
On March 20, 2003, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, Johnson for Congress Committee ("the Committee") and John Eveleth, as Treasurer, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). On June 8, 2004, the Commission found, based on the information in the complaint, and the information provided in response thereto, that there is no reason to believe that the Committee and John Eveleth, as Treasurer, violated the Act in this matter. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Statement of Policy Regarding Disclosure of Closed Enforcement and Related Files, 68 Fed. Reg. 70,426 (Dec. 18, 2003). A copy of the dispositive General Counsel's Report is enclosed for your information.
