III. **BACKGROUND:**

Receipt of Excessive Funds from Non-Federal Account for Shared Activities

The Democratic County Executive Committee of Philadelphia ("the Committee") received excessive transfers-in from the Democratic Campaign Committee of Philadelphia - Non Fed and the Democratic Campaign Committee of Philadelphia - Non Fed. ("the Non-Federal Account") totaling \$138,132 for shared activity disclosed on the 1996 Termination Report covering the period October 23, 1996 through November 25, 1996. The transfers were received by the Committee between October 23, 1996 and November 1, 1996 (Attachment 2).

On February 12, 1997, a Request for Additional Information ("RFAI") was sent to the Committee referencing the Termination Report. The RFAI notified the Committee that its report disclosed \$355,500 in transfers-in received from the Non-Federal Account without disclosing shared federal and non-federal disbursements (Attachment 3).

On March 18, 1997, a Second Notice was sent to the Committee for failure to respond to the RFAI (Attachment 4).

On March 18, 1997, the Commission received an Amended 1996 30 Day Post-General Report from the Committee. The amended report disclosed the entire non-federal portion of shared activity for the Committee to be \$217,368 on Line

21(a)(ii) of the Detailed Summary Page,¹ all of it reported on Schedule H4 for administrative/voter drive activity, occurring between October 23, 1996 and November 21, 1996. Also, there was \$138,132 disclosed in debts owed to the Non-Federal Account for administrative expenses (Attachment 5).

On April 23, 1997, an RFAI was sent to the Committee referencing the debt disclosed to the Non-Federal Account on the Amended 1996 30 Day Post-General Report. The RFAI notified the Committee that 11 CFR §102.5 prohibits a non-federal account from financing activity in connection with federal elections, and requested clarification on whether the debts owed to the Non-Federal Account relate to activity conducted in connection with federal elections (Attachment 6).

On May 9, 1997, the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") analyst spoke with Jim Mathews regarding the debt owed to the Non-Federal Account. He stated that the debt was disclosed to show the Committee's attempt to refund the Non-Federal Account for the excessive transfers made from it to the Committee. Additionally, he stated that the Committee was formed because the Pennsylvania Democratic Committee informed the Committee that they should register with the Commission because the Committee received federal funds from them. However, Mr. Mathews said that the Committee has undertaken no activity to influence federal elections and should not have registered as a federal committee (Attachment 7).

On May 16, 1997, a Second Notice was sent to the Committee for failure to respond to the RFAI (Attachment 8).

On May 19, 1997, the Commission received an Amended 1996 30 Day Post-General Report from the Committee. The Committee stated on the amended report that the, "[D]ebt owed to the non federal account does not relate to the election or defeat of any federal candidate. It simply occurred because we were given misinformation from the "Victory 96" campaign and transferred to (sic) much into the federal account...I assure you every effort is being made to clear up this confusion and pay off this debt." (Attachment 9).

On June 17, 1997, the RAD analyst spoke with Linda Mathews regarding the debt owed to the Non-Federal Account. She stated that the Committee has acquired roughly \$42,000 which it will transfer to the Non-Federal Account on June 18, 1997, and forward to the Commission the copies of the transfer checks.

Furthermore, the Committee wants to pay off this debt quickly so that they may terminate the Committee (Attachment 7).

On June 23, 1997, the Commission received a letter and copy of a \$40,000 transfer check from the Committee to the Non-Federal Account dated June 18, 1997. The Committee stated in the letter that, "...enclosed is a copy of a check from the Federal Account which was deposited in our Non-Federal account as payment on the outstanding debt \$138,132.00 reducing it to \$97,437.00.² As stated in previous correspondence we are making every effort to pay off this debt as soon as possible." (Attachment 10).

² Please note that the remaining balance owed to the Non-Federal Account is \$98,132. The Committee made a \$695 mathematical discrepancy. In addition, the Committee has not disclosed the source of the funds used for the \$40,000 transfer.

-On Schedule BA regarding Line 21(a) of the Detailed Summary Page, you have failed to include the total EVENT YEAR-TO-DATE amount for a payment(s) to all vendors. Please amend your report to include the missing EVENT YEAR-TO-DATE amount(s).

-Line 21(a)(ii) of the Detailed Summary Page of your report declares a total of \$24,532 in the federal share of operating expenditures. The sum of the entries listed on Schedule BA, however, indicates the total to be \$24,620. Please amend your report to clarify the discrepancy.

-Line 21(a)(iii) of the Detailed Summary Page of your report declares a total of \$217,335 in the non-federal share of operating expenditures. The sum of the entries listed on Schedule BA, however, indicates the total to be \$217,420. Please amend your report to clarify the discrepancy.

-Please clarify all expenditures for "water registration" and "get-out-the-vote". In addition, if any of the water registration or get-out-the-vote activities referenced above or future activities, they should be allocated accordingly, unless clearly indicated to the overall activity. If a portion or all of these expenditures were made on behalf of federal candidates, they

should be reported on Schedule B, E, or F for Line 23, 24, or 25 of the Detailed Summary Page, as appropriate.

Schedule D discloses \$138,132.00 in debts owed to the Democratic Campaign Comm. of Phila Non Fed. (pertinent portion(s) attached). You are advised that 11 CFR §102.5 prohibits a non-federal account from financing activity in connection with federal elections. Please clarify whether the debts owed to the non-federal account relate to activity conducted in connection with federal elections and if so, provide the date(s) when the original activity was conducted by the non-federal account. Any payments on debts related to the election or defeat of federal candidates should be allocated accordingly and disclosed as either in-kind contributions on Schedule B supporting Line 23, or as independent expenditures or coordinated expenditures on Schedule E or F supporting Line 24 or 25. 11 CFR §§104.3(b)(3) and 106.1

Although the Commission may initiate legal action regarding the activities conducted by your non-federal account, prompt repayment of the debt and any clarifying information that you provide will be taken into consideration.

