The Federal Election Commission reviewed the allegations in your complaint dated August 6, 1999, and found that on the basis of the information provided in your complaint, and information provided by respondents, there is no reason to believe that Vice President Albert Gore, Jr. violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b, no reason to believe that Gore 2000, Inc. and Jose Villarreal, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b, and no reason to believe that PG&E Corporation violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b. Accordingly, on February 26, 2001, the Commission closed the file in this matter. A copy of the General Counsel's Report is enclosed for your information.

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(8).
