Jersey Committee stated that the \$34,288.16 transfer to the New Jersey Democratic State Committee Operating Account was for an original deposit made in error to the Committee's federal account. He further stated that the deposit made in error occurred in October of 1988 and that his attorneys were in the process of determining the source of the funds.

On June 29, 1990, the New Jersey Committee submitted a response to RAD describing the transfer-out "as a result of an internal review of the DSC's records" and indicating that the New Jersey Committee was "currently in the process of obtaining the detailed information concerning the transfer and will [would] supply [such information] as soon as it [was] available." (Attachment 1, page 19-20).

On July 9, 1990, the RAD analyst telephoned the Committee to determine the status of the New Jersey Committee's response. (Attachment 1, page 21). The executive director informed the RAD analyst that a response would be ready for submission by July 13, 1990. As noted, supra, the executive director indicated that the \$34,288.16 deposit made in error during October of 1988 and the

\$80,905.47 cash discrepancy were related to each other.

(Attachment 1, page 14).

### RAD Update

With respect to the transfer out of \$34,288.16 for a deposit made in error, subsequent amendments to the New Jersey Committee's reports provided further information on this issue. (Attachment 2, page 1). The New Jersey Committee's Amended 30 Day Post-General Election Report disclosed that the \$34,288.16 transfer out was predicated on two transactions that constituted misdeposits to the New Jersey Committee's account. (Attachment 2, page 61). The first receipt was a check from "NYSDC" on November 2, 1988 in the amount of \$4,687.50 and is listed as a "check incorrectly deposited to this account."<sup>5/</sup> (Attachment 2, pages 25 and 61). The second receipt was a check from NJDSC - Decision '88 on November 9, 1988 in the amount of \$29,601.16 and is listed as a "check incorrectly deposited to this account." Both of these transactions involve receipts from non-federal accounts and both receipts were previously undisclosed by the New Jersey Committee.

### 2. Corporate Contribution

According to the RAD Update, the Amended 1988 30 Day

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<sup>5/</sup> In the amendment to the Committee's 1988 30 Day Post-General Election Report, the New Jersey Committee also reported a previously undisclosed \$4,687.50 receipt dated November 2, 1988 from "NYSDC" (a non-federal account) and listed the receipt as a "reimbursement for media time" (Attachment 2, page 61). This receipt was received on the same day, is in the same amount, and is disclosed on the same report page as the check from "NYSDC" that is claimed to have been incorrectly deposited to the Committee's account (Attachment 2, page 61). It is unclear as to whether this entry is connected to this previously discussed deposit made in error to the New Jersey Committee's Account.

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Post-General Report showed a previously undisclosed receipt from Leslie Fay Company, Inc. of \$2,000 on October 31, 1988.

(Attachment 2, pages 25 and 56). The receipt from Leslie Fay Company is listed on the New Jersey Committee's report as "'incorrectly deposited' - transfer to NJDSC Operating account to be reported in subsequent report". The transfer out, however, does not appear in any subsequent reports filed by the New Jersey Committee.

### 3. Analysis

11 C.F.R. § 102.5 prescribes certain requirements for organizations that intend to finance both federal and non-federal activity. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(1)(i), when an organization elects to establish a separate federal account that is treated as a separate federal political committee, only funds subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Act may be deposited into the federal account and all disbursements, contributions, expenditures and transfers by such committee in connection with federal elections must be made by the Federal Account.

On the other hand, organizations which are not political committees must either: 1) establish a separate account which contains only those funds permitted under the Act, or 2) demonstrate through a reasonable method that the organization has received sufficient funds subject to the limitations and prohibitions in order to make the contribution. 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(b).

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 441b, contributions or expenditures by national banks, corporations and labor unions in connection with

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federal elections are prohibited.

As noted, the New Jersey Committee had disclosed a \$34,288.16 disbursement on September 20, 1989, to the New Jersey Democratic State Operating Account for a "transfer deposit made in error to the account," and due to the New Jersey Committee's failure to itemize the initial receipt of such deposit, the source of funds and actual deposit date were unknown. The amendments to the New Jersey Committee reports have revealed the source and date of the \$34,288.16 in misdeposits disclosed on the 1989 Year End Reports (one from NJDSC Decision '88 in the amount of \$29,602.16 on 11/19/88 and the other from NYSDC in the amount of \$4,687.50 on 11/2/88) and it took approximately ten months for the New Jersey Committee to transfer out these purportedly misdeposited funds.