Jim Mathews stated that the debt owed to the Non-Federal Account is the result of making excessive transfers from the Non-Federal Account. Furthermore, the debt schedule was disclosed to show that the Committee recognized that it had an obligation to return the money and intends to do so promptly. About the Committee, he stated that it was formed because of a \$22,000 receipt of federal funds from the Pennsylvania Democratic Committee followed by poor advice from them. He stated that the Committee was formed because the Pennsylvania Democratic Committee informed the Committee that they should register with the Commission because the Committee received federal funds from them. However, Mr. Mathews said that the Committee has done no activity to influence federal elections and should not have registered as a federal committee.

CONVERSATION WITH:	Linda Mathews

Linda Mathews stated that to date, no transfers have been made to pay off the debt to the Non-Federal Account; however, the Committee has acquired \$42,000. When asked why no transfers have been made, she said that she was going to just make one large transfer per reporting period until the debt was paid off. When she asked for the analysts advice on this matter, he stated that the Committee should make transfers as it becomes able to, the sooner the better. And that forwarding copies of transfer checks, even before the Committees report is due, would be beneficial to disclose that the Committee is making efforts to pay off the debt. She said that she would make a transfer on the morning of June 18, 1997 and would forward a copy of the transfer check. She also said that the Committee wants to pay off this debt so that it may terminate.

I. GENERATION OF MATTER

The Office of General Counsel received a referral from the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") on July 30, 1997. The basis of the referral is the receipt by the Democratic County Executive Committee of Philadelphia and Norman Loudenslager, as treasurer ("Philadelphia Democrats" or "Committee"), of excessive transfers-in of funds totaling \$138,132 for shared

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federal and non-federal activity from its non-federal account in 1996.¹ The Committee has refunded \$453,000 of these funds back to its non-federal account.

III. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

A. Applicable Law

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"), requires local party organizations to register as political committees if, inter alia, they receive contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 during a calendar year. 2 U.S.C. §§ 431(4)(C) and 433(a). Further, the Act provides that no person or multicandidate political committee ("PAC") shall make contributions to a state or local party committee's federal account in any calendar year which in the aggregate exceed \$5,000, and prohibits the state or local committee from knowingly accepting such contributions. 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a) and (f). See also 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(3). Under Pennsylvania law, individuals and PACs may contribute unlimited amounts to candidates and party committees. However, corporations and labor organizations are prohibited from making contributions for political purposes. See Pa. Stat. Ann. tit. 25, § 3253(a) and tit. 43, § 11011.0701.

A party committee, such as the Philadelphia Democrats, that has established separate federal and non-federal accounts must make all disbursements, contributions, expenditures and transfers in connection with any federal election from its federal account. 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(1)(i). Only funds subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act shall be deposited in the separate federal account. *Id.* No transfers may be made to the federal account

¹ As explained in the analysis, \$75,600 of these funds apparently were used for 100% non-federal activity.

from any other accounts maintained by the committee for the purpose of financing non-federal election activity, except as provided in 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g). *Id.*

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(1)(i), a party committee that has established separate federal and non-federal accounts must pay the entire amount of an allocable expense from its federal account and shall transfer funds from the non-federal account to the federal account solely to cover the non-federal share of that allocable expense. In addition, for each transfer of funds from a committee's non-federal account to its federal account, the committee must itemize in its reports the allocable activities for which the transferred funds are intended to pay, as required by 11 C.F.R. § 104.10(b)(3). 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(A). Moreover, such funds cannot be transferred more than 10 days before or more than 60 days after the payment for which they are designated is made. 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(B). If these requirements are not met, any portion of a transfer from a committee's non-federal account to its federal account shall be presumed to be a loan or contribution to the federal account, in violation of the Act. 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(iii). Since transfers from a non-federal account to a federal account may then be made solely to cover the non-federal share of an allocable expense, transfers to a federal account for the purpose of financing purely non-federal activity are prohibited. See MUR 404B (New York Republican Federal Campaign Committee).

Finally, state and local party committees with separate federal and non-federal accounts must allocate their administrative expenses and costs of generic voter drives between these accounts using the "ballot composition method." 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(d). Administrative expenses are described at 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(a)(2)(i) as "including rent, utilities, office supplies, and salaries, except for such expenses directly attributable to a clearly identified candidate." (Generic

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voter drives are described at 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(a)(2)(iv) as "including voter identification, voter registration, and get-out-the-vote drives, or any other activities that urge the general public to register, vote or support candidates of a particular party or associated with a particular issue, without mentioning a specific candidate."

B. Factual Background

On October 25, 1996, the Philadelphia Democrats registered with the Commission as a party committee affiliated with the Pennsylvania Democratic State Committee. The 1996 30 Day Post-General Report (designated by the Philadelphia Democrats as a Termination Report), covering the period from October 23, 1996 through November 25, 1996, disclosed total receipts of \$377,500, including \$22,000 in transfers-in from an affiliated party committee and a total of \$355,500 in transfers-in from the non-federal account for administrative and generic voter drive costs.² The report showed \$377,500 in total disbursements, including \$301,900 in operating expenditures and \$75,600 in contributions to non-federal political committees. In February and March 1997, RAD notified the Committee that its 1996 30 Day Post-General Report disclosed \$355,500 in transfers-in from its non-federal account without showing any allocated disbursements on Schedule H4. RAD also notified the Committee that a Schedule H1 must be filed showing its ballot composition ratio calculation.

