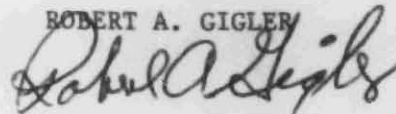

# Watchdog wants closer look at donors

A three-year investigation that is shaping up as the biggest campaign finance inquiry in state history has found enough evidence of wrongdoing by an Anchorage construction company to warrant a formal hearing by the state's political watchdog agency.

A staff report by the Alaska Public Offices Commission focuses on allegations that the owner and employees of Alaska Interstate Construction illegally contributed \$38,000 between 1991 and 1993 to state Senate candidates Larry Baker, Paul Fischer, Loren Leman, Drue Pearce, James Udelhoven and Bill Webb, as well as Anchorage

Assembly candidate Bob Bell.

The report concludes there were "many questionable transactions which are insufficiently explained" and "many inconsistencies between the facts as presented by the contributors" and other evidence and witnesses.

The contributors and the candidates have denied any intentional wrongdoing.

Records show irregularities in AIC's campaign activity as far back as 1986, in races ranging from Darryl Jordan's bid for Anchorage School Board to Wally Hickel's campaign for governor and the George Bush-Dan Quayle ticket for president and vice-president, the report says. Also mentioned are two of the three members of Alaska's all-Republican congressional delegation, Rep. Don Young and Sen. Frank Murkowski.

The five-member Alaska Public Offices Commission is scheduled to discuss the report next week. It must decide whether to proceed with an administrative hearing that could lead to civil penalties and criminal prosecution against the contributors and the candidates.

Staff investigator Jim Kentch said the scope of the allegations, the effort involved in checking them out and the potential for stiff penalties may make this the biggest case in the commission's 21-year history.

"People could go to jail," he said.

The penalties range from \$10-a-day fines for errors in campaign reports to misdemeanors for providing false information, punishable by up to a year in jail and \$5,000 fines.

At issue is whether AIC owner John Ellsworth and seven of his employees tried to sidestep the state's \$1,000-per-year-per-candidate contribution limit to win favor with politicians whose decisions could benefit their business. AIC, founded by Ellsworth in 1987, is a construction and oil-field service company that has had major projects at the Red Dog Mine and Prudhoe Bay over the years. Almost all the political contributions from AIC employees — more than \$55,000 in the 1991-92 period, mostly in \$1,000 checks — went to Republicans who favor oil and development interests.

The seven candidates under investigation could also be in trouble if the commission finds that they knowingly accepted or failed to question illegal contributions or did not properly disclose money they received.

The commission opened its investigation in the spring of 1993 in response to complaints filed by Democrat Dave Donley and Alaskan Independence Party candidate Robert Giegler, who both ran against Republican Larry Baker for state Senate in 1992. The complaints were triggered by a Daily News story that documented suspicious circumstances surrounding many of AIC's political contributions in 1991 and 1992.

The public offices commission expanded the investigation to include candidates other than Baker

and hired private investigator Rollie Port, a former state trooper, to gather evidence. Port worked on the case for about a year, sifting through bank records, corporate files and other documents and conducting numerous interviews.

The report documents several ways in which Ellsworth, his employees and the candidates could have violated campaign laws.

- Businesses that are owned by the same person or run by the same officers are forbidden by law from donating more than \$1,000 to a single candidate in a single calendar year. But some candidates received a total of \$2,000 in a single year from AIC and another construction company, Unicol, which are both fully owned by Ellsworth.

- State law requires candidates to make their best efforts to determine if contributions they've received are legal. During the 1992 campaign season, some candidates returned suspicious contributions from AIC. Others questioned the donations but decided to keep them.

- If two or more people coordinate their contributions during an election season, they are required by law to disclose their campaign activity as a group effort. It is also a crime to give a contribution in the name of someone else or reimburse another's contribution.

The AIC workers are accused of coordinating their contributions as a group but not reporting them

that way.

The employees have testified that they authorized office manager Cindy Scott to purchase cashier's checks in their names and donate them to candidates. Even though "some" of the checks had consecutive numbers, the employees have denied there was any organized effort to donate to specific candidates. They maintained that the timing of their contributions and the identity of the candidates were all coincidence.

The report credits the employees' lawyer, Joseph Sheehan of Fairbanks, for making sure they got their stories straight, but ultimately casts doubt on whether they're as independently active in Alaska politics as they claim.

Scott was paid more than \$150,000 a year, so she could afford to donate \$14,000 to 11 candidates. Nevertheless, when an investigator asked, she could not name her area representatives on the Anchorage Assembly, mistakenly believed that Leman had lost his election, and did not know if others whom she supported with \$1,000 checks won or lost.

Ellsworth and Scott did not return phone messages Wednesday, but Ellsworth did issue a written statement dated June 9 maintaining that he and his employees are innocent.

"Politically savvy, we are not, and it was never our intention to do anything wrong or to violate any law," he wrote.

This is to acknowledge receipt on July 10, 1995, of your letter dated July 5, 1995. The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") and Commission Regulations require that the contents of a complaint meet certain specific requirements. One of these requirements is that a complaint be sworn to and signed in the presence of a notary public and notarized. Your letter was not properly sworn to.

Please note that this matter will remain confidential for a 15 day period to allow you to correct the defects in your complaint. The respondents will then have an additional 15 days to respond to the complaint on the merits. If the complaint is not corrected, the file will be closed and no additional notification will be provided to the respondents.

# Watchdog wants closer look at donors

A three-year investigation that is shaping up as the biggest campaign finance inquiry in state history has found enough evidence of wrongdoing by an Anchorage construction company to warrant a formal hearing by the state's political watchdog agency.

A staff report by the Alaska Public Offices Commission focuses on allegations that the owner and employees of Alaska Interstate Construction illegally contributed \$38,000 between 1991 and 1993 to state Senate candidates Larry Baker, Paul Fischer, Loren Leman, Drue Pearce, James Udelhoven and Bill Webb, as well as Anchorage

Assembly candidate Bob Bell.

The report concludes there were "many questionable transactions which are insufficiently explained" and "many inconsistencies between the facts as presented by the contributors" and other evidence and witnesses.

The contributors and the candidates have denied any intentional wrongdoing.

Records show irregularities in AIC's campaign activity as far back as 1986, traces ranging from Darrell Jordan's bid for Anchorage School Board to Hickel's campaign for governor and the George Bush-Dan Quayle ticket for president and vice-president, the report says. Also mentioned are two of the three members of Alaska's all-Republican congressional delegation, Rep. Don Young and Sen. Frank Murkowski.

The five-member Alaska Public Offices Commission is scheduled to discuss the report next week. It must decide whether to proceed with an administrative hearing that could lead to civil penalties and criminal prosecution against the contributors and the candidates.

Staff investigator Jim Lentch said the scope of the allegations, the effort involved in checking them out and the potential for stiff penalties may make this the biggest case in the commission's 21-year history.

"People could go to jail," he said.

The penalties range from 30-a-day fines for errors in campaign reports to misdemeanors for providing false information, punishable by up to a year in jail and \$5,000 fines.

At issue is whether AIC owner John Ellsworth and seven of his employees tried to sidestep the state's \$1,000-per-year-per-candidate contribution limit to win favor with politicians whose decisions could benefit their business. AIC, founded by Ellsworth in 1987, is a construction and oil-field service company that has had major projects at the Red Dog Mine and Prudhoe Bay over the years. Almost all the political contributions from AIC employees — more than \$55,000 in the 1991-92 period, mostly in \$1,000 checks — went to Republicans who favor oil and development interests.

The seven candidates under investigation could also be in trouble if the commission finds that they knowingly accepted or failed to question illegal contributions or did not properly disclose money they received.

The commission opened its investigation in the spring of 1993 in response to complaints filed by Democrat Dave Donley and Alaskan Independence Party candidate Robert Gigler, who both ran against Republican Larry Baker for state Senate in 1992. The complaints were triggered by a Daily News story that documented suspicious circumstances surrounding many of AIC's political contributions in 1991 and 1992.

The public offices commission expanded the investigation to include candidates other than Baker

and hired private investigator Rollie Port, a former state trooper, to gather evidence. Port worked on the case for about a year, sifting through bank records, corporate files and other documents and conducting numerous interviews.

The report documents several ways in which Ellsworth, his employees and the candidates could have violated campaign laws.

- Businesses that are owned by the same person or run by the same officers are forbidden by law from donating more than \$1,000 to a single candidate in a single calendar year. But some candidates received a total of \$2,000 in a single year from AIC and another construction company, Unicol, which are both fully owned by Ellsworth.

- State law requires candidates to make their best efforts to determine if contributions they've received are legal. During the 1992 campaign season, some candidates returned suspicious contributions from AIC. Others questioned the donations but decided to keep them.

- If two or more people coordinate their contributions during an election season, they are required by law to disclose their campaign activity as a group effort. It is also a crime to give a contribution in the name of someone else or reimburse another's contribution.

The AIC workers are accused of coordinating their contributions as a group but not reporting them

that way.

The employees have testified that they authorized office manager Cindy Scott to purchase cashier's checks in their names and donate them to candidates. Even though some of the checks had consecutive numbers, the employees have denied there was any organized effort to donate to specific candidates. They maintained that the timing of their contributions and the identity of the candidates were all coincidence.

The report credits the employees' lawyer, Joseph Sheehan of Fairbanks, for making sure they got their stories straight, but ultimately casts doubt on whether they're as independently active in Alaska politics as they claim.

Scott was paid more than \$150,000 a year, so she could afford to donate \$14,000 to 11 candidates. Nevertheless, when an investigator asked, she could not name her area representatives on the Anchorage Assembly, mistakenly believed that Leman had lost his election, and did not know if others whom she supported with \$1,000 checks won or lost.

Ellsworth and Scott did not return phone messages Wednesday, but Ellsworth did issue a written statement dated June 9 maintaining that he and his employees are innocent.

"Politically savvy, we are not, and it was never our intention to do anything wrong or to violate any law," he wrote.

The undersigned has been requested by the Alaskans for Don Young and its treasurer, Robert Bohnert, ("Committee"), to respond to a complaint filed by Robert Gigler, now identified as Matter Under Review ("MUR") 4235. After a careful review of Mr. Gigler's alleged charges and the applicable federal law relating thereto, we request that no action be taken, and the above-referenced complaint be dismissed in its entirety as the Committee has in good faith fully complied with the Federal Elections Campaign Act of 1971.

First, the Committee filed timely and accurate Campaign Disclosure Reports. For your review, we have attached Exhibits "A" through "D"<sup>1</sup>, copies of the Committee's previously filed reports that identify the individual contributions referenced in the complaint.

Second, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. 441(a), the Committee lawfully received no more than \$1,000.00 per election from each individual contributor. The Committee received these individual campaign contributions at state fundraisers or by mail. The Committee received in excess of \$290,000.00 in individual contributions during 1992, all of which were properly reported.

Third, the Committee has received individual campaign contributions in the form of both personal and cashier's checks. Cashier's checks are a valid form of monetary exchange and are to be purchased by the individual in whose name appears on the cashier's check. Therefore, the Committee properly recognized the individual campaign contributions in the form of cashier's

checks to be valid, having no good faith reason to question the legitimacy of the individual contributions.

Finally, as distinguished from state law<sup>2</sup>, federal campaign reporting laws do not require a federal candidate to identify the check number of each campaign contribution on the disclosure reports; here, the check number is superfluous information for purposes of meeting the Committee's federal disclosure requirements.

For all the foregoing reasons, the Committee respectfully requests that the above-referenced complaint be dismissed. I believe all the issues raised in Mr. Gigler's complaint have been fully addressed. Should you need additional information, please do not hesitate to call.

2. My staff report of June 9, 1995. The contributions to federal candidates are discussed on pages 22-23 and 30-32 of this report. This document will give you a good overview of the contribution activity to the four federal candidates.
3. Four exhibits to the June 9, 1995 staff report:

Exhibit C: Documents showing John Ellsworth was the sole owner of Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. (AIC) in 1992.

Exhibit E: Four spreadsheets showing the contribution activity of the principals by date, check number, contributor and recipient. The contributions to the federal candidates are sorted by their recipients on the last two pages of this exhibit.

Exhibit J: Copy of check # 14201 drawn on AIC's checking account. As explained in part f. on pages 22-23 and part g. on page 32 of the June 9, 1995 staff report, \$4000 of the proceeds of this transaction was used to purchase three cashier's checks (# 80147215, 80147216, and 80147217) for contributions to Senator Murkowski in the names of Cindy Scott, David Thomas, John Ellsworth and Jan Ellsworth.

Exhibit K: Copy of check # 142 drawn on Al Davis' checking account by co-signer Cindy Scott for \$1,050 to AIC. As explained in part b. on page 31 of the June 9, 1995 staff report, \$1000 of this check was used to purchase cashier's check # 80107023 for a contribution to Senator Murkowski in the name of James Workman.



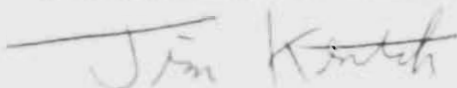
4. Bank records showing the source of the funds used to purchase the cashier's checks used for the contributions described in the tables on pages 30-32 of the June 9, 1995 staff report. These tables detail the contributions made by the principals to the four federal candidates. I apologize for the rather poor quality of the xeroxing, but it is the best that the condition of the bank records permits.

5. A Consent Agreement signed by all the contributor respondents which the Alaska Public Offices Commission approved on August 10, 1995. This Consent Agreement required payment of civil penalties totaling \$98,500.

The complainant, upon reading a front page, Anchorage Daily News article, appearing Sunday, November 1, 1992, a copy of which is enclosed herewith, realized that there exists a pattern of illegal campaign contributions in violation of AS 15.13, AS 24.45, and AS 39.50.

The complainant alleges that:

John Ellsworth, in knowing violation of Alaska Statute, used nominees in order to exceed the \$1,000<sup>00</sup> contribution

permitted to a person who controls the company he/she operates.

That John Ellsworth, in the names of Cindy Scott and James Workman, caused to be drawn a sequence of \$1,000 cashiers checks (#'s 80120007 through 80120010 inclusive) which were given to Bill Webb and Larry Baker.

That Bill Webb and Larry Baker should have known, through the exercise of common care and judgment, that the contributions represented therein were, prima facie, unlawful.

group, AIC and its employees rank high among companies, organizations and political groups that send out campaign checks.

Nearly half of the AIC donations were from Scott, Workman and three other employees.

These donations must be reported by both the candidates and their contributors. But a search of records at the Alaska Public Offices Commission failed to turn up donor statements for 21 of the AIC employees' \$1,000 donations.

APOC Director Karen Boorman said it's a misdemeanor to fail to file a statement within 10 days of the donation. But, she added, the agency is usually lenient if a contributor didn't know about the requirement.

Scott, however, appears to be aware of the law — she signed AIC's reports on file at APOC.

But missing reports weren't the only unusual characteristic of AIC-related money.

Candidate reports show about \$6,000 in AIC employee contributions were made with cashier's checks or money orders, many of them with sequential serial numbers. Of the \$6,000 reported donations in the current state election, only about 65 bear the long serial numbers that generally signify cashier's checks or money orders, which leave a more difficult audit trail to follow than personal checks.

One candidate, Fairbanks North Star Borough Mayor Jim Sampson, became so suspicious of a \$1,000 cashier's check he received from Scott on Sept. 6, 1991, that he returned it two weeks later.

There might have been a question in my mind that it may have been a contribution in the name of another, Sampson said.

There have been several well-publicized cases in the past in which employers and lobbyists have tried to get around the \$1,000 campaign contribution limit by giving money to others, who then made additional donations.

In 1984, a Mat-Su couple who owned a dairy farm and construction company tried to mask \$20,000 in contributions as "tool allowances" and other bonuses to employees. They were caught when the Daily News, and then the APOC, began investigating how milkmaids and laborers could afford \$1,000 contributions to Sen. Jay Kerttula. The couple paid a \$4,040 fine.

Over the past two weeks, Ellsworth scheduled interviews about his company's political involvement, then canceled the meetings. Messages left at AIC offices in Anchorage and Deadhorse for Workman and the three other employee contributors, James Peterson, David Thomas and William Castoe, went unreturned.

The employees' political influence is something new. There are no records of Scott or Workman making large political contributions to state candidates before 1991. As a corporation, AIC handed out \$20,000 to state candidates and political parties for the 1992 election. It gave \$15,000 for the 1990 race and \$3,000 for 1988.

Scott said she didn't think it unusual that she used cashier's

personal account.

Maybe they don't take personal checks, she said.

Cashier's checks have figured before into allegations of fraudulent donations by big contributors trying to get around the \$1,000 limit.

Anchorage developer Pete Zamarelli admitted in 1990 that he funneled thousands of dollars from his personal funds into Anchorage Mayor Tony Knowles' 1984 campaign by using the names of friends, relatives and employees on 20 separate \$1,000 cashier's checks. Many of the checks bore consecutive serial numbers.

No one was prosecuted because Zamarelli made that admission after the statute of limitations expired.

Again in 1984, the APOC briefly investigated a string of consecutively numbered \$500 and \$1,000 cashier's checks paid to House candidate Chuck Sassara and drawn from the Seattle bank where former Juneau lobbyist Lew Dischner had an account. The checks bore names of several Dischner associates, and an APOC investigator said the agency suspected a common source for the money. But the agency never pursued the case because the bank was located outside Alaska. Dischner was convicted several years later of unrelated federal corruption charges.

After the Zamarelli checks came to light in 1990, Mike Huelsman, then the APOC campaign disclosure coordinator, said the agency would adopt a policy of routinely investigating multiple donations with cashier's checks if those circumstances came to light again.

Huelsman has since left the agency, and director Boorman said the agency has been stripped of a budget position for an investigator. "There isn't any time to look for patterns or problems of the kind you're talking about," she said.

However, she said, the agency would respond if a complaint were filed.

State corporation records show AIC was founded in 1987 by Ellsworth. Before that, Ellsworth was an executive of Alaska International Construction, a heavy-construction company once owned by Alaska industrialist Neil Berg and then the Enserch Corp.

Ellsworth's new company, AIC, did about \$25 million in earth-moving work at the Red Dog Mine near Kotzebue in 1990 and 1991, according to Ralph Harrgrave of Cominco, the mine operator. It is a major gravel hauler and earth mover in Prudhoe Bay.

Sen. Drue Pearce, R-Anchorage, who has gotten \$7,000 from AIC and its employees over the past two years, described Ellsworth as a constituent and acquaintance.