The committees in question are non-federal committees and are not subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Act. Furthermore, under New York and New Jersey law, political committees may receive contributions from banks, corporations and labor unions. Therefore, the above mentioned deposits or misdeposits to the federal account may have been made with funds that contain contributions prohibited by 2 U.S.C. § 441b.

It also appears that the New Jersey Committee also received an incorrectly deposited corporate contribution (\$2,000) from Leslie Fay Company, Inc. Moreover, while the receipt indicates that the transaction would be corrected by a transfer out of the same amount in a subsequent report, this transfer out has not occurred on any of the reports subsequently filed by the New Jersey Committee. Furthermore, it also appears that the New Jersey Committee may have received an additional incorrectly

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deposited check from "NYSDC" of \$4,687.50 for reimbursement of media expenses.

Based on the foregoing, it appears that these transactions may constitute violations of 11 C.F.R. §§ 102.5(a) and 441b. Accordingly, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission find reason to believe the New Jersey Committee and Robert Menedez, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a).

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Open a MUR.
2. Find reason to believe the New Jersey Democratic State Committee and Robert Menedez, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(b) and 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a).
3. Approve the appropriate letter and the attached Factual and Legal Analysis.

The Factual and Legal Analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against the Committee and you, as treasurer. You may submit any factual or legal materials that you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit such materials to the General Counsel's Office within 15 days of your receipt of this letter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

In the absence of any additional information demonstrating that no further action should be taken against, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

If you are interested in pursuing pre-probable cause conciliation, you should so request in writing. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d). Upon receipt of the request, the Office of the General Counsel will make recommendations to the Commission either proposing an agreement in settlement of the matter or recommending declining that pre-probable cause conciliation be

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Quarterly report.<sup>1</sup> First, the response of the New Jersey Committee states that the amounts reported as coordinated expenditures on behalf of Frank Pallone on Schedule F were incorrectly designated as coordinated expenditures. Rather, the New Jersey Committee states, Pallone for Congress paid the New Jersey Committee for services rendered. Consequently, the New Jersey Committee amended its report to show \$31,692.45 in itemized services on behalf of Frank Pallone on line 19 as operating expenditures.<sup>2</sup> Second, in addressing the coordinated expenditures on behalf of Frank Pallone, the New Jersey Committee also moved \$18,240 in previously disclosed coordinated expenditures on behalf of another candidate, former Rep. Jim Florio, to line 19 as well.

It does appear from the reports on file at the Commission that the New Jersey Committee received from the Pallone campaign a substantial amount of payments above and beyond \$31,692.45 for services rendered to Pallone. What is less clear is whether the recharacterization as operating expenditures of \$18,240 in previously disclosed coordinated expenditures on behalf of Jim Florio should also occur. Reports on file at the Commission do not show at least \$18,240 in payments from Jim Florio to the New Jersey Committee for services rendered. Thus, the New Jersey's committee's rationale for moving the \$18,240 in coordinated expenditures from line 23 to line 19 does not appear

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to be supported by the record.

### 3. Analysis

Under 2 U.S.C. § 434(b), political committees are required to report all receipts and disbursements during the reporting period and to disclose the cash on hand balance at the beginning of each reporting period. 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a)(1).

Review of the New Jersey Committee's reports disclosed a cash discrepancy of \$80,905.47 between the ending cash-on-hand balance of the 1988 Year End Report and the beginning cash-on-hand balance of the 1989 Mid-Year Report of the New Jersey Committee.