On March 18, 1997, the Commission received an amended 1996 30 Day Post-General Report from the Committee, including a Schedule H1 indicating that 28% of the Committee's

² The Committee disclosed the source of the \$22,000 as "VICTORY 96 - Federal IPA Democratic Coordinated Campaign," located in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. Although Commission records do not list any such entity, the contributions are itemized on the 1996 30 Day Post-General Report of the Pennsylvania Democratic Party, located at the same address.

shared expenses were for federal activity.³ The amended report disclosed the non-federal portion of shared activity to be \$217,368 (72% of operating expenditures of \$301,900), all of it reported on Schedule H4 as administrative/voter drive activity occurring between October 23, 1996 and November 21, 1996. Also, the Committee disclosed a \$138,132 debt owed to the non-federal account for "Administrative Expenses."

On April 23, 1997, RAD notified the Committee that 11 C.F.R. § 102.5 prohibits a non-federal account from financing activity in connection with federal elections, and requested clarification on whether the \$138,132 debt owed to the non-federal account related to such activity. On May 9, the RAD analyst telephoned the Committee's contact person, Jim Mathews, who stated that the debt was disclosed to show the Committee's attempt to reimburse the non-federal account for excessive transfers from it to the Committee. Mr. Mathews also explained that the Philadelphia Democrats registered as a political committee because the Pennsylvania Democratic State Committee informed them that they needed to file with the Commission as a result of receiving federal funds from the state committee. However, Mr. Mathews stated that the Philadelphia Democrats had undertaken no activity to influence federal elections and, therefore, should not have registered as a federal committee.

On May 19, 1997, the Commission received another amended 1996 30 Day Post-General Report from the Committee. An attached letter stated that the "[d]ebt owed to the non-federal

³³ The ballot composition information in the Schedule H1 shows 2 Federal points out of 7 total points, which, if calculated to the nearest one-hundredth, would be 28.57 (federal) and 71.43 (non-federal). The Commission will permit committees, in all cases in which a ratio does not result in a whole number, to round to the nearest whole number. Advisory Opinion 1991-6, fn. 3. However, instead of choosing to round to 29% for the Federal share, the Committee has rounded down to 28%, which slightly inflates the non-federal share to the benefit of the Committee. Because the variation is of such a small magnitude, this Office will adhere to the 28%/72% allocation figures attributed by the Committee.

account does not relate to the election or defeat of any federal candidate. It simply occurred because we were given misinformation from the 'Victory 96' campaign and transferred to [sic] much into the federal account. . . . I assure you every effort is being made to clear up this confusion and pay off this debt." On June 17, the RAD analyst spoke with Linda Matthews regarding the debt owed to the non-federal account. She stated that the Committee had acquired roughly \$42,000 which it would transfer to the non-federal account. She attested that the Committee wanted to pay off the debt quickly so that it could be terminated. On June 23, 1997, the Commission received a copy of a \$40,000 check from the Committee to the non-federal account. On August 4, the Committee submitted a copy of a check written out to the non-federal account in the amount of \$3,000 "towards payment of the debt." The Committee's 1997 Mid-Year Report, covering the period from January 1, 1997 through June 30, 1997, discloses the \$40,000 transfer to the non-federal account. The report also discloses debts of \$48,132, all to the non-federal account, and cash-on-hand of \$3,306.50.

C. Analysis

Contrary to the assertion of the Philadelphia Democrats that they should not have registered with the Commission, they qualified as a political committee as early as October 25, 1996, the date they did in fact register, when they received \$10,000 from an affiliated party committee. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.6(a)(2), such transfers shall count against the reporting thresholds of the Act. Since the transfer exceeded \$5,000, political committee status was triggered. See 11 C.F.R. § 100.5(c).

The activity at issue in this matter appears to be limited to a one-month period. The Committee initially transferred \$500 to the federal account from the non-federal account on

October 23, 1996, designated on the Committee's Schedule H3 as administrative and voter drive expenses.⁴ The Committee's first expenditure was for joint activity in the amount of \$106 on the same date, itemized as a "Bank Charge."⁵ Between October 25 and October 29, 1996, the Committee received transfers-in of funds permissible under the Act totaling \$20,000 from an affiliated committee. On October 31 and November 1, 1996, the Committee received transfers-in totaling \$355,000 from the non-federal account to cover administrative and voter drive activities. At this point, the Committee's federal account contained a total of \$375,394, with all but \$20,000 of that amount comprising of non-federal funds. On November 1, 1996, the Committee made expenditures totaling \$298,219 for allocable activity, which it later described as "Food & Beverages, Transportation, Volunteers, Generic GOTV."⁶ Since all of the non-federal transfers-in occurred within 10 days prior to this date, they were available for the Committee to use for the non-federal share of this allocable activity pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(B). However, the Committee could pay no more than 72%, or \$214,718, of this amount with non-federal funds; the remaining 28%, or \$83,501, should have been paid for with funds permissible under the Act. Because the federal account contained only \$20,000 in such funds, the remaining portion, or \$63,501, was paid for with impermissible non-federal funds.

At this juncture, the balance in the federal account was \$77,175, consisting only of non-federal funds. At that time, on November 1, the Committee made disbursements of \$75,600

⁴ All amounts are rounded off to the nearest dollar.

