
On October 21, 2004, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Kinde Durkee, in her official capacity as treasurer to the Committee to Elect Cynthia Matthews, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). On February 9, 2006, the Commission found, on the basis of the information in the complaint and information provided by your client, that there is no reason to believe Kinde Durkee, in her official capacity as treasurer to the Committee to Elect Cynthia Matthews, violated the Act. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Statement of Policy Regarding Disclosure of Closed Enforcement and Related Files, 68 Fed. Reg. 70,426 (Dec. 18, 2003). A copy of the General Counsel's Report is enclosed for your information. A Statement of Reasons from one or more Commissioners may follow shortly.