Initially, the New Jersey Committee indicated a relationship between the cash discrepancy and the transfer-out of the deposit made in error. The cash discrepancy also raised the issue of whether the New Jersey Committee accurately reported all financial transactions. This discrepancy has been corrected by the New Jersey Committee's amendments to the 1988 October Quarterly, 12 Day Pre-General, 30 Day Post-General and Year End Reports. These amendments disclosed a substantial amount of previously undisclosed activity (\$100,053.30 in receipts and \$19,147.83 in disbursements) and also recategorized or modified the previously filed reports of the Committee. Thus, there was no connection between the cash discrepancy and the New Jersey Committee's transfer-out, as the Committee had originally posited. Instead, the record clearly shows that the New Jersey Committee failed to disclose a substantial amount of receipts and disbursements until approximately 2 years after the 1988 election. Furthermore, it is not clear whether the New Jersey Committee has accurately

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reflected the change from coordinated expenditures made on behalf of Jim Florio to operating expenditures made by the New Jersey Committee. Accordingly, there is reason to believe that the New Jersey Committee and Robert Menedez, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b).

**B. Receipt of Apparent Impermissible Funds**

**1. Deposits Made in Error**

On the 1989 Year End Report, the New Jersey Committee disclosed a \$34,288.16 disbursement made on September 20, 1989, to the New Jersey Democratic State Committee Operating Account. The purpose of the disbursement was listed as "transfer deposit made in error to account." An RFAI was sent to the Committee on May 2, 1990, requesting "the original date of deposit, the source of the funds, and an explanation of the aforementioned transaction". On May 24, 1990, a Second Notice was sent to the Committee for failing to respond to the RFAI.

The RAD analyst telephoned the Committee on June 25, 1990, to discuss the issues raised in the original RFAI. The executive director of the New Jersey Committee stated that the \$34,288.16 transfer to the New Jersey Democratic State Committee Operating Account was for an original deposit made in error to the Committee's federal account. He further stated that the deposit made in error occurred in October of 1988 and that his attorneys were in the process of determining the source of the funds.

On June 29, 1990, the New Jersey Committee submitted a response to RAD describing the transfer-out "as a result of an internal review of the DSC's records" and indicating that the New

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Jersey Committee was "currently in the process of obtaining the detailed information concerning the transfer and will [would] supply [such information] as soon as it [was] available." On July 9, 1990, the RAD analyst telephoned the Committee to determine the status of the New Jersey Committee's response. The executive director informed the RAD analyst that a response would be ready for submission by July 13, 1990. As noted, supra, the executive director indicated that the \$34,288.16 deposit made in error during October of 1988 and the \$80,905.47 cash discrepancy were related to each other.

With respect to the transfer out of \$34,288.16 for a deposit made in error, subsequent amendments to the New Jersey Committee's reports provided further information on this issue. The New Jersey Committee's Amended 30 Day Post-General Election Report disclosed that the \$34,288.16 transfer out was predicated on two transactions that constituted misdeposits to the New Jersey Committee's account. The first receipt was a check from "NYSDC" on November 2, 1988 in the amount of \$4,687.50 and is listed as a "check incorrectly deposited to this account".<sup>3</sup> The second receipt was a check from NJDSC - Decision '88 on November 9, 1988 in the amount of \$29,601.16 and is listed as a "check incorrectly

In the amendment to the Committee's 1988 30 Day Post-General Election Report, the New Jersey Committee also reported a previously undisclosed \$4,687.50 receipt dated November 2, 1988 from "NYSDC" (a non-federal account) and listed the receipt as a "reimbursement for media time." This receipt was received on the same day and is in the same amount as the check from "NYSDC" that is claimed to have been incorrectly deposited to the Committee's account. It is unclear as to whether this entry is connected to this previously discussed deposit made in error to the New Jersey Committee's Account.

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deposited to this account". Both of these transactions involve receipts from non-federal accounts and both receipts were previously undisclosed by the New Jersey Committee.

## 2. Corporate Contribution

The Amended 1988 30 Day Post-General Report also showed a previously undisclosed receipt from Leslie Fay Company, Inc. of \$2,000 on October 31, 1988. The receipt from Leslie Fay Company is listed on the New Jersey Committee's report as "'incorrectly deposited' - transfer to NJDSC Operating account to be reported in subsequent report". The transfer out, however, does not appear in any subsequent reports filed by the New Jersey Committee.

