



SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

On August 10, 1978, the Office of General Counsel received a notarized complaint from Clarence Kadys, a Democratic candidate for Congress from New York's 33rd District, alleging that 1) Roy Bernardi, also a Democratic Congressional candidate from the 33rd District has no principal campaign committee and 2) the Onondaga County Democratic Committee is serving as Bernardi's campaign committee because it allegedly paid people to petition for Bernardi. (see Attachments).

ANALYSIS

Mr. Kadys based his complaint on his conclusion that Mr. Bernardi does not have a campaign committee. In fact, Bernardi has a principal campaign committee, the Bernardi for Congress Committee, I.D. number C00097295, which registered with the Commission on, and has been reporting receipts and expenditures since June 12, 1978.

While the July 10 report of the Bernardi Committee does not list any expenses for a petition drive, the drive was not completed until July 27, 1978. If the Bernardi for Congress Committee expended funds for the petition drive, these expenditures would not appear on the Committee's reports until the ten day pre-primary election report due September 2, 1978.

2 U.S.C. §441a(d)(1) provides that "... a State committee of a political party including any subordinate committee of a State committee, may make expenditures in connection with the general election campaign of candidates for Federal office..." If the County Committee did make the expenditures for primary candidate Bernardi as Kadys has charged, the County Committee may be in violation of 2 U.S.C. §441a(d)(1). However, in the news article supplied by Kadys, County Committee Secretary, Richard A. Romeo, reportedly denies that his Committee paid for the petitioning. Kadys' other argument that the Committee funded the petitioning is not persuasive. The fact that the County Committee sent a circular to its people listing a slate of approved candidates, among them Bernardi, does not show the Committee paid for petitioning for Bernardi.

Given the existence of the Bernardi for Congress Committee, and the absence of any evidence of the County Committee's payment for Bernardi's petitioners, we think there is no reason to believe a violation has occurred.

RECOMMENDATION

We recommend the Commission find no reason to believe violations occurred, close the file, and send the attached letters.

Dear Sir:

In light of the recent news article attached herewith, and a search of the Onondaga County Records for assumed names, Independent Committees, and newly formed businesses, we charge that there is no Independent Committee established by or for Mr. Roy Bernardi.

In light of this, there cannot be an Independent source legally paying the petition gatherers for Mr. Bernardi. With this in mind, in the statement by Mr. Romeo, and a search by Mrs. Grier of the Onondaga County Clerk's office, we feel that there can only be one assumption. There was only one party that could have paid these people and that is the Onondaga County Democratic Committee. And, Mr. Romeo, the Elections Commissioner, and an executive member of the Onondaga County Democratic Committee, admits that these people were paid.

Now the petition drive ended on the 28th of July. Enclosed is a copy of a letter sent out by and for Mr. Roy Bernardi, and as can be clearly seen, it is post-marked the 1st of July. Please also note that it is on Onondaga Democratic Committee stationery.

Further note that there is a new address on the envelope and on the letterhead to which the Onondaga County Democratic Committee moved during the petition drive. As this is a newly printed envelope, and newly printed stationery, it would indicate that there were not loaned to any Independent Committee (they may have loaned them their old ones and crossed out their name), and that the Independent Committee could have gotten their own stationery in the same time frame as the printing was done for the Onondaga County Democratic Committee and, obviously, during the petition drive.

Now, as Mr. Romeo states, these people were paid, it would be safe to assume that this Committee should be established and/or in effect during some point of the petition drive. As of today, one day after Mr. Romeo's reply was published (the news reporter was Mr. Roy Peters of the Herald-Journal), there still cannot be found any such Independent Committee.

Therefore, we charge:

Allegedly:

1. There is no such Independent Committee;
2. Mr. Ramo does not have his facts straight; or worse,
3. if so facts these people were paid by the Onondaga County Democratic Committee, therefore making null and void any and all such petition as collected by same, paid for by same, in the name of the candidate, Mr. Roy Bernardi.

These charges are hereby notarized and sworn to by the undersigned and a copy of same is going by certified mail to Mr. Roy Bernardi.

Kadys files objections

Clarence Kadys, candidate in the Democratic primary election for Congress in the 33rd District, has filed specific objections against designating petitions filed by Democratic candidate Roy A. Bernardi.

Kadys said the objections deal with signatures for the same person in different handwriting, husbands or wives signing for their mates, and people signing petitions two or more times.