John Ellsworth has made a ton of money in construction, she said. "He flies around in a private jet, he's got a huge lot on Campbell Lake, he's got an easement from the municipality to put the biggest floating dock on the lake — he does everything in a flamboyant way," she said.

Pearce said she didn't harbor any suspicions about the checks because she believes AIC's employees to be well paid.

According to a state Labor De-

# Questions follow company-related gift

Hopefuls receive \$14,000 from office manager of 'politically active' construction firm

Cindy Scott's state voter record shows she hasn't cast a ballot in Alaska since 1986.

Yet during the past year, the Anchorage office manager has donated \$14,000 to political candidates, joining the high-paid lobbyists and wealthy businessmen who inhabit the top ranks of campaign contributors.

Scott works for Alaska Interstate Construction, an oil-field service company that has emerged this year as a major political player. Four other AIC

employees have also made big contributions to candidates.

But several irregularities surround the money. Contributions totaling \$21,000 weren't on file as required at the Alaska Public Offices Commission.

Several checks bore consecutive serial numbers but were issued in the names of different employees.

One candidate, suspicious that one of Scott's contributions was made under a false name, returned the \$1,000 check.

State law makes it a crime for someone to lend a name to another's contribution, or for anyone to reimburse another's contribution.

Scott said her \$14,000 in contributions came from her own funds. But she wouldn't explain what motivated her to give so much money, or how an office manager could afford to be so lavish.

"You ask too many questions," she said.

AIC, owner John Ellsworth, fired all his workers and a related construction company owned by Ellsworth — Unicol Inc. — have given more than \$55,000 to candidates and political parties over

the past two years. All but six of the donations were in \$1,000 checks, the maximum a contributor can give to a single candidate under Alaska law.

Most of the recipients were Republicans who favor oil and development interests. AIC is one of the select group of oil-field contractors recently chosen by the major oil companies to continue working the North Slope as production and jobs decline. Arco Alaska Vice President Jim Weeks said "politically active" companies were looked upon more favorably than others when the cut

was made.

A computer-assisted search of 9,000 donations to state dates running for office shows Scott ranked fifth more than 2,000 individuals.

Her co-worker, office manager James Workman, 25th with \$8,000. State shows Workman isn't registered to vote in Alaska and did not for a permanent fund dividend in 1991 or 1992. Scott said Workman doesn't live in Alaska.

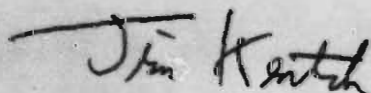

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## I. INTRODUCTION

On November 1, 1992 an article appeared in The Anchorage Daily News on campaign contributions in various races. The next day Bob Gigler and Citizens for Dave Donley each filed a complaint with APOC. Exhibit A. Each complaint was based on the information reported in the newspaper the previous day and on candidates' campaign disclosure reports. Staff consolidated these two complaints for the purposes of efficiency. After extensive investigation, staff recommends the commission refer all allegations to a hearing officer for a hearing under the Administrative Procedure Act as the best way to resolve the significant and numerous factual matters in dispute.

It is important to remember that this report does not try to present a final version of the facts. Instead, its purpose is to present the facts as staff has developed them to date as well as to recommend a next step to the commission. This report presents a more than adequate factual basis for the commission to hold a hearing under the Administrative Procedure Act. Staff has found many questionable transactions which are insufficiently explained. There are also many inconsistencies between the facts as presented by the contributors and as presented by the other evidence, both documentary and the testimony of other witnesses.

## II. THE ALLEGATIONS

### A. Introduction

On April 9, 1993 staff wrote a letter to the respondents summarizing the allegations against them. Exhibit B. There are two categories of respondents--contributors and candidates. The contributors are:

1. Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. (AIC), incorporated in 1987.
2. Unicol, Inc., incorporated in 1990.
3. John Ellsworth, president, director and sole owner of AIC and Unicol (Exhibit C)
4. Cindy Scott, AIC office manager, secretary, treasurer and director; Unicol office manager and secretary (has worked six years with Ellsworth)
5. James Workman, AIC North Slope operations manager (has worked 15 years with Ellsworth)
6. Bill Castoe, AIC field superintendent (has worked ten years with Ellsworth)
7. David Thomas, AIC manager of safety and engineering (has worked 12 years with Ellsworth)
8. John Peterson, AIC chief estimator (has worked 20 years with Ellsworth)
9. Al Foster, AIC Prudhoe Bay night shift superintendent (has worked seven years with Ellsworth)
10. Al Davis, AIC chief of operations at Red Dog Mine (has worked 12-13 years with Ellsworth)



These contributors allegedly:

1. formed at least one group without registering and reporting with APOC, without using a campaign depository, and without appointing campaign treasurers;
2. made excess contributions;
3. made contributions in the name of another;
4. gave or furnished money to another person or group for the purpose of making a contribution in the name of another; and
5. did not file timely and accurate "Statements of Contribution by an Individual, Organization or Business," (APCC Form 15-5).

The candidates are:

1. Larry Baker, 1992 candidate for Senate
2. Bob Bell, 1991 and 1993 candidate for Anchorage Assembly
3. Paul Fischer, 1992 candidate for Senate
4. Loren Leman, 1992 candidate for Senate
5. Drue Pearce, 1992 candidate for Senate
6. James Udelhoven, 1992 candidate for Senate
7. Bill Webb, 1992 candidate for Senate

These candidates allegedly:

1. failed to properly and timely report contributions from a group or groups on their campaign disclosure reports;
2. failed to make their best efforts to determine the legality of all their contributions;
3. knowingly accepted excess contributions;
4. did not return apparently illegal contributions within ten days of receipt or note on their campaign disclosure reports that the legality of the contribution was in question; and
5. filed campaign disclosure reports that did not properly report the correct source of all contributions or note that the legality of one or more contributions was in question.

## **B. The Answers**

### **1. The Contributors' Answers**

All respondents filed an answer to staff's April 9, 1993 letter, Exhibit D. All ten of the contributor respondents are represented by Joseph Sheehan, and they all answered at the same time through him. These answers--which deny all allegations except timely filing of 15-5's-- present a common theme. Cindy Scott (Scott) stated that as all of AIC's construction work activity occurs in rural Alaska, part of her job as office manager is to "expedite parts, equipment, employees and any other item needed by AIC field

personnel." She purchased 14 cashier's checks of \$1000 each on behalf of six employees at their direction with money (cash or personal check) they had deposited in their personnel file. These six employees are James Workman, John Peterson, William Castoe, Alton Foster, Alton Davis, and John Ellsworth. (Scott does not include David Thomas among the AIC employees for whom she purchased cashier's checks for contributions. In her deposition, however, she testified she had purchased a cashier's check in Thomas' name payable to Senator Leman). These cashier's checks were for contributions to candidates. Each employee gave directions to Scott on the amount, recipient and method of delivery of each contribution. Scott also explained that she made 13 contributions of \$1000 each with her own personal funds in the form of cashier's checks rather than with personal checks because she claimed she was under the mistaken impression that "it was improper to make a political contribution using a personal check." (Scott did not gain this impression from John Ellsworth, AIC or Unicol, as these contributors gave \$25,500 of contributions in personal checks from 1990 through 1992. Exhibit E. In 1986 Ellsworth also made two contributions of \$1000 each, apparently by personal check. See Tables VI and VII on pages 30-31).

The answers of four of the six employees on whose behalf Scott acted corroborate Scott's explanation of this method of making contributions:

1. James Workman (Workman) asserts he works almost continuously in Prudhoe Bay, and often asks Scott to do things for him in Anchorage. He stated he gave cash to Scott--as he normally conducts his business in cash rather than personal checks--and directed her to purchase seven cashier's checks, each for a \$1000 contribution. Workman also instructed Scott to deliver the contributions to the candidates or their representative, as he did not attend any fundraisers.

2. William Castoe (Castoe) resides in Palmer and works 16 to 18 week shifts at Prudhoe Bay and the Red Dog Mine. Castoe claims he leaves between \$1000 and \$2000 cash with Scott "because of the distance between Palmer and Anchorage and the associated inconvenience." Scott reportedly uses this money in the way she does for Workman. In his answer he states that because he was out of town, he asked Scott to take \$1000 of his cash and buy and deliver cashier's checks as contributions for two candidates.<sup>1</sup> Castoe's answer also states he gave money to Webb as a result of Webb's direct personal solicitation in Prudhoe Bay. At his deposition Castoe changed this, saying that he did not meet Webb during the campaign and was not solicited by Webb. This revised story corroborates Webb's account, who said he really doesn't know Castoe and did not remember asking Castoe for money.

3. Alton Foster (Foster) maintains he works 11 months a year at Prudhoe Bay and normally leaves over \$1500 cash with Scott for her to make purchases for him while he

is working. Foster also contends he instructed Scott to buy a cashier's check with \$1000 of his cash for a contribution.

4. Alton Davis (Davis) resides in Anchorage and asserts he works 12 to 19 week shifts at the Red Dog Mine. Davis stated he has authorized Scott as a signatory on his bank accounts and also--and this was his idea--leaves cash with her in his personnel file. He claims he asked Scott to buy a cashier's check with \$1000 of his cash and deliver it to a candidate.

## **2. The Candidates' Answers**

All the candidates also filed answers. Four of the candidates--Larry Baker (Baker), Bob Bell (Bell), Senator Drue Pearce (Pearce) and Bill Webb (Webb)--are represented by Groh, Eggers and Price, and answered through their lawyer. These candidates categorically deny every allegation except one. Pearce admits Thomas delivered checks from Workman and Scott to her fundraiser on September 30, 1992. Jermain, Dunnagan and Owens represents James Udelhoven (Udelhoven), who also denies all allegations of misconduct. Udelhoven states his campaign held only one fundraiser, and Ellsworth and Thomas attended it.

Two candidates--Senator Loren Leman (Leman) and Paul Fischer (Fischer)--filed their own answers. Leman denies all allegations, explaining that he initially questioned four contributions of \$1000 each that he received from AIC and three of its employees in 1992 because of their size and his lack of familiarity with two of the contributors. He states he returned the two contributions to the people he didn't know (Workman and Thomas), but then Scott explained to Leman's assistant that the contributions were valid. Leman relates that Scott told his assistant that the employees contribute regularly to their own political donation account and authorize her to "cut checks to candidates" from their remote work sites. Leman states that Scott assured him the contributions fully complied with APOC regulations, and she reissued the two \$1000 contributions he had returned earlier. It is important to recognize that on August 21, 1991 APOC staff member Chris Ellingson explained the rule concerning limits on closely related corporations to Scott.

Fischer also denied all allegations in his answer. In an interview Fischer said that Cliff Groh, of Groh, Eggers and Price, helped him draft his answer but did not charge him any money.



### III. THE INVESTIGATION

Staff began its investigation by subpoenaing relevant bank records. Soon after beginning its investigation, staff and the commission realized that several factors necessitated hiring a contract investigator: the lack of an investigator on staff since June 1991; the number of respondents; the scope of alleged activity; the volume of financial data to be collected and analyzed; and the press of other daily business. The commission contracted with Rolie Port (Port), a private investigator, to handle the investigation and appear before the Commission to assist staff in presenting its recommendation. Port interviewed or deposed all 15 human respondents as well as other witnesses. He also reviewed subpoenaed bank and telephone records as well as documents subpoenaed from AIC and Unicol.

AIC, Unicol and Ellsworth filed a lawsuit in Fairbanks Superior Court on July 12, 1994 asking the judge to declare the commission's subpoenas invalid, to dismiss the investigation against AIC, Unicol, and their employees, and to order staff to submit to the commission AIC's, Unicol's and Ellsworth's motion to dismiss the complaint which their lawyer Sheehan had sent to staff earlier. The judge ruled that the subpoenas were valid, ordering all parties from which information had been subpoenaed to provide the information by September 9, 1994.

A spreadsheet of all contributions from the respondents from February 1990 through December 1992 is attached as Exhibit E. The data are sorted by date of contribution, by contributor, by recipient and by check number. This exhibit represents, to the best of staff's knowledge, all contributions the ten contributor respondents made from February 1990 through December 1992.

### IV. RELEVANT LAW

#### A. Groups

"group" means... any combination of two or more persons or individuals acting jointly who take action the major purpose of which is to influence the outcome of an election...AS 15.13.130(4). A "group" includes every combination of two or more persons who are elected, appointed, or otherwise chosen, or who cooperate for the purpose of raising, soliciting, collecting or disbursing money or anything of value, or for directing or controlling those activities to secure or defeat the election to public office of an individual or candidate...2 AAC 50.314(a)(1).

"group" includes two or more persons who jointly make a contribution in the name of another as described in 2 AAC 50.357. 2 AAC 50.314(a)(3).

"person" includes corporations, organizations and associations. AS 15.13.130(7), AS 01.10.060.

Each group shall register with the commission before making an expenditure on behalf of a candidate. AS 15.13.050.

### **B. Reporting Requirements**

Each group and candidate shall make a certified and full report of: the aggregate amount of all contributions made to it; the date and amount contributed, name, address, principal occupation and employer of the makers of all contributions over \$100 in the aggregate each year; and the date and amount of all expenditures. AS 15.13.040(a), (b), (c).

Group and candidate reports are due 30 days before the election, seven days before the election, ten days after the election, and on December 31. AS 15.13.110(a).

Contributions that appear to be illegal must, within ten days after receipt, be returned to the contributor. 2 AAC 50.319(d).

A campaign treasurer shall make his or her best efforts to determine the legality of a contribution. If a contribution cannot be determined to be legal, a refund must be made within a reasonable time, and the treasurer shall note the refund by amending the current report or noting the change on the next required report. Alternatively, the contribution may be deposited into the campaign depository and reported. If it is deposited, the treasurer shall make and retain a written record noting the basis for the appearance of illegality. A statement noting that the legality of the contribution is in question must be included in the next required report. 2 AAC 50.319(e).

The candidate is responsible for the performance of the campaign treasurer, and any default or violation by the treasurer shall also be considered a default or violation by the candidate if the candidate knew or had reason to know of the default or violation. AS 15.13.060(f).

### **C. Restrictions on Contributions**

A person or group may not contribute over \$1000 to a candidate a year. AS 15.13.070(a).

A contribution may not be made, directly or indirectly, by one person or group in the name of another to influence the election of a candidate. AS 15.13.070(d).

Contributions by two or more organizations to the same recipient are in the name of another if the organizations share the majority of their boards of directors, share two or more corporate officers, or are owned by the same shareholders. 2 AAC 50.357(c).

No person, employer, principal, supervisor or contractor may lend, pay, advance, or reimburse employees, agents or other persons for contributions to a candidate or group in the employee's, agent's or other person's name, or in a name other than the original

source of the contribution. 2 AAC 50.357(b).

A contribution made at the direction of another person is a contribution in the name of another. 2 AAC 50.357(c).

#### **D. Penalties**

A person who fails to file a properly completed report on time is subject to a daily civil penalty of not more than \$50 if the report was due seven days before the election. AS 15.13.125.

A person who fails to file a properly completed report on time is subject to a daily civil penalty of not more than \$10 if the report was due 30 days before the election, ten days after the election, or on December 31. AS 15.13.125.

A person who violates a provision of AS 15.13 is guilty of a misdemeanor and may be punished by imprisonment for not less than one year or by a fine of not more than \$5,000. A violation includes:

- \* failing to file a required statement
- \* failing to file a required statement on time
- \* filing a false statement
- \* giving or furnishing money to another person or group for the purpose of making a contribution or expenditure in the name of another
- \* knowingly accepting a contribution in violation of AS 15.13.070. AS 15.13.120(a).

### **V. AIC-UNICOL CORPORATE GROUP**

#### **A. Introduction**

Staff's analysis of the facts within the context of the applicable law indicates that the ten contributor respondents (AIC, Unicol and its eight employees) formed three major groups. For ease of reference, these three groups are the "AIC-Unicol corporate group," the "AIC employee group," and the "residual group." This report discusses these three groups in this order.



## **B. Analysis: Group Activity**

Table I illustrates the relationship between AIC and Unicol for 1990, 1991 and 1992.

1. AIC and Unicol formed a group in 1990, 1991 and 1992 by operation of law.

2 AAC 50.357 sets forth several tests to judge whether two corporations are similar enough that--for the purposes of the campaign disclosure law under APOC regulation 2 AAC 50.314--they become one contributor. Two corporations form a group if they:

- \* share at least two corporate officers; or
- \* are owned by the same shareholders.

When two corporations meet just one of these criteria, they form a group and their contributions to a candidate are thus limited to \$1000 a year. If two corporations which satisfy just one of these criteria make contributions in their corporate names, the contributions are in the name of another because they should be made in the name of the group (the actual source, the AIC-Unicol corporate group) rather than the corporate names.

Table I shows that AIC and Unicol had the same corporate officers and the same shareholder in 1990, 1991 and 1992. <sup>2</sup> This sharing of officers and owner was total; neither AIC nor Unicol had any officers or shareholder that the other lacked. Although AIC and Unicol would form a group if they only shared two officers or were just owned by the same shareholders, AIC and Unicol satisfy two of the legal tests for forming a group. By operation of the campaign disclosure law, AIC and Unicol formed a group in 1990, 1991 and 1992 by sharing the same officers and owner and contributing to candidates.

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<sup>2</sup> This information is from biennial reports AIC and Unicol filed with the Department of Commerce and Economic Development and from information supplied by their lawyer. See Exhibit C.

**2. The AIC-Unicol Corporate group made \$6000 excess contributions to five candidates.**

Table II on page 12 shows that during the three years from 1990 through 1992, this group gave \$11,000 to five candidates. As a group cannot legally contribute more than \$1000 a year to a candidate, only \$5000 of this \$11,000 were legal contributions, and the rest--\$6000--was excess.

Four candidates--Shields, Sampson, Bell and Pearce--returned a \$1000 contribution to the AIC-Unicol Corporate group. As the law prohibits a contributor from making an excess contribution, this refund does not absolve the AIC-Unicol corporate group from making excess contributions.

**Shields:**

Shields received one \$1000 contribution from AIC in March 1990, and a second one in July 1990. She returned this second excess contribution on August 15, 1990, and Unicol contributed another \$1000 the same day. She explained that in 1990 she didn't know that Ellsworth owned both AIC and Unicol.

**Sampson:**

August 6, 1991: Sampson received \$1000 from both Unicol and AIC.