## 3. Analysis

11 C.F.R. § 102.5 prescribes certain requirements for organizations that intend to finance both federal and non-federal activity. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(1)(i), when an organization elects to establish a separate federal account that is treated as a separate federal political committee, only funds subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Act may be deposited into the federal account and all disbursements, contributions, expenditures and transfers by such committee in connection with federal elections must be made by the Federal Account.

On the other hand, organizations which are not political committee must either: 1) establish a separate account which contains only those funds permitted under the Act, or 2) demonstrate through a reasonable method that the organization has received sufficient funds subject to the limitations and

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prohibitions in order to make the contribution. 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(b).

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 441b, contributions or expenditures by national banks, corporations and labor unions in connection with federal elections are prohibited.

As noted, the New Jersey Committee had disclosed a \$34,288.16 disbursement on September 20, 1989, to the New Jersey Democratic State Operating Account for a "transfer deposit made in error to the account," and due to the Jersey Committee's failure to itemize the receipt, the source of funds and actual deposit date was unknown. The amendments to the New Jersey Committee reports have revealed the source and date of the \$34,288.16 in misdeposits disclosed on the 1989 Year End Reports (one from NJDSC Decision '88 in the amount of \$29,602.16 on 11/19/88 and the other from NYSDC in the amount of \$4,687.50 on 11/2/88) and it took approximately ten months for the New Jersey Committee to transfer out these purportedly misdeposited funds.

The committees in question are non-federal committees and are not subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Act. Furthermore, under New York and New Jersey law, political committees may receive contributions from banks, corporations and labor unions. Therefore, the above mentioned deposits or misdeposits to the federal account may have been made with funds that contain contributions prohibited by 2 U.S.C. § 441b.

It also appears that the New Jersey Committee also received an incorrectly deposited corporate contribution (\$2,000) from Leslie Fay Company, Inc. Moreover, while the receipt indicates

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that the transaction would be corrected by a transfer out of the same amount in a subsequent report, this transfer out has not occurred on any of the reports subsequently filed by the New Jersey Committee. Furthermore, it also appears that the New Jersey Committee may have received an additional incorrectly deposited check from "NYSDC" of \$4,687.50 for reimbursement of media expenses.

Based on the foregoing, it appears that these transactions may constitute violations of 11 C.F.R. §§ 102.5(a) and 441b. Accordingly, there is reason to believe the New Jersey Committee and Robert Menedez, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a).

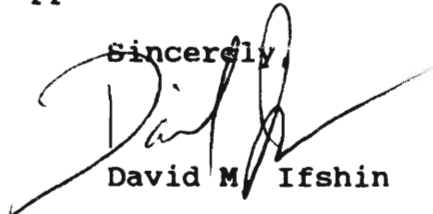

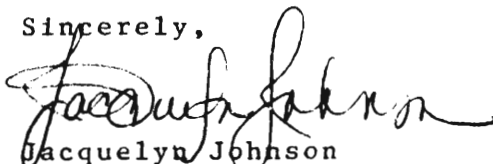

This letter is in partial response to the Commission's reason to believe finding in the above referenced matter. As recently discussed with both you and Mr. Bernstein, we are gathering all of the necessary information to provide you with a thorough and complete response. In addition to retaining our services, the New Jersey State Committee, (the "Committee" or "NJDCS"), has hired an independent accountant to review all of the relevant records. We will continue to submit additional information to you as it becomes available to us.<sup>1</sup>

I. Violation of 2 U.S.C. ss 434 (b)

In the factual and legal analysis provided by the Commission, it was noted that the \$80,905.47 cash-on-hand discrepancy between the cash-on-hand balance of the 1988 Year-End

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Report and the beginning cash-on-hand balance of the 1989 Mid-Year Report has been corrected by the NJDSC through its amendments to the 1988 October Quarterly, 12 Day Pre-General, 30 Day Post-General and Year End Reports. The Commission, however, questioned whether NJDSC accurately recharacterized \$18,240 from a coordinated expenditure on behalf of Rep. Jim Florio to an operating expenditure. Moreover, there is some question as to whether the amendments provided by NJDSC clearly explained their recategorizations to the Commission. The following explains some of these transactions with supporting documentation, where available.