Bernardi denied the allegations and said his campaign team will have specific objections against designating petitions filed by Kadys with the State Board of Elections in Albany.

Bernardi filed a general objection but the registered letter reportedly was lost in the mail. Bernardi said he has a receipt for the letter from the post office, which is tracing the piece of mail.

Last week Kadys charged the Democratic County Committee expended committee funds in petition drives for several candidates.

Richard A. Romeo, committee secretary, said the allegations are false since an independent committee, established six weeks ago to promote candidates in the primary election, expended the funds.

Kadys reiterated the charge and pointed out a letter written on county committee stationery, and signed by Richard Parkinson, city chairman, and Gus Arabadjis, towns chairman, asked town and ward chairmen to appoint liaison coordinators to keep the county committee candidates informed of any activities taking place in the coordinator's town or ward.

Included with the letter was a list of Democratic candidates designated by the party, which didn't include Kadys' name.

He also said committee members were paid to collect petition signatures, but Romeo said the independent committee paid for the collection of signatures.

TO: Town and Ward Chairpersons

SUBJECT: Appointment of Town and Ward Campaign Liaison Coordinators

We are asking each Town and Ward Chairperson to appoint a Liaison Coordinator to act as contact person between the candidate and the respective Town or Ward. The function of the coordinator is to inform the County Committee office and the candidates of any activities that are taking place in the coordinator's town or ward and to act in a general liaison capacity. The coordinator should be a person who is well connected into the various goings-on in their area and who can help the candidates plan their activities on the local level.

The County Committee office will act as a central clearing house for information about activities taking place around the county. A calendar of events will be maintained so a candidate can find out what is going on in the county at any particular time. The calendar will depend on the input of the town and ward coordinators.

Here is what we would like you to do:

- a) Appoint a Liaison Coordinator (you may wish to do this yourself if you have time). Pass along the information in this letter to the coordinator so he or she knows what is expected.
- b) Call the County Committee office (Art Rancke, 422-0345) with the name, address and telephone number of the coordinator for your town or ward. We shall keep a list of the coordinators and make it available to all the candidates.

Here is what we would like the Liaison Coordinator to do:

- a) Keep track of any functions or activities that are going on in the coordinator's town or ward. The coordinator should monitor the local papers, bulletin boards, ask local organizations for their events schedules, etc. These events include political (rallies, committee meetings, coffee hours) as well as non-political functions (fireman's breakfasts, field days, church socials, PTA meetings, meetings of home-owners groups, Elks, Kiwanis, JC's affairs, etc.) Find out if candidates will be welcome to attend the affair, whether it is the type of affair at which attending candidates may be introduced, an estimate of how many persons will attend, whether the audience is a general cross-section of the community or pri-

marily of one political party, etc. This kind of information is essential to the candidates if they have to decide which of two conflicting events it is better for them to attend.

b) Call the County Committee office (422-0345) with this information so the event can be placed on the calendar of events.

c) Although each candidate should keep abreast of what is on the events calendar, it would be useful if the coordinator has the time call the candidates running in their area and pass along the same information. Enclosed is a list showing which political subdivisions are included in each town or ward and a list of candidates telephone numbers.

d) If a candidate decides to attend a local function, he or she may like a local contact person to meet at the event who can handle introductions, etc. The candidates should be able to ask the Liaison Coordinator to arrange for such a contact person.

e) In general, the Liaison Coordinator should function as the first line of communication between the local town or ward and the candidates.

Thank you for your help in setting this up. If everyone participates, this can be a very effective and useful system for helping our Democratic candidates plan their campaign activities.

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

In response to the filing of your check upon Mr. Bernardi's nominating

ically as follows: each and every sheet are defective,
generally and specifically as follows:

1. The petitions were printed, mailed, and stored, paid,
in envelopes supplied by, and controlled by telephone
of the Onondaga County Democratic Committee,
Syracuse, New York.
2. In more than one instance, the petitioners were
collected into a petition with at least 11
signatures, with specific instructions to do at
least that. Such instructions are illegal. Such
instructions were made by the Onondaga County
Democratic Committee and its members. This is also
likewise illegal.
3. It has been reported that some individuals have been paid
for gathering petitions while they were members of
the Onondaga County Democratic Committee. Specifically,
we find that individuals are unwilling to sign any
affidavits to that effect.