Between August 7 and August 21, 1991: According to Janet Flodin (Flodin), Sampson's campaign treasurer, Sampson saw that John Ellsworth signed both of these two \$1000 checks, and noticed they were both received on the same day. Although Ellsworth doesn't think he spoke with Sampson about the returned check, Sampson said he telephoned Ellsworth. Sampson remembers Ellsworth as being upset when Sampson told him he could not accept both checks because it appeared as though one person owned both companies. Sampson told Port that Ellsworth told him, "You don't want my money? That is a new one."

August 20, 1991: Flodin wrote Ellsworth a letter explaining that AIC and Unicol could not contribute more than \$1000 from both companies. Exhibit F. This letter cited the correct APOC regulation prohibiting the type of contribution that AIC and Unicol had just made to Sampson, and refers to a conversation with "your office."

August 21, 1991: Sampson returned \$1000 to AIC.

August 21, 1991: According to staff member Chris Ellingson, Scott telephoned Ellingson and asked, "My boss has two corporations, one union and one non-union. We want to contribute \$1000 to a candidate out of each business. Can we?" Ellingson replied that the union status was not relevant under the campaign disclosure law; what mattered were

any overlapping directors, shareholders or officers. Ellingson discussed these factors with Scott, and informed her that if the corporations met any of those tests they were limited to contributing \$1000 to a candidate a year. Scott thanked Ellingson and said she would tell her boss. At her deposition Scott testified that she called APOC between 1990 and 1993 to find out what to do with a returned campaign check.<sup>3</sup> She admitted she understood the explanation that if one person owned two companies, both companies could contribute only \$1000 in a calendar year. She also stated that Ellsworth told her to "do whatever she had to do to fix it." It is reasonable to conclude that Scott telephoned Ellingson in response to Flodin's letter and the returned contribution.

**Bell:**

August 20, 1991: AIC and Unicol each contributed \$1000 to Bell.

August 21, 1991: Bell's treasurer LaJuna Streif telephoned Ellingson because she was concerned about two checks she had received from AIC and Unicol that were signed by the same person. Ellingson discussed with Streif the APOC tests to determine whether corporate contributions were excessive, and suggested she call the contributors and find out their relationship.

Between August 21 and August 23, 1991: Bell informed Port that he told Ellsworth that he was returning one of the \$1000 checks because APOC rules prohibit companies he owns from contributing more than \$1000 to a candidate. Bell explained the rule to Ellsworth, and Ellsworth said he was not aware of this rule; it was fine with him if Bell wanted to return the check. Bell did not ask Ellsworth who owned AIC or Unicol, and Ellsworth did not volunteer that information. Bell returned the check because "In my mind I didn't want to worry about whether or not he [Ellsworth] was or was not [the owner], I just wanted to have the problem go away." At his deposition Ellsworth stated he could not remember if Bell had told him on the telephone he could not accept checks from both AIC and Unicol. He also did not know if Bell, a personal friend, had returned a campaign contribution in 1991.

August 23, 1991: Bell returned \$1000 contribution to Unicol.

**Pearce:**

Pearce received \$1000 from AIC in August 1992, and seven weeks later received another \$1000 from Unicol. She returned this second contribution almost two years later, explaining that she did not know Ellsworth owned both AIC and Unicol. Exhibit G.

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<sup>3</sup> At her deposition Scott initially denied asking APOC staff for advice before this complaint was filed, but later stated she remembered calling for advice on what to do with a returned contribution.



### **3. AIC-Unicol Corporate group's 1992 activity**

The AIC-Unicol corporate group contributed \$2000 to Pearce in 1992, \$1000 of which is over the \$1000 limit. This excess contribution is particularly puzzling when viewed in the context of the group's 1991 contributions. Two candidates--Sampson and Bell--had each returned \$1000 to the AIC-Unicol corporate group in 1991. Both Sampson and Bell told staff they each explained to Ellsworth they were returning contributions based on his actual or apparent ownership of AIC and Unicol. On August 21, 1991 Ellingson discussed with Scott (the secretary and treasurer of both AIC and Unicol) the factors that limited corporations to contributing \$1000 to a candidate a year. Despite Flodin's letter (Exhibit F) and these three conversations which Bell, Ellingson and Flodin had with Ellsworth or Scott in 1991, the AIC-Unicol corporate group made another excess contribution in 1992.

### **4. The AIC-Unicol corporate group made contributions totaling \$11,000 in the name of another.**

As discussed above, AIC and Unicol formed a group in 1990, 1991 and 1992 because they shared their owner and all officers. All contributions in the names of AIC and Unicol during these three years are not actually from either corporation, but instead from the AIC-Unicol corporate group these two corporations formed. All these contributions are illegal because they were made in the name of another.

### **5. The AIC-Unicol corporate group did not register before it made contributions, and has not filed group reports. It has neither designated a campaign depository nor made all deposits to and expenditures from it. It has also failed to appoint any campaign treasurers.**

None of these required forms has been filed with APOC.

Table II illustrates the contributions that AIC and Unicol made to candidates in 1990, 1991 and 1992. The six excess contributions are in **bold**.

### C. Conclusion

The Aic-Unicol corporate group has violated--and continues to violate--the following provisions of law:

1. formed a group without registering and reporting with APOC, without using a campaign depository, and without appointing campaign treasurers;

2. made excess contributions; and
3. made contributions in the name of another.

## VI. AIC EMPLOYEE GROUP

### A. Introduction

The AIC employee group is the second major group staff has identified. In her answer Scott admitted under oath that six AIC employees (Ellsworth, Workman, Castoe, Foster, Davis and Peterson) directed her to purchase cashier's checks for them for particular candidates. The "owner of the money" gave directions on the amount, recipient and method of the contribution, and gave Scott cash or a personal check so she could buy cashier's checks for their contributions. <sup>4</sup> Scott explained that AIC employees deposit cash or personal checks with her because they work for extended periods in rural Alaska; she holds this cash and these checks in the employees' personnel files for distribution according to the employee's instructions. She stated she kept this money and bought the cashier's checks as a personal favor for her friends rather than as part of her job.

Scott also fills out the individual contributor report (the 15-5) when she makes contributions for her friends, and has verbal authorization--but no power of attorney--from Workman, Castoe, Thomas, Davis and Foster to sign their 15-5's for them. Thomas, however, stated under oath that he had signed all his 15-5's himself. She initially denied filling out a 15-5 for Rodney Wallace, a pilot of Ellsworth's plane, but later admitted she had. If this joint activity actually happened as described in the answers of the AIC employees, the AIC employees created a group.

However, it is possible that the employees' answers are not reliable. The next section of this report sets forth the reasons supporting the veracity of their answers as well as the reasons showing that their answers present something other than an accurate version of the facts. After reading this next section, it will be reasonable to conclude that the employees' answers do not accurately portray the manner in which these contributions were made as well as the sources of the contributions.

Table III on page 15 illustrates the contributions for which Scott admits purchasing cashier's checks. All 14 of these contributions were for \$1000. The five excess contributions are in **bold**.

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<sup>4</sup> At her deposition Scott gave a different version, stating that she had not received personal checks from AIC employees with which to make contributions.



## B. Analysis

1. If the seven AIC employees acted as described in their answers, their joint action formed a group in 1991 and 1992.

When two or more people take joint action whose major purpose is to influence the outcome of an election, they form a group. AS 15.13.130(4). Table III on the next page shows that in 1991 and 1992 Scott and seven other AIC employees took joint action whose only purpose was to contribute to candidates. They formed a group by acting together in this way. The "owner of the money" directed Scott as to the amount of the contribution, the candidate who was to receive it, and the "method of the contribution." Scott bought the check, and someone other than the person in whose name the contribution was made delivered it. Scott testified in her deposition that they were acting as friends rather than as fellow employees; this was not part of Scott's AIC job duties.

## **2. Reasons supporting the truthfulness of the AIC employees' answers**

If this joint activity actually happened as described in the answers of the AIC employees, the AIC employees created a group.

a. The answers were made under oath and have some consistency with facts verified by other sources. Scott states she purchased cashier's checks for AIC employees with cash, and bank documents show many cashier's checks were bought with cash. Pearce's and Thomas' answers concur by saying that Thomas personally delivered his contribution at her fundraiser.<sup>5</sup>

b. The timing of the contributions in Table III correlates fairly closely with the candidates' fundraisers. Research shows that ten of the 14 contributions in Table III were received in connection with a fundraiser.

c. Some of the travel documents obtained from AIC corroborate the employees' answers. Copies of plane tickets show that Peterson was in Anchorage the dates on which he said he personally gave Scott \$2000 cash to buy cashier's checks, and they also show that Scott was in Anchorage each day the contributions listed in Table III occurred. Of the ten contributions which were made in Workman's name in 1992, he was clearly not in Anchorage the date one was reported, and he may also have been out of Anchorage for two more contributions. Ellsworth was in Anchorage for 16 of the 19 days between December 1991 and October 1992 on which a cluster of contributions occurred, and thus could have delivered those contributions to a fundraiser on any of those 16 days. The plane tickets are equivocal as to Ellsworth's whereabouts the other three days.

The plane tickets obtained from AIC do not present a complete picture of all the travel which Thomas, Workman, Foster, Castoe, Davis, Ellsworth and Castoe did, as AIC does not maintain travel records for its employees other than plane ticket stubs. A private jet owned by one of Ellsworth's corporations provided transportation for at least Castoe and Ellsworth.

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<sup>5</sup> Pearce's answer states that Thomas told her at this fundraiser that Workman was on the North Slope and could not attend the fundraiser. AIC travel records are inconclusive as to Workman's whereabouts on September 30, 1992, the day of the fundraiser. These records show that on September 27 Workman flew from the North Slope to Fairbanks; the next travel record shows that he flew from Anchorage to the North Slope on November 17.



d. The AIC employees received enough compensation to enable them to make the contributions with their own money. The following table shows the compensation of the eight AIC employee respondents for 1990, 1991 and 1992:

Some of these employees made statements supporting the conclusion that they were accustomed to spending significant sums of money. Workman testified that \$7,000 is not a lot of money to him. Castoe testified that \$1,000 doesn't mean anything to him, as he makes more than that every week. His wife told Port that she wastes \$3,000 in a week. AIC contributed \$50,000 to the Republican National Committee in mid-October 1994, but in early December of 1994 Ellsworth testified he did not know how much he had contributed to it in 1994. Foster testified he felt that a person should be able to give any amount of money he wants to a candidate. However, both Ellsworth and Thomas testified they did not like to write checks on their personal checking accounts because they did not want to bounce a check.

Peterson initially testified that he had never taken a draw or advance from AIC. However, when shown an AIC check for \$26,000 payable to him that was written in April 1992, he admitted receiving a draw for \$26,000 in the form of a bonus. He said this was his only bonus he received in 1990 through 1992. <sup>6</sup> He "paid back" this draw by receiving a bonus on October 16, 1992 which canceled out the earlier \$26,000 check. However, the net effect of these transactions was that Peterson received \$26,000 in April 1992 and \$2,836 on October 16, 1992.

<sup>6</sup> As Table IV shows, he actually received three bonuses, all in 1992.

### **3. Reasons supporting the falsity of the AIC employees' answers**

However, it is possible that the joint activity which the AIC employees' answers describe did not take place as set forth in those answers. If this is the case, the evidence strongly indicates the AIC employees' activity formed a group under 2 AAC 50.314(a)(3). The following facts support this:

#### **a. Possible motive for employees' contributions**

All employees have a motive to assert the contributions made in their names were made with their own money rather than with money from another source, such as AIC or Ellsworth.

\* Table IV on pages 17-18 shows the money, in the form of salaries and bonuses, that AIC pays its employees.

\* AIC also gives Scott and Thomas substantial in-kind bonuses. In December 1993, during this investigation, AIC purchased that land included a restaurant in Big Lake valued at approximately \$217,000 for Scott. AIC pays the monthly mortgage of \$1,956, and the property is in her name. <sup>7</sup> Ellsworth stated that AIC has no retirement plan because its employees are paid well enough to provide for their own retirement. The only employee who has a pension is Scott, one of the most highly paid AIC employees. Scott also receives the lease payments from the restaurant. This arrangement is not in writing, and Ellsworth's refusal to make future payments would force her to take over the payments herself.

\* Ellsworth sold a house in Sportsmen's Point, an Anchorage subdivision, to Thomas in June 1994 for \$191,000, 67% of its appraised value of \$285,000. Staff's research revealed that during the seven months from August 1994 through February 1995, three houses were sold in this subdivision. The selling price of these three houses ranged from \$265,000 to \$295,000. The average list price was \$295,000.

\* At his deposition Ellsworth said that AIC employees know what needs to be done to help out AIC. If AIC doesn't have projects, its employees have no jobs. Similarly, he supports his workers 100%.

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<sup>7</sup> Scott first testified that the only land she owned in Alaska was in Anchorage and Fairbanks, and that she did not own any property or anything of value with anyone associated with AIC. She also said she owns nothing that Ellsworth has a monetary interest in, and she did not know of any AIC assets used to make mortgage payments for any AIC employees. She later changed her story, disclosing she also owned this Big Lake property on which AIC was making mortgage payments.



## **b. Timing of bonuses and contributions**

For three of the five AIC employees who received bonuses, a correlation exists between the timing of the bonuses and their contributions to candidates:

Scott's \$5,000 bonus in September 1991 coincides with her first contributions.<sup>a</sup>

It is also noteworthy that in 1990 and 1991 Peterson did not receive a bonus, and he made no contributions. In 1992 he first received a bonus and first contributed to candidates. His bonus of \$2,836 coincides with his only two contributions.

Castoe admitted under oath that he received a regular payroll check that also contained a \$1000 bonus several days after he contributed \$1000 to Udelhoven on August 20, 1992. (This payroll check is dated September 4, 1992 and covers the pay period August 24 through August 30, 1992. Castoe received two bonuses on the same day in two separate checks). Castoe explained this \$1000 bonus was for work he did for an Amerada Hess project. However, neither AIC's nor Unicol's check register shows any deposits coming in from Amerada Hess in 1992. One payroll check to Castoe indicates he worked 176 hours one week in November of 1990; however, a week of 24 hour days contains only 168 hours. Castoe stated these excess hours had no connection to the \$1000

<sup>a</sup> On August 30, 1991 Elsworth took a "draw" from the AIC checking account for \$5,000. Unlike the records for almost every other "draw," AIC records do not indicate the purpose of this one. His only other "draw" for 1991 was for \$3,325.16 to "reimburse for parts-auction."

contributions made in his name to either Udelhoven or Young.

**c. Cash in personnel files**

People differ in the degree to which they believe employees could keep as much as \$7000 cash in a company's personnel files.

\* When asked as to the contents of the personnel files, Scott testified that AIC employees' personnel files contain IRS forms, health and safety information, hiring and lay-off slips, and any child support payment information. She did not say they contained cash.

\* According to Leman, Scott said employees contribute regularly to their accounts; the employees call her and tell her how to distribute the money. Leman said he would not have accepted cashier's checks from AIC employees if he had known that they were purchased with cash kept in personnel files; so casual a practice would alert him to something wrong.

\* When asked about the practice of keeping cash in personnel files so purchases could be made for out-of-town employees, Shields replied, "I haven't heard of the practice. I'm not saying the practice isn't there....It's stupid...it would be a stupid thing to do."

\* John Pike, Sr., who worked off and on for three years for Ensearch under Ellsworth, never knew of this practice.

\* John Pike, Jr., worked for AIC for nine months in 1991 at all the pipeline camps and also in spring of 1994. He didn't know of this policy either, as AIC had not extended that courtesy to him or any of his co-workers he knew of. He thought such a practice was odd, and could not believe it existed.

\* Gerald Phillips worked for AIC off and on for the past three years, most recently in March 1994. Phillips had never heard of the opportunity to leave money with AIC's Anchorage office so Scott could use it for employees' personal errands.

\* Pearce and Bell, however, were not surprised to hear of this practice. When Pearce ran the bank in Kotzebue, it was common for people who worked in rural Alaska to allow someone else to handle their banking. Bell said Thomas and Workman told him shortly after November 2, 1992 that they kept cash in their folders for contributions or other bills "so that they could call and just have somebody go get a cashier check." Scott did not explain why she used a cashier check, but Bell believed all three AIC employees when they told him they contributed their own money. Davis' wife believes her husband could leave money with Scott as they are very close friends.

**d. AIC check # 13479 for petty cash**

Scott's answer states that she bought \$4000 worth of cashier's checks for her contributions and Workman's contributions of \$1000 each to Webb and Baker on August 12, 1992. Workman's answer states that he gave Scott cash to buy these two cashier's checks. Workman testified that he did not authorize AIC to buy his two checks, and would object if AIC had bought them. However, documents obtained from the bank indicated that these two cashier's checks were not purchased with cash that belonged to Workman, but instead with AIC check # 13479. Exhibit H. This check is marked "petty cash fund." Scott explained she had \$4,000 cash in her purse to buy these four checks as well as the AIC check marked for petty cash when she went to the bank, and the bank made an error by using the AIC petty cash check to buy the four cashier's checks instead of the cash. The bank did not provide a cash-in stub in response to APOC's subpoena, and if the transaction occurred as Scott describes it there would be a cash-in stub. She stated it was a coincidence that the petty cash fund needed to be increased by \$4,000 the same day she decided to get \$4,000 worth of cashier's checks for herself and Workman.

Scott stated the cue for her to deposit more money into petty cash was either a low balance in petty cash or an imminent trip by the pilots. Before this \$4,000 was deposited into petty cash, the petty cash fund had \$6,758 in it; in staff's opinion this is not a low balance. The pilots' first reimbursement from petty cash after the \$4,000 deposit was 19 days later, on August 31, for \$3,579. If the \$4,000 had not been deposited, petty cash would have had \$5,734 on August 31—more than enough to cover the pilots' reimbursement.

Exhibit I shows the monthly ending balance in AIC's petty cash for 1990, 1991 and 1992. The two months with the highest ending balance (November 1991 and July 1992) immediately precede periods of significant contribution activity. On November 30, 1991 petty cash had \$5,034; AIC and its employees contributed \$8,500 the next month. On July 30, 1992 petty cash had \$8,048; AIC and its employees contributed \$18,000 the next month. During this three year period, \$87,500 was deposited into petty cash.

**e. Ellsworth's \$6000 draw**

On October 2, 1992 Ellsworth took a "draw" of \$6,000 from AIC, his first that year. On that same day someone used \$3000 cash to purchase cashier's checks in the names of Thomas, Castoe and Peterson, all payable to Webb. Seven days later, someone used another \$3000 cash to buy cashier's checks in the names of Ellsworth, Thomas and Peterson payable to Don Young.