⁵ This transaction occurred before the Committee achieved "political committee" status under the Act. Because the Committee could have conceivably demonstrated that the funds came from permissible sources, see 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(b)(1)(ii), this Office has not presumed that the federal portion of the expenditure (28% of \$106, or \$30) constituted an improper disbursement.

⁶ Multiple transactions occurred on November 1, 1996, such that the exact timing of the transactions may not accord with the chronology as presented here.

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from its federal account, apparently for 100% non-federal expenses. The funds were disbursed among non-federal candidates (city council and state senate) and sub-local party wards. Because these disbursements do not appear to constitute allocable expenses, this portion of the transfers-in from the non-federal to the federal account was an impermissible transfer of funds.

The above transactions reduced the balance of the Committee's federal account to \$1,575, all non-federal funds. On November 6, 1996, the Committee received a \$2,000 transfer-in from an affiliated committee of funds permissible under the Act, raising the balance to \$3,575. The next transaction appears to have been a disbursement of \$3,574 for joint activity on November 21, 1996. However, since the non-federal funds in the federal account had been transferred to the account on November 1, they did not comply with the 10 day time limit established at 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(B). Accordingly, the \$1,575 non-federal transfer-in was not available to the Committee to cover the non-federal portion of the joint activity, and thus it constituted an improper transfer from the non-federal to the federal account.

In summary, the Committee made a total of \$140,676 in improper disbursements or transfers-in, consisting of \$63,501 in impermissible disbursements and \$1,575 in impermissible transfers-in for shared activity, and \$75,600 in transfers from the non-federal account to the federal account for 100% non-federal expenses.⁷ Accordingly, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) and 11 C.F.R. §§ 102.5(a)(1)(i) and 106.5(g)(1)(i).⁸ This Office further recommends that the

⁷ The discrepancy between the total amount arrived at by this Office and RAD's figure of \$138,132 appears to result mainly from RAD's apparent assumption that the Committee's November 21, 1996 expenditure for \$3,574 was properly allocated expense.

⁸ This Office makes no recommendations as to violations of 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) because, as mentioned, Pennsylvania law prohibits corporate and labor contributions for political purposes.

Commission enter into conciliation with the Committee prior to a finding of probable cause to believe.

3. Enter into preprobable cause conciliation with the Democratic County Executive Committee of Philadelphia and Norman Loudenslager, as treasurer.

Dear Mr. Loudenslager:

On December 31, 1997, the Federal Election Commission found that there is reason to believe the Democratic County Executive Committee of Philadelphia and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), and 11 C.F.R. §§ 102.5(a)(1)(i) and 106.5(g)(1)(i) of the Commission's regulations. The Factual and Legal Analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's findings, is attached for your information.

You may submit any factual or legal materials that you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit such materials to the General Counsel's Office within 15 days of your receipt of this letter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath. In the absence of additional information, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

In order to expedite the resolution of this matter, the Commission has also decided to offer to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a conciliation agreement in settlement of this matter prior to a finding of probable cause to believe. Enclosed is a conciliation agreement that the Commission has approved.

If you are interested in expediting the resolution of this matter by pursuing preprobable cause conciliation, and if you agree with the provisions of the enclosed agreement, please sign and return the agreement, along with the civil penalty, to the Commission. In light of the fact that conciliation negotiations, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, are limited to a maximum of 30 days, you should respond to this notification as soon as possible.

Requests for extensions of time will not be routinely granted. Requests must be made in writing at least five days prior to the due date of the response and specific good cause must be demonstrated. In addition, the Office of the General Counsel ordinarily will not give extensions beyond 20 days.

If you intend to be represented by counsel in this matter, please advise the Commission by completing the enclosed form stating the name, address, and telephone number of such counsel, and authorizing such counsel to receive any notifications and other communications from the Commission.

This matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U.S.C. §§ 437g(a)(4)(B) and 437g(a)(12)(A), unless you notify the Commission in writing that you wish the investigation to be made public.

For your information, we have attached a brief description of the Commission's procedures for handling possible violations of the Act. If you have any questions, please contact Thomas J. Andersen, the attorney assigned to this matter, at (202) 219-3690.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

MUR 4709

I. GENERATION OF MATTER

This matter was generated based on information ascertained by the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. See 2 U.S.C. § 467(g)(2).

II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

A. Applicable Law

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"), requires local party organizations to register as political committees if, inter alia, they receive contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 during a calendar year. 2 U.S.C. §§ 431(4)(C) and 433(a). Further, the Act provides that no person or multicandidate political committee ("PAC") shall make contributions to a state or local party committee's federal account in any calendar year which in the aggregate exceed \$5,000, and prohibits the state or local committee from knowingly accepting such contributions. 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a) and (f). See also 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(3). Under Pennsylvania law, individuals and IPACs may contribute unlimited amounts to candidates and party committees. However, corporations and labor organizations are prohibited from making contributions for political purposes. See Pa. Stat. Ann. tit. 25, § 3253(a) and tit. 43, § 1101.1701.

