Dear Mr. Jordan,

This letter is to respond to your letter stating that Mr. George C. Taylor made a formal complaint to the Federal Election Commission about his potential exclusion from the congressional debates sponsored by the League of Women Voters of South Carolina and aired by South Carolina Educational Television. Mr. Taylor has subsequently withdrawn his complaint in a letter to the Federal Election Commission dated September 15, 2000. I have enclosed a copy of his letter.

Mr. Taylor made his original complaint based on the criteria the League used for participation in debates held for the candidates for South Carolina Constitutional offices in 1998. This criteria was not used for 2000 congressional debates.


I have enclosed a copy of the League of Women Voters' 2000 congressional debate criteria. The criteria was solely created by the League of Women Voters of South Carolina based on our understanding of FEC regulations.

As one of the candidates who filed for South Carolina's 2<sup>nd</sup> congressional district race, Mr. Taylor was invited to participate in the debate and show proof that he met the enclosed criteria. A League Criteria Committee reviewed information supplied to the League by Mr. Taylor and concluded that Mr. Taylor met the criteria. He will be participating in the 2<sup>nd</sup> district congressional debate to be aired on October 23, 2000.

We believe we have complied with the Federal Election Commission's regulations.

**CRITERIA FOR CONGRESSIONAL DEBATES  
LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS OF SOUTH CAROLINA  
FALL 2000**

To be eligible for inclusion in a debate, the candidate must have:

- 1) Ballot Access - The candidate must meet all South Carolina election law requirements to be on the ballot.
- 2) A formal campaign - The candidate must present evidence that a formal campaign is being waged, e.g. presence of headquarters, campaign volunteers, issuance of position papers, campaign appearances, media coverage.
- 3) Financial Support - Evidence of support through the receipt of contributions from a significant number of contributors.

A congressional candidate wishing to be included in a LWVSC candidate debate must supply the League with evidence that all criteria have been met. Final determination of eligibility to participate will be made by a League Steering committee and must be received by the time specified in the invitation letter.

Status as a nominee of a particular party does not automatically make a candidate eligible for debate participation.

There will be no substitutes or stand-ins for the candidates and no "empty chair" debates. At least one major party candidate must be participating.