The Commission questioned NJDSC's rationale for recharacterization of \$18,240 in coordinated expenditures on behalf of Rep. Jim Florio to operating expenditures. A portion of the amount in question is specifically addressed by NJDSC's previous counsel, Ms. Lyn Utrecht in a February 15, 1989 letter to the Commission's Reports Analysis Division. Page two, item 4, of the letter, states:

Page 1 of 1, line number 12, entry A, was incorrectly reported as a transfer from an affiliated/other party committee. This payment was not a contribution. Rather, it was a payment for services provided by NJDSC to Democrats for a New Direction 88, and unrelated to **federal** candidates. (emphasis added) We have requested an accounting from Democrats for a New Direction 88 who have informed us that they had sufficient funds permissible under the Act so that there was no commingling of improper funds by acceptance of the payment from them.<sup>2</sup>

It is important to note that Jim Florio was a candidate for

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federal office in 1988 and that he did not seek election to state office until 1989. The amount paid to NJDSC by Democrats for a New Direction in 88 was \$14,630.00. In NJDSC's amended October 15,

Quarterly Report filed on July 26, 1990, NJDSC again included this same receipt in error as a coordinated expenditure instead of including it under line item 15 as an offset to an operating expense. NJDSC is in the process of correcting this error through another amendment to this report and will submit it to the Commission upon its completion.

Moreover, the remaining difference between the \$14,630.00 paid to NJDSC and the \$18,240.00 erroneously listed as a coordinated expenditure on behalf of Rep. Jim Florio is, on information and belief, an operating expenditure of the Committee for services provided to Bill Simon. A review of the amended October 15, Quarterly Report for example, discloses two receipts from the Friends of Bill Simon, one on the 23rd of September in the amount of \$1,800.00 and another on September 30th in the amount of \$1,860.00. While there appears to be no corresponding offsetting expense for Bill Simon, the identical amounts on those same dates were paid to "Excel Color Graphics," and partially attributed to Jim Florio. That attribution to Jim Florio was on information and belief, in error. As stated above, the NJDSC is seeking to obtain documentation to further explain and substantiate these transactions and it will be provided to the Commission as soon as it becomes available.

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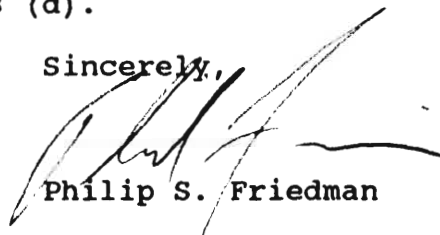
II. Violation of 2 U.S.C. ss 441 (b)

The Commission also questions NJDSC's possible receipt of impermissible funds and cites the receipt of \$2000.00 from Leslie Fay Company on October 31, 1988 as reported in the Amended 30 Day Post-General Report. NJDSC initially reported in its Amended 30 day Post-General Report that the receipt was "incorrectly deposited" - transfer to be reported in a subsequent report." The transfer out did in fact occur and was reported by the committee in its October 15th Quarterly Report in 1990.<sup>3</sup>

The other receipt that the Commission questions is one from "NYSDC" in the amount of \$4,687.50 for reimbursement of media expenses. NJSDC is presently seeking documentation to support this reporting and will provide it to the Commission as it becomes available.

As earlier noted, the information provided in this letter is a partial response to the questions presented by the Commission. We are continuing our efforts to obtain all available information to fully respond to the Commission's concerns and to more adequately consider our current intention to formally request, at a later date, pre-probable cause conciliation under the provisions of 11 C.F.R. ss 111.18 (d).

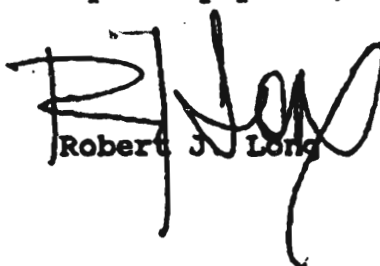

This letter is a partial response to your requests for additional information concerning the New Jersey Democratic State Committee's (NJDCS) 1988 October Quarterly and 12 Day Pre-Election Reports. As we have informed you, the bookkeeper is on maternity leave, and was unable for several weeks to assist us in responding to your inquiries. She is now making time available to aid us but is able to do so only to a limited extent. This response addresses your questions which we can answer at this time. We will continue to research your remaining questions and will update this response as soon as possible.