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A party committee, such as the Democratic County Executive Committee of Philadelphia and Norman Loudenslager, as treasurer ("Philadelphia Democrats" or "Committee"), that has established separate federal and non-federal accounts must make all disbursements, contributions, expenditures and transfers in connection with any federal election from its federal account. 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(1)(i). Only funds subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act shall be deposited in the separate federal account. *Id.* No transfers may be made to the federal account from any other accounts maintained by the committee for the purpose of financing non-federal election activity, except as provided in 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g). *Id.*

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(1)(i), a party committee that has established separate federal and non-federal accounts must pay the entire amount of an allocable expense from its federal account and shall transfer funds from the non-federal account to the federal account solely to cover the non-federal share of that allocable expense. In addition, for each transfer of funds from a committee's non-federal account to its federal account, the committee must itemize in its reports the allocable activities for which the transferred funds are intended to pay, as required by 11 C.F.R. § 104.10(b)(3). 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(A). Moreover, such funds cannot be transferred more than 10 days before or more than 60 days after the payment for which they are designated is made. 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(B). If these requirements are not met, any portion of a transfer from a committee's non-federal account to its federal account shall be presumed to be a loan or contribution to the federal account, in violation of the Act. 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(iii). Since transfers from a non-federal account to a federal account may be made solely to cover the non-federal share of an *allocable* expense, transfers to a federal account for

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the purpose of financing purely non-federal activity are prohibited. See MUR 4413 (New York Republican Federal Campaign Committee).

Finally, state and local party committees with separate federal and non-federal accounts must allocate their administrative expenses and costs of generic voter drives between those accounts using the "ballot composition method." 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(d). Administrative expenses are described at 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(a)(2)(i) as "including rent, utilities, office supplies, and salaries, except for such expenses directly attributable to a clearly identified candidate." Generic voter drives are described at 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(a)(2)(iv) as "including voter identification, voter registration, and get-out-the-vote drives, or any other activities that urge the general public to register, vote or support candidates of a particular party or associated with a particular issue, without mentioning a specific candidate."

B. Factual Background

On October 25, 1996, the Philadelphia Democrats registered with the Commission as a party committee affiliated with the Pennsylvania Democratic State Committee. The 1996 30 Day Post-General Report (designated by the Philadelphia Democrats as a Termination Report), covering the period from October 23, 1996 through November 25, 1996, disclosed total receipts of \$377,500, including \$22,000 in transfers-in from an affiliated party committee and a total of \$355,500 in transfers-in from the non-federal account for administrative and generic voter drive costs. The report showed \$377,500 in total disbursements, including \$301,900 in operating expenditures and \$75,600 in contributions to non-federal political committees. In February and March 1997, the Committee was notified that its 1996 30 Day Post-General Report disclosed \$355,500 in transfers-in from its non-federal account without showing any allocated

disbursements on Schedule H4. The Committee was also notified that a Schedule H1 must be filed showing its ballot composition ratio calculation.

On March 18, 1997, the Commission received an amended 1996 30 Day Post-General Report from the Committee, including a Schedule H1 indicating that 28% of the Committee's shared expenses were for federal activity. The amended report disclosed the non-federal portion of shared activity to be \$217,368 (72% of operating expenditures of \$301,900), all of it reported on Schedule H4 as administrative/voter drive activity occurring between October 23, 1996 and November 21, 1996. Also, the Committee disclosed a \$138,132 debt owed to the non-federal account for "Administrative Expenses."

On May 9, 1997, the Committee's contact person informed the Commission that the Philadelphia Democrats registered as a political committee because the Pennsylvania Democratic State Committee informed them that they needed to file with the Commission as a result of receiving federal funds from the state committee. He stated, however, that the Philadelphia Democrats had undertaken no activity to influence federal elections and, therefore, should not have registered as a federal committee.

On May 19, 1997, the Commission received another amended 1996 30 Day Post-General Report from the Committee. An attached letter stated that the "[d]ebt owed to the non-federal account does not relate to the election or defeat of any federal candidate. It simply occurred because we were given misinformation from the 'Wootsy '96' campaign and transferred to [sic] much into the federal account. I assure you every effort is being made to clear up this confusion and pay off this debt." On June 23, 1997, the Commission received a copy of a \$40,000 check from the Committee to the non-federal account. On August 4, the Committee

submitted a copy of a check written out to the non-federal account in the amount of \$3,000 "towards payment of the debt." The Committee's 1997 Mid-Year Report, covering the period from January 1, 1997 through June 30, 1997, discloses the \$40,000 transfer to the non-federal account.

C. Analysis

The Philadelphia Democrats qualified as a political committee as early as October 25, 1996, the date they did in fact register, when they received \$10,000 from an affiliated party committee. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.6(a)(2), such transfers shall count against the reporting thresholds of the Act. Since the transfer exceeded \$5,000, political committee status was triggered. See 11 C.F.R. § 100.5(c).

The Committee initially transferred \$500 to the federal account from the non-federal account on October 23, 1996, designated on the Committee's Schedule H3 as administrative and voter drive expenses. The Committee's first expenditure was for joint activity in the amount of \$106 on the same date, itemized as a "Bank Charge."¹

Between October 25 and October 29, 1996, the Committee received transfers-in of funds permissible under the Act totaling \$20,000 from an affiliated committee. On October 31 and November 1, 1996, the Committee received transfers-in totaling \$355,000 from the non-federal account to cover administrative and voter drive activities. At this point, the Committee's federal account contained a total of \$375,394, with all but \$20,000 of that amount comprising of non-federal funds. On November 1, 1996, the Committee made expenditures totaling \$298,219 for allocable activity, which it later described as "Food & Beverages, Transportation, Volunteers,

Generic GOTV.² Since all of the non-federal transfers-in occurred within 10 days prior to this date, they were available for the Committee to use for the non-federal share of this allocable activity pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(B). However, the Committee could pay no more than 72%, or \$214,718, of this amount with non-federal funds; the remaining 28%, or \$83,501, should have been paid for with funds permissible under the Act. Because the federal account contained only \$20,000 in such funds, the remaining portion, or \$63,501, was paid for with impermissible non-federal funds.

