Dear General Counsel;

There is a contested primary in my congressional district at this time (12th district of NJ). I recently received two pieces of US mail that I found disturbing. They appeared to come from "third parties". The first letter is from a Brian M. Nelson of Plainsboro NJ and the second letter is from a Patricia Reilly who did not include a return address. I do not know either of these people. Both these letters call Mike Pappas a "negative campaigner" and advocate a vote for Dick Zimmer, Pappas's opponent in the 12th district Republican congressional primary. They are very similar in both style and substance but neither of these letters say that they are from or financed by the Dick Zimmer for Congress campaign. Further, both envelopes are addressed in an identical fashion to:



Both letters have "berry" series (i.e. blueberries, raspberries, strawberries, etc...) stamps. The Post Office tells me that these stamps are only available as a mixed sheet (some of each kind of berry). It seems a little unusual to receive two similar letters, with the same style of address, with the same odd series of stamp, with the same postmark (Trenton, NJ) postmarked just one day apart. It would be odd indeed, unless of course, these letters were sent by the same organization.

I have also received a letter from Dick Zimmer's campaign that says "paid for by ZIMMER 2000, INC" at the bottom. This letter's envelope also has a "berry" series stamp, and was also postmarked in Trenton, NJ. I have included Xerox copies of all three letters and their envelopes.

Another odd thing is, that all three letters seem to have been printed on the same printer. There is a "shadow" of the printed text at the bottom of all three letters - they look like the work of the same machine. These letters have gone out all over the county and have disturbed a number of my friends; they are also a concern to me. Doesn't the Zimmer campaign have to identify itself on all these letters if in fact they had a hand in sending them out? Isn't Zimmer breaking the law? I would like you to look into this matter.



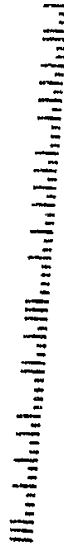