With respect to your request for additional information for the October Quarterly Report:

1. Page 1 of 1, line number 12, entries B and C, were incorrectly reported as transfers from affiliated committees. Both entries should have been reported on line 15 as offsets to operating expenditures. These receipts from Friends of Bill Simon and Pallone for Congress were payments for mailing services provided by NJDCS. NJDCS will amend its report to itemize the costs of the mailings as operating expenditures on line 19 and the payments to NJDCS from the candidate.

2. Page 1 of 1, line number 12, entry D, was incorrectly reported as a transfer from an affiliated committee. This entry should have been reported as a contribution on line 11(c). This contribution was from the candidate's excess campaign funds from his 1984 campaign and is not subject to any contribution limit. 11 C.F.R. § 113.2(c). NJDSC will amend its report accordingly.
3. Page 1 of 1, line number 11(b), entry A, was incorrectly reported as a contribution from the Alabama State Democratic Executive Committee. This entry should have been reported as a transfer from another party committee on line 12. Apparently, there has been some confusion over this contribution. NJDSC was informed at the time the check was received, that it was a transfer from the Alabama State Party's federal account. The check was made out to "Victory Fund '88" which was the name of the NJDSC 1988 general election federal account. This was also the name of the DNC's general election program. We have contacted the Alabama State Party and have determined that the check was drawn on their federal account. They reported making the contribution to the DNC Victory Fund, however, and not to NJDSC Victory Fund. NJDSC properly reported the contribution as coming from Alabama, since the check was from the Alabama Party and was directly deposited into the NJDSC account. Apparently, it was not made clear to the Alabama Party that the check was intended for New Jersey.
4. Page 1 of 1, line number 12, entry A, was incorrectly reported as a transfer from an affiliated/other party committee. This payment was not a contribution. Rather, it was a payment for services provided by NJDSC to Democrats for a New Direction 88, and unrelated to federal candidates. We have requested an accounting from Democrats for a New Direction 88 who have informed us that they had sufficient funds permissible under the Act so that there was no commingling of improper funds by acceptance of the payment from them.
5. Pages 1 and 2 of 3, line number 19, disclose payments made by the NJDSC federal account to the Victory '88 Disbursement Account. You have questioned whether these payments represent reimbursements for payments previously made by NJDSC's non-federal account. They do not. Victory '88 Disbursement Account is the escrow account established by NJDSC to pay its operating and vendor bills which must be allocated between federal

and non-federal funds. As specifically permitted by the Commission, NJDSC has elected to pay its vendors with a single check from the disbursement account. The appropriate federal share is transferred to the disbursement account from the federal account. Schedules are provided itemizing the federal share of each payment made by the disbursement account in an amount equal to each amount transferred to the disbursement account. FEC Advisory Opinion 1978-67. The payments made to Political Americana from the disbursement account were for exempt campaign materials referencing both federal and state candidates. The portions of these payments allocable to federal candidates are itemized as required on the Attachments to Schedule B.

6. The amounts reported as coordinated expenditures on behalf of Frank Pallone on Schedule F were incorrectly designated as coordinated expenditures. As discussed in # 1 above, NJDSC was paid by Pallone for Congress for the cost of services rendered. The reports will be amended to disclose NJDSC's disbursements as operating expenditures and the payments from Pallone for Congress as offsets to operating expenditures.
  7. You have questioned whether transfers from the national party committee were used to finance payments for exempt campaign materials. They were not. NJDSC financed its exempt activities from contributions it received from individuals and non-political party committees, and not from any funds transferred in from the national party. As you can see from the October Quarterly Report, NJDSC had receipts during that period of \$429,356.88, less than one quarter of which were from the national party. Moreover, the ASDC - Dollars for Democrats, and ASDC - Democratic Victory Fund are direct mail and telephone solicitations performed under contract with the DNC and represent funds raised in New Jersey, not funds transferred from the national party.
  8. The attachments itemizing the transfers to the disbursement account state "expenses" as the purpose for a number of entries. These reimbursements were primarily for travel, i.e., gas, mileage, tolls, taxis. NJDSC will review the underlying records and will obtain greater detail for those expenditures in excess of \$200. Since NJDSC was not required to itemize expenditures aggregating less than \$201 to a single payee, it was not required to provide any purpose for those amounts less than \$201.