At this juncture, the balance in the federal account was \$77,175, consisting only of non-federal funds. At that time, on November 1, the Committee made disbursements of \$75,600 from its federal account, apparently for 100% non-federal expenses. The funds were disbursed among non-federal candidates (city council and state senate) and sub-local party wards. Because these disbursements do not appear to constitute allocable expenses, this portion of the transfers-in from the non-federal to the federal account was an impermissible transfer of funds.

The above transactions reduced the balance of the Committee's federal account to \$1,575, all non-federal funds. On November 6, 1996, the Committee received a \$2,000 transfer-in from an affiliated committee of funds permissible under the Act, raising the balance to \$3,575. The next transaction appears to have been a disbursement of \$3,574 for joint activity on November 21, 1996. However, since the non-federal funds in the federal account had been transferred to the account on November 1, they did not comply with the 10 day time limit established at 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(B). Accordingly, the \$1,575 non-federal transfer-in

² Multiple transactions occurred on November 1, 1996, such that the exact timing of the transactions may not accord with the chronology as presented here.

was not available to the Committee to cover the non-federal portion of the joint activity, and thus it constituted an improper transfer from the non-federal to the federal account.

In summary, the Committee made a total of \$140,676 in improper disbursements or transfers-in, consisting of \$63,501 in impermissible disbursements and \$1,575 in impermissible transfers-in for shared activity, and \$75,600 in transfers from the non-federal account to the federal account for 100% non-federal expenses. Therefore, there is reason to believe that the Democratic County Executive Committee of Philadelphia and Norman Loudenslager, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) and 11 C.F.R. §§ 102.5(a)(1)(i) and 106.5(g)(1)(i).



RESPONDENT'S BRIEF

Respondents, Democratic Executive Committee of Philadelphia and Norman Loudenslager as Treasurer, (Committee), by their undersigned counsel hereby files the following brief concerning this matter under review by the Federal Election Commission (Commission). This brief has been verified by the Committee's Administrative Assistant, Miss Linda Mathews.

I. RESPONDENTS' PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

Respondents welcome the opportunity to resolve this matter through conciliation with the Commission. Further, Respondents acknowledge certain unintentional acts which violated the Commission's regulations concerning disbursement of campaign funds in 1986 and agree to enter into a reasonable conciliation negotiations.

II. COUNTER-STATEMENT OF THE FACTS

At the end of the 1996 election, the Committee received contributions from "Victory 96," which was then the campaign arm of the Pennsylvania Democratic State Committee. Upon receipt of the initial contribution the Committee registered with the Commission. The Committee received two (2) \$10,000.00 contributions from Victory 96' during its first reporting period.¹ The Committee's Administrative Assistant, Miss Linda Mathews, attempted to carefully comply with Victory 96's bare-bones written instructions. Further, Miss Mathews requested further instructions from Victory 96's comptroller, Mr. Jeff DiSantis. Pursuant to discussions with Mr. DiSantis, all disbursements for both federal and non-federal activities for the 1996 election were made through the Committee's federal account. Moreover, the Committee arranged for the printing of ballots in the manner requested by Victory 96'.

After the election, Mr. DiSantis as well as Mr. David Katz, the director of Victory 96', were no longer associated with the Democratic State Committee. This Democratic State Committee no longer maintained staff personnel after the conclusion of the election. This left Miss Mathews with no contact at the state committee and she had never received any training with regard to compliance with federal election law. Miss Mathews did not sense that there was any problem and did not seek guidance from the treasurer or from the Committee's legal counsel.

Thereafter Miss Mathews filed a "termination report" because the Committee was no longer receiving federal money and it was not anticipated that the Committee would be receiving such funds in the future. Through a Commission analyst Miss Mathews first learned of the penology of reporting and other obligations under the Federal Election Campaign Financing Act of 1971, 2 U.S.C. Section 431, et. seq. The Commission's record clearly indicates that Miss Mathews and Mr. Loudenslager, the Committee's

¹ In the next reporting period the Committee received a final \$2,000 contribution from Victory 96'.

Treasurer, attempted to come into compliance through filing amended reports and letters of explanation. However, it is now apparent that certain violations of the Commission's regulations did in fact occur regarding the disbursements made in the 1996 election.

III. RESPONDENTS' LEGAL ANALYSIS

It is clear that Miss Mathews did not understand the appropriate law and regulations with regard to making campaign disbursements. For example, the expenses for federal and non-federal activities were not allocated pursuant to the "ballot composition method".² This resulted in inappropriate proportional payments for election day expenses and the resultant debt.³

However, Respondents do not agree with the General Council's analysis concerning this conclusion that "The Committee made disbursements of \$75,600.00 from its federal account, apparently for 100% non-federal expenses. The funds were disbursed among non-federal candidates (city council and state senate) and sub-local party wards." See Commission's Factual and Legal Analysis at p. 6. On the contrary, all of the funds were spent for federal and non-federal joint activities. These funds were merely paid to other political committees and/or local party officials in the manner requested by the recipients of the funds. This had been the customary practice to distribute election day expenses to local party leaders and is lawful under Pennsylvania law. This practice will be immediately stopped at the direction of the Chairman. However, all of these funds were paid to persons for lawful purposes for both federal and non-federal offices to be filled in the 1996 election.