**f. Forgotten keys and a \$6000 AIC check**

On October 13, 1992, 11 days after Ellsworth received his \$6,000 "draw" from AIC, he had



no cash. Scott had forgotten her keys to the personnel files with the employees' cash. Ellsworth explained that for a lack of keys, there was a lack of cash, and so he directed Scott to write him a \$6,000 AIC check (#14201). Exhibit J. Even though the roundtrip from AIC's office to Scott's house is 8.1 miles and takes just over 18 minutes--and despite the fact that Scott's absence would have left the AIC office with at least one worker who could have answered the phone--Scott did not get the keys. Ellsworth instead took the \$6,000 check to the bank and used it to buy five cashier's checks:

\$1000 in Davis' name to Webb

\$1000 in Foster's name to Webb

three checks to Frank Murkowski in the names of Scott, Thomas, Ellsworth and his wife

Ellsworth stated that Scott repaid him the next day. Scott testified that she keeps cash at home for "extras," and on any given day can have from \$1000 to \$2000 cash in her pocket. Peterson swore he commonly has \$1,000 cash in his pocket, and at his deposition said he probably had \$1,350 then and there. Ellsworth testified that he routinely keeps more than \$1000 cash on hand at AIC's office, but stated under oath he nonetheless had no cash on October 13 despite this practice and despite his \$6000 "draw" 11 days earlier. Foster could not explain this \$6,000 check, as he gave Scott--and not AIC--permission to buy his cashier's check.

#### **g. Serially numbered cashier's checks**

Pages four through six of Exhibit E sort the relevant contributions by check number. Each series of consecutively numbered checks are enclosed in boxes. These data show 17 separate series of serial cashier's checks totaling \$49,000 of contributions. Consecutively numbered cashier's checks are purchased in sequence from the same bank teller, and are thus a strong indication that one person is purchasing them all at once. Serial cashier's checks are thus a prime indicator of group activity, particularly when it is recognized that the source of funds used to purchase cashier's checks is much harder to trace than the source of funds upon which a personal check is drawn. Some but not all of the cashier's checks used by the AIC employee group are sequentially numbered.

#### **h. AIC employees' knowledge of and participation in Alaska politics**

\* Thomas, in whose names \$6000 was contributed to Udelhoven, Leman, Pearce, Webb and Bell, moved to Alaska in 1992. He did not become a registered voter until 1993. When asked on November 30, 1994 to name his elected officials, he gave Walter Hickel, Jack Coghill, Don Young, Frank Murkowski and Drue Pearce; he omitted Bill Faulkner, Joe Murry, Rick Mystrom, Ted Stevens and Mark Hanley. Although he testified that in 1992 he was on the North Slope over 300 days, AIC travel records (which are incomplete) show he was on the Slope between 105 and 196 days in 1992.

\* Castoe, in whose name \$2000 was contributed to Udelhoven and Webb, lives in Palmer.

He did not know his elected officials, and did not contribute to any candidates running from the Mat-Su Valley. He asserts in his answer that he asked Scott to buy two cashier's checks for him "Because I was out of town and could not do it for myself." The travel documents AIC supplied are inconclusive, and do not prove that he was out of town. He also stated that he normally works 16 to 18 week shifts; these documents indicate that the longest stretch Castoe worked in 1990, 1991 and 1992 was 64 days, from August 3, 1990 to October 6, 1990. He has lived in Alaska off and on for 20 years, and now lives in Palmer. He registered to vote in 1992.

\* Davis, in whose name \$1000 was contributed to Webb, lives in North Carolina. He is not a registered voter anywhere and doesn't know any of his elected officials. His answer states he works 12 to 19 week shifts with only four to six weeks off a year, and thus he has Scott purchase items and send them to him at Red Dog. However, AIC travel documents indicate that between 1990 and 1992 he flew into or out of Anchorage between six and ten times each year. On July 19, 1994 his wife was contacted in North Carolina. She stated her husband was currently working six weeks on and one month off. She has been totally aware of her husband's finances since they were married in September 1993, and they do not have enough money to make political contributions to anyone.

\* Foster, in whose name \$1000 was contributed to Webb, is a registered voter in Oregon. He does not know any of his elected officials in Oregon. Foster has never voted in Alaska or received a Permanent Fund Dividend, and has no vehicle registered with the Alaska Department of Motor Vehicles. His answer asserts he normally works 16 weeks straight with one or two intervening weeks off, being away from the North Slope about one month each year. However, AIC travel documents indicate that in 1992 he was away from the North Slope 18 weeks.

\* Scott, in whose name \$15,000 was contributed to Sampson, Bell, Pearce, Collins, Leman, Zawacki, Webb, Baker, Udelhoven, Fischer and Taylor, is a registered Alaskan voter. However, she does not know her elected officials. At her deposition she stated that Robin Taylor was a senator, "maybe from Kenai." Senator Taylor is from Southeast. She also stated that her representative on the Anchorage Assembly was Bob Bell. In reality, she had two representatives on the Anchorage Assembly: Bill Faulkner (elected 1985) and Joe Murdy (elected 1993). She mistakenly believes Leman lost his election, and does not know if Zawacki or Fischer won. She does not know the districts of Collins, Leman, Zawacki, Baker, Fischer or Webb.

\* Workman, in whose name \$7000 was contributed to Bell, Webb, Baker, Udelhoven, Fischer, Leman and Pearce, has never voted in his life. He does not receive a permanent fund dividend despite living in Prudhoe Bay. His answer states he asked Scott to purchase seven cashier's checks of \$1000 each which the candidates reported receiving on six dates from May 29, 1992 through September 30, 1992. On five of those six dates, according to the AIC travel documents, Workman was in Anchorage. (\$6000 was

contributed in his name between August 10, 1992 and September 30, 1992; his payroll records indicate he did not work for most of that period). Although he states that he does not "have access to the services and conveniences of a city," the AIC travel documents indicate that for 1990, 1991 and 1992 he was in a city an average of 83 days (just shy of seven weeks) each year.

**Summary:** As a result of all the above reasons, material questions of fact exist about the manner in which these contributions were made as well as whose funds were originally used to pay for them. If the employees' answers are truthful, then the AIC employee group exists. However, for all the above reasons, it is reasonable to conclude that the employees' answers do not accurately portray the manner in which these contributions were made as well as the contributions' source. The AIC employees may have formed a group through joint activity other than what is described in their answers. The fact that all AIC employees answered through one lawyer increases the likelihood that the answers will be similar, because they could coordinate their answers with each other to decrease inconsistencies.

**4. If the AIC employees did form a group, all its 1991 and 1992 contributions (\$14,000) were in the name of another because they were made in the name of the individual employees rather than in the name of the AIC employee group.**

The AIC employees filled out the checks and 15-5's in their own individual names rather than in a group's name. If they did form a group, all these contributions were in the name of another, and thus illegal.

**5. If the AIC employees did form a group, it made \$5000 excess contributions.**

In 1991 this group's activity was limited to two contributions of \$1000 each to two candidates. According to Scott, in early September of 1991 Ellsworth gave her cash or a personal check for her to buy two cashier's checks of \$1000 each for two candidates.

In 1991 the AIC employee group made no excess contributions as it made just two contributions of \$1000 to each of two candidates. Table III. The Campaign Disclosure Law allows a group to contribute \$1000 per year per candidate, so no excess contributions occurred in 1991.

In 1992 this group was much more active, contributing \$5000 to Webb, \$2000 to Udelhoven, and \$1000 to each of five other candidates (Bell, Baker, Fischer, Leman and Pearce), for a total of \$12,000 of contributions. This group could legally contribute only \$1000 a year to a candidate. As the group contributed to seven candidates, only \$7000 of this \$12,000 were not excess contributions. The rest--\$5000--was excess. The AIC employee group made a \$1000 excess contribution to Udelhoven and \$4000 of excess



contributions to Webb.

6. If the AIC employees did form a group, it did not register before making contributions, and has not filed group reports. It has neither designated a campaign depository nor made all deposits to and expenditures from it. It has also failed to appoint any campaign treasurers.

None of these group duties has been met.

### C. Conclusion

Whether or not the AIC employees' answers present a complete and accurate picture of the facts, the employees' joint activity formed a group. If their answers are credible, they have admitted—under oath—participating in activity that formed a group under 2 AAC 50.314(a)(1). The core of this group activity is Scott's participation in getting the cash from the personnel files, using the cash to buy cashier's checks, ensuring that the contributions were delivered to the campaigns, and filling out and filing the 15-5's. However, if the AIC employees' answers present an inaccurate version of the facts, the evidence currently available suggests the AIC employees engaged in joint activity that formed a group under 2 AAC 50.314(a)(3) by making contributions in the name of another. The core of this group activity is the use of money from petty cash, AIC checks and draws, salaries and bonuses—both in-kind and in the form of money—as a source of contributions made in the names of the various employees.

## VII. THE RESIDUAL GROUP

### A. Introduction

This is the third and final major group staff has identified. The next table shows ten clusters of contributions which may comprise group activity. These ten clusters of contributions represent all the possible group activity among the contributions on Exhibit E (the universe of contributions) not included in the discussion of the AIC-Unicol corporate group and the AIC employee group. All amounts on Table V are \$1000, and all occurred in 1992. Unlike the AIC-Unicol corporate group, the residual group is not formed by operation of law. Unlike the AIC employee group, the existence of the residual group is not supported by any sworn admissions of the AIC employees. Instead, the evidence showing the existence of the residual group is circumstantial.

The contribution made in Castoe's name to Webb on October 1 is part of the AIC employee group discussed earlier; it appears on this table only to show that Thomas' contribution to Webb on 10/1 was part of a cluster. This residual group contributed a total of \$23,000 to eight candidates.

### C. Analysis

There is evidence on both sides of this issue. The residual group may or may not exist.

#### 1. Evidence supporting the existence of the residual group

##### a. The AIC employees have a motive for making substantial campaign contributions.

Ellsworth owns two construction companies which do projects related to resource extraction, mainly in Prudhoe Bay and the Red Dog Mine. For the three years 1990 through 1992, AIC's gross income was between 13 million and 26 million dollars; for Unicol it ranged between none (in 1990) and 3.5 million. Leman explained to Port that he believed AIC was making campaign contributions to gain favor with oil companies. Leman stated that some \$40,000 of campaign contributions was "a drop in the bucket" if AIC



received a large contract in part because of its political contributions. Leman also told Port he believed it is likely that Ellsworth encouraged his employees to contribute to certain candidates. A political environment sympathetic to resource extraction would increase the number of contracts upon which AIC could bid; this would benefit the contributor respondents' livelihood. Leman stated that Ellsworth was one member of the Alliance (an oil industry support group) who lobbied in Juneau recently against collecting back taxes from the oil industry. Ellsworth testified that AIC's contributions to legislators have never benefitted AIC, and doesn't remember going to Juneau to lobby about this issue.

**b. An earlier pattern of related contributions involving Ellsworth exists.**

**1. 1986 Contributions to the Hickel Campaign**

This pattern of campaign contributions made with sequentially numbered cashier's checks and personal checks from individuals associated with AIC on or about the same day is not limited to the 10 incidents in Table V. This pattern, which shows a method of making campaign contributions identical to that demonstrated in Table V, started in 1986 with the following contributions to Walter J. Hickel:

**2. 1986 and 1989 Contributions to Darryl Jordan**

This pattern of contributions also occurred in the 1986 and 1989 campaign of Darryl Jordan for Anchorage School Board. The following contributions are very similar to those involving Ellsworth in Hickel's 1986 campaign as well as those of the residual group:

In 1986, Jordan received about \$17,300 in contributions from others; \$4,000 (23%) of that was from the Motskos, Gallion and Ellsworth. In 1989, Jordan received about \$5,000 in contributions from others; \$3,000 (60%) of that was from Castoe, Workman and Ellsworth. Jan Gallion is now married to Ellsworth. It is noteworthy that Mike Motsko, Cheryl Motsko and Castoe all give their address as Fairbanks, and Workman gives his as Delta Junction.

### 3. 1992 Contributions to Federal Candidates

In addition to contributing to state candidates, some of the individual contributors also made campaign contributions to federal candidates in 1992. The following chronology of federal contributions shows a pattern of seven clusters of contributions that resembles the contributions to state candidates:

- a. 4/23/92: Unknown person uses \$2000 cash to buy two \$1000 cashier's checks:

b. 4/24/92: Al Davis (by his agent and co-signatory Cindy Scott) wrote AIC a check on his personal checking account for \$1050. Exhibit K. The purpose of this check is indicated to be "Repay parts, electrical, etc." on the face of the check. Despite this inscription, someone cashed this \$1050 check, and its proceeds went to a \$5 check fee, \$45 cash, and a \$1000 cashier's check, # 80107023, from Workman to Frank Murkowski.

Workman testified at his deposition that the money used to buy his cashier's check to Frank Murkowski came from his personnel file.

Davis stated he knew nothing of this check. He never saw this check until his deposition, never authorized it, and has no idea what it could possibly be for. He never buys parts for AIC for which he needs reimbursement.

c. 7/9/92: "John Ellsworth" is endorsed on the back of AIC check # 13078 for \$3000 (memo: petty cash) used for \$1000 in cash and two cashier's checks of \$1000 each:

c. Scott's, Ellsworth's and Ringstad's explanations about contributions to Senator Leman differ.

Leman received three sequentially numbered cashier's checks in the name of Workman, Scott and Thomas at a fundraiser. Upon discovering that the checks were sequentially numbered, he remembered trouble VECO had in the past with sequential checks and became concerned whether they were legal. He asked his friend John Ringstad (Ringstad) to ascertain if the checks were legal. The accounts of Leman, Ringstad and Ellsworth differ as to the events that followed:

Leman told staff that Ringstad informed him a few days later that he had discussed the "rules of contributions" with Scott, who had assured Ringstad that the contributions complied with the law. She said employees contribute regularly to their own personal political donation account and call in from remote sites to authorize her to cut checks for candidates. <sup>a</sup> Based upon this information, Leman decided to accept the contributions but asked for two of the three checks to be reissued, perhaps to have the individuals

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<sup>a</sup> Bell said that Scott gave him a different answer on the same issue. Bell said that Scott, Workman and Thomas told him that they kept cash in their folders for making contributions or other bills that they needed paid.

reconfirm it was actually their money. If this were Leman's motive, it is unclear why he returned only two checks rather than all three. If Leman thought all three checks were legal, it is unclear why he would need to return any of them. He stated he kept the check from AIC (which was not a cashier's check) and the check from Scott because they were past contributors; he also said he returned the checks from Workman and Thomas (neither of whom he knew) to AIC himself. In reality, however, he returned the checks from Scott and Thomas.

Ringstad's version of this conversation differs from what Leman told staff. Ringstad told staff he spoke with Ellsworth--and only Ellsworth--at AIC about the checks. Ringstad informed staff that Ellsworth told him that AIC employees who want to make political contributions put in money up front at the start of the year, so if they are out of town the money can be taken to a fundraiser as a contribution from the employee's money. Ringstad was concerned about the possibility of a last minute smear campaign, so Ellsworth told him he could get the checks reissued if there were a perception problem. Ringstad told staff he--and not Leman--returned the checks to AIC's office, saying "I talked with John [Ellsworth] about this."

Ellsworth stated under oath that he was not involved in the process of exchanging checks, and does not remember talking to Leman or Ringstad about serially numbered checks. He also testified that he did not know which AIC employees were contributing to which candidates before this investigation started. Although Ellsworth testified that he did not know of any money being kept anywhere other than the petty cash can, Ringstad related that Ellsworth told him that the AIC employees put the money aside. Although Ringstad didn't know the accounting angle, he got the sense the money was not put into an account.

Scott took the two returned checks back to the bank and bought two new cashier's checks with them. The signature of Thomas on the back of the cashier's check originally issued in his name does not match his signature on any of the nine 15-5's filed in his name. Exhibit L. Scott initially stated that she could have signed Thomas' name, as she has signed his name for years despite not having a power of attorney to do so. After examining the back of the cashier's check purchased in Thomas' name, Scott stated "I would say it was me signing Dave Thomas' signature." Scott explained that the two new cashier's checks' not being in sequence is a result of her buying them in two separate trips to the bank. Data on the two reissued checks indicate they were bought on the same day from different tellers; the checks do not indicate whether they were bought at the same time.

Neither Thomas' nor Scott's answer states that either of them contributed \$1000 to Leman on September 22, 1992--their first checks to Leman. No 15-5's for these contributions have ever been filed; only 15-5's for the reissued checks exist. Scott filed the 15-5's for both contributions. As these first contributions were the only relevant ones omitted from their answers, this omission suggests that Scott and Thomas considered

these contributions suspect. Their failure to file 15-5's for these two contributions also corroborates this. At his deposition Thomas initially recalled contributing \$1000 to Leman in 1992, but later denied it. According to the AIC travel documents, Thomas was in Anchorage from September 12, 1992 through October 18, 1992, so he could have endorsed the check himself. Thomas did not remember anything about Leman's returning his check. He would not have expected Ellsworth to take care of any problem with a returned contribution, but instead would have expected the issue to be brought to his attention so he could resolve it himself. According to Thomas, Ellsworth has never done any personal business for him.

**d. Ellsworth's, Unicol's and AIC's contributions were often clustered with other contributions.**

Ellsworth made 10 contributions to candidates in his name during 1990, 1991 and 1992. 80% of these contributions were in conjunction with at least one other contribution by another respondent. During those same three years 49 contributions were made in the names of Ellsworth, Unicol and AIC. 55% of these contributions were in conjunction with at least one other contribution by another respondent. Webb said he talked to Ellsworth weekly about his (Webb's) need to raise money.

**2. Evidence which does not support the existence of the residual group**

**a. In their answers and depositions, all AIC employees deny participating in any group activity.**

The sworn testimony of all AIC employees corroborated their answers—they swore they did not talk to each other about the timing, amount or recipient of their contributions. They maintained the timing of the contributions and the identity of the candidates were all coincidence. Scott also testified that she would batch her bank errands to be efficient.

**b. The employees earned sufficient salary and bonuses to cover the contributions.**

As discussed at pages 17-18, AIC pays its employees enough money so they could have made these contributions using their own funds.

**c. The petty cash journal's deposits agree with Scott's and Ellsworth's accounts.**

Twice—July 9, 1992 and August 12, 1992—Scott or Ellsworth went to the bank with an AIC check payable to cash and left with cashier's checks payable to candidates. The bank records for both days' transactions show that these cashier's checks were purchased with the checks made out to petty cash. These bank records thus indicate that the money from these two AIC checks went to buy cashier's checks and not to petty cash. However, the petty cash journal shows a deposit in the amount of these two AIC checks.