3. The attachments referred to in support of line number 19 will be supplied as soon as the bookkeeper is able to prepare them.

If you have any additional questions concerning this response, please feel free to contact me. As indicated above, NJDSC will file the amended reports necessary as soon as the bookkeeper is able to work with someone to prepare them. The Committee has retained the services of a new accountant to work with her as soon as possible.

**I. BACKGROUND**

In April 1992 this Office circulated a memorandum to the Commission containing a list of cases which we believed warranted the exercise of prosecutorial discretion by the closing of the file. The memorandum also invited the Commission to suggest additional cases for consideration of such action. Presented below are the cases included in our memorandum as well as those suggested to us by a Commissioner for inclusion (as denoted by an asterick).

This report recommends closing certain matters, not closing others, and holding one matter in abeyance. This Office's recommendations as to whether the file should be closed in each matter reflect numerous factors including our present workload, the age of the case, the amount of financial activity involved, and the seriousness of the violation. Closing cases under these circumstances should not necessarily be seen as a decision on how to handle similar cases in the future.

This matter is a RAD referral involving reporting errors and deposits of impermissible funds into the Federal Account. While a few questions remain, the Committee has clarified or corrected the major problems in the matter.

It is unclear how the substantial cash discrepancy between the 1988 Year-End Report and the 1989 Mid-Year Report occurred. As noted in the First General Counsel's Report, however, the Committee has corrected the \$80,905 mathematical discrepancy through amendments of its reports, showing \$100,053.30 in previously undisclosed receipts mostly in the form of transfers from affiliated committees and \$19,147.83 in previously undisclosed disbursements. Another issue was whether the Committee had appropriately recharacterized as operating expenditures disbursements of \$18,240 initially reported as coordinated expenditures made on behalf of Jim Florio. The Committee's response explains that most of the reported disbursement was not in fact a disbursement but actually a receipt of \$14,630 from Democrats for A New Direction 88 for services the Committee provided to this organization that were unrelated to federal candidates. The Committee was also informed by this organization that it had sufficient funds permissible under the Act so there was no commingling of impermissible funds by virtue of the Committee's acceptance of payment.

As noted in the First General Counsel's Report, the Committee has provided details on the transfer out from the Federal Account to the Non-federal Account of \$34,288.16 that had been deposited in error to the Federal Account. The Committee's Amended 30 Day Post-General Election Report disclosed that the \$34,288.16 transfer out was predicated on two deposits in error to the Federal Account (\$4,687.50 from NYSDC and \$29,601.16 from NJDSC - Decision '88). Consequently, the above mentioned deposits in error to the Federal Account have been corrected. Moreover, the Committee's response to reason to believe shows an additional transfer out of the \$2,000 corporate contribution received from Leslie Fay Company, Inc. that was also deposited in error to the Federal Account.

The major issues in this matter have been resolved or clarified by the Committee. The Committee has corrected the \$80,905 mathematical discrepancy by amendment of its reports, the recharacterization of expenditures have largely been explained, and impermissible funds deposited in error to the Federal Account have been corrected by transfer out of the amounts deposited in error. For these reasons, this Office recommends that the Commission take no further action and close the file in this matter.

On November 8, 1991, the New Jersey Democratic State Committee ("Committee") was notified that the Federal Election Commission found reason to believe the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(b) and 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a). On January 3, 1992, the Committee submitted a response to the Commission's reason to believe findings.

After considering all the circumstances of the matter, and in the exercise of its prosecutorial discretion, the Commission determined on June 2, 1992, to take no further action against New Jersey Democratic State Committee and its treasurer and closed the file. The Commission reminds the Committee that inaccurate reporting of contributions and expenditures, and the receipt and deposit of corporate funds into a federal account constitute violations of 2 U.S.C. §§ 434 and 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a).