²The allocation was not made until after inquiry by the Commission's analyst. Therefore a Schedule "H" was immediately filed with the Commission.

³Currently the Committee is making every effort to pay off the debt. The balance of the debt has been substantially reduced. Since the funds to retire the balance of the debt may come from either federal or non-federal sources, the Committee should be able to raise enough money to cover the balance of the debt. However, it would be very difficult for the Committee to pay this sum outside of its ordinary fund-raising cycle.

Nothing in the Administrative Record indicates that the Committee intentionally violated the law and/or the Commission's regulations in making disturbances for the 1996 election. On the contrary, this record indicates that the violations resulted from innocent mistake or lack of knowledge of the law and regulations. All of this negates any finding of intent to violate.

IV. PROPOSED CONCILIATION

CONCLUSION

For the reasons herein set forth the Respondents, Democratic Executive Committee of Philadelphia County and Norman Loudenslager, as Treasurer, requests the Commission to enter into a reasonable conciliation agreement on terms which are just and fair under the facts and circumstances of this matter under review.

On April 30, 1998, the Federal Election Commission accepted the signed conciliation agreement and civil penalty submitted on your clients' behalf in settlement of violations of 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and 11 C.F.R. §§ 102.5(a)(1)(i) and 106.5(g)(1)(i). Accordingly, the file has been closed in this matter.

The confidentiality provisions at 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(12) no longer apply and this matter is now public. In addition, although the complete file must be placed on the public record within 30 days, this could occur at any time following certification of the Commission's vote. If you wish to submit any factual or legal materials to appear on the public record, please do so as soon as possible. While the file may be placed on the public record before receiving your additional materials, any permissible submissions will be added to the public record upon receipt.

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission ("Commission") pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities.

The Commission found reason to believe the Democratic County Executive Committee of Philadelphia and Norman Loudenslager, as treasurer ("Respondents"), violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) and 11 C.F.R. §§ 102.5(a)(1)(i) and 106.5(g)(1)(i).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondents, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over Respondents and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(A)(i).

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. The Democratic County Executive Committee of Philadelphia is a political committee within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. § 431(4).

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2. Norman Loudenstayer is the treasurer of the Democratic County Executive Committee of Philadelphia.

3. The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"), requires local party organizations to register as political committees if, inter alia, they receive contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 during a calendar year. 2 U.S.C. §§ 431(4)(C) and 433(a). Respondents qualified as a political committee on October 25, 1996, the date they did in fact register, when they received \$10,000 from an affiliated party committee. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.6(a)(2), such transfers shall count against the reporting thresholds of the Act. Since the transfer exceeded \$5,000, political committee status was triggered. See 11 C.F.R. § 100.5(c).

4. The Act provides that no person or multicandidate political committee ("PAC") shall make contributions to a state or local party committee's federal account in any calendar year which in the aggregate exceed \$5,000, and prohibits the state or local committee from knowingly accepting such contributions. 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a) and (f). See also 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(3).

5. Under Pennsylvania law, individuals and PACs may contribute unlimited amounts to candidates and party committees. However, corporations and labor organizations are prohibited from making contributions for political purposes. See Pa. Stat. Ann. tit. 25, § 3253(a) and tit. 43, § 1101.1701.

6. A party committee, such as Respondents, that has established separate federal and non-federal accounts must make all disbursements, contributions, expenditures and

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transfers in connection with any federal election from its federal account. 11 C.F.R.

§ 102.5(a)(1)(i). Only funds subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act shall be deposited in the separate federal account. *Id.* No transfers may be made to the federal account from any other accounts maintained by the committee for the purpose of financing non-federal election activity, except as provided in 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g). *Id.*

7. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(1)(i), a party committee that has established separate federal and non-federal accounts must pay the entire amount of an allocable expense from its federal account and shall transfer funds from the non-federal account to the federal account solely to cover the non-federal share of that allocable expense. In addition, for each transfer of funds from a committee's non-federal account to its federal account, the committee must itemize in its reports the allocable activities for which the transferred funds are intended to pay, as required by 11 C.F.R. § 104.10(b)(3). 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(A). Moreover, such funds cannot be transferred more than 10 days before or more than 60 days after the payment for which they are designated is made. 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(B).

8. If the above requirements are not met, any portion of a transfer from a committee's non-federal account to its federal account shall be presumed to be a loan or contribution to the federal account, in violation of the Act. 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(iii). Since transfers from a non-federal account to a federal account may be made solely to cover the non-federal share of an *allocable* expense, transfers to a federal account for the purpose of financing purely non-federal activity are prohibited.

9. State and local party committees with separate federal and non-federal accounts must allocate their administrative expenses and costs of generic voter drives between

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those accounts using the "ballot composition method." 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(d). Administrative expenses are described at 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(a)(2)(i) as "including rent, utilities, office supplies, and salaries, except for such expenses directly attributable to a clearly identified candidate."

Generic voter drives are described at 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(a)(2)(iv) as "including voter identification, voter registration, and get-out-the-vote drives, or any other activities that urge the general public to register, vote or support candidates of a particular party or associated with a particular issue, without mentioning a specific candidate."

10. Respondents' 1996 30 Day Post-General Report (designated as a Termination Report), covering the period from October 23, 1996 through November 25, 1996, disclosed total receipts of \$377,500, including \$22,000 in transfers-in from an affiliated party committee and a total of \$355,500 in transfers-in from the non-federal account for administrative and generic voter drive costs. The report showed \$377,500 in total disbursements, including \$301,900 in operating expenditures and \$75,600 in contributions to non-federal political committees.