#### D. Conclusion

As the above discussion shows, a factually disputed question of whether the activity described above comprises one or more groups exists; there is evidence on both sides. Patterns of related contributions involving Ellsworth occurred in three earlier campaigns of Hickei and Jordan. This pattern also appears in seven clusters of contributions to federal candidates in 1992. The motive of the AIC employees to make substantial contributions and the exchange of the sequentially numbered cashier's checks for other checks to Leman are reasons supporting the existence of the residual group. However, the AIC employees' insistence upon the independence of their contribution activity, their substantial remuneration and the petty cash journal are all evidence to the contrary.

#### **VIII. MISCELLANEOUS REPORTING VIOLATIONS: CONTRIBUTORS**

##### A. Facts

The following tables depict the 15-5's which the contributors filed late, incomplete, or not at all. All contributions were for \$1000.

**B. Analysis**

When an individual contributes over \$250 to a candidate or group, the contributor must file a "Statement of Contributions by an Individual" within 10 days of making the contribution. This form is commonly known as a "15-5," and must disclose the date, source, recipient and amount of the contribution as well as the check number, if any.

These 15-5's do not meet these legal requirements for at least one of several reasons:

**1. The 15-5 was never filed.**

The last column in the above tables show which 15-5's have never been filed.

**2. The 15-5 was filed late.**

The last column in the above tables show which 15-5's were filed later than ten days after the contribution was made.

### **3. The 15-5 does not disclose the correct check number or date.**

The last column in the above tables show which 15-5's had no check number, an incorrect check number, or the wrong date.

### **4. Discussion**

These contributors' failure to file timely and accurate 15-5's deprived the public of contemporaneous knowledge of the pattern of contributions.

Two of the individuals cannot claim they were unaware of the need to file a complete 15-5 because they had filed them earlier. Scott knew of the requirement to file a 15-5, as she filed 15-5's on behalf of AIC as early as February of 1990. She also filed them on behalf of Unicol as early as August of 1990, and on her own behalf as early as October of 1991. Ellsworth knew that he was supposed to disclose the check number on a 15-5, as he did so in October 1986 and February 1990. In his deposition Ellsworth stated he did not know what an APOC Form 15-5 was until the depositions in late 1994. However, in 1990 a 15-5 was filed under what appears to be Ellsworth's signature for a contribution to Jim Campbell; in 1986 a similar one was filed for a contribution to Darryl Jordan.

In addition to these individuals' direct personal knowledge of the requirement of filing a 15-5, AIC also knew of this requirement. In December 1989 Jill Cornforth, then the office manager of AIC, received a blank 15-5 form from staff. She then filled out seven 15-5's and filed them with APOC. Exhibit M. On AIC letterhead she stated that "in the future, 'I'll be aware of and adhere to the 10-day requirement [in which to file a 15-5 after the contribution is made]." (Although Scott testified that she did not know until November 1992 that individuals--and not just businesses--had to file 15-5's, Scott filed 15-5's for her own contributions as early as October 1991).

### **C. Conclusion**

The only penalty for failing to file an accurate and timely 15-5 is criminal prosecution; no civil penalty exists.

## **IX. MISCELLANEOUS REPORTING VIOLATIONS: CANDIDATES**

### **A. Facts**

Three candidates--Udelhoven, Bell and Leman--filed incomplete campaign disclosure statements; one of Leman's reports remains incomplete. Only miscellaneous reporting violations are treated in this report; staff is not discussing the fact that the candidates' reports disclose that the contributions came from individuals rather than from one of the three groups under consideration.

**CANDIDATE: JAMES UDELHOVEN**

Udelhoven's 1992 7 day pre-primary campaign disclosure report contained the following errors.

Leman's answer which he filed April 30, 1993 (Exhibit D at 126) states he received and returned two contributions of \$1000 each from Workman and Thomas; this information partially corrected his 1992 30 day pre-general report.

**B. Conclusion**

Both criminal and civil penalties exist for failing to file timely and complete campaign disclosure reports.

## **X. RECOMMENDATION**

### **A. The Commission Should Refer this Matter For a Hearing under the Administrative Procedure Act**

Staff recommends the commission hold a hearing under the Administrative Procedure Act to determine answer the following factually disputed questions. As stated in the introduction, this report does not try to present a final presentation of the facts. Staff has found many questionable transactions which are insufficiently explained. There are also many inconsistencies between the facts as presented by the contributors and the version presented by the other evidence, both documentary and the testimony of other witnesses.

1. Did the contributor respondents (AIC, Unicol, Ellsworth, Scott, Workman, Castoe, Thomas, Peterson, Foster and Davis) form one or more groups by taking joint activity in 1990, 1991 and 1992 whose major purpose was to influence the outcome of an election?
2. Did any group formed by the contributor respondents' joint activity:
  - a. fail to register or report with the commission;
  - b. fail to use a campaign depository;
  - c. fail to appoint deputy treasurers;
  - d. make excess contributions;
  - e. make contributions in the name of another; or
  - f. give or furnish money to another person or group for the purpose of making a contribution in the name of another?
3. Did any contributor respondent fail to file timely and accurate "Statements of Contribution by an Individual, Organization or Business," (APOC Form 15-5)?
4. Did any candidate respondent (Baker, Bell, Fischer, Leman, Pearce, Udelhoven or Webb):
  - a. knowingly accept excess contributions;
  - b. fail to properly and timely report contributions from a group or groups on their campaign disclosure reports;
  - c. fail to make their best efforts to determine the legality of all their contributions;

d. fail to return apparently illegal contributions within ten days of receipt or note on their campaign disclosure reports that the legality of the contribution was in question; or

e. file campaign disclosure reports that did not properly report the correct source of all contributions or note that the legality of one or more contributions was in question?

**B. The Commission should Refer the Contributions to Federal Candidates to the Federal Election Commission**

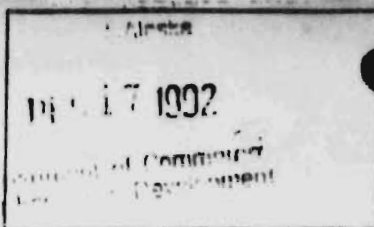
APOC has no jurisdiction over contributions to federal candidates, and no authority to enforce any federal election laws. However, this pattern of contributions to federal candidates might violate federal election law. Staff recommends the commission refer these federal contributions to the Federal Election Commission for its consideration.

CONSENT AGREEMENT WITH CONTRIBUTOR RESPONDENTS

1. Investigation. In response to two complaints filed by Robert Gigler and Citizens for Donley on November 2, 1992, the staff of the Alaska Public Offices Commission (staff) reviewed the campaign disclosure reports filed by Larry



Baker, Bob Bell, Paul Fischer, Loren Leman, Drue Pearce, James Udelhoven and William Webb (the candidates) from 1990 through 1993. Staff also reviewed the Individual Contributor Statements (15-5's) filed by Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. (AIC), Unicol, Inc. (Unicol), John Ellsworth, Cindy Scott, James Workman, William Castoe, David Thomas, John Peterson, Al Foster and Al Davis (the contributors). This review indicated the complaints contained allegations which, if true, constituted violations of the Campaign Disclosure Law and its regulations by the candidates and the contributors.

2. Allegations. The contributors allegedly:

- a. formed at least one group without registering and reporting with APOC, without using a campaign depository, and without appointing campaign treasurers;
- b. made excess contributions;
- c. made contributions in the name of another;
- d. gave or furnished money to another person or group for the purpose of making a contribution in the name of another; and
- e. did not file timely and accurate "Statements of Contribution by an Individual, Organization or Business," (APOC Form 15-5).

3. Allegation admitted. This Consent Agreement constitutes an admission by AIC and Unicol, both corporations wholly owned by John Ellsworth,

that in 1990, 1991 and 1992 the corporations formed a group by operation of law under 2 AAC 50.357(c)(2) and (3) and 2 AAC 50.314(a)(3) which made excess contributions and made contributions in the name of another to Jim Campbell, Mary Shields, Jim Sampson, Bob Bell and Drue Pearce. This group formed by AIC and Unicol failed to register, failed to file campaign disclosure reports, failed to designate a campaign depository, failed to appoint campaign treasurers, made excess contributions and gave or furnished money to another person or group for the purpose of making a contribution in the name of another.

4. Allegations Not Admitted This Consent Agreement does not constitute any other admissions by the contributors other than those admitted in paragraph 3. Specifically, the contributors do not admit to forming any groups other than the group in paragraph 3 of this Consent Agreement. The contributors assert there is a genuine unresolved legal issue as to the formation and operation of any groups other than the one group in paragraph 3 of this Consent Agreement. Staff's position is that the issue of whether the activity of AIC, Unicol, John Ellsworth, Cindy Scott, James Workman, William Castoe, David Thomas, John Peterson, Al Foster and Al Davis formed an additional group or groups is not an unresolved legal question. This Consent Agreement, therefore, reflects a desire on the part of the contributors and the Alaska Public Offices Commission (APOC) to resolve this matter fairly and expeditiously without additional administrative

proceedings.

5. Reports to be Filed. The contributors hereby recognize the public interest in full and timely disclosure by groups of all information required by the Campaign Disclosure Law and agree to file a group registration and one accurate and complete group report for the group described in paragraph 3 of this Consent Agreement at the commission's Anchorage office within thirty days of the commission's approval of this Consent Agreement. The filing of this group registration, group report, and this Consent Agreement satisfies any and all duties the contributors may have had to file any additional group registrations and reports to indicate the source of the contributions made in the names of the contributors to the candidates in 1990 1991 and 1992.

6. Good Faith Settlement. The parties agree that the allegations have been raised by APOC and addressed by the contributors in good faith.

7. Waiver of Rights. The contributors understand and agree that by signing this Consent Agreement they waive their rights to any and all further administrative procedures before APOC and that the matter captioned as Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., Unicol, Inc., and John Ellsworth v. State of Alaska and Alaska Public Offices Commission, 4FA-94-1846 CI and all claims which were or



could have been raised therein shall be dismissed with prejudice, each party to bear its own costs and attorneys' fees.

8. Civil Penalty. Each of the contributors agrees to pay a civil penalty to the State of Alaska within thirty days of the Commission's approval of this Consent Agreement as follows:

- a. John Ellsworth, AIC and Unicol, jointly and severally liable: \$55,500
- b. Cindy Scott, with her own money, not reimbursed directly or indirectly from any other source: \$25,000
- c. James Workman, with his own money, not reimbursed directly or indirectly from any other source: \$7000
- d. David Thomas, with his own money, not reimbursed directly or indirectly from any other source: \$6000
- e. William Castoe, with his own money, not reimbursed directly or indirectly from any other source: \$2000
- f. John Peterson, with his own money, not reimbursed directly or indirectly from any other source: \$1000
- g. Al Foster, with his own money, not reimbursed directly or indirectly from any other source: \$1000
- h. Al Davis, with his own money, not reimbursed directly or indirectly from any other source: \$1000

Each contributor also agrees that upon the commission's approval of this Consent Agreement, each civil penalty constitutes a just debt for which each of them is liable as described above and that, in the event of nonpayment, debt collection actions may be sought against any or each of them in the district or superior court of the State of Alaska at Anchorage for collection of the principal, interest, costs and attorney's fees.

9. Remedial Action. Each contributor agrees in the future not to make contributions to candidates or groups with cashier's checks and cash. Each contributor agrees to file with APOC an accurate and timely Individual Contributor Statement (APOC Form 15-5) within ten days signed by the individual making the contribution for each contribution which any of them makes over \$250 in the future. The contributors agrees that each of them will attend a training session by staff at 2221 East Northern Lights, # 128, Anchorage, for a maximum of two hours by December 31, 1995 at a time convenient to both the contributors and staff. Each contributor recognizes that APOC staff will monitor their contributions and any future violations of the law involving allegations similar to those in this proceeding shall not be treated leniently.

10. Complete Settlement: Effect of Violation of Consent Agreement. Upon the commission's acceptance of this Consent Agreement, full

payment of the civil penalty and completion of the training provided above, the allegations and issues raised against the contributors in this proceeding shall be deemed settled in full. If any contributor does not pay the civil penalty in full when due, or if any contributor has not completed the training by December 31, 1995, the commission may, in its discretion, either reinstate the allegations against any such contributor or move in the courts of the State of Alaska for collection, or both.

11. Effect of Rejection of Consent Agreement by the Commission.

This Consent Agreement is not binding on the commission or the contributors until such time, if any, as it is approved by the commission. Commission staff will recommend the commission's approval of this Consent Agreement and will also recommend that the commission not refer to the Attorney General for possible criminal prosecution any issue that arose in this matter which incriminates any contributor. If the commission rejects this Consent Agreement, this Consent Agreement will be null and void and shall not constitute an admission in any respect or waive any of the contributors' rights to further administrative proceedings in this matter. The contributors recognize that if the commission rejects this Consent Agreement, this matter will proceed to a hearing under the Administrative Procedure Act. The contributors also agree that the commission's consideration of this Consent Agreement shall not be grounds for claiming that the



commissioners are biased against them, cannot fairly decide the case, or have received ex parte communications.

12. Effect of Approval of Consent Agreement by the Commission. If the commission approves this Consent Agreement, the terms of this agreement are legally binding and the agreement shall be enforceable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the State of Alaska and is to be interpreted under Alaska law. This Consent Agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties. No amendments or modifications to this Consent Agreement shall be deemed valid unless they are in writing and signed by all parties to this Consent Agreement. This Consent Agreement may be executed in counterparts, all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument.

## I. GENERATION OF MATTER

This matter arose from a 24 July, 1995 complaint filed by Robert A. Gigler, a losing candidate for the Alaska State Senate in 1992 from the Alaskan Independence Party.<sup>1</sup> The complaint alleges that Murkowski '92 Committee and Alaskans for Don Young received excessive illegal contributions totaling \$16,500 from John Ellsworth and his two companies, Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. ("AIC") and Unicol, Inc. ("Unicol") in the names of the following respondent employees: Cindy Scott, James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson, Rona Troutman and Janice Ellsworth, John Ellsworth's wife.<sup>2</sup> Both AIC and Unicol are construction companies which do projects in the oil fields of Alaska. Murkowski '92 Committee was the political committee of Frank Murkowski, a candidate for the United States Senate. Alaskans for Don Young was the political committee of Don Young, a candidate for the United States Congress in 1992.<sup>3</sup> The primary election was held on 8 September, 1992 and the general election was held on 3 November, 1992.

This Office received responses from all respondents, who, except for the committee respondents, are represented by the same counsel. It appears that the respondent employees have worked for Mr. Ellsworth for several years.

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<sup>1</sup> Previously, on November 2, 1992, Mr. Gigler filed a similar complaint with the Alaska Public Offices Commission, Alaska's state "political watchdog" agency regarding contributions to state candidates.

<sup>2</sup> Ms. Ellsworth does not appear to be an employee of either company.

<sup>3</sup> Both candidates won their respective elections. Mr. Murkowski currently is a United States Senator, and Mr. Young currently is a member of the House of Representatives.



## II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

### A. Facts

#### 1. Complaint

The complaint indicates that the contributions at issue were all made by certified checks, many of which had consecutive serial numbers. The complaint presents the following contributions:

As the above chart shows, many of the cashier's checks were numbered consecutively.

For example, checks from four respondents, James Workman, David Thomas, William Castoe,

and Janice Ellsworth, were numbered 80120422 through 80120425. Those checks were all dated 31 August, 1992 and were made out to Alaskans for Don Young. The contribution checks to Frank Murkowski's senatorial campaign showed a similar pattern. Contributions from Cindy Scott, Dave Thomas, and John and Janice Ellsworth, were made by three cashier's checks purchased on the same date (13 October, 1992) and showed consecutive check numbers (80147215 through 80147217).

The complaint also attached a 15 June, 1995 unnamed newspaper article which reported that Mr. Ellsworth and employees of AIC and Unicol were being investigated by the Alaska Public Offices Commission for the making of contributions in the name of another. According to the article, the employees testified that they authorized AIC's Office Manager, Cindy Scott, to purchase cashier's checks in their names and donate them to the candidates. The article further reported that even though some of the checks had consecutive serial numbers, the employees denied there was any organized effort to donate to specific candidates. The employees claimed that the timing of their contributions and the identity of the candidates were all coincidence. The article also reported that Mr. Ellsworth maintained that he and his employees were innocent and did not intend to violate any laws.

## **2. Responses**

AIC admitted to making a \$1,000 contribution to Murkowski's campaign by corporate check dated 9 December, 1991. The campaign returned the check to AIC on 4 February, 1992. Unicol claimed that it made no contributions to either candidate in 1992. All of the respondent employees claimed to have independently made the respective contributions attributed to them and denied that they violated the Act. They each also provided copies of their respective

contribution checks. The checks were payable to the respective committees; the employee names appeared on the checks as the purchasers.

According to the responses, James Workman, AIC's North Slope Operations Manager, claimed that in August, 1992 he contributed \$1,000 to Don Young's congressional campaign by cashier's check dated 31 August, 1992 (Primary) and \$1,000 to Frank Murkowski's senatorial campaign by check dated 24 April, 1992 (Primary). John Peterson, AIC's Chief Estimator, claimed that in October, 1992, he contributed \$1,000 to Don Young's campaign by cashier's check dated 15 October, 1992 (General).<sup>4</sup> David Thomas, AIC's Manager of Safety and Engineering, claimed that in 1992 he contributed \$2,000 to Young's campaign: \$1,000 by cashier's check dated 31 August, 1992 and \$1,000 by cashier's check dated 9 October, 1992.<sup>5</sup> He also claimed to have contributed \$1,000 to Murkowski's campaign by cashier's check dated 13 October, 1992 (Pre-General). William Castoe, AIC's Field Superintendent, claimed that in August, 1992, he contributed \$1,000 to Young's campaign by cashier's check dated 31 August, 1992 (Primary). Cindy Scott, AIC's Office Manager, Secretary, treasurer and director, as well as Unicol's Office Manager and Secretary, claimed that she contributed \$1,000 to Young's campaign by cashier's check dated 9 July, 1992 (Primary), and \$2,000 to Murkowski's campaign by two \$1,000 cashier's checks dated 24 April, 1992 (Primary) and 13 October, 1992.<sup>6</sup>

<sup>5</sup> These contributions do not show up in the Commission's records. However, the 31 August, 1992 contribution appears as a contribution to the primary election in the copy of the October 15 Quarterly Report which the committee provided in its response.

