On June 7, 2005, the Federal Election Commission reviewed the allegations in your complaint dated September 23, 2004, and found that on the basis of the information provided in your complaint and on other publicly available information, there is no reason to believe that Kerry-Edwards, 2004, Inc., and Robert Farmer in his official capacity as treasurer, and CBS Broadcasting, Inc., violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). Accordingly, on June 8, 2005, the Commission closed the file in this matter.