11. On March 18, 1997, the Commission received an amended 1996 30 Day Post-General Report from Respondents, including a Schedule H1 indicating that 28% of Respondents' shared expenses were for federal activity. The amended report disclosed the non-federal portion of shared activity to be \$217,368 (72% of operating expenditures of \$301,900), all of it reported on Schedule H4 as administrative/voter drive activity occurring between October 23, 1996 and November 21, 1996. Also, the Committee disclosed a \$138,152 debt owed to the non-federal account for "Administrative Expenses."

12. Respondents initially transferred \$5100 to the federal account from the non-federal account on October 23, 1996, designated on the Committee's Schedule H3 as administrative and voter drive expenses. Respondents' first expenditure was for joint activity in the amount of \$106 on the same date, itemized as a "Bank Charge."

13. Between October 25 and October 29, 1996, Respondents received transfers-in of funds permissible under the Act totaling \$20,000 from an affiliated committee. On October 31 and November 1, 1996, Respondents received transfers-in totaling \$355,000 from the non-federal account to cover administrative and voter drive activities. At this point, Respondents' federal account contained a total of \$375,394, with all but \$20,000 of that amount comprising of non-federal funds.

14. On November 1, 1996, Respondents made expenditures totaling \$298,219 for allocable activity, which they later described as "Food & Beverages, Transportation, Volunteers, Generic GOTV." Since all of the non-federal transfers-in occurred within 10 days prior to this date, they were available for Respondents to use for the non-federal share of this allocable activity pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(B). However, Respondents could pay no more than 72%, or \$214,718, of this amount with non-federal funds; the remaining 28%, or \$83,501, should have been paid for with funds permissible under the Act. Because the federal account contained only \$20,000 in such funds, the remaining portion, or \$63,501, was paid for with non-federal funds.

15. Following the above transactions, the balance in the federal account was \$77,175, consisting only of non-federal funds. At that time, on November 1, Respondents made disbursements of \$75,600 from the federal account for 100% non-federal expenses. The funds

were disbursed among non-federal candidates (city council and state senate) and sub-local party wards. Because these disbursements did not constitute allocable expenses, this portion of the transfers-in from the non-federal to the federal account was an impermissible transfer of funds.

16. The above transactions reduced the balance of Respondents' federal account to \$1,575, all non-federal funds. On November 6, 1996, Respondents' received a \$2,000 transfer-in from an affiliated committee of funds permissible under the Act, raising the balance to \$3,575. The next transaction was a disbursement of \$3,574 for joint activity on November 21, 1996. However, since the non-federal funds in the federal account had been transferred to the account on November 1, they did not comply with the 10 day time limit established at 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(B). Accordingly, these non-federal transfers-in were not available to Respondents to cover the non-federal portion of the joint activity.

17. In summary, Respondents made a total of \$140,676 in improper disbursements or transfers-in, consisting of \$63,501 in impermissible disbursements and \$1,575 in impermissible transfers-in for shared activity, and \$75,600 in transfers from the non-federal account to the federal account for 100% non-federal expenses.

18. On June 23, 1997, the Commission received a copy of a \$40,000 refund check from Respondents to the non-federal account. Respondents' 1997 Mid-Year Report, covering the period from January 1, 1997 through June 30, 1997, discloses the \$40,000 transfer to the non-federal account. On August 4, 1997, Respondents submitted a copy of a check written out to the non-federal account in the amount of \$3,000 "towards payment of the debt." Respondents' 1997 Year End Report, covering the period from July 1, 1997 through December 31, 1997, discloses the \$3,000 transfer to the non-federal account, as well as another

\$12,200 transfer to the non-federal account in partial payment of the debt. Because Respondents have refunded \$55,200 from the federal account to the non-federal account, a total of \$9,876 (\$65,076 - \$55,200) impermissibly used for shared activity remains unrefunded.

19. Respondents contend that the violations in this matter were not knowing and willful.

V. In 1996, Respondents paid for the federal portion of allocable expenditures with \$63,501 in non-federal funds, transferred \$1,575 in non-federal funds for shared activity to their federal account outside of the time period established at 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(g)(2)(ii)(B), and transferred \$75,600 in non-federal funds to their federal account to pay for 100% non-federal activity, in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f) and 11 C.F.R. §§ 102.5(a)(1)(i) and 106.5(g)(1)(i).

VI. 1. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Federal Election Commission in the amount of twenty-four thousand dollars (\$24,000), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A), such penalty to be paid as follows:

- a. One initial payment of \$6,000 to be submitted with this signed agreement;
- b. Six additional payments of \$3,000 each; with each subsequent payment due on the first day of each succeeding month thereafter.

2. Respondents will refund \$9,876 from the federal account to the non-federal account impermissibly used for allocable activity, such payments to be paid as follows:

- a. One initial payment of \$1,876 to be transferred at the time of this signed agreement;
- b. Four additional payments of \$2,000 each; with each subsequent payment due on the first day of each succeeding month thereafter.

3. Respondents will provide evidence of each transferred payment.

4. In the event that any installment payment is not received by the Commission by the fifth day of the month in which it becomes due, the Commission may, at its discretion, accelerate the remaining payments and cause the entire amount to become due upon ten days written notice to the respondents. Failure by the Commission to accelerate the payments with regard to any overdue installment shall not be construed as a waiver of its right to do so with regard to future overdue installments.

VII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

VIII. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

IX. Respondents shall have no more than 30 days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

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X. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, either written or oral, made by either party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be enforceable.