<sup>6</sup> The Commission's records do not show the 13 October, 1992 contribution. However, the records show a \$1,000 contribution by John Peterson on the same date for the general election. Mr. Peterson did not admit to this contribution, so there is a question regarding the reporting of this contribution.



John Ellsworth, President, director and sole owner of AIC and Unicol, claimed that he contributed \$2,000 to Young's campaign by two \$1,000 cashier's checks dated 9 July, 1992 and 9 October, 1992, respectively.<sup>7</sup> He also claimed that he contributed a total of \$2,000 to Murkowski's campaign: \$1,000 by a cashier's check dated 23 April, 1992,<sup>8</sup> and another \$1,000 by a joint \$2,000 cashier's check dated 13 October, 1992 with his wife, Janice Ellsworth.<sup>9</sup> In her response, Mrs. Ellsworth corroborated Mr. Ellsworth's account of the \$2,000 joint cashier's check contribution to Murkowski's campaign. She also claimed that in August, 1992, she contributed \$1,000 to Young's campaign by cashier's check dated 31 August, 1992 (Primary). Finally, Rona Troutman claimed that she made only a single \$500 contribution to Young's campaign by personal check dated 30 November, 1993.<sup>10</sup> She denied making any contributions in 1992.

In their response, Alaskans for Don Young and Robert Bohnert, as treasurer, deny violating the Act. They claim that they received no more than \$1,000 per election from each of the contributors in question, that they accurately filed the requisite reports, and that they had no obligation nor good faith reason to question the legitimacy of the contributions. They provided copies of their corresponding contribution reports previously filed with the Commission. The

Murkowski '92 Committee also generally denied violating the Act, but provided no additional information to support their denial.

### 3. Alaska Public Offices Commission Documents

In response to an oral request from this Office, Alaska Public Offices Commission ("APOC") provided additional documents and information regarding this matter. (Attachment No. 1). Among the materials APOC provided was a 9 June, 1995 staff report ("APOC Staff Report") describing the results of its investigation.<sup>11</sup> (Attachment No. 1, page 7). Consistent with the newspaper article attached to the complaint, the report shows that the employees generally maintained that the contributions were made with their personal funds. The employees claimed that they left cash with Ms. Scott because they worked for extended periods in rural Alaska. Ms. Scott held those funds in the employees' personnel files at the companies for disbursement according to each employee's instruction. Ms. Scott claimed that she bought the cashier's checks for the contributions upon the direction of the employees, as a personal favor to the employees as friends rather than as part of her job. (Attachment No. 1, page 22).

Despite the employees' assertions, the report shows that the source of the moneys for the contributions were not from the employees personal funds but from either AIC's petty cash fund, salaries and bonuses to the respective employees or "draws" from the company. (Attachment No. 1, page 35). For example, the report shows that on 2 October, 1992, Mr. Ellsworth took a "draw" of \$6,000 from AIC. On that same day, someone from AIC used \$3,000 to purchase cashier's checks in the names of Thomas, Castoe and Peterson for contributions to a candidate

for the Alaska State Senate, Bill Webb. Seven days later, someone used another \$3,000 to buy cashier's checks in the names of Ellsworth, Thomas and Peterson for contributions to Don Young. (Attachment No. 1, page 31). Similarly, on 13 October, 1992, 11 days after Mr. Ellsworth received the \$6,000 "draw," he directed Ms. Scott to issue him a \$6,000 AIC company check. He took the check to the bank and used it to buy five cashier's checks (four \$1,000 cashier's checks and one \$2,000 cashier's check), three of which were used to make \$1,000 contributions to Murkowski's campaign in the names of Scott, Thomas, Ellsworth and his wife.

In addition to the above activity, the report shows that the employees generally were not politically active or sophisticated. Some of them either could not identify their political representatives or had not registered to vote prior to 1992. (Attachment No. 1, pages 32-34).

Finally, AIC, Unicol, and the respondent employees (except Janice Ellsworth and Rona Troutman), entered into a consent agreement with APOC in which they admitted making contributions in the name of another, in violation of Alaska State campaign finance laws. (Attachment No. 1, page 92). The settlement was approved by APOC on 10 August, 1995. Under the agreement, John Ellsworth, AIC and Unicol jointly agreed to pay a civil penalty of \$55,000. Cindy Scott agreed to pay a penalty of \$25,000; James Workman agreed to pay \$7,000; David Thomas agreed to pay \$6,000; William Cantoe agreed to pay \$2,000; and John Pearson agreed to pay \$1,000.

## **B. Law**

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") provides that no person shall make contributions to any candidate and the candidate's authorized political



committees with respect to any election for federal office which, in the aggregate, exceeds \$1,000. 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A).

The Act also prohibits corporations from making contributions or expenditures in connection with a Federal election. 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a). This broad prohibition extends to "anything of value" given to any candidate or campaign in connection with any Federal election. 2 U.S.C. § 441b(b)(2). Section 441b(a) of the Act further prohibits any officer or any director of any corporation from consenting to any contribution or expenditure by the corporation. That provision also makes it unlawful for a political committee knowingly to accept or receive corporate contributions.

Section 441f of the Act prohibits any person from making a contribution in the name of another person or from permitting his or her name to be used to effect such a contribution. It also prohibits any person from knowingly accepting a contribution made by one person in the name of another person. 2 U.S.C. § 441f. The Commission regulations at 11 C.F.R. § 110.4(b)(1)(iii) also makes it unlawful for any person to knowingly help or assist any person making a contribution in the name of another. The Commission regulations and rulings makes it clear that section 441f prohibitions apply to any person that provides money to others, or any person who uses said money, to make contributions, 11 C.F.R. § 110.4(b)(2), and to incorporated or unincorporated entities who give money to another to effect a contribution in the second person's name. Advisory Opinion 1986-41.

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 431(11), political committees are persons under the Act and, therefore, they are prohibited from knowingly accepting contributions in the name of another. Additionally, political committees are required to report contributions completely and accurately.

2 U.S.C. § 434(b); 11 C.F.R. § 104. Furthermore, the treasurer of a committee has a responsibility to examine all contributions for evidence of illegality. 11 C.F.R. § 103.3(b).

### C. Analysis

The available information clearly shows a pattern of practice in which AIC and Unicol's corporate officers, John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott, bought cashier's checks in the names of the respondent employees and made contributions to the respondent committees. Many of the cashier's checks displayed the same date and were numbered sequentially, indicating that the checks were purchased in bulk from the same bank teller. Inasmuch as they all worked for the same employer, the sequentially numbered cashier's checks also indicate coordination among the respondent employees.

Respondents asserted in the APOC investigation that the contributions were made from each contributor's personal funds. Considering the available information, this Office agrees with the APOC Staff Report and does not find respondents' assertions credible. The employees' explanations of the circumstances surrounding the contributions do not indicate an urgency or other basis for them not being able to make the contributions independently (either before or after their work assignments in rural Alaska). Under the circumstances, it is also dubious that the employees would contribute to the same candidates at the same time. The APOC Staff Report shows that many of them were not politically active prior to the contributions at issue and that many of them were not even registered to vote prior to the contributions.

Based on the foregoing, it appears evident that the contributions at issue were made with moneys provided by the respondent companies, not from the personal funds of the employees in whose name the contributions were made. The APOC Staff Report shows that the source of the

moneys for the contributions were from either AIC's petty cash fund, salaries and bonuses to the respective employees or "draws" from the company. Consequently, it appears that the respondent employees, except Ms. Troutman, knowingly permitted their names to be used to make contributions in the name of another.<sup>12</sup> Accordingly, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson and Janice Ellsworth violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f.

The evidence also indicates an intent to evade the election law prohibitions against corporate contributions. In addition to the factors already mentioned, it appears that John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott, the officers of the respondent corporations, executed the contribution scheme shortly after AIC's corporate check to the Murkowski campaign was returned. Furthermore, they and the respondent corporations signed a consent agreement with APOC admitting to a similar scheme in violation of the State of Alaska's election laws. Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f by permitting their names to be used to make contributions in the name of another, by knowingly assisting in the making of such contributions and by consenting to the making of corporate contributions. This Office also recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. and Unicol, Inc. knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f by making corporate contributions totaling \$16,000 in connection with a Federal election and by making contributions totaling \$16,000 in the names of their employees.<sup>13</sup>

<sup>12</sup> The Commission's records show a contribution by another AIC employee, David Loudon, to Young's campaign. The contribution was for \$1000 and was made on 14 October, 1992. There is no information regarding the circumstances surrounding that contribution.



The evidence shows that Ms. Troutman's contribution was made by personal check and was made some time after the general election. Therefore, it is uncertain that Ms. Troutman participated in the contribution scheme. Accordingly, this Office makes no recommendation regarding Ms. Troutman at this time. This Office also makes no recommendations as to the complainant's allegation that Mr. Ellsworth made excessive contributions in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441a. The evidence shows that the true source of the contributions was the respondent companies, not Mr. Ellsworth personally. Although, as sole owner and principal officer, Mr. Ellsworth may have complete control of the respondent companies, it is unnecessary to disregard AIC and Unicol's corporate identities.

Finally, with respect to the respondent committees, it is not clear the extent to which they were aware of the contribution scheme. It is not known how the checks were transmitted to the committees or who provided the requisite contributor identification information about the employees. Arguably, the fact that the contributions were made with sequentially numbered cashier's checks by employees of the same company, in conjunction with the treasurer's duty to ascertain that contributions are lawful, provides a basis for the committees to question the contributions. See MURs 3449 and 3089 (Commission found reason to believe that a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441f occurred where the Dukakis/Bensten Committee and the Dukakis for President Committee, respectively, accepted sequentially numbered money order contributions). This is particularly so for Murkowski's campaign which previously had returned AIC's corporate contribution check. As discussed in notes 4, 6-9 supra, there also appears to be reporting

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<sup>13</sup> The available information show contributions primarily from AIC funds. However, considering that AIC and Unicol had the same owner and corporate officers, it is prudent to cite both companies for the violations.

irregularities by both committees with respect to many of the contributions at issue.

Nevertheless, this Office recognizes that additional investigation is necessary to explore the committees' awareness of the contribution scheme. Considering the age of the activity at issue, this Office does not believe that such investigation is worthwhile and, therefore, does not recommend that the Commission pursue the respondent committees.

### **III. DISCUSSION OF CONCILIATION AND CIVIL PENALTY**

This Office also recommends that the Commission offer to enter into conciliation with respondents prior to a finding of probable cause to believe.

#### IV. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Find reason to believe that Janice Ellsworth, James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, and John Peterson violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f, and enter into conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe.
2. Find reason to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., Unicol, Inc., John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f, and enter into conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe.
3. Approve the attached joint Factual and Legal Analysis, Conciliation Agreement, and the appropriate letter.

On 10 September, 1996, the Federal Election Commission found that there is reason to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., Unicol, Inc., John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f and that James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson and Janice Ellsworth violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f, provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). A joint Factual and Legal Analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

In order to expedite the resolution of this matter, the Commission has also decided to offer to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a joint conciliation agreement with Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., Unicol, Inc., John Ellsworth, Cindy Scott, James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson and Janice Ellsworth in settlement of this matter prior to a finding of probable cause to believe. Enclosed is a joint conciliation agreement which the Commission has approved.

If you are interested in expediting the resolution of this matter by pursuing preprobable cause conciliation and if you agree with the provisions of the enclosed agreement, please sign and return the agreement, along with the civil penalty, to the Commission. In light of the fact that conciliation negotiations, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, are limited to a maximum of 30 days, you should respond to this notification as soon as possible. If you do not desire to negotiate a resolution of this matter at this time, please let us know immediately.

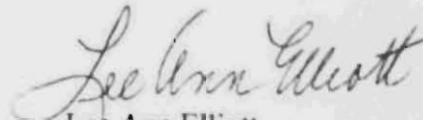

#### I. GENERATION OF MATTER

This matter was generated by a complaint filed with the Federal Election Commission by Robert A. Gigler. See 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1). The complaint alleged that Murkowski '92 Committee and Alaskans for Don Young received illegal contributions totaling \$16,500 from John Ellsworth and his two companies, Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. ("AIC") and Unicol, Inc. ("Unicol") in the names of the following respondent employees: Cindy Scott, James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson, Rona Troutman and Janice Ellsworth, John Ellsworth's wife.<sup>1</sup> Murkowski '92 Committee was the political committee of Frank Murkowski, a candidate for the United States Senate. Alaskans for Don Young was the political committee of

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<sup>1</sup> Ms. Ellsworth does not appear to be an employee of either company.



Don Young, a candidate for the United States Congress in 1992. The primary election was held on 8 September, 1992 and the general election was held on 3 November, 1992.

## II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

### A. Facts

The complaint indicates that the contributions at issue were all made by certified checks, many of which had consecutive serial numbers. The checks were payable to the respective committees; the employee names appeared on the checks as the purchasers.

The complaint presented the following contributions:

As the above chart shows, many of the cashier's checks were numbered consecutively. For example, checks from four respondents, James Workman, David Thomas, William Castoe, and Janice Ellsworth, were numbered 80120422 through 80120425. Those checks were all dated 31 August, 1992 and were made out to Alaskans for Don Young. The contribution checks to Frank Murkowski's senatorial campaign showed a similar pattern. Contributions from Cindy Scott, Dave Thomas, and John and Janice Ellsworth, were made by three cashier's checks purchased on the same date (13 October, 1992) and showed consecutive check numbers (80147215 through 80147217).

The complaint also provided a 15 June, 1995 unnamed newspaper article which reported that Mr. Ellsworth and employees of AIC and Unicol were being investigated by the Alaska Public Offices Commission for the making of contributions in the name of another. According to the article, the employees asserted that they authorized AIC's Office Manager, Cindy Scott, to purchase cashier's checks in their names and donate them to the candidates. The article further reported that even though some of the checks had consecutive serial numbers, the employees denied there was any organized effort to donate to specific candidates. The employees claimed that the timing of their contributions and the identity of the candidates were all coincidence. The article also reported that Mr. Ellsworth maintained that he and his employees were innocent and did not intend to violate any laws.

In response to the complaint, AIC admitted to making a \$1,000 contribution to Murkowski's campaign by corporate check dated 9 December, 1991. However, the

campaign returned the check to AIC on 4 February, 1992. Unicol claimed that it made no contributions to either candidate in 1992. Generally, the employees claimed to have independently made the respective contributions attributed to them and denied that they violated the Act.

According to the responses, James Workman, AIC's North Slope Operations Manager, claimed that in August, 1992 he contributed \$1,000 to Don Young's congressional campaign by cashier's check dated 31 August, 1992 (Primary) and \$1,000 to Frank Murkowski's senatorial campaign by check dated 24 April, 1992 (Primary). John Peterson, AIC's Chief Estimator, claimed that in October, 1992, he contributed \$1,000 to Don Young's campaign by cashier's check dated 15 October, 1992 (General).<sup>2</sup> David Thomas, AIC's Manager of Safety and Engineering, claimed that in 1992 he contributed \$2,000 to Young's campaign: \$1,000 by cashier's check dated 31 August, 1992 and \$1,000 by cashier's check dated 9 October, 1992. He also claimed to have contributed \$1,000 to Murkowski's campaign by cashier's check dated 13 October, 1992 (Pre-General). William Castoe, AIC's Field Superintendent, claimed that in August, 1992, he contributed \$1,000 to Young's campaign by cashier's check dated 31 August, 1992 (Primary). Cindy Scott, AIC's Office Manager, Secretary, treasurer and director, as well as Unicol's Office Manager and Secretary, claimed that she contributed \$1,000 to Young's campaign by cashier's check dated 9 July, 1992 (Primary), and \$2,000 to Murkowski's campaign by two \$1,000 cashier's checks dated 24 April, 1992 (Primary) and 13 October, 1992, respectively.

John Ellsworth, President, director and sole owner of AIC and Unicol, claimed that he contributed \$2,000 to Young's campaign by two \$1,000 cashier's checks dated 9 July, 1992 and 9 October, 1992, respectively. He also claimed that he contributed a total of \$2,000 to Murkowski's campaign: \$1,000 by a cashier's checks dated 23 April, 1992, and another \$1,000 by a joint \$2,000 cashier's check dated 13 October, 1992 with his wife, Janice Ellsworth. In her response, Mrs. Ellsworth corroborated Mr. Ellsworth's account of the \$2,000 joint cashier's check contribution to Murkowski's campaign. She also claimed that in August, 1992, she contributed \$1,000 to Young's campaign by cashier's check dated 31 August, 1992 (Primary).

Documents provided by the Alaska Public Offices Commission ("APOC") showed that, consistent with the newspaper article attached to the complaint, the employees generally maintained that the contributions were made with their personal funds. The employees claimed that they left cash with Ms. Scott because they worked for extended periods in rural Alaska. Ms. Scott held those funds in the employees' personnel files at the companies for disbursement according to each employee's instruction. Ms. Scott claimed that she bought the cashier's checks for the contributions upon the direction of the employees, as a personal favor to the employees as friends rather than as part of her job.

Despite the employees' assertions, the available information showed that the moneys for the contributions were not from the employees personal funds but from AIC or Unicol's petty cash fund, salaries and bonuses to the respective employees or "draws" from the company. For example, the information shows that on 2 October, 1992,

Mr. Ellsworth took a "draw" of \$6,000 from AIC. On that same day, someone from AIC used \$3,000 to purchase cashier's checks in the names of Thomas, Castoe and Peterson for contributions to a candidate for the Alaska State Senate, Bill Webb. Seven days later, someone used another \$3,000 to buy cashier's checks in the names of Ellsworth, Thomas and Peterson for contributions to Don Young. Similarly, on 13 October, 1992, 11 days after Mr. Ellsworth received the \$6,000 "draw," he directed Ms. Scott to issue him a \$6,000 AIC company check. He took the check to the bank and used it to buy five cashier's checks (four \$1,000 cashier's checks and one \$2,000 cashier's check), three of which were used to make \$1,000 contributions to Murkowski's campaign in the names of Scott, Thomas, Ellsworth and his wife.

In addition to the above activity, the available information shows that the employees generally were not politically active or sophisticated. Some of them either could not identify their political representatives or had not registered to vote prior to 1992.

Finally, AIC, Unicol, and the respondent employees (except Janice Ellsworth) entered into a consent agreement with APOC for comparable violations of Alaska State campaign finance laws. The settlement was approved by APOC on 10 August, 1995. Under the agreement, John Ellsworth, AIC and Unicol jointly agreed to pay a civil penalty of \$55,000. Cindy Scott agreed to pay a penalty of \$25,000; James Workman agreed to pay \$7,000; David Thomas agreed to pay \$6,000; William Castoe agreed to pay \$2,000; and John Peterson agreed to pay \$1,000.

## B. Law

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") prohibits corporations from making contributions or expenditures in connection with a Federal election. 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a). This broad prohibition extends to "anything of value" given to any candidate or campaign in connection with any Federal election. 2 U.S.C. § 441b(b)(2). Section 441b(a) of the Act further prohibits any officer or any director of any corporation from consenting to any contribution or expenditure by the corporation.

Section 441f of the Act prohibits any person from making a contribution in the name of another person or from permitting his or her name to be used to effect such a contribution. 2 U.S.C. § 441f. The Commission regulations at 11 C.F.R. § 110.4(b)(1)(iii) also makes it unlawful for any person to knowingly help or assist any person making a contribution in the name of another. The Commission regulations and rulings make it clear that section 441f prohibitions apply to any person who provides money to others, or any person who uses said money, to make contributions, 11 C.F.R. § 110.4 (b) (2), and to incorporated or unincorporated entities who give money to another to effect a contribution in the second person's name. Advisory Opinion 1986-41.

## C. Analysis

The available information clearly shows a pattern of practice in which AIC and Unicol's corporate officers, John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott, bought cashier's checks in the names of the respondent employees and made contributions to the respondent committees. Many of the cashier's checks displayed the same date and were numbered sequentially, indicating that the checks were purchased in bulk from the same bank teller.

It appears that many of them were not politically active prior to the contributions at issue and that many of them were not even registered to vote prior to the contributions. Furthermore, they and the respondent corporations signed a ~~consent~~ agreement with APOC admitting to a similar scheme in violation of the State of Alaska's election laws.

Therefore, there is reason to believe that James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson and Janice Ellsworth violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f by permitting their names to be used to make contributions in the name of another. There is also reason to believe that John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott knowingly and willfully

violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f by permitting their names to be used to make contributions in the name of another, by knowingly assisting in the making of such contributions and by consenting to the making of corporate contributions. Finally, there is reason to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. and Unicol, Inc. knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f by making corporate contributions totaling \$16,000 in connection with a Federal election and by making contributions totaling \$16,000 in the names of their employees.

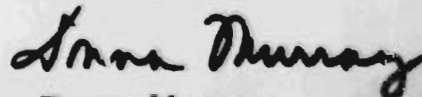
Dear Mr. Noble:

Dear Members of the Commission:


This matter arose as result of a complaint filed by Robert Gigler in the summer of 1995. I am communication with you directly because counsel for the committee is unavailable. The Alaskans for Don Young Committee responded to the complaint in September 1995 with an explanation of its actions and a request that the Commission address this matter. Alaskans for Don Young believes that it has acted in full compliance with the applicable laws and regulations and expects that the Commission staff will come to that conclusion upon completion of its review.

This matter has now been under review for over 15 months. It has to do with an incident which occurred in 1992—some four years ago. Since it filed its response, the Committee has heard nothing from the Commission or its staff as to the status of this investigation or when the Commission's review will be completed.

This matter needs to be resolved. It should not take this long for the Commission to make a determination as to the validity of a complaint.

We request that the Commission thoroughly and promptly complete its review of this matter. We anticipate that the Commission will determine whether any violations of applicable law or regulation occurred and advise the parties of its findings. Please ask that this matter be promptly addressed and that the review be completed as soon as possible.

**GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT**

**I. BACKGROUND**

On September 10, 1996, the Commission found reason to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., Unicol, Inc., and their officers, John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f and that several employees, James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson, and Janice Ellsworth, John Ellsworth's wife<sup>1</sup> (collectively "Respondents") knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f. See First General Counsel's Report dated August 22, 1996. The reason to believe findings were based on a July 24, 1995 complaint alleging that the respondent companies made contributions totaling \$16,500 in the names of the above employees. The contributions were made by groups of sequentially numbered cashier checks to Murkowski '92 Committee, the political committee of Senator Frank Murkowski, and to Alaskans for Don Young, the political committee of

<sup>1</sup> Ms. Ellsworth does not appear to be an employee of either company.



Representative Don Young.<sup>2</sup> The Commission also determined to enter into conciliation with Respondents prior to a finding of probable cause to believe.

<sup>2</sup> The Commission made no findings against the recipient committees in the First General Counsel's Report.



## II. DISCUSSION

This matter involves 1992 activity and a total of \$16,000 in contributions. An investigation poses evidentiary difficulties and significant expense because of the dated activity, the type of contributions involved (cashier's checks), and the location and quantity of respondents. This Office has not conducted an independent investigation into this matter. Rather, we have relied on the questionable manner in which the contributions were made and an investigation conducted by the State of Alaska's election agency showing similar violations of State election laws by the respondent companies and their employees.

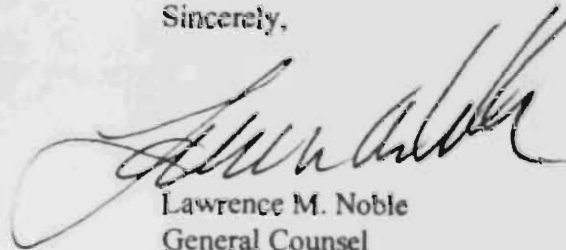

**GENERAL COUNSEL'S BRIEF**

**I.     STATEMENT OF THE CASE**

On September 10, 1996, the Federal Election Commission ("Commission") found reason to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., Unicol, Inc., and their officers, John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, ("Act" or "FECA") and that several employees, James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson, and Janice Ellsworth, John Ellsworth's wife, (collectively "Respondents") violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f.

**II.    ANALYSIS**

In late 1991 John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott, two officers of Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. ("AIC") made a contribution to the 1992 Senate campaign of Frank Murkowski using an AIC corporate check. The Murkowski campaign returned the check, and two months later Mr. Ellsworth and Ms. Scott began a deliberate campaign to circumvent FECA prohibitions on corporate contributions in Federal elections by funneling AIC money to



Senator Murkowski's Senate Campaign, Representative Don Young's U.S. House campaign, and the Bush/Quayle Presidential Committee in the form of 18 cashier's checks totaling \$19,000 -- bank checks contributed under the names of AIC employees and the wife of Mr. Ellsworth. AIC and its sister corporation Unicol, Inc. were corporations dependent on the oil industry, and a chief motivating factor for making these contributions was Senator Murkowski's, Representative Young's and President Bush's commitments to opening untapped Alaskan territory to oil exploration.

The Commission's information and investigation in this matter is based on an exhaustive investigation by the Alaska agency empowered to investigate Alaska campaign finance violations. The state of Alaska's investigation turned up a plethora of information showing that the AIC respondents had engaged in a multi-year scheme to funnel AIC money to Alaska state political candidates, again using cashier's checks in the names of AIC corporate employees, and there was no credible evidence that the contributions were made using personal funds. Respondents engaged in the identical conduct at the Federal level. The state investigation resulted in civil penalties collectively totaling almost \$100,000 by all Respondents in the instant matter except for Mrs. Ellsworth.

The FECA provides that no person shall make contributions to any candidate and the candidate's authorized political committees with respect to any election for federal office which, in the aggregate, exceeds \$1,000. 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A). The Act also prohibits corporations from making contributions or expenditures in connection with a Federal election. 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a). This broad prohibition extends to "anything of value" given to any candidate or campaign in connection with any Federal election. 2 U.S.C. § 441b(b)(2). Section

441b(2) of the Act further prohibits any officer or any director of any corporation from consenting to any contribution or expenditure by the corporation. That provision also makes it unlawful for a political committee knowingly to accept or receive corporate contributions.

Section 441f of the Act prohibits any person from making a contribution in the name of another person or from permitting his or her name to be used to effect such a contribution. It also prohibits any person from knowingly accepting a contribution made by one person in the name of another person. 2 U.S.C. § 441f. The Commission regulations at 11 C.F.R. § 110.4(b)(1)(iii) also makes it unlawful for any person to knowingly help or assist any person making a contribution in the name of another. The Commission regulations and rulings makes it clear that section 441f prohibitions apply to any person that provides money to others, or any person who uses said money, to make contributions, 11 C.F.R. § 110.4(b)(2), and to incorporated or unincorporated entities who give money to another to effect a contribution in the second person's name. Advisory Opinion 1986-41.

The Act addresses violations of law that are knowing and willful. See, 2 U.S.C. §§ 437g(a)(5)(C) and 437g(d). The phrase "knowing and willful" indicates that "actions [were] taken with full knowledge of all of the facts and a recognition that the action is prohibited by law." 122 Cong. Rec. H3778 (daily ed. May 3, 1976). The knowing and willful standard requires knowledge that one is violating the law. Federal Election Commission v. John A. Dramesi for Congress Committee, 640 F. Supp. 985 (D. N.J. 1986). A knowing and willful violation may be established "by proof that the defendant acted deliberately and with knowledge that the representation was false." United States v. Hopkins, 916 F.2d 207, 214 (5th Cir. 1990). An inference of a knowing and willful violation may be drawn "from the defendants'

elaborate scheme for disguising" their actions and that they "deliberately conveyed information they knew to be false to the Federal Election Commission." *Id.* at 214-15. In *Hopkins*, the defendant was found criminally liable for engaging in an elaborate scheme to disguise the source of corporate political contributions. See also *U.S. v. Crop Growers Corp.* (corporate contributions arising in the Donald Smaltz Independent Counsel investigation); *U.S. v. Aqua-Leisure and Simon Fireman* (corporate contributions to the Dole for President campaign); and *U.S. v. Lalit H. Gadhia* (foreign contributions).

The Alaska Public Offices Commission ("APOC") provided documents and information regarding this matter, all of which are on the public record in Alaska. Among the materials APOC provided was a June 9, 1995, staff report ("APOC Staff Report") describing the results of the APOC investigation. The report indicates that APOC conducted a full-scale investigation, including oral depositions of the respondent employees and other nonparty witnesses, and a review of bank, travel, and voting records. The APOC Staff Report shows that the employees generally maintained that the bank check contributions were made with their personal funds,<sup>1</sup> but when questioned by an APOC investigator, a number of long-term AIC employees had never even heard that anyone kept cash in his or her personnel file. Even Cindy Scott, in an APOC deposition, testified that AIC employees' personnel files contained IRS forms, health and safety information, hiring and lay-off slips, and child support payment information. She did not mention that the files contained cash. Despite the employees' assertions, the report shows that

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<sup>1</sup> The employees claimed that they left cash with Cindy Scott because they worked for extended periods in rural Alaska, and Ms. Scott held those funds in the employees' personnel files at the companies for disbursement according to each employee's instruction. Ms. Scott claimed that she bought the cashier's checks for the contributions upon the direction of the employees, as a personal favor to the employees as friends rather than as part of her job.



the sources of the money for the contributions were not from the employees' personal funds but from AIC's petty cash fund, bonuses to the respective employees, or alleged "draws" from the company which were specifically granted for the purpose of making political contributions.

The following is a chronology of the events at issue in this matter. On December 9, 1991, John Ellsworth, President of AIC, and Cindy Scott, Secretary and Treasurer of AIC, made a \$1,000 contribution to the 1992 Murkowski campaign using an AIC corporate check. The campaign returned the check to AIC on February 4, 1992, and the practice of using cashier's checks for Federal contributions in the names of AIC employees began on April 23, 1992, barely two months later. The first two AIC Respondents to engage in these transactions were John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott, the same two individuals who had unsuccessfully attempted to make corporate contributions to the Murkowski campaign. On April 23, two \$1,000 cashier's checks from First National Bank of Anchorage were purchased, and on the next day, the two checks, respectively numbered 80105471 and 80105472, were used to make contributions to Frank Murkowski in the names of Cindy Scott and John Ellsworth.

Then, on April 24, 1992, Cindy Scott wrote check number 142 payable to AIC in the amount of \$1,050 on the personal account of Al Davis, an AIC manager. The memo line on this check states "Repay parts, electrical etc." Despite this inscription, Ms. Scott cashed the \$1,050 check on April 24, and, as listed on the back of the check, used \$1,000 to purchase a First National Bank of Anchorage cashier's check numbered 80107023, which was contributed to Frank Murkowski's campaign in the name of James Workman. Despite the clear evidence on the face and the reverse of this check, Mr. Workman testified at his APOC deposition that the money

used to purchase his cashier's check for Frank Murkowski came from his personnel file.

According to the APOC Staff Report, at his deposition, Mr. Davis stated that he had granted Ms. Scott check signing authority, but he knew nothing of the check to AIC, never saw it before the deposition, never authorized it, and had no idea what it could possibly be for, because he never bought parts for AIC for which he would need to be reimbursed.

A \$3,000 AIC check dated July 9, 1992, was signed by John Ellsworth with "pay to the order of CASH." The memo line entry on this check reads: "Petty cash fund." The back of the check is signed by John Ellsworth and the endorsement shows that the check was used for \$1,000 cash and two First National Bank of Anchorage cashier's checks numbered 80119184 and 80119185. Those cashier's check were each for \$1,000. Both were contributed to Don Young's campaign on July 9, respectively in the names of John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott.

On July 29, 1992, three \$1,000 cashier's checks from First National Bank of Anchorage numbered 80124070, 80124071, and 80124085 were purchased. These three checks were used as contributions to the Bush/Quayle Committee in the names of James Workman, John and Janice Ellsworth, and Cindy Scott on July 29 or July 30. On August 31, four \$1,000 First National Bank of Anchorage cashier's checks numbered 80120422 through 80120425 were purchased with cash and were used for four contributions made to Don Young in the names of James Workman, David Thomas, William Castoe, and Janice Ellsworth. On October 2, 1992, Mr. Ellsworth received \$6,000 from AIC. On that same day, \$3,000 in cash was used to purchase consecutively numbered cashier's checks in the names of David Thomas, William Castoe and John Peterson for contributions to a candidate for the Alaska State Senate, Bill Webb.

Seven days later, another \$3,000 in cash was used to buy First National Bank of Anchorage cashier's checks respectively numbered 80125952, 80125953, and 80125954 in the names of Mr. Ellsworth, Mr. Peterson, and Mr. Thomas for contributions to Don Young.

Although he had received \$6,000 on October 2, Mr. Ellsworth had no cash by October 13 and would not explain how he had spent his money. On October 13, Mr. Ellsworth signed AIC check 14201, payable to "CASH." This was used to buy five cashier's checks (four \$1,000 cashier's checks and one \$2,000 cashier's check), three of which were used to make \$1,000 contributions to Senator Murkowski's campaign in the names of Ms. Scott, Mr. Thomas, Mr. Ellsworth and Janice Ellsworth, through First National Bank of Anchorage cashier's checks 80147215, 80147216, and 80147217. The remaining two First National Bank of Anchorage cashier's checks numbered 80147213 and 80147214 were used for contributions in the names of Al Davis and Al Foster, another supervisor, to Bill Webb, the same candidate for the Alaska contributions who had previously received AIC "employee" checks dated October 2.

To explain this scenario involving the second \$6,000 cash payment, according to the APOC Staff Report, Mr. Ellsworth claimed that Ms. Scott had forgotten her keys to the personnel files containing the employees' cash. Because there was no access to this cash, Mr. Ellsworth directed Ms. Scott to write him the \$6,000 AIC check, even though Ms. Scott could easily have gone home to retrieve the keys. Mr. Ellsworth then took the AIC check to the bank and purchased the five cashier's checks. Mr. Ellsworth stated that Ms. Scott repaid him the next day, implying that repayments were made from the personnel files.

AIC, Unicol, and all individual respondents, except Janice Ellsworth, entered into a consent agreement with APOC in which they admitted making contributions in the name of another, in violation of Alaska campaign finance laws. The settlement was approved by APOC on August 10, 1995, and the AIC respondents who are respondents in this matter paid civil penalties totaling \$96,000. Under the agreement, John Ellsworth, AIC and Unicol jointly agreed to pay a civil penalty of \$55,000. Cindy Scott agreed to pay a penalty of \$25,000; James

Workman agreed to pay \$7,000; David Thomas agreed to pay \$6,000; William Castoe agreed to pay \$2,000; and John Peterson agreed to pay \$1,000.

The available information clearly shows a pattern of practice in which AIC and Unicol's corporate officers, John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott, used corporate funds and bought cashier's checks in the names of the respondent employees and made contributions to the Murkowski and Young political committees. All of the cashier's checks used for these contributions were purchased from First National Bank of Anchorage, and many bore the same date and were numbered sequentially, indicating that the checks were purchased in bulk from the same bank teller. Inasmuch as they all worked for the same employer, the sequentially numbered cashier's checks also show coordination among the respondent employees.

Mr. Ellsworth even admits that the series of contributions made on October 13 came from AIC funds. Then, the cashier's checks were used to make contributions to Frank Murkowski in the names of Mr. Scott, Mr. Thomas, and Mr. and Mrs. Ellsworth. Even if these contributions were repaid, and there is no documentary evidence to show this, such repayments would not mitigate the making of corporate contributions in the names of others, in violation of 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b and 441f. While it is highly suspect that this transaction was intended as Mr. Ellsworth's personal draw from AIC, even so such use of a draw would result in a corporate contribution. Despite Respondents' contention to the contrary, if bonuses or draws arise from corporate funds, they do not become personal funds if they were distributed to the purported donor for the purpose of making political contributions. See, e.g., MUR 4161 and AO 1986-41.

Respondents asserted in their responses to the APOC investigation that the contributions at issue in this matter were made from each contributor's personal funds.<sup>2</sup> Although asked to provide specific information and documents to support their claim of use of personal funds, Respondents have refused to do so while only maintaining their general denials. Because there is specific documentary evidence demonstrating the transformation of AIC corporate checks into a number of the contributions at issue in this matter, a compelling inference is made that all of the contributions were originally derived from corporate funds and not from personal funds.

One of the ostensible reasons for making contributions with cashier's checks was because AIC employees were routinely in the Alaskan wilderness on the dates that the contributions were made. Whether or not plausible for AIC field employees,<sup>3</sup> this is not a credible argument for Mr. and Mrs. Ellsworth and Ms. Scott. Mr. Ellsworth was AIC president and Ms. Scott was AIC office manager, and both were based in Anchorage. Mrs. Ellsworth also lived there. Respondents never provided evidence to the Commission that they were away on the dates any of these contributions were made to federal candidates. In fact, the pattern of using cashier's

<sup>2</sup> Pursuant to Alaska law, form 15-5s, "statements of contributions by an individual, organization, or business," were filed for all contributions at issue in this matter to the Murkowski and Young Campaigns. On the form, the signator must certify that "the contribution described above consists of funds or property belonging to myself. . . ." For all individual contributions at issue made between April 23 and October 13, 1992, the form 15-5s were dated between October 15 and October 31, 1992. The two 15-5s for James Workman's April 24 contribution to Frank Murkowski and August 31 contribution to Don Young are both dated October 31. The signatures on these two forms are identical, but do not appear to match James Workman's signature on the designation of counsel form in the instant matter. The signature on Mr. Workman's 15-5 forms appear to be in the handwriting of Cindy Scott, but, according to the APOC Staff Report, Ms. Scott has verbal authorization, but no power of attorney, to fill out Mr. Workman's 15-5s.

<sup>3</sup> For example, a contribution was made in the name of James Workman to Don Young on August 31, 1992, but according to the APOC Staff Report, AIC payroll records show that Mr. Workman did not work for most of August and September of 1992.



checks for federal contributions began only after Mr. Ellsworth and Ms. Scott discovered that they could not make contributions to Federal candidates with direct corporate checks, and they were the very first two individual AIC Respondents to use this method. At least Mr. Ellsworth knew that he could use a personal check to make contributions to candidates, as evidenced by his April 6, 1991, personal check to Don Young, a check which was not refunded, and other earlier contributions to state candidates.

Despite Respondents' contention that they knew the candidates to whom they contributed in this matter, the APOC Staff Report shows that many of the Respondents were not politically active prior to the contributions at issue and that many of them were not registered to vote prior to the contributions. As the APOC Report indicates, Mr. Ellsworth also had great incentive to contribute to candidates sympathetic to oil extraction, because his livelihood depended on it, and, as Respondents acknowledge, Representative Young, Senator Murkowski, and President Bush were firmly committed to opening the Arctic National Wilderness Refuge for oil exploration.

The scheme described above was implemented after John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott tried to use a \$1,000 AIC corporate check dated December 9, 1991, to contribute to Frank Murkowski's campaign. Although John Ellsworth as president, director and sole owner of AIC agreed to the making of this contribution, Cindy Scott, AIC secretary, treasurer, and director, actually signed the Form 15-5 required by APOC to be filed simultaneously with each contribution. This contribution was refunded on February 4, 1992. As this may have been the first notice to Mr. Ellsworth and Ms. Scott that corporate contributions were illegal at the federal level and the return of the contribution may have provided the impetus for the illegal scheme that followed, this Office does not assert that this particular contribution was knowing and willful.

Accordingly, this Office recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., John Ellsworth, and Cindy Scott violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a).

Based on the foregoing, the evidence demonstrates that the remaining \$19,000 in contributions were made with moneys provided by the respondent companies, not from the personal funds of the employees in whose name the contributions were made. A number of the corporate checks show the standard bank notations showing the corporate checks were used to purchase cashier's checks later used to make political contributions. The APOC Staff Report shows that the sources of the money for the contributions were from either AIC's petty cash fund, bonuses to the respective employees, or "draws" from the company, which were specifically granted for the purpose of making political contributions. As APOC discovered, making corporate contributions in the names of various employees was not new to the AIC respondents in 1992. As the APOC Report shows, AIC perpetrated the same type of scheme at the state level which involved many more contributions and candidates, a case which APOC settled with a civil penalty totaling \$98,500 (\$96,000 attributable to the Respondents in the instant matter). Accordingly, this Office recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe that James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson and Janice Ellsworth violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f.

In addition to the factors already mentioned, the evidence shows that John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott, the officers of the respondent corporations, executed the contribution scheme shortly after AIC's corporate check to the Murkowski campaign was returned on February 4, 1992. Furthermore, they and the respondent corporations signed a consent decree with APOC

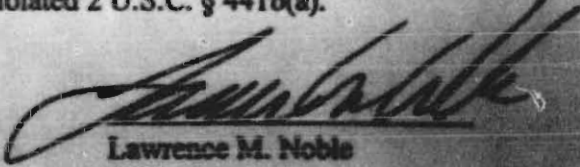
admitting to a similar scheme in violation of the State of Alaska's election laws. Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe that John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f by permitting their names to be used to make contributions in the name of another, by knowingly assisting in the making of such contributions, and by consenting to the making of corporate contributions. This Office also recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. and Unicol, Inc. knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f by making corporate contributions totaling \$19,000 in connection with a Federal election and by making contributions totaling \$19,000 in the names of their employees.

### III. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Find probable cause to believe that Janice Ellsworth, James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, and John Peterson violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f.
2. Find probable cause to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., Unicol, Inc., John Ellsworth, and Cindy Scott knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f.
3. Find probable cause to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a).

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

On September 10, 1996, the Federal Election Commission ("Commission") found reason to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. ("AIC"), Unicol, Inc., and their officers, John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f and that several employees, James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson, and Janice Ellsworth, John Ellsworth's wife, (collectively "Respondents") violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f. On the same date the Commission also determined to enter into conciliation with Respondents prior to a finding of probable cause to believe. Because all Respondents represented by the same attorney, the Commission determined to enter into a single conciliation agreement.

On January 22, 1997, the Commission

approved a conciliation agreement

Commission entered into conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause

probable cause was forwarded to the Respondents on April 24, 1997. Respondents have

respond to the brief and did not request an extension of time in which to respond. After the fifteen day period had lapsed, this Office telephonically confirmed with counsel for the Respondents that he had received the brief and did not plan to respond.<sup>1</sup> This General Counsel's Report contains probable cause recommendations.

## II. ANALYSIS

An analysis of the Respondents' violations in this matter is contained in the General Counsel's brief signed on April 23, 1997. The factual and legal analysis set forth in the General Counsel's brief is incorporated as if fully set forth herein. Because Respondents failed to respond to the brief and in the absence of any new arguments to the contrary, this Office recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., John Ellsworth, and Cindy Scott violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) with respect to the direct 1991 corporate contribution to the Murkowski Committee. See Brief at 11-12. This Office also recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe that James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson and Janice Ellsworth violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f. This Office further recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe that Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., Unicol, Inc., John Ellsworth, and Cindy Scott knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f.

### III. DISCUSSION OF CONCILIATION PROVISIONS AND CIVIL PENALTY

This matter involves 1992 activity and this Office has not conducted its own investigation given the evidentiary difficulties and significant expense caused by the dated activity and the location and quantity of respondents. There is, however, sufficient information to substantiate the probable cause recommendations as discussed above and in the Brief. Moreover, although these transactions date to 1992, the general statute of limitations may not bar enforcement action five years after the specific contributions at issue. In pending litigation in FEC v. Williams, No. 95-55320 (9th Cir.), the Ninth Circuit has sought responsive briefs for a possible rehearing on the issues of fraudulent concealment and injunctive relief, and both issues are directly relevant to the instant matter which involves corporate contributions made in the names of others precisely to avoid detection of the prohibited source of the contributions.

Attached for Commission approval is a proposed conciliation agreement

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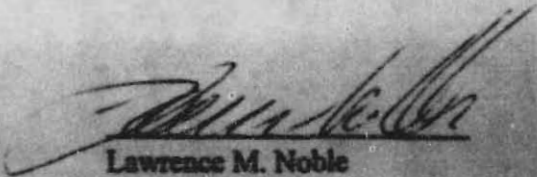

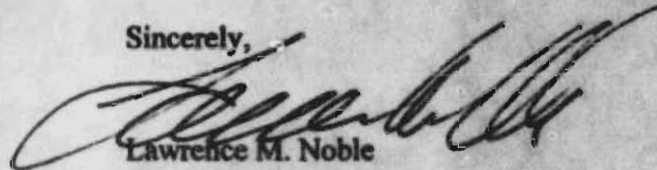

**I. BACKGROUND**

Attached is a conciliation agreement that has been signed by the above-named corporate and individual respondents. This matter came to the Commission in July 1995 and was activated in early 1996, but it relates to 1991-92 transactions.

this Office recommends the Commission accept the agreement in this matter and close the file.





this Office recommends the Commission accept the signed conciliation agreement in settlement of this matter. Respondents submitted the civil penalty amount along with the executed agreement.

The remaining respondents in the matter are Murkowski for U.S. Senate Committee (formerly Murkowski '92 Committee), and Donna Pagano Murray, as treasurer, Alaskans for Don Young, and Robert Bohnert, as treasurer, and Rona Troutman, another corporate employee. This Office made no recommendations and the Commission has made no findings with respect to these respondents. First General Counsel's Report in MUR 4235, dated August 22, 1996, at page 12-13. Accordingly, they will be notified that the matter closed with no Commission findings against them. The recipient committees requested guidance earlier in the matter as to the Commission's resolution of the MUR 4235 complaint, and it is the Commission's practice in such cases to seek remedial disgorgement from all active recipient committees whether or not respondents

Therefore, as to the recipient committees, this Office recommends that upon closure of the matter, the Commission advise them of its knowing and willful probable cause findings and conciliation agreement with respect to the contributions at issue, instruct the committees to disgorge the amount of the illegal funds to the Treasury, and explain that by doing so they can thereby avoid any need to reopen the matter as to them.

Although not a named respondent in this matter, this Office will similarly notify Bush-Quayle '92 Primary Committee, Inc., which was the beneficiary of three illegal contributions totaling \$3,000, see General Counsel's Brief, p. 8; Conciliation Agreement ¶ IV. 10.

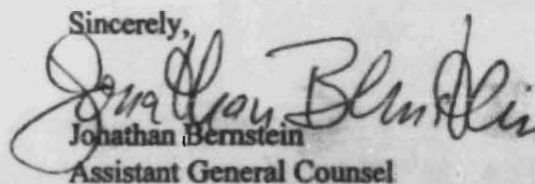

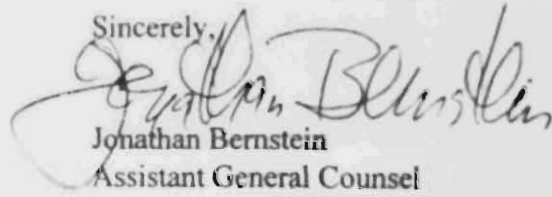

IV. The activity at issue occurred in 1992; the pertinent facts are as follows:

1. Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. and Unicol, Inc ("Unicol") are corporations within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. §441b(a) and persons within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. §441f.

2. John Ellsworth is President, director and sole owner of AIC and Unicol.

3. Cindy Scott was AIC's Office Manager, Secretary, treasurer and director, as well as Unicol's Office Manager and Secretary.

4. James Workman, John Peterson, David Thomas and William Castoe were employees of AIC or Unicol.

5. Janice Ellsworth is John Ellsworth's wife.

6. The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") prohibits corporations from making contributions or expenditures in connection with a Federal election 2 U.S.C. §441b(b)(2). Section 441b(a) of the Act further prohibits any officer or any director of any corporation from consenting to any contribution or expenditure by the corporation.

7. Section 441f of the Act prohibits any person from making a contribution in the name of another person or from permitting his or her name to be used to effect such a contribution. 2 U.S.C. §441f. The Commission regulations at 11 C.F.R. §110.4(b)(1)(iii) also makes it unlawful for any person to

knowingly help or assist any person making a contribution in the name of another. The Commission regulations and rulings make it clear that section 441f prohibitions apply to any person who provides money to others, or any person who uses said money, to make contributions, 11 C.F.R. §110.4(b)(2), and to incorporated or unincorporated entities who give money to another to effect a contribution in the second person's name. Advisory Opinion 1986-41.

8. The Act addresses violations of law that are knowing and willful. 2 U.S.C. §§437g(a)(5)(B) and 437g(d).

9. By corporate check dated December 9, 1991, AIC made a \$1,000 contribution to Murkowski '92 Committee, the political committee of Frank Murkowski a candidate for the United States Senate in 1992. The campaign returned the check to AIC on February 4, 1992.

10. Thereafter, between April and October of 1992, the respondent individuals made contributions totaling \$7,000 to the Murkowski '92 Committee, the political committee of Frank Murkowski, a candidate for the United States Senate; contributions totaling \$9,000 to Alaskans for Don Young, the political committee of Don Young, a candidate for the United States Congress in 1992; and \$3,000 in contributions to the Bush/Quayle Committee.

11. The contributions were all made by certified checks. Many of the checks displayed the same date and had consecutive serial numbers, indicating that they were purchased at

the same time from the same bank teller. Each check was for \$1,000 and was payable to the respective committee, except for a \$2,000 check to the Murkowski Committee in the name of John and Janice Ellsworth. Each individual's name appeared on the corresponding check as the purchaser.

12. The moneys for the contributions were either from AIC or Unicol's petty cash fund, bonuses to the respective employees or "draws" from the companies.

V. For the purpose only of settling these 1991-92 transactions, Respondents agree to the following:

1. Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc., John Ellsworth, and Cindy Scott made a corporate contribution to a political committee, in violation of 2 U.S.C. §441b(a), with respect to the direct 1991 corporate contribution to the Murkowski Committee.

2. James Workman, David Thomas, William (Bill) Castoe, John Peterson and Janice Ellsworth permitted their names to be used to make contributions in the name of another, in violation of 2 U.S.C. §441f.

3. John Ellsworth and Cindy Scott knowingly and willfully permitted their names to be used to make contributions in the name of another, assisted in the making of such contributions and consented to the making of corporate contributions, in violation of 2 U.S.C. §§441b(a) and 441f.

4. Alaska Interstate Construction, Inc. and Unicol,



Inc. knowingly and willfully made corporate contributions totaling \$19,000 in connection with a Federal election and made contributions totaling \$19,000 in the names of their employees, in violation of 2 U.S.C. §§441b(a) and 441f.

VI. Respondents jointly will pay a civil penalty to the Federal Election Commission in the amount of Forty Thousand dollars (\$40,000), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(5)(A).

VII. Respondents shall not directly or indirectly make corporate contributions to federal candidates; shall not make contributions to federal candidates in the name of another person; shall not permit their names to be used to make contributions to Federal candidates unless the contributions are from their personal funds; and shall only use funds permissible under the Act to make contributions or expenditures to influence a federal election.

VIII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

IX. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

X. Respondents shall have no more than 30 days from the

date this agreement becomes effective to comply with an implement the requirement contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

XI. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, either written or oral, made by either party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be enforceable.

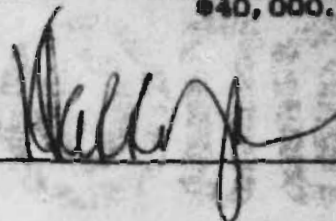

The Commission found probable cause to believe that these contributions actually came from corporations rather than the named individuals.

Federal law prohibits the acceptance of contributions from corporations directly or through any other person. 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a); see 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(a). Further, 2 U.S.C. § 441f prohibits the acceptance of any contribution in the name of another. 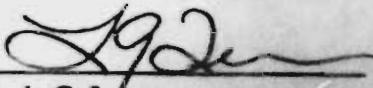

We received your letter dated December 22, 1997, enclosing materials concerning Matter Under Review ("MUR") 4235. Having considered the matter, the Bush-Quayle '92 Primary Committee, Inc. (the "Committee") must respectfully decline the Commission's request to pay \$3,000 to the U.S. Treasury in connection with the MUR.

The Committee was not a respondent in MUR 4235 and, accordingly, was not provided with the opportunity to participate in the investigation. Nor do the materials included with your letter provide an adequate basis for evaluating the allegations in the MUR. The conciliation agreement indicates that the respondents entered into the agreement for "the purpose only of settling these 1991-92 transactions." The remaining materials, such as the description of the conciliation agreement in a Commission publication, provide no independent basis for assessing the allegations.

As you are no doubt aware, neither the Federal Election Campaign Act nor Commission regulations provide any basis for ordering a payment by the Committee under these circumstances. Further, over five years have passed since the contributions were made, and the Committee is in the process of winding down and closing its books. The inherent unfairness in reaching back to raise issues after so many years is why the statute of limitations prohibits the Commission from enforcing such stale issues.

Accordingly, the Committee cannot agree to the Commission's request.

Upon closure of this matter on August 22, 1997, the Commission instructed the two respondent recipient committees, Alaskans for Don Young and Murkowski for U.S. Senate, to disgorge the amount of the illegal funds to the U.S. Treasury, and explained that by doing so, they could thereby avoid any need to reopen the matter as to them. Although not a named respondent in this matter, this Office similarly notified the Bush-Quayle '92 Primary Committee, Inc. ("Bush-Quayle '92"), which was the beneficiary of three illegal contributions totaling \$3,000.

On September 18, 1997, and September 23, 1997, disgorgements were received from Murkowski for U.S. Senate and Alaskans for Don Young, respectively. Attachments 1 and 2. In response to counsel for Bush-Quayle '92's request, this Office forwarded a copy of the conciliation agreement, the Record summary of the case, and the disgorgements received from the two respondent recipient committees. We received a letter dated January 6, 1998, from Thomas O. Barnett, counsel for the Committee declining the Commission's disgorgement request. Attachment 3.

Mr. Barnett argues in his letter that the Committee was not a respondent, the Committee is in the process of winding down and closing its books, and because the activities date from 1992, the statute of limitations prohibits the Commission from seeking the requested disgorgement. *Id.* The only applicable statute of limitations, 28 U.S.C. § 2462, does not apply to equitable remedies such as the requested disgorgement. See FEC v. Christian Coalition, 965 F. Supp. 66 (D.D.C. 1997); but see FEC v. Williams, 104 F.3d 237 (9th Cir. 1996), *cert. denied*, 118 S. Ct. 606 (1997). The Commission sought this disgorgement precisely because the resolution of this matter demonstrated a willful contribution reimbursement scheme resulting in illegal money to a



publicly funded presidential campaign. On the other hand, it is true that it is now more than 6 years after the contributions at issue; the amount involved is small; Bush-Quayle '92 is nearly defunct with no other matters still open before the Commission; and, the principal recipient committees (Murkowski for U.S. Senate and Alaskans for Don Young) have complied with the Commission's disgorgement request. The only course left now, as Bush-Quayle '92 was never a respondent, would be to open a new matter and make new findings. Under all of these circumstances, absent objection, this memorandum will be part of the public record of this closed matter, but this Office does not intend to further pursue disgorgement by the Bush-Quayle '92 Primary Committee, Inc.
